- ❖ The Union Minister for Culture Prahlad Singh Patel has announced the inclusion of Nepali and Santhali languages in the Scheme for grant of Senior/Junior Fellowships of Culture Ministry.
 - Centre for Cultural Resources and Training (CCRT), New Delhi is the Nodal institute for handling the Scheme of Sr. /Jr. Fellowship till selection process.
- Atish Dabholkar, a theoretical physicist from India, has been appointed as the new director of Abdus Salam International Centre for Theoretical Physics (ICTP) in Trieste, Italy.
 - o Mr. Dabholkar will take up his duties as ICTP director with the rank of Assistant Director General of the UNESCO.
- ❖ Wing Commander Tarun Chaudhri became the first Indian Air Force (IAF) pilot to do a wingsuit jump from a Mi-17 helicopter from an altitude of 8500 feet.
 - He attempted the jump during Kargil Diwas celebrations in Jodhpur on July 21.
- ❖ Sri Lankan Government has exempted Indian tourists from Visa Fees for tourism purposes with effect from 1 August 2019.
- ❖ Infosys has launched its state-of-the-art Cyber Defence Center in Bucharest, Romania.
 - o This Defence Center will provide Real-Time, End-To-End, 24×7 Cyber Security monitoring and protection services.
- ❖ The eighth annual plastic collection drive has commenced at Vembanad Lake, Kerala.
 - It is a designated Ramsar site and one of the most polluted waterbodies in the world.
- ❖ Ethiopian Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed has launched a country-wide tree planting exercise named as "Green Legacy Initiative".
 - Under the initiative more than 350 million trees were planted in a single day and it is claimed to be a world record.
- ❖ Delhi State Government has announced free Electricity for people who consume upto 200 units. People who consume between 201 and 400 units would also be given a 50% subsidy by the state government.
- ❖ IIT Kharagpur has developed a new technology for solid waste management termed "Hydro Thermal Carbonization (HTC)".





- HTC technology can convert municipal solid waste to biofuel, soil amendment and absorbents. This Technology can be used by civic bodies to effectively manage solid waste.
- ❖ India's Vivek Kohli and M P Singh have been elected as chairman and secretary general respectively of the Commonwealth Table Tennis Federation (CTTF).
 - The current President of CTTF is Dushyant Chautala. It is for the first time that all the three positions in CTTF are held by Indians.
- ❖ The first State-level accreditation agency in the country, the State Assessment and Accreditation Centre (SAAC), has been operationalised for higher education institutions in Kerala.
 - 3 State-specific parameters are included for accreditation social inclusiveness, equity and excellence, and steps to foster scientific temper and secular outlook.
- ❖ Scientists in Japan will begin trying to grow human organs in animals after receiving government permission for the first study of its kind in the country.
 - They will employ xenotransplantation technique. Xenotransplantation or heterologous transplant is the transplantation of living cells, tissues or organs from one species to another.
- ❖ Girraj Prasad Gupta has been appointed as the Controller General of Accounts (CGA) with effect from August 1, 2019.
- ❖ Bhasha Mukherjee, a 23-year-old Indian origin doctor was crowned Miss England 2019.
- ❖ President Ram Nath Kovind inaugurated exhibitions on Mahatma Gandhi and Khadi at the "Ebunjan Theatre" in the Gambia to commemorate the 150th birth anniversary of the Mahatma Gandhi.
- ❖ In Jammu and Kashmir, the 43-day-long Machail Mata Yatra in Kishtwar district was suspended due to security reasons.
 - Machail Mata is a Goddess Durga shrine located at Machail, Kishtwar District of Jammu region in India.
- ❖ Addressing the 10th MGC Ministerial Meeting in Bangkok, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has emphasised on better connectivity between India and other member countries of the Mekong Ganga Cooperation (MGC) bloc.
 - It is a sub-regional cooperation organisation comprising India and five ASEAN countries, namely, Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, Thailand and Vietnam.





- ❖ NASA's Transiting Exoplanet Survey Satellite (TESS) mission has discovered GJ 357 d, a super-Earth planet located 31 light years away from our own solar system.
- ❖ India's Satwik sairaj Ranki reddy and Chirag Shetty scripted a piece of history by beating reigning World champions Li Jun Hui and Liu Yu Chen, in the men's doubles final of the Thailand Open badminton championship in Bangkok.
- ❖ TN Chief Minister inaugurated the Karur Government Medical College on 31 July 2019.
 - o It is the 23rd government medical college in the State and First medical college in Karur district.
- Atish Dabholkar, a theoretical physicist from India has been appointed as the new director of Abdus Salam International Centre for Theoretical Physics (ICTP) in Trieste, Italy.
- ❖ French inventor Franky Zapata successfully crossed English Channel, between France and England, on a jet-powered hoverboard for the 1st time.
 - Flyboard Air is a board powered by four turbo jet engines that allows a rider to fly through air untethered, using a computer to keep it stabilized.
- Authorities at the Arignar Anna Zoological Park, Vandalur have brought a fouryear-old Rhino from Kaziranga National Park in Assam as part of an animal exchange programme.
 - o The zoo was started in the year 1985 and had one rhino then. But it died in 1989.
- ❖ IIT-Guwahati team has developed a "portable device" with bio-compatible sensor to detect bacteria "without the time-consuming cell culture or microbiological assays". It can be used to diagnose critical illnesses such as meningitis.
 - o Such a rapid detection of bacteria, is not just important in healthcare, but also in Anti- bioterrorism measures and environmental monitoring.
- ❖ Securities and Exchange Board of India has approved Singapore Stock Exchange and National Stock Exchange of India Ltd to operate jointly in Gujarat International Finance Tec-City, Gandhinagar.
 - o The two entities will create a new platform for trading called NSE International Financial Service Centre (IFSC)-SGX Connect.
- ❖ Hiroshima Day is observed on 6th August. It commemorates 6 August 1945, the day when an atomic bomb (Little Boy) was dropped from the Enola Gay Airplane on the Japanese city of Hiroshima.
 - o The day is now a focus for anti-war and anti-nuclear discussions and demonstrations.





- ❖ The Lalit Kala Akademi, also known as National Academy of Art celebrated its 65th Foundation Day in New Delhi. Minister of Culture & Tourism Prahlad Singh Patel inaugurated the celebrations.
- ❖ According to Forbes, 23-times Grand Slam champion Serena Williams has become the highest paid female athlete of 2019.
 - Japanese player Naomi Osaka's recent Grand Slam title wins at the US and Australian Opens has catapulted her to second spot.
- ❖ The United States has designated China a "Currency Manipulator", thus fulfilling Donald Trump's election campaign promise.
 - o The US treasury department accused China of manipulating its currency "to gain unfair competitive advantage in international trade".
- ❖ The 77th anniversary of the Quit India Movement was observed on 8 August.
 - On this date in 8 Aug 1942, Mahatma Gandhi gave a clarion call to end the British rule and launched the Quit India Movement at the Bombay session of the All-India Congress Committee.
- Saudi Arabia has announced a change in its law that will allow women to obtain passports and travel internationally without being escorted by a male "guardian". This system was known as Guardianship system.
- ❖ 9-year old 'Valentina Elangbam' of Manipur's Kakching district has been appointed as Green Ambassador for the State government's Green Manipur Mission.
 - o She had planted 2 Gulmohar tress few years back. These were cut down for road expansion. The kid kept crying inconsolably in a Face Book post and the issue was brought to the attention of Chief Minister.
- ❖ The Virasat-e-Khalsa museum in Punjab's Anandpur Sahib town will enter Asian Book of Records soon for becoming the most visited museum in the Asian subcontinent on a single day. 20,569 visitors came on March 20,2019 alone.
 - Virasat-e-Khalsa was built to commemorate the history and culture of Punjab and Sikhism and was inaugurated in November 2011.
- ❖ Former U.S. Ambassador to Cambodia and President, World Food Prize Foundation, Kenneth M. Quinn received the Dr. M.S. Swaminathan Award for Environment Protection.
- ❖ President Ram Nath Kovind has given his assent to the legislation for bifurcation of Jammu and Kashmir into two Union Territories on 09.08.19.
 - The Union Territories Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh will come into existence on October 31. It is the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel.





- ❖ The President of India, Ram Nath Kovind, presented Bharat Ratna Awards to Nanaji Deshmukh (posthumously), Bhupendra Kumar Hazarika (posthumously) and Pranab Mukherjee on August 08, 2019 at Rashtrapati Bhavan.
- ❖ The Tamil Nadu State Education Department has launched a pilot scheme that focuses on offering online resources called "Matific" App to enhance the mathematical learning of students studying in elementary schools.
 - Matific provides students with engaging problem-solving tasks that will contribute to the holistic development of their mathematical learning.
- ❖ The Khadi and Village Industry Commission (KVIC) has launched "Leather Mission" on 2019 World Indigenous Peoples' Day (August 9). It will distribute leather kits to the leather artisans across the nation.
- ❖ Chandrima Shaha is set to be the 1st woman president of the Indian National Science Academy. Her tenure will begin from January 2020.
 - She was formerly the Director of the National Institute of Immunology, Delhi.
- ❖ India's first 'health credit card' has been launched by private sector bank RBL and digital healthcare platform Practo. It can be used for like online consultations with doctors and a free health check-up.
- ❖ Indian Badminton star Sourabh Verma clinched the Men's Singles title in the Hyderabad Open. He beat Singapore's Loh Kean Yew in the final clash.
- ❖ Bajrang Punia defeated Iran's Peiman Bibyani in the 65kg category and won his fourth Gold medal of the season at the Grand Prix Wrestling tournament held at Tbilsi, Georgia.
- ❖ The Israeli spacecraft called "Beresheet" crashed onto the Moon in April. It carried dehydrated microscopic lifeforms known as tardigrades which are supposedly still alive in moon.
 - o Tardigrades are among the most resilient animals known, with individual species being able to survive in extreme conditions.
- ❖ Delhi-Lahore bus service has been stopped. It was started in 1999 under Vajpayee's rule.
- ❖ India beat Bangladesh and won the Under-19 Tri-Series cricket tournament held at England under the captaincy of Pavan Shah.
- ❖ The 2019 Rogers cup was won by Bianca Andreescu (Women's) and Rafael Nadal (5th Time) at Montreal, Canada.
- ❖ Tamilnadu was the only and the first state government in India to have included 'bariatric surgery' under TN Chief Minister's comprehensive health insurance scheme. More than 100 people have benefitted till now.





- ❖ The Confederation of Indian Industries (CII) and Jammu and Kashmir Trade Promotion Organisation (JKTPO) have announced that a three-day "global investors summit" will be held in Srinagar from October 12.
- ❖ To improve standards of law education, the Bar Council of India (BCI) has imposed a '3-year moratorium' on opening of new institutions except for national law universities (NLUs), if proposed by a state.
 - o BCI is a statutory body established by Parliament under the Advocates Act, 1961 to regulate and represent Indian bar.
- ❖ The Pacific island nation of Papua New Guinea has the highest number of 'living' indigenous languages in the world (840), while India stands fourth with 453.
 - o The year 2019 is designated as United Nations' International Year of Indigenous Languages.
- ❖ Rajasthan has won the "best innovation and initiative leadership award" for its achievements in higher education in the World Education Summit-2019 held in New Delhi.
- ❖ India's transsexual woman Naaz Joshi was crowned for third successive time in the beauty pageant "Miss World Diversity" held at Mauritius.
- ❖ Iran has unveiled three precision-guided air-air missiles: Yasin", "Balaban" and the "Ghaem".
- ❖ Scientists from University of Leeds, UK have reportedly created the world's thinnest gold which is just 0.47 nanometres. It is a 2D object because it is made of just 2 atoms.
- ❖ Alejandro Giammattei became the New President of Guatemala after winning the election in the second round against Sandra Torres.
- ❖ Singapore said that it will impose ban on Domestic sale of Ivory from 2021.
- ❖ As per the recent report of World Health Organization, Sri Lanka is the fourth country in the WHO South-East Asia Region, after Bhutan, Maldives, and Timor-Leste, to eliminate measles and control rubella.
- ❖ In the recent ODI match against West Indies, Virat Kohli scored his 42nd century and became the second highest Indian run-getter by surpassing Sourav Ganguly (11363). Now Kohli is behind Sachin Tendulkar.
- ❖ The former Prime Minister Manmohan Singh filed his nomination as the Congress candidate for the by-election to the Rajya Sabha for the first time from Rajasthan. He was a Rajya Sabha member from Assam for five consecutive terms between 1991 and 2019.
- ❖ Information and Broadcasting Ministry has decided to implement Accessibility Standards for Persons with Disabilities in "private television channel programmes" from this Independence Day.





