### Jaipur Literature festival

- ❖ Jaipur Literature festival was held in Houston, Texas, United States on 14th and 15th September 2018.
- ❖ This is the 1st time the festival is held outside Jaipur, ever since its inception in 2006.
- ❖ It is hailed as the World"s largest free literary festival.
- ❖ After Houston, it will be held in New York from September 19 to 20 and in Boulder, Colorado from September 21 to 23.
- ❖ It will also be held in Australia and England later.

#### **ECONOMY**

### Credit Suisse Research Institute (CSRI) Report

- ❖ India ranks third globally in terms of number of family-owned businesses with 111 companies having a total market capitalisation of \$839 billion.
- \* The study was published by the Credit Suisse Research Institute (CSRI).
- ❖ India closely follows China with 159 firms and the US with 121 firms, according to the 'Credit Suisse Family 1000 in 2018'.
- ❖ As per the report, in terms of number of family-owned businesses within the non-Japan Asian region, the list is dominated by China, India and Hong Kong.
- ❖ These three jurisdictions together account for around 65% of the non-Japan Asian section of CSRI's database.

## **Typhoon Mangkhut**

- ❖ Typhoon Mangkhut made landfall on the northeastern tip of Luzon island in the Philippines with the top of the scale Category 5 winds of 165 mph.
- ❖ The name Mangkhut is a Thai word for the fruit mangosteen. In the Philippines, the typhoon is locally known as Ompong.
- ❖ The Hong Kong Observatory reported Mangkhut was the most powerful cyclone to hit the city since 1979.
- ❖ The deadliest storm on record in the Philippines was Super Typhoon Haiyan in 2013.
- ❖ Hurricanes and typhoons are the same type of storm. Both are tropical cyclones. But those that occur in the Pacific west of the International Date Line are called typhoons.

#### **STATES**

# Swayangsiddha

- ❖ In an attempt to combat human trafficking, the West Bengal government has rolled out a scheme, Swayangsiddha, in different districts of the State.
- Swayangsiddha, which means self-reliance, will be executed by the West Bengal Police.
- ❖ The scheme aims to empower young boys and girls to make informed choices so that they are less vulnerable to trafficking and child marriage.
- ❖ As the per the NCRB data, West Bengal has highest recorded case of trafficking among the States.

#### YuvaNestam scheme

- ❖ Andhra Pradesh is going to launch 'YuvaNestam scheme' for providing 'unemployment allowance' to the state's youth from October 2018
- ❖ For this purpose, the CM launched website "yuvanestham.ap.gov.in", where candidates have to register
- ❖ The scheme provides an allowance of RS 1000 for the unemployed youth in the age group of 25 years to 35 years.





### 1st Ever Dedicated Dog Park

❖ For the first time in India, a dedicated dog park has been set up at Hyderabad the park at an area of 1.3 acres.



❖ It was developed by "Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation" at a cost of Rs 1.1 crore and certified by Kennel Club of India.

### 'Swachh Dhara'

- ❖ Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu flagged off the 'Swachh Dhara' programme at Amravati in Andhra Pradesh.
- ❖ It was launched with the main objective of providing clean drinking water across the state.

# PERSONALITIES, AWARDS AND EVENTS

## **Hindi Implementation Award**

- State-run Punjab National Bank (PNB) bagged the "Rajbhasha Kirti" award for outstanding performance in implementing the Official Language Policy during 2017-18.
- ❖ The award was given on the occasion of Hindi Diwas (15th September).





❖ The award, under the category of 'Nationalised Banks and Financial Institutions in Region A', was presented by Vice President M. Venkaiah Naidu.

#### Anna Rajam Malhotra passed away

- ❖ Anna Rajam Malhotra, first Indian woman IAS officer after Independence, died in Mumbai on 17th September.
- ❖ The officer served in the Madras State under then Chief Minister C. Rajagopalachari.



- ❖ During her tenure, the construction of India's first computerised port Nhava Sheva (Jawaharlal Nehru Port) in Mumbai was completed.
- ❖ Anna Rajam was honored with the Padma Bhushan award in 1989 for her exemplary service.

### **SPORTS**

#### **Ahmet Comert Tournament**

- ❖ Simranjit Kaur (64kg), Monika (48kg) and BhagyabatiKachari (81kg) claimed gold medals at Ahmet Comert Tournament in Istanbul, Turkey.
- ❖ Simranjit, a former national medallist, defeated Turkey's SemaCaliskan to win the Gold.
- ❖ Bhagyabati was declared the most scientific boxer of the tournament.





#### New marathon world record

❖ Kenyan Eliud Kipchoge set a new marathon world record in Berlin (Germany), smashing the previous best as he clocked 2 hours 1 minute 39 second.



- ❖ The 33-year-old Olympic champion took 1 minute 17 second off the previous best set four years ago by Dennis Kimetto.
- ❖ Ethiopian Ruti Aga finished second and her compatriot Tirunesh Dibaba third.

# Mountaineers climbed Asia's highest volcanic peak Mount

- ❖ Mountaineers Satyarup Siddhanta and Mousumi Khatua have created history by climbing Asia's highest volcanic peak Mount Damavand in Iran.
- ❖ At the elevation of 5,609 metres, Mount Damavand is a potentially active volcano.
- ❖ The expedition team comprised of three members, Siddhanta, Mousumi and Bhaswati Chatterjee.

### **Dow Jones Sustainability Index 2018**

- ❖ Tata Steel has bagged the 'Steel Industry Leader' Award in 'Dow Jones Sustainability Index 2018' (DJSI 2018).
- ❖ Tata Steel is the only India-based company to win among 60 sectors evaluated for DJSI 2018





❖ It has been named the "Industry Leader" amongst 24 steel companies globally, for the second time in the last 3 years.