- As a first step, they had been asked to telecast a short programme on Independence Day Celebrations along with corresponding sign language interpretation.
- West Bengal's Priyam Chatterjee became the 1st Indian chef to be awarded the prestigious 'Chevalier de l'Ordre du Mérite Agricoleto' by the government of France.
 - o He is famous for creating French cuisines out of Bengali dishes.
- ❖ Andhra Pradesh government has announced a scheme called "Village Volunteers System" which is aimed at providing Government services at doorsteps of people.
- ❖ Harshad Pandurang Thakur has been appointed as Director of National Institute of Health and Family Welfare. Decision in this regard was taken by Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) chaired by Prime Minister.
- ❖ A rare variety of tea named 'Golden Butterfly' from Upper Assam's Dikom Tea Estate set a new record on as it was auctioned for Rs.75,000 per kg at Guwahati Tea Auction Centre (GTAC).
- Union Information and Broadcasting Minister Prakash Javadekar released a patriotic song titled Watan in New Delhi to mark the occasion of Independence Day 2019.
 - o The special song has been created by public service broadcaster Doordarshan (DD) and Prasar Bharati for Independence Day.
- Australian all-rounder Ellyse Perry has become the first cricketer of either gender to reach the rare milestone of scoring 1000 runs and taking 100 wickets in T20 international cricket.
- ❖ The 'QS Best Student Cities Ranking' has been compiled by global education consultancy QS Quacquarelli Symonds. London has been named as the world's best city for students for the second consecutive year, followed by Tokyo and Melbourne.
 - o Bengaluru (81st rank) is ranked as India's best student city.
- ❖ World Lizard day is observed on August 14.
- ❖ The AIIMS-Delhi has launched a first-of-its-kind clinical ecotoxicology facility in India. The centre will be used to investigate increasing cases of diseases resulting from exposure to environmental toxins contaminating water, food and air.
- ❖ The two day long 22nd National Conference on E-Governance has been conducted at Shillong, Meghalaya.
- Palaeontologists have found the 'fossils' of the largest parrot ever recorded in New Zealand. It is estimated to have weighed 7 kg.





- o The new species has been named "Heracles inexpectatus" to reflect its unusual size and strength and the unexpected nature of the discovery.
- ❖ The Karnataka IT department has launched a scheme called "E-Step" for students/start-ups/entrepreneurs to understand the basics of entrepreneurship from 'experienced trainers'.
- ❖ The third International Electric Vehicles and charging infrastructure Conclave was held at new Delhi.
- ❖ Ravi Shastri has been reappointed head coach of the men's senior national team by the Indian cricket board (BCCI) for an extended two-year term that will conclude in November 2021.
- ❖ Thailand women's cricket team has created a world record by winning its 17th successive T20 international match. This is the highest number of consecutive wins by any team (both men and women) in T20 format.
- ❖ India's Varun Kapur has won bronze medal at the Bulgarian Junior International Badminton Championships 2019, which took place at Pazardzhik, Bulgaria.
- ❖ Aishwarya Pissay created history by becoming the first Indian to claim a World Title in motorsports. She lifted the FIM World Cup in the women's category in Hungary.
 - The event was conducted by International Motorcycling Federation, the governing body for motorcycle racing in the world.
- ❖ German cancer researcher Fiona Kolbinger has become the 1st woman to win one of the world's toughest cycling races (4,000 km). The race was held between Bulgaria and France.
- ❖ Air India becomes first Indian airline to fly over North Pole. The Air India flight from Delhi to San Francisco usually flies over the Atlantic or the Pacific Ocean but on August 15, it flew over zero degree north.
- ❖ Anupam Kher's autobiography "Lessons Life Taught Me, unknowingly" was recently released in India.
- ❖ Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik inaugurated the Naval Tata Hockey Academy (NTHA) at Kalinga Stadium in Bhubaneswar.
- P.Ramyalakshmi, Assistant Director, Fisheries, Cuddalore has received the Tamil Nadu Government's Kalpana Chawla Award 2019 for her exemplary courage and daring enterprise in taking on the illegal practice of "purse seine fishing".
 - o Purse seine fishing deprives traditional fishermen of catch and threatens the marine ecosystem as a whole in the region.





- Union Minister of State for Shipping Mansukh Mandaviya has announced that country's first Central Institute of Chemical Engineering and Technology (CICET) will be established in Gujarat.
- ❖ The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) has fixed the retirement age for all Central Armed Police Force (CAPF) personnel at 60 years.
 - Central Industrial Security Force (CISF), Assam Rifles, Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), Border Security Force (BSF), Indo-Tibetan Border Police (ITBP) and Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB) together form CAPF.
- ❖ A new species of Jharkhand's burrowing frog has been confirmed and published in Records of the Zoological Survey of India.
 - It is named as Spahaerotheca Magadha and commonly called as 'Magadha Burrowing Frog'. It was discovered in 2015.
- ❖ Vice President inauguaretd and dedicated to the nation 'Shyamali House' which is a heritage house of Rabindranth Tagore located in Santiniketan.
 - o Shyamali was a mud house which was built by local Santhals of Santiniketan in 1934.
- ❖ According to the first-ever global assessment of 'forest biodiversity' by World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF) there has been a 53 per cent decline in the number of forest wildlife populations since 1970.
 - o The new findings were based on the Forest Specialist Index, an index that tracks wildlife that lives only in forests.
- ❖ August 19th is observed as International Orangutan Day.
- ❖ Tamilnadu government has won three awards for excellence under Union Government's Poshan Abiyaan scheme.
 - o Poshan Abiyaan is a multi-ministerial convergence mission to attain malnutrition-free India and was launched in 2017.
- ❖ In a first in the history of Indian Metro rail projects, Pune Metro will get aluminium-bodied coaches. Thus far, Metros in the country have used stainless steel-bodied coaches.
 - o Aluminium coaches are lighter in weight, more energy efficient and have better aesthetics and will be manufactured in Kolkatta.
- ❖ The 9-Day National Tribal Festival "Aadi Mahotsav" is being held at Polo Ground, Leh-Ladakh from 17th August. It is organised jointly by Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India & Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation of India (TRIFED).





- ❖ Akilesh Ranjan Task Force for drafting a New Direct Tax Legislation has submitted its report and a draft of the new proposed version of the Income-tax law to Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman.
- Clinical trials conducted amid an Ebola epidemic in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) have identified two new drugs that can dramatically cut mortality from the disease - REGN-EB3 and mAb114.
- ❖ Researchers from Dresden University, Germany have developed a new self-calibrating, lens-less endoscope that produces three-dimensional (3D) images of objects smaller than a single cell.
- ❖ In the run-up to the UNFCC Conference of Parties (COP-25) meet to be held on December 2019, the BASIC countries (Brazil, South Africa, India and China) has held its 28th Ministerial meeting on Climate Change from 14th to 16th August, 2019 at Sao Paulo, Brazil.
- South Korea's Lee Duck-hee has become the 'first deaf player' to win a match in the main draw of a tournament on the ATP Tour.
 - He beat Switzerland's Henri Laaksonen at the Winston-Salem Open in North Carolina, USA.
- ❖ The 9th Session of the India-Kenya Joint Trade Committee (JTC) was held on 19th − 20th August 2019 in New Delhi.
- ❖ The one-day National Conference of Tourism Ministers was organised by the Union Ministry of Tourism at New Delhi on 20 August 2019.
- ❖ India's Prashant Gade has won the NCPEDP MPHASIS Universal Design Award 2019 for developing low cost prosthetic arm called as "Inali Arm".
- ❖ To strengthen enforcement of the ban on production and sale of electronic cigarettes, Karnataka government has included "nicotine" under its Class A poison category.
 - Highly toxic chemicals, which are dangerous to life even in very small quantities such as cyanogen, hydrocyanic acid, nitrogen peroxide, and phosgene are classified as Class A poisons in Karnataka.
- ❖ A startup from California Cerebras Systems has developed the biggest processor in the world, which consists of 1.2 trillion transistors. It is called the Cerebras Wafer Scale Engine.
- ❖ Every year, August 21 is observed as World Entrepreneurs' Day, a day to celebrate innovation and empowerment of entrepreneurship and leadership.
- ❖ The chief minister of Punjab has launched a universal health insurance scheme called "Sarbat Sehat Bima Yojana" which covers pre-existing disease also and benefits nearly 46 lakh families.





- ❖ Former Additional Commissioner of Police and a current member of the BCCI's Anti-Corruption Unit, B.N.S. Reddy has won the gold medal at the World Police and Fire Games tournament, held in Chengdu, China.
- ❖ The recent excavation carried out by Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) at Maharashtra's Phupgaon has revealed evidence of an Iron Age settlement in the Vidarbha region.
 - o The site is situated near Purna river, which is a tributary of Tapi.
- ❖ Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and tennis player Sania Mirza will be among co-chairs for India Economic Summit to be held in October by the World Economic Forum.
- ❖ Former Indian opener Vikram Rathour has been appointed as team India's new batting coach. He will replace Sanjay Bangar. While Bharath Arun and R. Sridhar were retained as bowling and fielding coaches.
- ❖ M. Mansoor Ali, a social science teacher at Diamond Jubilee Higher Secondary School in Gobichettipalayam and R. Selvakkannan, Headmaster of Panchayat Union Primary School at K. Paramathi in Karur have been selected from the State for the National award for best teachers for 2018.
- ❖ Union Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate change (MoEFCC) has decided to 'waive off' or relax mandatory charging of lease rent of Rs.30,000 per Mega Watt (MW) for wind power projects.
- Prahlad Singh Patel, Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Culture and Tourism has launched the book 'The Diary of Manu Gandhi' (1943-44), translated from Gujarati by Tridip Suhrud.
 - The book has been brought out on occasion of 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi by National Archives of India in collaboration with Oxford University Press.
- ❖ Bollywood Actor Akshay Kumar has made it to the 4th position on the Forbes magazine's World's Highest-Paid Actors Of 2019 list. He has earned \$65 million. Top paid actor is Dwayne 'Rock' Johnson.
- ❖ The President of India, Ram Nath Kovind, inaugurated the first World Youth Conference on Kindness in New Delhi on August 23, 2019.
 - It is organised by the UNESCO Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Education for Peace and Sustainable Development, Ministry of Human Resource Development.
- ❖ Prime Minister Modi has launched redevelopment project of the 200-year-old Sri Krishna temple in Manama, Bahrain.
- ❖ Prime Minister Modi has been honored with two prestigious state awards from monarchs in Bahrain and the United Arab Emirates (UAE).





- From Bahrain: The King Hamad Order of the Renaissance and from UAE:
 Order of Zayed.
- Nigeria has become the first country to approve open cultivation of genetically modified (GM) Bt cowpea. Earlier, Nigeria and Ethiopia had also approved GM cotton.
- ❖ Iran's President Hassan Rouhani inducted domestically built 'Bavar-373 air missile defense system' into their military.
- ❖ The Indian team of Sukhbeer Singh, Sangampreet Singh Bisla and Tushar Phadtare clinched a 'bronze medal' in the junior compound men's team event in the World Archery Youth Championships in Madrid, Spain.
- ❖ India's 'Statue of Unity' and 'Soho House' in Mumbai have been featured in the Time's list of 100 greatest places in the world. The list is divided into places to visit, to stay and to eat and drink.
- ❖ An advanced neurosurgery unit was inaugurated at Cauvery Hospital in Chennai. It will provide comprehensive and advanced neuro and spine treatment using 3D and robotic technology.
- ❖ India has contributed \$1 million to United Nation Special Purpose Trust Fund (SPTF) for Resident Coordinator System.
- ❖ In a first for Karnataka, it will have three Deputy Chief Ministers Govind M. Karjola, Dr Ashwath Narayana and Laxman Savadi have been named as deputy CMs in Yediyurappa's cabinet.
- ❖ The Union Minister for Textiles, Smriti Irani launched Project SURE, a move towards sustainable fashion at Lakmé Fashion Winter/Festive 2019, in Mumbai.
 - SURE stands for 'Sustainable Resolution' a commitment from the industry to move towards fashion that contributes to a clean environment.
- ❖ In a massive push for women hygiene, the Union government will slash price of sanitary napkins sold from its Jan Aushadhi Kendras to just Re 1 per piece from Rs 2.50 currently.
 - The biodegradable sanitary napkins 'Suvidha' will be available at the subsidised price at designated centres from August 27, 2019.
- ❖ India's first woman Director General of Police (DGP), 1973-batch IPS Officer Kanchan Chaudhary Bhattacharya has passed away. She made history when she was appointed the DGP of Uttarakhand in the year 2004.
 - o She was also the second woman IPS officer in the country.
- ❖ In its new Industrial Policy, Maharashtra government has put in place a new 'sons-of-the-soil' clause which mandates 80% jobs for the locals. Companies not adhering to the clause will have their GST incentives cancelled.





- ❖ 10th bus service between India and Nepal has been launched. It connects Siliguri in West Bengal with Kathmandu.
- ❖ U.S. space agency NASA is investigating what may be the 'first crime committed in outer space'.
 - Astronaut Anne McClain is accused of identity theft and improperly accessing her estranged wife's private financial records while being aboard International Space Station (ISS).
- ❖ Madurai-based J Dhaanya Thasnem was declared as one among three students to go on an educational tour to National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) and interact with astronauts there.
 - The class 10 student bagged the opportunity after winning the National Space Science Contest 2019.
- ❖ The Supreme Court has decided to examine the "legal challenge" against the Centre's decision to abrogate Article 370, which gave special status to Jammu and Kashmir.
 - o It has referred the matter to a five-judge Constitution bench.
- Union Minister for Chemicals and Fertilisers D. V. Sadananda Gowda has launched a mobile application called "Jan Aushadhi Sugam". It is to enable people search their nearest Jan Aushadhi generic medicine stores.
- ❖ In a bid to encourage Good Samaritans, the Puducherry government has announced a cash award of Rs 5,000 to those rushing road accident victims to hospitals and helping save lives.
- ❖ Union Government has notified 63 provisions of the Motor Vehicles Amendment Act 2019 including the ones dealing with enhanced penalties for various traffic offences. The new clauses will come into effect from September 1st, 2019.
- ❖ Defence Minister Rajnath Singh inaugurated the '26th Ladakhi Kisan Jawan Vigyan Mela' organised by Defence Institute of High-Altitude Research in Leh.
- ❖ Prominent economist Abdalla Hamdok has taken charge as the new Prime Minister of Sudan.
- Constable Monali Jadhav from Maharashtra won three medals, including two golds, at the recently concluded World Police and Fire Games International Championship held in Chengdu, China.
- ❖ The Tamil Nadu government signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Kings College Hospital, London, to set up its branch in the state.

Water ATM at Nilgiris


- ❖ Nilgiris district administration has installed Water ATMs at 70 locations popular with tourists.
- ❖ The ban on sale of plastic water bottles and soft drinks along highways running through Nilgiris will come into effect from August 15.
- ❖ Tourists can collect water from ATMs at a nominal price.



TN ambitious Bus Rapid Transit System


- ❖ Tamil Nadu government has revived the ambitious Bus Rapid Transit System (BRTS) along seven key stretches in Chennai.
- BRTS will encompass:
 - o Old Mahabalipuram Road,
 - o GST Road,
 - o The stretch between <u>Koyambedu</u> and <u>Poonamallee</u>, and
 - o Chromepet-Thoraipakkam Road.
- ❖ BRTS combines the flexibility and affordability of buses with the efficiency and quality of metro rail.





Three bio-CNG plants - Chennai

- ❖ Greater Chennai Corporation will set up three bio-CNG plants that will bottle compressed natural gas produced from bio waste.
- ❖ They will be set up at Pallikaranai, Sholinganallur and the abandoned asphalt complex in Anna Nagar.
- ❖ The plants will be set up in private-public partnership where the private company will be in charge of manufacturing and maintenance of the facility.
- ❖ Bio-CNG can replace CNG as an automotive fuel (for CNG buses and tractors) and LPG for cooking purposes, as well as to power street lights.







V.O. Chidambaranar Port Creates Record

- ❖ V.O. Chidambaram Port created a new record by handling 1,80,597 Metric Tonnes of cargo in a single day on 27th July,2019.
- ❖ It is surpassing the previous single day record of 1,77,639 Metric Tonnes on 16th November, 2017.
- ❖ Earlier, on 25th July, 2019, the port had set another record by handling a vessel with highest parcel size of 85,224 Tonnes, when the Cyprus vessel 'MV KMAX EMPEROR' arrived from UAE.
- ❖ The highest parcel size handled by the port before this was the vessel 'MV SFAKIA WAVE' with 84,502 tonnes of limestones on 11th February, 2019.

Health Insurance in Tamilnadu

- ❖ As per data from the Union health ministry, Tamil Nadu has the maximum number of families covered by national health insurance.
- ❖ At least 1.57 crore families in the state now have a cover of Rs 5 lakh a family.
- ❖ The state combined Tamil Nadu Chief minister's Health Insurance program with the Centre's Ayushman Bharat-Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana.
- ❖ In Tamilnadu, the most commonly sought medical procedure under Insurance was renal dialysis.

Compulsory Aadhar in TN Schools

- Tamilnadu School Education Department has announced that students who are studying in government and government-aided schools must provide Aadhar card details.
- ❖ Information including parents must be collected by the schools and uploaded in Educational Management Information System (EMIS) portal managed by State Government.
- ❖ The Aadhar registration and collection of these details for EMIS is done by Samagra Shiksha, which is partly funded by the Union Government.

Heavy Rains at Nilgiris

- ❖ The Avalanche region in the Nilgiris has recorded 820 mm rainfall in the 24-hour period till 08.08.19 and 2,136 mm in the 72 hours (09.08.19).
- ❖ It is claimed to be the highest in South India.





- ❖ In Tamilnadu, the previous highest rainfall recorded in a single day was at Cuddalore, in 1943 570 mm of rain.
- ❖ In Western Ghats region, no maximum rain was recorded beyond 400 mm.
- ❖ In 2015, Sembarambakkam lake has received 470 mm rainfall.
- ❖ Mahabaleshwar, situated in the Western Ghats of Maharashtra, became the wettest place in India after Mawsynram in Meghalaya.
- ❖ It recorded 6,031.5 mm rainfall between June 1 and August 8 of 2019.
- ❖ Mawsynram is the wettest place on Earth. It receives an average annual rainfall of 11,872 mm.
- ❖ It is 15 km west of Cherrapunji. Earlier Cherrapunji was credited as the wettest place on Earth.

Best Corporation and Municipalities in TN

- ❖ The Commission of Municipal Administration (CMA) has recommended Salem as the best performing Corporation and Dharmapuri as the best performing Municipality in the state.
- ❖ The recommendations were accepted by the State government and the towns will get the Chief Minister's Award.
- ❖ Vedaranyam and Aranthangi were selected as the second and third best performing Municipalities
- ❖ In 2018, Tiruppur Corporation bagged the best performing Corporation Award while Kovilpatti, Cumbum and Sirkazhi Municipalities bagged the top three best performing Municipalities, respectively.

Kalaimamani Awards 2011-18

- Chief Minister presented the Kalaimamani awards to artistes for the years 2011 to 2018.
- ❖ He also announced that 'three special Kalaimamani awards' in the name of former Chief Minister J.Jayalalithaa will be constituted and awarded annually.
- ❖ Financial assistance given to elderly artistes every month was increased from ₹2,000 to ₹3,000.
- ❖ As many as 201 recipients were selected from 72 different art forms for Kalaimamani awards and 8 senior artistes were selected for a special cash award.

Palani Panchamirtham - GI Tag

- ❖ Palani panchamirtham, given as 'prasadam' at the Murugan temple there has been granted the Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- ❖ This is the first time a temple 'prasadam' from Tamil Nadu has been bestowed with the GI tag.

Tirupattur, Ranipettai Districts

- Vellore district in Tamil Nadu will be divided into Vellore, Ranipet and Tirupattur districts.
- ❖ With this, the total number of districts in the State will increase to 37.
- Vellore district was created in 1989 by bifurcating North Arcot district into Vellore and Tiruvanamalai districts.
- ❖ In July 2019, Tenkasi and Chengalpet districts were created as separate districts from Thirunelveli and Kanchipuram districts.

AMMA Patrol Vehicle

- ❖ It is a new novel scheme introduced in Tamil Nadu to help women, children, and older adults.
- ❖ The patrol vans are to assist the special wing of police for the crimes against women & children.





- ❖ All the complaints against them will be investigated by the special wing which is attached to the all-women police stations.
- ❖ Patrol Vans will be under the All Women Police Stations.
- ❖ Aided by the state and central governments, these patrol vans will soon start from patrolling Chennai.
- ❖ This vehicle will also have the display of 1091 and 1098 phone numbers.



Regional Meteorological Centre (RMC) in Nungambakkam

- Chennai Regional Meteorological Centre in Nungambakkam is recognized by World Meteorological Organization (WMO) for its impeccable work spanning more than 100 years.
- ❖ It was among five stations in the country to receive the recognition.
- ❖ Others are Mumbai, Panjim (Goa), Pune and Trivandrum.
- ❖ Chennai meteorological centre is considered one of the first modern astronomical-cum-meteorological observatory in the East.

About

- * RMC was started as Madras observatory, the first astronomical observatory in 1786.
- ❖ It was a private facility set up at Egmore by William Petrie, an officer with the East India company.
- ❖ In 1789, the observatory passed from Petrie's private ownership to the East India Company.
- ❖ Later that astronomical observatory was shifted to Kodaikanal.





- * RMC was founded by Sir Charles Oakeley, the then Governor of Madras under the East India Company in 1792.
- ❖ It was founded way before the establishment of the Indian Meteorological Department in 1875.
- ❖ It is responsible for the weather-related activities of the southern Indian peninsula comprising the states of Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu and the union territories of Andaman and Nicobar, Lakshadweep Islands and Puducherry.
- ❖ It is one of the six regional meteorological centres (RMCs) of the India Meteorological Department (IMD).
- ❖ The other regional centres are located at Kolkata, Guwahati, Mumbai, Nagpur and New Delhi.

Blue Glow in Chennai Beaches

- 'Sea tinkle' also known as bioluminescence was observed in Chennai beaches.
- ❖ Commonly known as sea tinkle, the Noctiluca algae were behind this phenomenon.
- ❖ The algae exhibit the phenomenon of bioluminescence or biologically produce light when disturbed.
- ❖ Then the light is produced by a chemical reaction in the presence of oxygen involving an enzyme called "luciferase".
- ❖ Goa, Mumbai and the backwaters of Kerala have already witnessed these algal blooms.
- ❖ These algal patches are linked to coastal pollution.

Invasive Plant Species in Mudumalai Tiger Reserve

- ❖ The Mudumalai Tiger Reserve (MTR) which boasts the highest density of tiger population in Tamil Nadu, is facing a threat from an invasive plant species named "Cassia spectabilis (native of North America)".
- ❖ MTR is already being eradicated of two other invasive species lantana camara and parthinium.
- ❖ For any alien species, the new soil, environment and the climatic condition would work favourably.
- ❖ The food chain in the forest area gets disturbed by invasive species which prevent germination of native species of plants, including grass.

M Sand

- ❖ Tamil Nadu plans to put in place an M-sand policy to promote its use as an alternative building material and eliminate sub-standard products.
- ❖ Manufactured sand (M-Sand) is a substitute of river sand for concrete construction.
- It is produced by crushing hard granite stones.

Advantages

- ❖ No organic and soluble compound that affects the setting time and properties of cement.
- ❖ Less transportation cost as M-sand can be manufactured from nearby granite rocks.
- ❖ Increased quality and durability of concrete due to absence of impurities.
- ❖ Available in various sizes.







Kalvi Tholaikkatchi

- ❖ Tamilnadu government has launched a TV Channel exclusively dedicated for school students in the state.
- ❖ Named as 'Kalvi Tholaikkatchi', it will telecast programmes from 6 am to 9.30 pm every day.
- ❖ Programmes will be based on board exam preparation for students, employment news and opportunities for the youth and career-guidance information.
- ❖ The channel will be available on Tamil Nadu Arasu Cable TV and Thamizhaga Cable TV Communication Private Limited.

Ecotoxicology Centre at SACON, Coimbatore

- Union Environment and Forest Minister Prakash Javadekar inaugurated the National Centre for Avian Ecotoxicology at Salim Ali Centre for Ornithology and Natural Sciences (SACON), Anaikatti, near Coimbatore.
- SACON was formed in 1990.
- ❖ The Centre would study the harmful effects of environmental contaminants such as pesticides, heavy metals and drugs on birds, which reach them through the food chain.
- ❖ Ecotoxicological studies are important because ecological factors are unable to explain continued mortality of birds.
- ***** Example: the near extinction of vultures, from 40 million to nearly one thousand.

New law colleges

- ❖ Recently three new Government law colleges at Salem, Namakkal and Theni were inaugurated by the Tamil Nadu State Government.
- ❖ These colleges will function under the Tamil Nadu Dr. Ambedkar Law University.
- ❖ With these 3 colleges, Tamil Nadu has 13 Government Law colleges in the state.

Special Grievance Redressal Scheme

- ❖ The Chief Minister Inaugurated Special Grievance Redressal Scheme at Vanavasi and Konganapuram of Edappadi assembly constituency in Salem district.
- ❖ The complaints would be digitally recorded and sent to the departments concerned, who will take action on the grievances within a month.





❖ While the scheme was inaugurated in Edappadi, it will be implemented in all the 234 assembly constituencies.

STAR 2.0

- ❖ The Chief Minister of Tamilnadu commissioned the extended services under Simplified and Transparent Administration of Registration STAR 2.0 Project.
- ❖ It ensures quick, transparent and simplified registration process.
- ❖ It also eliminates middlemen.
- ❖ Through this, the documents relating to transfer of patta, will be sent to the revenue department offices once the document registration is over, thus saving time.

First Electric Buses in Tamilnadu

❖ As part of measures to check air pollution, the Tamil Nadu government unveiled a battery-powered electric air-conditioned bus.



- ❖ It would be initially operated on a trial basis on routes specified by the Metropolitan Transport Corporation, Chennai.
- ❖ These 32-seater buses are fitted with GPS, fire detection and suppression system and can travel upto 120 km on a single charge.
- They are manufactured by Ashok Leyland.
- ❖ In June 2018 the State government signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with England-based C-40 Cities Climate Leadership Group to manufacture electric buses.





❖ Shortly, 525 more such buses are expected to ply all over major cities of Tamilnadu under Phase-II of Faster Adoption and Manufacturing of Electric Vehicles in India Scheme (FAME India Scheme).

Microchipping Chippiparai Dogs - Nellai Veterinary College

- Veterinary College and Research Institute, Tirunelveli has embarked on creating a database of the native Chippiparai dog breed and has done microchipping of around 100 such dogs for the first time in the country.
- ❖ Microchipping is mandatory for dogs that are members of the Kennel Club of India (KCI).
- ❖ This has gained Chippiparai a status on a par with elite exotic dog breeds in the country.
- ❖ Chippiparai has also gained distinction as a 'universal donor' of canine blood.



Dindigul Locks, Kandangi Saree

- ❖ Dindigul lock and Kandangi saree have been given the Geographical Indication (GI) tag by the Geographical Indications Registry in Chennai.
- ❖ The lock is famous for its superior quality and durability, that even the city is called Lock City.
- * The abundance of iron in this region is the reason for the growth of the industry.
- ❖ The Kandangi cotton sarees are manufactured in the entire Karaikudi taluk in Sivaganga district.
- ❖ They are characterised by large contrast borders. Some are known to have borders covering as far as two-thirds of the saree.





Energy Efficient Electric Trains - Southern Railway

- ❖ The Southern Railway has introduced new energy-efficient three-phase Mainline Electric Multiple Unit (MEMU) between Chennai and Arakkonam.
- It has 'regenerative braking system'.
- ❖ This enables faster acceleration and deceleration.
- ❖ This results in saving up to 35 per cent of energy compared to conventional Electric Multiple Units (EMU) and MEMUs.

Planning - Online Sanction

- ❖ The State government has initiated online sanctioning of planning permission for construction of houses.
- ❖ It is to enhance greater transparency.
- ❖ The property owners who own plots measuring less than 2,500 sq. ft. and who plan to build less than 1,200 sq. ft. of residential accommodation could get planning permission by submitting their applications online.
- ❖ The online mode could be used for paying property tax, commercial tax, and water and sewage taxes.
- ❖ The platform is to simplify the planning permission modelled on the Model Building Bye-Laws 2016 of the Centre.





NATIONAL

Atal Community Innovation Centre

- ❖ Under NITI Aayog's flagship scheme Atal Innovation Mission (AIM), Atal Community Innovation Centres have been launched.
- ❖ They aim to encourage the spirit of innovation at the community level.
- ❖ The program will focus on the 484 backward districts where the innovation infrastructure is very weak.
- ❖ Unserved regions of Tier 1/2/3 cities, North-East, Jammu and Kashmir as well as the rural and tribal regions of India will be targeted under the program.

Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Marriage) Bill, 2019

- ❖ Both houses of Parliament have passed the Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Marriage) Bill 2019.
- ❖ Lok sabha passed the bill on 25-07-2019 and the Rajya sabha passed the bill on 30-07-2019.
- ❖ The Bill would help in protecting the rights of married Muslim women and prevent divorce by practice of 'Talaq-e-biddat' by their husbands.
- ❖ It declares the practice of triple talaq, including in written or electronic form, as void and illegal.
- ❖ It makes this offence punishable with imprisonment up to three years and fine.
- ❖ The amount of any fine is at the discretion of the Magistrate hearing the case.
- ❖ It provides for payment of 'subsistence allowance' to married Muslim women and dependent children which is decided by the magistrate.
- ❖ The wife is entitled to seek custody of the minor children from the marriage.
- ❖ The offence is non-bailable. However, there is a provision that the magistrate hearing the case may grant bail to the accused.

Additional Charge - NSG

- ❖ ITBP (Indo Tibetan Border Police) Director General S S Deswal was given additional charge of counter-terror force National Security Guard (NSG).
- ❖ He took over from NSG DG Sudeep Lakhtakia who is retired on 31st July 2019.
- ❖ The post NSG DG is occupied by an IPS officer S S Deswal is a 1984-batch IPS officer of Telangana cadre.





About

- ❖ NSG was established in 1984, to protect states against internal disturbances and terrorism.
- ❖ It is under the administrative control of Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA).
- ❖ It deals with anti-terrorist activities in all its forms.

National Bal Bhawan


- Union HRD Minister Ramesh Pokhriyal opened a special IAF pavilion with a flight simulator at National Bal Bhawan, New Delhi
- ❖ It is aimed at inspiring young children to serve in the Indian Air Force (IAF).
- ❖ Air Chief Marshal B S Dhanoa also launched a new 3D mobile-based video game "Indian Air Force: A Cut Above" based on the missions of the force.

About

- ❖ National Bal Bhawan is fully funded autonomous body under the Ministry of Human Resource Development (HRD).
- ❖ It was started in 1956 by Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru as a nationwide mission for creative enhancement of children through playing and doing different activities in a child friendly environment.

R-27 Air to Air Russian Missiles

❖ India has signed a deal to acquire R-27 air-to-air missiles from Russia.



- ❖ They will equip Su-30MKI combat aircraft fleet of the Indian Air Force and boost its capabilities in beyond visual range warfare.
- ❖ They are acquired under 10- I project which mandates all the 3-armed forces to maintain War Wastage Reserve (WWR).





❖ WWR implies maintaining critical weapon systems and spares for a specified minimum period.

ISRO Technical Liaison Unit at Moscow

- ❖ Cabinet has approved the setting up of ISRO Technical Liaison Unit (ITLU) at Moscow in Russia.
- ❖ It will collaborate with Space agencies and industries in Russia and neighbouring countries for mutually synergetic outcomes.
- ❖ ITLU will support the ongoing "bilateral programmes" of cooperation in space technology.
- . It will fully act on behalf of ISRO.

Water Stress Index

- ❖ According to Water Stress Index, 11 of 20 biggest cities in the country are facing extreme risk of scarcity.
- ❖ Water Stress Index is formulated by London-based risk analytics firm Verisk Maplecroft and has listed India as the 46th highest risk country in the World.
- ❖ The index measures the water consumption rates of households, industries and farm sectors and the available resources in rivers, lakes and streams.
- ❖ Delhi, Chennai, Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Nashik, Jaipur, Ahmedabad and Indore are among the cities facing 'extreme risk'.

Nutrient Based Subsidy

- ❖ The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) has approved the Nutrient Based Subsidy (NBS) Rates for P&K Fertilizers for the year 2019-20.
- It was proposed by the Department of Fertilizers.
- Under NBS mechanism, annual subsidy will be fixed on the basis of per kilogram of the following nutrients
 - o Nitrogen (N)
 - o Phosphate (P)
 - o Potash (K)
 - o Sulphur (S)





- ❖ Other fertilisers with other micro nutrients like Boron and Zinc will also be eligible for a separate subsidy.
- ❖ This will enable the manufacturers and importers to formalize supply contracts for fertilizers and fertilizer inputs and make fertilizers available to the farmers in the year 2019-20.

Increasing the Number of SC Judges

- ❖ The Union Cabinet has approved increasing the number of judges in the Supreme court from the present 31 to 34, including the Chief Justice of India.
- ❖ The bill to increase the strength of judges awaits parliamentary nod.
- ❖ The Supreme Court (Number of Judges) Act, 1956 originally provided for a maximum of 10 judges (excluding the CJI).
- ❖ The Act was last amended in 2009 to increase the judges' strength from 25 to 30 (excluding the CJI).

The Protection of Human Rights (Amendment) Bill, 2019

- ❖ The Protection of Human Rights (Amendment) Bill, 2019 which amends the Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993 has been approved by both Houses of Parliament.
- ❖ Under the 1993 Act, the Chairperson of the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC) is a person who has been a retired Chief Justice of the Supreme Court.
- ❖ But now Chief Justice of India or any Supreme Court Judge can become a Chairperson.
- ❖ Similarly, State HRC can be headed by any Judge of the High Court including Chief Justice of High Court not only by a former Chief Justice of High Court.
- ❖ The Act provides for two persons having knowledge of human rights to be appointed as members of the NHRC.
- ❖ But after this amendment, three members will be appointed, of which at least one will be a woman.
- ❖ The Amendment reduces the term of office to three years or till the age of seventy years, whichever is earlier. Earlier it was five years.
- ❖ Further, the Act allows for the reappointment of members of the NHRC and SHRCs for a period of five years. The Bill removes the five-year limit for reappointment.





- ❖ The 1993 Act provided for a Secretary-General (SG) of the NHRC and a Secretary of a SHRC, who exercise powers as may be "delegated" to them.
- ❖ After amendments, SG will exercise all administrative and financial powers (except judicial functions), subject to the respective chairperson's control.
- ❖ The present commission must include Chairperson of the National Commission for Backward Classes, Chairperson of the National Commission for Protection of Child Rights and the Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities as deemed Members of the Commission.
- ❖ The Bill provides that the central government may confer on a SHRC human rights functions being discharged by Union Territories. Functions relating to human rights in the case of Delhi will be dealt with by the NHRC.

One Nation One Ration - Trail Implementation

- ❖ In a major boost to national food security, Union Government has launched One Nation-One Ration Card scheme on pilot basis in
 - o Telangana
 - Andhra Pradesh
 - o Maharashtra
 - o Gujarat
- ❖ The pilot project is effective from 1 August 2019.
- One Nation One Ration Card scheme seeks to allow portability of food security benefits.
- ❖ Families who have food security cards can buy subsidized rice and wheat from any ration shop in these states but their ration cards should be linked with Aadhar Number to avail this service.

The Indian Medical Council (Amendment) Bill, 2019

- ❖ The Indian Medical Council (Amendment) Second Bill, 2019 has been successfully passed by Parliament.
- ❖ It replaces Indian Medical Council Act, 1956.
- ❖ The Bill sets up the National Medical Commission (NMC) which will replace the Medical Council of India (MCI).
- ❖ It will consist of 25 members, appointed by the Union government.





- ❖ Within three years of the passage of the Bill, the state governments will establish State Medical Councils at the state level.
- ❖ The Union government will constitute a Medical Advisory Council (MAC).
- ❖ The States/Union Territories can put forth their concerns before the NMC through MAC.
- ❖ MAC will advise the NMC on measures to determine and maintain "minimum standards" of medical education.
- ❖ The NMC may grant a limited license to certain mid-level practitioners connected with the modern medical profession to practice medicine.
- ❖ There will be a uniform National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) for admission to under-graduate and post-graduate super-specialty medical education in all medical institutions regulated under the Bill.
- ❖ There will be a common final year undergraduate examination called the National Exit Test (NEXT) for the students graduating from medical institutions to obtain the license for practice.
- NEXT scores will also serve as the basis for admission into post-graduate courses at medical institutions under this Bill.

Pashmina Testing Centre

- ❖ Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) announced that it would set up a Pashmina testing center in Leh.
- ❖ It will be set up in partnership with the lab of Ladakh Autonomous Hill Development Council (LAHDC), Leh to check the quality of pashmina collected.
- ❖ Pashmina is a fine type of Kashmiri wool which comes from 4 distinct breeds of the Cashmere goats.

India's First Time Release Study

❖ The Department of Revenue, Ministry of Finance is conducting India's first national Time Release Study (TRS).





- ❖ It will be conducted between to enable faster movement of cargo across borders to benefit traders.
- ❖ It will be conducted at the same time across 15 ports including sea, air, land and dry ports between 1st − 7th August.
- ❖ The Overall Objective is to identify and address bottlenecks in the trade flow process and take the corresponding policy and operational measures required to improve the effectiveness and efficiency of border procedures.
- The TRS is an internationally recognized tool advocated by World Customs Organization (WCO) to measure the efficiency and effectiveness of international trade flows.

Genome India Initiative

- ❖ Under Genome India Initiative, the Department of Biotechnology (DBT) plans to scan nearly 20,000 Indian genomes over the next 5 years in a two-phase exercise.
- ❖ The project is done to develop diagnostic tests that can be used to test for cancer.
- ❖ While 22 institutions, including Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) and the DBT would be involved in the exercise.
- ❖ The data generated will be accessible for to researchers anywhere for analysis through National Biological Data Centre.

The Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (Amendment) Bill, 2019

The Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (Amendment) Bill or POCSO (Amendment) Bill has been passed by both houses of Parliament. It amends POCSO Act, 2012.



Kala Azar Disease

- Researchers at the IIT Hyderabad have been able to achieve sustained release of the drug (Amphotericin B) for up to 10 days, which can be used for treating kalaazar.
- ❖ It is a disease caused by parasites of the Leishmania type.
- It is spread by the bite of infected female sandflies.
- ❖ It attacks the immune system, and is almost always fatal if not treated.
- ❖ It is the second-largest parasitic killer in the world (after malaria).
- Kala Azar also known as black fever, and Dumdum fever is classified as a neglected tropical disease.
- ❖ In India, this disease is endemic to West Bengal, Bihar, Jharkhand and eastern Uttar Pradesh.







Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Amendment (UAPA) Bill, 2019

- ❖ Both houses of Parliament have passed the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Amendment Bill, 2019.
- ❖ It amends Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, 1967.
- ❖ The Bill empowers government to designate even "Individuals" as terrorists in addition to designating certain organisations as terrorist organisations.
- ❖ Earlier investigation of cases may be conducted by officers of the rank of Deputy Superintendent or Assistant Commissioner of Police or above.
- ❖ The Bill additionally empowers the officers of the NIA of the rank of Inspector or above, to investigate cases.
- ❖ Earlier acts done in contravention to 9 treaties, including the Convention for the Suppression of Terrorist Bombings (1997) and the Convention against Taking of Hostages (1979) were defined as terrorist acts.
- ❖ The amendment includes one more convention International Convention for Suppression of Acts of Nuclear Terrorism (2005)
- ❖ Under the 1967 Act, an investigating officer is required to obtain the prior approval of the DGP to seize properties that may be connected with terrorism.
- ❖ Now the amendments add that if the investigation is conducted by an officer of the National Investigation Agency (NIA), the approval of the Director General of NIA would be required for seizure of such property.

Institutions of Eminence

- ❖ The University Grants Commission (UGC) on 02nd August 2019 has recommended 20 Institutions to be accorded the status of Institutions of Eminence (IoE).'
- ❖ The IITs Madras and Kharagpur, Delhi University, University of Hyderabad, Amritha Vishwa Vidyapeetham and VIT are among the 20 institutions.
- ❖ Started in 2018, the IoE scheme is aimed at developing 20 world-class institutions which would put India on the global education map.
- ❖ The chosen public institutions will also receive a government grant of ₹1,000 crore, while the private institutions will not get any funding under the scheme.

Comprehensive information for Census 2021

❖ Census 2021 will for the first time seek information from households on smartphones, DTH/Cable TV connection, internet access, number of members of





households having bank accounts, ownership of house other than the rented accommodation of a household, bottled water availability and mobile number as part of the house listing procedure.

- ❖ The Census 2021 house listing questionnaire will no longer seek a breakup of male and female persons in a household.
- ❖ Importantly it will not collect caste data and will have a listing for third gender.
- ❖ Another fresh inclusion mainly pertains to new categories of disabilities as per the latest definition.
- ❖ The data collected during the 2021 Census will be stored electronically, the first time since the decennial exercise was conducted in 1951 in Independent India.

Disabled-friendly buses

- ❖ In a first, the road transport ministry has issued a draft norm to disabled-friendly features mandatory for buses to obtain fitness certificate.
- ❖ Buses with more than 13 seats will require to have provisions for ramp for wheelchairs, their locking system and other features to meet the requirement of physically challenged persons.

Triple Talaq Bill's History


- ❖ On 22 August 2017, the Indian Supreme Court deemed instant triple talaq (talaq-e-biddat) unconstitutional and asked the government to ban the practice by enacting a law.
- ❖ Then, the Muslim Women (Protection of Rights on Marriage) ordinance was promulgated by the President on 19th September 2018.
- ❖ As the ordinance was to expire on 22nd January 2019, the government introduced fresh bill in the Lok Sabha on 17th December 2018 to replace the ordinance.
- ❖ However, the bill was not passed by the Rajya Sabha.
- ❖ Again, before the expiry of triple talaq ordinance of 2018, the government had repromulgated the ordinance on 10th January 2019.
- ♦ On 12th January 2019, the President re-approved the ordinance of 2019.
- ❖ The triple talag ordinance of 2019 was to expire on 29 August 2019.
- ❖ The bill was passed by Lok Sabha on 25th July 2019 and then by Rajya Sabha on 30th July 2019.
- ❖ The President gave assent to the bill on August 1, 2019 and it has come into effect retrospectively from September 19, 2018.
- ❖ The bill is in line with Article 44 of the Constitution (Uniform Civil Code).





Saffron Experiment in Ladakh

- ❖ In Jammu and Kashmir, Ladakh Farmers and Producers Cooperative Limited have started experimenting with saffron farming in Leh.
- ❖ At present, saffron is farmed in Pulwama and Pampore areas of Jammu and Kashmir.
- ❖ Ladakh has similarities of climatic conditions with Iran and Afghanistan where saffron is grown.
- ❖ Saffron is one of the world's costliest spice and is in great demand for its medicinal, cosmetic and aromatic properties.
- ❖ It grows from a very small plant botanically known as Crocus Sativus.



Ayodhya Mediation Failed

- ❖ The three-member Babri Masjid Ram Janmabhoomi land dispute case "mediation panel" including Sri Sri Ravi Shankar and Shriram Panchu headed by former apex court judge FM Kalifulla has submitted its report.
- ❖ The efforts to arrive at an amicable settlement through mediation have failed.
- ❖ So, the Supreme Court is set to commence day-to-day hearing in the case.
- ❖ A five-judge Constitution bench headed by Chief Justice Ranjan Gogoi will conduct the hearing.

Prisoner's Cannot Vote

❖ The Election Commission of India (ECI) has informed the Delhi High Court that "prisoners" do not have voting rights under the Representation of People (RP) Act.





- ❖ The poll panel said the right to vote is a statutory right created under Section 62 of the RP Act and the law is settled that the "right to vote being a statutory right is subject to the restrictions prescribed in the RP Act".
- ❖ Further ECI quoted the Supreme Court judgement in the Anukul Chandra Pradhan v Union of India (1997) case which denied voting rights to prisoners.

The Repealing and Amending Bill, 2019

- ❖ The Repealing and Amending Bill, 2019 has been passed by both houses of Parliament.
- ❖ The Bill repeals 68 laws that have been listed in the First Schedule of the Bill. These include
 - o The Beedi Workers Welfare Fund Act, 1976
 - o The Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Act, 2001
- ❖ The Bill makes minor amendments to two Acts which relate to substitution of certain words. The two Acts are
 - o The Income Tax Act, 1961
 - o The India Institutes of Management Act, 2017

The Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Bill, 2019

- ❖ The Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Bill, 2019 was introduced and passed in Rajya Sabha on August 5, 2019 and passed in Lok Sabha on August 6, 2019.
- ❖ The Bill provides for reorganisation of the state of Jammu and Kashmir into
 - o The Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir with legislature
 - Union Territory (UT) of Ladakh without a legislature (previously 4 seats).
- ❖ The UT of Ladakh will comprise Kargil and Leh districts only. The rest of the territories will belong to UT of Jammu and Kashmir.
- ❖ Lok Sabha will have five seats from the UT of J-K, while Ladakh will have one seat.

Lieutenant Governor

❖ Both the Union Territories will be administered by the President, through an administrator appointed by him known as the Lieutenant Governor (LG).

Legislative Assembly of Jammu and Kashmir

❖ The Bill provides for the addition of 7 seats to the Legislative Assembly for J & K UT with 114 seats (previously 107 seats).





- ❖ Of these, 24 seats will remain vacant on account of certain areas of Jammu and Kashmir being under the occupation of Pakistan. Rest of 90 seats will be for J and K.
- ❖ The LG may nominate two members to the Legislative Assembly to give representation to women, if they are not adequately represented.
- ❖ Assembly seats will be reserved for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in proportion to their population.
- ❖ The assembly will have a term of 5 years and the LG must summon the Assembly at least once in six months.
- ❖ It may make laws for any part of the J and K UT related to:
 - o any matters specified in the State List of the Constitution, except "Police" and "Public Order".
 - o any matter in the Concurrent List applicable to Union Territories.
 - o Further, Parliament will have the power to make laws in relation to any matter for the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

Council of Ministers

- ❖ There will be a Council of Ministers of not more than ten percent of the total number of members in the Assembly.
- ❖ It will aid and advice the LG on matters that the Assembly has powers to make law.
- ❖ The Chief Minister will communicate all decisions of the Council to the LG.

High Court

- ❖ The High Court of Jammu and Kashmir will be the common High Court for the Union Territories of Ladakh, and Jammu and Kashmir.
- ❖ Further the UT of J and K will have an Advocate General to provide legal advice to the government of the Union Territory.

Legislative Council

❖ The Legislative Council of the state of Jammu and Kashmir will be abolished. Upon dissolution, all Bills pending in the Council will lapse.

Old State Laws of J and K

- ❖ 153 state laws of Jammu and Kashmir have been repealed.
- ❖ 166 state laws will remain in force, and 7 laws will be applicable with amendments.
- ❖ These amendments include lifting of prohibitions on "lease of land" to persons who are not permanent residents of Jammu and Kashmir.





Other Provisions

- ❖ The Union Government will establish Advisory Committees for issues related to
 - o The generation and supply of electricity and water
 - o The Jammu and Kashmir State Financial Corporation
 - o Distribution of assets and liabilities of corporations of the state of Jammu and Kashmir between the two Union Territories.

Safeguarding Space Assets

- ❖ ISRO is setting up a network of telescopes and radar to develop its own system to monitor space debris and safeguard its space assets.
- Currently ISRO has 50 functional satellites, including communication, navigation and surveillance satellites, in space.
- ❖ It depends on NORAD's (North America Aerospace Defense Command) publicly available and inaccurate data for
 - Keeping track of space debris
 - o Monitoring our active and passive (dead) satellites.
- ❖ The foundation stone for Space Situational Awareness Control Centre has been laid in Bengaluru.
- ISRO will set up telescopes and radars in four corners of the country.
 - o Telescope in Trivandrum, Mount Abu (Rajasthan), Deep North
 - o A radar in the northeast
- ❖ The network will be set up under the Directorate of Space Situational Awareness and Management.

Elephant Census

- Union Ministry of Environment informed about the elephant population in India.
- ❖ Elephant population in India is estimated at 29,964 as per the census conducted in 2017.
- ❖ The South Region accounted for 14,612 followed by North East with 10,139 elephants.
- ❖ While the census of tigers is undertaken at the national level once every four years, the census of elephants is undertaken at every five years.





Intelligent Traffic Control - Chandigarh

- ❖ In a first-of-its-kind initiative in the country, Mohali traffic police have launched 3-D Smart Traffic Signal devised by the students of a Chandigarh university.
- ❖ One of the major reasons for traffic congestion is the inefficient working of traffic signal timers installed at intersections.
- ❖ This wireless system, called 'Intelights' uses dynamic signal control technology to adjust the timers of red, yellow and green lights.
- Timings is adjusted according to the traffic density at an intersection.
- ❖ It uses CCTV cameras to gather live traffic feed.

Article 370

- ❖ Union Minister for Home Affairs introduced two statutory resolutions regarding Article 370 in Rajya Sabha on August 05, 2019. They were passed by Lok Sabha on August 06, 2019. The resolutions are
 - Constitution (Application to Jammu & Kashmir) Order, 2019 {Ref. Article 370(1) of Constitution of India} issued by President of India to supersede the 1954 order related to Article 370.
 - Resolution for Repeal of Article 370 of the Constitution of India {Ref. Article 370 (3)}

The 1954 order

- ❖ The 1954 presidential order constituted a founding legal document for Jammu and Kashmir.
- ❖ The Constitution (Application to Jammu and Kashmir) Order, 1954, lists the Articles and provisions that apply to J&K.
- ❖ By virtue of this order Jammu and Kashmir enjoyed special status under Article 370 of the Constitution of India.
- ❖ This Article describes it as a temporary provision and that it will cease to be operative if the President issues a public notification to that effect.
- ❖ Article 370 enabled a separate Constitution for J and K and all laws made by Parliament would not be automatically applicable there except without concurrence from State Government.
- These special measures can be altered only on the recommendation of the Sadari-Riyasat of Jammu and Kashmir (King), acting on the advice of the Council of Ministers, or by the "Constituent Assembly" of that State.





Article 35 A

- ❖ In 1954, the President also listed a set of exceptions under Article 35A of the Constitution (this Article does not figure in the text of the Constitution of India, but figures only in the J&K's Constitution).
- ❖ It was inserted by the Presidential order in 1954 not by Constitutional Amendment.
- ❖ It protected the exclusive laws of the state like
 - o The bar on outsiders buying property
 - o Kashmiri Women marrying non-Kashmiris losing their property rights

The 2019 Order

- ❖ President Ram Nath Kovind has issued a presidential order under Article 370 (1) of the Constitution.
- ❖ This clause enables the President to specify the matters which are applicable to Jammu and Kashmir.
- ❖ As it can be issued only with the J & K government's concurrence, the notification uses the words "with the concurrence of the Government of the State of Jammu and Kashmir".
- ❖ Since the State is under President's rule and administered by Governor, the governor has given his concurrence on behalf of the State government.
- ❖ The Order supersedes the 1954 Order.
- ❖ This effectively means that all the provisions that formed the basis of a separate "Constitution" for Jammu and Kashmir stand abrogated.
- ❖ The Order declares that all the provisions of the Constitution of India, shall apply to Jammu and Kashmir too.

Special measures to support 2019 Order


- ❖ A few clauses were added to the Article 367 of the Constitution. Article 367 contains "Interpretations".
- ❖ All references to the 'Sadar-i-Riyasat' acting on the aid and advice of the Council of Ministers, will be considered as referring to "Governor" of the State.
- ❖ All references to the State government shall mean "the Governor".
- ❖ Article 370 (3) says that the President can declare that Article 370 is no more operative only on the recommendation of the Constituent Assembly.
- ❖ The reference to the "Constituent Assembly" has been amended to read "Legislative Assembly of the State".
- Since there is no State Assembly also now, Governor plays the role.





Monsoon Session 2019

- ❖ The First Session of Seventeenth Lok Sabha commenced on 17th of June, 2019 and 249th Session of Rajya Sabha commenced from 20th June, 2019.
- ❖ Lok Sabha was adjourned *sine die* on 6th August, 2019. Rajya Sabha was adjourned *sine die* on 7th August, 2019.



- ❖ The Union Budget for 2019- 20 was presented on 5th July, 2019.
- ❖ The first session of the newly elected Government is also known as the Budget Session.
- The Budget session of the Lok Sabha had 37 sittings and sat for 280 hours.
- ❖ During this Session a total of 40 Bills (33 in Lok Sabha and 07 in Rajya Sabha) were introduced.
- ❖ 36 Bills were passed by Lok Sabha.
- ❖ 32 Bills were passed by Rajya Sabha.





- ❖ 30 Bills have been passed by both the Houses of Parliament This is a record in single first/effective Session after constitution of new Lok Sabha.
- ❖ The number of Bills passed in this session were more than the Bills passed in 1952.
- ❖ In the first session of the first Lok Sabha in 1952, the House had 67 sittings in which 24 bills were passed.
- ❖ The productivity of the Lok Sabha has been 135 per cent and of Rajya Sabha 100 per cent-the highest in the past 20 years.

Samjhauta Express Stopped

- ❖ Pakistan has unilaterally decided to suspend the train services on its side.
- ❖ The Samjhauta Express, commonly called the friendship express, is a bi-weekly train running on Thursday and Monday.
- ❖ It runs between Delhi and Attari in India and Lahore in Pakistan.
- ❖ The train services began in July 22, 1976 under the Shimla Agreement signed between India and Pakistan in 1972.
- ❖ The word Samjhauta means "agreement" in both Hindi and Urdu.

Thar Express

- ❖ Pakistan has also suspended the Thar Express train service with India, which links the two countries across the Rajasthan border.
- ❖ It runs between Jodhpur's Bhagat ki Kothi station to Karachi every Friday night since services resumed on February 18, 2006 after a 41-year suspension.

National Entrepreneurship Awards, 2019

- ❖ Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship announced the fourth edition of National Entrepreneurship Awards, 2019.
- ❖ The annual awards have been instituted to honour outstanding young first-generation entrepreneurs and ecosystem builders for their exceptional contribution in entrepreneurship development.
- ❖ To be eligible for these awards, the nominee (entrepreneur)
 - o must be under the age of 40 year
 - o must be first-generation entrepreneurs
 - o must hold 51% or more equity and ownership of the business (women entrepreneurs 75% ownership)





Child Care Leave - Male Military Personnel

- ❖ The Defence minister has approved extension of benefits of Child Care Leave (CCL) to single male Service Personnel as well as certain relaxations of CCL provisions in case of women officers of defence forces.
- Currently Child Care Leave (CCL) is granted only to women officers in defence forces.
- ❖ CCL can be availed in respect of a child with 40% disability and could be availed without any restriction of age limit of child.

66th National Film Awards

- ❖ The 66th National Film Awards (NFA) for 2018 have been announced by Directorate of Film Festivals (DFF), a body under the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting.
- ❖ The selections of awards are made by a jury consisting of eminent filmmakers and film personalities, which is appointed by the DFF.
- ❖ The 2019 winners are
 - o Best Feature Film Award: Gujarati film Hellaro.
 - Best Film on Social Issues: Hindi movie Padman.
 - o Best Director Award: Aditya Dhar for Uri: The Surgical Strike.
 - Best Actor Award: Jointly awarded to Ayushman Khurana and Vicky Kaushal for their performances in Andhadhun and Uri: The Surgical Strike respectively.
 - Best Actress award: Keerthy Suresh for her performance in Telugu movie Mahanati.
 - Best Film on Environment Conservation/ Preservation: Marathi movie Paani.
 - Nargis Dutt Award for Best Feature Film on National Integration: Kannada film Ondalla Eradalla.
 - o Most Film Friendly State: Uttarakhand.





Supreme Court (Number of Judges) Amendment Bill 2019

- ❖ President has signed into law a Bill which seeks to increase the sanctioned strength of judges in the Supreme Court from 30 to 33 besides the Chief Justice of India.
- ❖ The move to increase the strength of judges by 3 or 10 per cent comes against the backdrop of rising cases in the top court which stand at nearly 60,000.
- ❖ The Supreme Court (Number of Judges) Amendment Bill was passed by Parliament earlier.







Breastfeeding Report

- ❖ The Health and Family Welfare Minister Dr Harsh Vardhan released a report on Breastfeeding.
- Manipur has topped the rankings in Breastfeeding and Infant and Young Child Feeding Practices in the country.
- ❖ Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan and Bihar are at the bottom positions in the report card.
- ❖ National capital Delhi is also among the worst-performing States.
- ❖ The Breastfeeding report card has been developed by devising a composite score based on three indicators namely:
 - Early initiation of breastfeeding,
 - Exclusive breastfeeding for six months and
 - o Complimentary feeding at 6-8 months of child's age.

Eco-Sensitive Zones (ESZ)

- ❖ The Ministry of Environment approved 13 wildlife sanctuaries as eco-sensitive zones (ESZ) for scientific conservation of the ecosystem.
- ❖ The 11 sanctuaries in Tamil Nadu are
 - 1. Vaduvoor Bird Sanctuary,
 - 2. Kanjirankulam Bird Sanctuary,
 - 3. Srivilliputhur Grizzled Squirrel sanctuary,
 - 4. Megamalai Wildlife sanctuary,
 - 5. Gulf of Mannar Marine National Park,
 - 6. Vettangudi Birds sanctuary,
 - 7. Kodaikanal Wildlife Sanctuary,
 - 8. Sakkarakottai Bird Sanctuary,
 - 9. Vallanadu Blackbuck Sanctuary,
 - 10. Oussudu Lake Bird Sanctuary
 - 11. Point Calemere Wildlife Sanctuary.
- ❖ The Achanakmar Tiger Reserve in Chhattisgarh and Tungareshwar Wildlife Sanctuary in Maharashtra have also been approved as ESZ.





ESZ

- ❖ ESZs are extended up to 10 km from the protected areas, National Parks and Wildlife Sanctuaries.
- ❖ It acts as a transition zone from areas of high protection to areas involving lesser protection.
- ❖ It works as a shock absorber to the protected areas as certain activities such as mining, quarrying or heavy construction are banned around national parks and wildlife sanctuaries.
- ❖ It aims to minimize the negative impact on the fragile ecosystem.
- ❖ Final ESZ notification provides for prohibition of mining, stone quarrying and crushing units located within one km of such protected areas.
- ❖ The ESZ notifications are issued under the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 and Environment (Protection) Rules 1986 by the Union Environment Ministry.
- ❖ But, the Environment (Protection) Act, 1986 does not mention the word "Eco-Sensitive Zones".
- ❖ The Supreme Court in December 2006 had directed all the States to demarcate ESZs within four weeks.
- Over 30 per cent of India's protected area (PA) has been covered under the Final ESZ notification.
- ❖ Out of the 651 protected areas in India, 316 have been covered under the Final ESZ notification.

The Consumer Protection Bill, 2019

❖ The Consumer Protection Bill, 2019 was passed by both Houses of Parliament. It replaces the Consumer Protection Act, 1986.

Who's a Consumer?

- ❖ A consumer is defined as a person who buys any good or avails a service for a consideration.
- ❖ It does not include a person who obtains a good for "resale" or a good or service for commercial purpose.
- ❖ It covers transactions through all modes offline, online through electronic means, teleshopping, multi-level marketing or direct selling.

Rights of Consumers

❖ 6 Consumer's rights have been defined in the Bill including the right to





- Be protected against marketing of goods and services which are hazardous to life and property
- Be informed of the quality, quantity, potency, purity, standard and price of goods or services
- ❖ Be assured of access to a variety of goods or services at competitive prices
- ❖ Seek redressal against unfair or restrictive trade practices.

Central Consumer Protection Authority

- ❖ A Central Consumer Protection Authority will be set up to promote, protect and enforce the rights of consumers.
- ❖ It will have an investigation wing, headed by a Director-General, which may conduct inquiry or investigation into such violations.
- ❖ It may impose a penalty on a manufacturer or an endorser of up to Rs 10 lakh and imprisonment for up to two years for a false or misleading advertisement.
- ❖ It can also prohibit the endorser of a misleading advertisement from endorsing that particular product or service for a period of up to one year.

Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission (CDRC)

- ❖ CDRC will be set up at the district, state, and national levels.
- ❖ Appeals at district level redressal commission can be escalated till national level.
- ❖ Final appeal will lie before the Supreme Court.
- Complaints can be made in relation to
 - Unfair or restrictive trade practices
 - o Defective goods or services
 - o Overcharging or deceptive charging
 - Offering of goods or services for sale which may be hazardous to life and safety.

Jurisdiction

- ❖ The District CDRC will entertain complaints where value of goods and services does not exceed Rs.1 crore.
- ❖ State CDRC will do from 1 crore to 10 crores
- ❖ National CDRC will deal with complaints of over 10 crores value.

Product liability

Product liability means the liability of a product manufacturer / service provider / seller to compensate a consumer for any harm or injury caused by a defective good or deficient service.






❖ To claim compensation, a consumer has to prove any one of the conditions for defect or deficiency, as given in the Bill.

July 2019 Hottest Recorded Month in History

- ❖ The World Meteorological Organization has announced that July 2019 is recorded for the hottest month since climate analysis began in 1880.
- ❖ July 2019 was close to 1.2°C above the pre-industrial level.
- ❖ The previous warmest month on record was July 2016, and July 2019 was at least on par with it.
- ❖ Alarming situation: July 2016 was warmer because of El Nino. But July 2019 is the warmest month ever without El Nino.
- ❖ Immediate Results: Huge Ice melt in Greenland, in the Arctic, European glaciers and Wildfires in Arctic.



Operation Number Plate - RPF

- ❖ The Railway Protection Force (RPF) of Indian Railways has launched a Special Drive with a Code Name "Operation Number Plate".
- ❖ It plans to identify and verify all vehicles parked in Railway premises, circulating area, parking and even in the 'No Parking' areas for a longer duration.
- ❖ The unidentified vehicles are considered a serious threat to the security and safety of passengers and other stakeholders of railways.





Cancer Treatment

- ❖ The Union Government plans to include all types of cancers and their treatment under the Ayushman Bharat Yojana.
- ❖ It is because cancer care costs cause massive financial crisis among people and many had to go without treatment.
- ❖ Cancer is the second-most common disease in India.
- ❖ Lung cancer is the most common type of cancer in India, followed by breast cancer and oral cancers.

Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (Amendment) Bill, 2019

- ❖ The Bill amends the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016.
- Insolvency is a situation where individuals or companies are unable to repay their outstanding debt.
- ❖ The Code provides a time-bound process for resolving insolvency in companies and among individuals.

Important Changes

- ❖ Under the Code, a financial creditor may file an application before the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) for initiating the insolvency resolution process.
- ❖ The NCLT must find the existence of default within 14 days.
- ❖ Thereafter, a Committee of Creditors (CoC) consisting of financial creditors will be constituted for taking decisions regarding insolvency resolution.
- ❖ The CoC will appoint a resolution professional who will present a resolution plan to the CoC.
- ❖ Then the CoC must approve a resolution plan, and the resolution process must be completed within 180 days.
- ❖ If the resolution plan is rejected by the CoC, the debtor will go into liquidation.
- ❖ This may be extended by a period of up to 90 days if the extension is approved by NCLT.
- ❖ The Code states that the insolvency resolution process must be completed within 180 days, extendable by a period of up to 90 days.
- Now the Bill adds that the resolution process must be completed within 330 days.

Summary

- The Bill addresses three important issues.
- ❖ First, it strengthens provisions related to time-limits.






- ❖ Second, it specifies the minimum pay-outs to operational creditors in any resolution plan.
- ❖ Third, it specifies the manner in which the representative of a group of financial creditors (such as home-buyers) should vote.

Public Premises (Eviction of Unauthorised Occupants) Amendment Bill, 2019

- ❖ It was introduced in Parliament by the Minister of Housing and Urban Affairs Hardeep Singh Puri.
- ❖ The Bill amends the Public Premises (Eviction of Unauthorised Occupants) Act, 1971.



- ❖ The Bill defines 'residential accommodation occupation' as the occupation of public premises by a person on the grant of a license for such occupation.
- ❖ The Bill adds a provision laying down the procedure for eviction from residential accommodation.
- ❖ If the person in unauthorised occupation of the residential accommodation challenges the eviction order passed by the estate officer in court, he/she will be required to pay damages for every month of such occupation.





Motor Vehicles (Amendment) Bill, 2019

- It was introduced in parliament by the Minister for Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari.
- ❖ The Bill seeks to amend the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 to provide for road safety.
- ❖ The Act provides for grant of licenses and permits related to motor vehicles, standards for motor vehicles, and penalties for violation of these provisions.

Important Changes

- ❖ The central government will develop a scheme for cashless treatment of road accident victims during golden hour.
- ❖ The Bill defines golden hour as the time period of up to one hour following a traumatic injury, during which the likelihood of preventing death through prompt medical care is the highest.
- ❖ The Bill increases the minimum compensation for hit and run cases as follows
 - o In case of death, from Rs 25,000 to two lakh rupees, and
 - o In case of grievous injury, from Rs 12,500 to Rs 50,000.
- ❖ The Bill requires the central government to constitute a Motor Vehicle Accident Fund, to provide compulsory insurance cover to all road users in India.
- ❖ The Bill defines a good samaritan as a person who renders emergency medical or non-medical assistance to a victim at the scene of an accident.
- ❖ The Bill allows the central government to order for recall of motor vehicles if a defect in the vehicle may cause damage to the environment, or the driver, or other road users.
- ❖ The manufacturer of the recalled vehicle will be required to
 - o reimburse the buyers for the full cost of the vehicle, or
 - o replace the defective vehicle with another vehicle with similar or better specifications.
- ❖ The central government may develop a National Transportation Policy, in consultation with state governments.
- ❖ The Bill provides for a National Road Safety Board, to be created by the central government through a notification.
- ❖ The Bill defines aggregators as digital intermediaries or market places which can be used by passengers to connect with a driver for transportation purposes (taxi services).







Key highlights of the Motor Vehicles Amendments Bill, 2019



- Cashless treatment likely of victims during golden hour
- Minimum compensation for hit-and-run cases hiked in case of death from ₹25,000 to ₹2 lakh, and, in case of grievous injury, from ₹12,500 to ₹50,000

Offences and penalties: The maximum penalty for driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs has been increased from ₹2,000 to ₹10,000

Compulsory Insurance:

- The Bill requires the central government to constitute a Motor Vehicle Accident Fund, to provide compulsory insurance cover to all road users in India
- ❖ These aggregators will be issued licenses by state.
- ❖ Further, they must comply with the Information Technology Act, 2000.
- ❖ The Bill increases penalties for several offences under the Act.
- ❖ For example, the maximum penalty for driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs has been increased from Rs 2,000 to Rs 10,000.
- ❖ If a vehicle manufacturer fails to comply with motor vehicle standards, the penalty will be a fine of up to Rs 100 crore, or imprisonment of up to one year, or both.
- ❖ If a contractor fails to comply with road design standards, the penalty will be a fine of up to one lakh rupees.
- ❖ The central government may increase fines mentioned under the Act every year by up to 10%.

Gallantry Medals to Armed Forces

- ❖ President of India approved 132 Gallantry Awards and other decorations to Personnel of Armed and Paramilitary Forces.
- ❖ The awards include two Kirti Chakras, one Vir Chakra, 14 Shaurya Chakras, eight Bar to Sena Medals (Gallantry), 90 Sena Medals (Gallantry), five Nao Sena Medals (Gallantry), seven Vayu Sena Medals (Gallantry) and five Yudh Seva Medals.





- ❖ He also approved 8 Tatrakshak medals to Indian Coast Guard Personnel.
- ❖ The gallantry awards are announced twice in a year first on the occasion of the Republic Day and then on the occasion of the Independence Day.
- ❖ Wing Commander Abhinandan Varthaman has been awarded Vir Chakra for shooting down a Pakistani F-16 combat jet on February 27, 2019
- ❖ This is the Indian Air Forces's first Vir Chakra since the Kargil war.
- ❖ IAF Squadron leader Minty Agarwal, who guided IAF Wing Commander Abhinandan Varthaman during February 27 dogfight, has been awarded the Yudh Seva Medal.
- ❖ This medal is awarded to recognise distinguished service of a high order during war, conflict or hostilities.

RPF Commandos - CORAS

- ❖ Union Minister of Railways Piyush Goyal launched CORAS (Commando for Railway Security) of Indian Railways.
- ❖ CORAS is a separate Commando Unit of Railway Protection Force (RPF).
- ❖ They will be posted in Left extremist wing affected areas, north-eastern region and Jammu and Kashmir where providing security to the passengers and the railway network is of utmost priority.
- ❖ A new commando training centre will be set up in Jagadhri, Haryana to modernize and train the RPF Commandos.







Swachh Bharath (Urban)

- Union Minister for Housing & Urban Affairs Hardeep Singh Puri has launched the following programs
 - Swachh Survekshan 2020 (SS 2020): fifth edition of the annual cleanliness survey.
 - o The Swachh Bharath Mission (SBM) Water PLUS Protocol: Preventing release of untreated waste water into the environment
 - Swachh Nagar Mobile App An app for monitoring, collection of segregated waste and tracking the movement of waste vehicles and waste pickers
 - o AI enabled mSBM App To track application status of Individual Household Toilets scheme beneficiaries.

Home Minister's Medal for Excellence in Investigation

- ❖ The "Union Home Minister's Medal for Excellence in Investigation" for the year 2019 has been awarded to 96 Police personnel.
- ❖ The medal is awarded to officers in Central investigation agencies, State/UT police force investigating agencies in recognition of their outstanding service in investigation.
- ❖ The award was first created in 2018 to promote high professional standards of investigation of crime.







Chief of Defence Staff (CDS)

- ❖ In his Independence Day address, Prime Minister announced the creation of the post of Chief of Defence Staff.
- ❖ It was described as a strategy to provide "effective leadership at the top level" to the three wings of the armed forces and to help improve coordination among them.
- ❖ CDS is a high military office that oversees and coordinates the working of the three Services.
- ❖ The role of the CDS becomes critical in times of conflict.
- CDS is expected to offer seamless tri-service views and single-point advice to the Executive (to the Prime Minister) on long-term defence planning and management.
- ❖ The first proposal for a CDS in India came from the 2000 Kargil Review Committee (KRC).

Samagra Shiksha-Jal Suraksha

- ❖ A new initiative called Samagra Shiksha-Jal Suraksha has been initiated by the Department of School Education and Literacy under the HRD Ministry.
- ❖ It aims to promote awareness about water conservation activities among school students in the country.

UNSC Closed Consultation on Kashmir Issue

- ❖ The United Nations Security Council held a rare closed-door meeting to discuss the Union Government's move to end the special status of Jammu and Kashmir.
- ❖ The "closed consultations on the issue" was requested by Pakistan and backed China.
- ❖ The outcome of the UNSC meeting is not be a formal pronouncement as the consultations are informal in nature.
- ❖ Poland is the Security Council President for the month of August.





- Currently the 10 non-permanent members of UNSC are Belgium, Cote d'Ivoire, Dominican Republic, Equatorial Guinea, Germany, Indonesia, Kuwait, Peru, Poland and South Africa.
- ❖ The last time there was a full Security Council meeting on Kashmir region was in 1965.



India - Bhutan Relations


- ❖ The Indian Prime Minister, who is here on his second visit to Bhutan, inaugurated the Mangdechhu hydroelectric power plant.
- ❖ He launched stamps to commemorate five decades of India-Bhutan hydropower cooperation.
- ❖ He also launched the RuPay Card in Bhutan.
- ❖ Modi and Lotay Tshering (PM of Bhutan) jointly inaugurated the Ground Earth Station and SATCOM network, developed with assistance from ISRO for utilization of South Asia Satellite in Bhutan.
- ❖ On August 8, 1949 Bhutan and India signed the Treaty of Friendship.
- ❖ India re-negotiated the 1949 treaty with Bhutan and signed a new treaty of friendship in 2007.
- ❖ The new treaty replaced the provision requiring Bhutan to take India's guidance on foreign policy with broader sovereignty and not require Bhutan to obtain India's permission over arms imports.
- ❖ Modi made his first foreign visit as a PM in 2014 to Bhutan.





Chardham Project

- ❖ The Supreme Court has cleared the decks for the Chardham highway project.
- ❖ It is a proposed express National Highway to connect the four holy places in the state of Uttarakhan (Badrinath, Kedarnath, Gangotri and Yamunotri).



Thar Express

- India suspends Thar Link Express to Pakistan.
- ❖ It starts from Jodhpur of Rajasthan, crosses Munabao, the last station on the Indian side of the border. It reaches Karachi in Pakistan.
- The Thar Link Express is a continuation of the previous Sind Mail.
- ❖ It was revived after a period of 41 years on 18 February 2006.





About

- ❖ On 28 June 1976, India and Pakistan signed the rail communication agreement.
- ❖ It was signed to normalise the relations between two nations after signing the Simla Agreement (2 July 1972) few months after the end of Indo-Pakistani War of 1971.
- ❖ This agreement forms the basis of running Thar Link Express, as well as the Samjhauta Express.
- ❖ The Delhi–Lahore Bus and Srinagar-Muzaffarabad Bus are based on a separated agreement.

India and Pakistan have
2 Trans-Border Trains. They Are:
1.Samjhauta Express: Operates on Delhi-Lahore Route Via Attari-Wagah Border
Crossing. It carries both Passenger and the Freight.
2. Thar Express: It links Jodhpur(India) and Karachi(Pakistan) via Munabao-Khokhrapar Border Crossing. It carries only Passengers.

e-version of Rozgar Samachar

- The e-version of Rozgar Samachar has been launched recently by Union Minister of Information & Broadcasting Prakash Javadekar.
- ❖ It has been launched in 1976 with a view to make aspirants aware of job opportunities in government sector including public sector enterprises.
- * Rozgar Samachar is the corresponding version of Employment News (English).
- ❖ Employment News is the flagship weekly job journal from Ministry of Information and Broadcasting.

Committee to review Defence Procurement Procedure

- ❖ Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has approved setting up of a Committee to review the Defence Procurement Procedure (DPP) to strengthen 'Make in India'.
- This 11-member Committee has been setup under the Chairmanship of Director General (Acquisition).





❖ It will try to remove bottlenecks in defence acquisition, promote Indian startups and research and development.

Know India Program for Indian origin Youth

- ❖ A group of Indian Origin youth have visited India under the 54th Edition of 'Know India Programme' (KIP).
- ❖ The 54th KIP is scheduled from 1st August to 25th August, 2019 in association with the partner sates of Punjab and Haryana.
- ❖ KIP is organised by Ministry of External Affairs for Indian origin youth (between 18-30 years).

International Conference on Teacher Education - New Delhi

- Union Human Resource Development Minister Ramesh Pokhriyal inaugurated an international conference on teacher education in New Delhi.
- ❖ The two-day event is being organized by the National Council of Teacher Education (NCTE) as part of silver jubilee celebration of its establishment in 1995.
- ❖ NCTE serves as an advisory body to Central and State Governments to ensure maintenance of standards and quality in Teacher Education.

Two New Fish Species

- Scientists of the Zoological Survey of India have discovered two new species of freshwater fishes.
 - Glyptothorax gopii A new species of catfish found in Mizoram's Kaladan river.
 - o Garra simbalbaraensis Discovered in Himachal Pradesh's Simbalbara river.

Inter-State Council

❖ The Inter-State Council, which is mandated to investigate and advise on disputes between states, has been "reconstituted" with Prime Minister as its chairman and six Union ministers and all chief ministers as members.





- ❖ The Chief Ministers of the Union territories (UT) having legislative assemblies and the administrators of UTs not having a legislative assembly will also be members of the council.
- ❖ Ten other Union ministers have been made permanent invitees to the council.
- ❖ The Article 263 of the Constitution provides for the establishment of an Inter-State Council.

National Essential Diagnostics List (NEDL)

- ❖ India has got its first National Essential Diagnostics List (NEDL).
- ❖ The list has been finalised by the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR).
- ❖ NEDL is based on World Health Organisation's EDL released in 2018.
- ❖ With this, India has become the first country to compile such a list.





- ❖ The NEDL list would provide guidance to the government for 'deciding the kind of diagnostic tests' that different healthcare facilities in villages and remote areas require.
- ❖ The list is meant for facilities from village till the district level.

Environmental and Social Management Framework - Coastal States

- ❖ The Environment Ministry has unveiled a draft plan to asses prospective infrastructure projects situated along the coast before they can apply for clearance.
- ❖ The draft Environmental and Social Management Framework (ESMF) is part of a World Bank-funded project.
- ❖ The document lays out guidelines out for coastal States to adopt when they approve and regulate projects in coastal zones.
- ❖ It describes how "environmental and social aspects" ought to be integrated into the planning, design, implementation of projects.
- ❖ Gujarat, Odisha and West Bengal are three coastal states that have already prepared Coastal Zone Management Plans with support from the World Bank.

2nd Uday Express

- ❖ The 2nd UDAY (Utkrisht Double Decker Air Conditioned Yatri) Express will run between Visakhapatnam and Vijayawada in the East Coast Railway zone.
- ❖ The 1st double-decker UDAY Express started service between Coimbatore and Bangalore in June 2018.

Mobile Metallic Ramp for Army

- ❖ Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has handed over the design of Mobile Metallic Ramp (MMR) to the Indian Army.
- ❖ It has been developed by DRDO's premier research laboratory the Centre for Fire, Explosive and Environment Safety, New Delhi.
- ❖ MMR will provide the strategic mobility for Armoured and Mechanized units and formations of the Army.






D Voters - Assam NRC Issue

- With few days left for the publication of the final National Register of Citizens (NRC), the Election Commission of India (ECI) is now faced with the legal question whether those excluded should be marked as 'D' voters.
- ❖ 'D' voters, sometimes also referred to as Dubious voter or Doubtful voter, are a category of voters in Assam whose citizenship is doubtful or under dispute.
- This category was introduced in 1997.
- Such D Voters cannot participate in elections unless their case is decided by a Foreigners' Tribunal.
- ❖ Around 1.2 lakh 'D' voters did not participate in the recently concluded Lok Sabha elections.

THE CITIZENSHIP CONUNDRUM

After the first National Register for Citizens (NRC) exercise was carried out in 1951, the wheels were set in motion to update the list in 2005. In 2015, Assam began the task of verifying and updating the NRC list. Out of current 32.9 million applicants to the list, 4 million potentially stare at being rendered 'stateless'.

- ❖ The current Union Home Secretary Rajiv Gauba IAS has been appointed as the next Cabinet Secretary for a tenure of two years (from August 30, 2019).
- ❖ Gauba was the key architect of the recent Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act which divided Kashmir into two Union Territories.
- ❖ Ajay Kumar has been appointed as Secretary, Defence.
- ❖ Subhash Chandra has been appointed as Secretary, Defence Production.
- Similarly, Brij Kumar Agarwal will be Secretary, Lokpal.





NISHTHA - Teacher's Training Program

- Union HRD Minister Ramesh Pokhriyal has launched the Integrated Teachers' Training Programme, NISHTHA (National Initiative for School Head's and Teachers' Holistic Advancement) in New Delhi.
- ❖ He also launched NISHTHA initiative's Website, Training Modules, Primer Booklet and Mobile App built for purpose.
- ❖ The Mobile App and Learning Management System (LMS) have been developed by NCERT.
- ❖ This Integrated Teachers' Training Programme aims to build capacities by training around 42 lakh teachers across country.



Op-Blue Freedom: Phase 2

- ❖ After the success of the Chandigarh leg, Sports Minister Kiren Rijiju and former India football captain Baichung Bhutia flagged off the Delhi leg of Op-Blue Freedom.
- ❖ Op-Blue Freedom is a nation-wide adaptive scuba diving programme for people with disabilities as well as the able bodied.
- ❖ The group of eight veterans, including from the elite special forces of PARA regiment and MARCOS (Special commando force of Indian Navy) trained people.
- ❖ The program aims to train adventure enthusiasts in special forces skills like survival techniques, emergency first response skills, unarmed combat, endurance and fitness.





SARAL - State Rooftop Solar Attractiveness Index

- ❖ Union Minister of State for Power and New & Renewable Energy (IC) launched SARAL State Rooftop Solar Attractiveness Index.
- ❖ SARAL evaluates Indian states based on their attractiveness for rooftop development.
- ❖ It is the first of its kind index to provide a comprehensive overview of state-level measures adopted to facilitate rooftop solar deployment.
- ❖ Karnataka tops the SARAL index. It is followed by Telangana, Gujarat and Andhra Pradesh.
- ❖ SARAL has been designed collaboratively by the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE), Shakti Sustainable Energy Foundation (SSEF), ASSOCHAM and Ernst & Young (EY).

Zonal Councils Meet

❖ Union Home Minister, Amit Shah chaired the 24th meeting of the Western Zonal Council at Panaji (Goa).







- ❖ The meeting was also attended by Chief Ministers of Gujarat, Maharashtra, Goa and Administrator of the UTs of Daman & Diu and Dadra & Nagar Haveli.
- ❖ The Six Zonal Councils are Western, Eastern, Northern, Southern, North Eastern and Central.
- ❖ They were set up under the State's Reorganization Act, 1956 to foster Inter-State co-operation and co-ordination among the States.

Ocean Energy as Renewable Energy

- ❖ Minister of New and Renewable Energy (Independent Charge) RK Singh has approved a proposal to declare 'ocean energy' as Renewable Energy.
- ❖ The energy produced using various forms of ocean energy such as tidal, wave and ocean thermal energy conversion will be considered as Renewable Energy.
- ❖ It will be eligible for meeting the non-solar Renewable Purchase Obligations (RPO).
- ❖ The decision is expected to give a boost to ocean energy in the country.

'SAN-Sadhan' Hackathon - Accessible Toilets

- ❖ The Government of India has invited applications for its latest initiative called the 'SAN-Sadhan' Hackathon − for Divyangjan accessible toilets.
- It is an initiative under the Swachh Bharat Mission to ease lives of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan) by making toilets smarter, more accessible, and easier to use.
- ❖ The shortlisted applicants will work to develop their prototype during the two-day Hackathon scheduled to be held in the month of September in New Delhi.

The Sabka Vishwas - Legacy Dispute Resolution Scheme, 2019


- ❖ The Sabka Vishwas Legacy Dispute Resolution Scheme, 2019, which was announced in the Union Budget 2019-20, has now been notified.
- ❖ It will be operationalized from 1st September 2019 and would continue till 31st December 2019.
- ❖ The government expects large number of taxpayers to avail the scheme for closing their 'pending disputes' relating to old Service Tax and Central Excise cases that are now subsumed under GST.





National Resource Efficiency Policy, 2019

- Driven by serious sustainability concerns, the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change has proposed a draft 'National Resource Efficiency Policy 2019.
- ❖ It aims to streamline the efficient use of these resources with minimum negative impact on environment.
- ❖ The policy aims for a 'circular economy' Through efficient use of available material resources, based on principles of 6R.
- ❖ 6R stands for- reduce, reuse, recycle, redesign, re-manufacture and refurbish.
- Zero Landfill Approach Imposing 'landfill taxes' for bulk generators of waste so that they can move towards optimal use of materials and better waste management.








Composite Water Management Index 2.0

❖ NITI Aayog has released the second Round of Composite Water Management Index (CWMI 2.0).



- ❖ It is a tool to assess and improve the performance of States/ UTs in efficient management of water resources.
- This assessment has been done in partnership with Ministry of Jal Shakti, Ministry of Rural Development and all the States/ Union Territories.
- ❖ The first such index was released in 2018.
- ❖ It has found that in 2019 rankings, 80% states have improved their water management scores.

Rankings

- * Reference year for rankings: 2017-18.
- ❖ Gujarat topped the list followed by Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Goa, Karnataka and Tamil Nadu.
- ❖ In North Eastern and Himalayan States, Himachal Pradesh has been adjudged number 1 followed by Uttarakhand, Tripura and Assam.

Mesovelia Insects

- ❖ Scientists of the Zoological Survey of India have discovered seven species of 'water treaders'. (Genus: Mesovelia).
- These are semi-aquatic insects that can walk or run on the surface of water.
- ❖ They have hydrophobic setae (bristles) on their legs.





❖ The combination of hydrophobic setae and water surface tension prevents them from sinking.



SPG Protection Withdrawn for Former PM Manmohan Singh

- ❖ The Government of India is likely to withdraw the SPG (Special Protection Group) from former PM Manmohan Singh's security.
- ❖ But however, he will continue to have the "highest category" Z-plus protection, to be provided by CRPF.
- SPG would be tasked with protecting only PM Modi, Congress president Sonia Gandhi and her children Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra.

About

- ❖ SPG is an armed force of the Union for providing proximate security to − PM, Former PM, members of their immediate families.
- ❖ It was formed in 1985 after Indira Gandhi assassination.
- ❖ Later on, it became a statutory body under Special Protection Group Act, 1988.
- ❖ Initially SPG provided security to PM only.
- ❖ Post Rajiv Gandhi assassination, SPG Act was amended in 1991 to provide security to former PMs and their immediate families.





Indo Pacific Chiefs of Defence Conference

- ❖ The 2019 Indo Pacific Chiefs of Defence (CHOD) Conference will be held in Thailand's capital city Bangkok.
- ❖ It will see participation of Chiefs of Defence of more than 33 countries.
- ❖ India will be represented by Chairman of the Chiefs of Staff Committee (COSC) and Chief of the Air Staff- Air Chief Marshal Birender Singh Dhanoa.
- ❖ Theme of the conference: "Collaboration in a free and Open Indo Pacific".

FSSAI Lab @ Ghaziabad, UP

- Union Health Minister Harsh Vardhan inaugurated regulator Food Safety and Standard Authority of India's (FSSAI) National Food Laboratory, in Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖ It was inaugurated on the occasion of 13th anniversary of enactment of Food Safety and Standards Act, (FSSA) 2006.
- ❖ NFL is one of two premier referral laboratories under direct administrative control of FSSAI.
- * The other lab is at Kolkatta.





Construction around Protected Monuments

- Union Ministry of Tourism has relaunched and expanded the integrated 'No Objection Certificate Online Application Processing System (NOAPS)' portal of National Monuments Authority (NMA).
- ❖ It will cover protected monuments in 6 states Madhya Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Haryana, Punjab, Jharkhand and Telangana.
- ❖ Permission and No Objection Certificate for any construction activity around protected monuments can be processed through NOAPS.
- ❖ The portal is supported by ISRO's 'Smarac' mobile app.

Amazon and Indian Military Veterans

- ❖ Amazon India has launched a Military Veterans Employment programme.
- It plans to create continued work opportunities in Amazon for 'military families' across India.
- ❖ Amazon has collaborated with
 - o Director-General of Resettlement (DGR)
 - o Department of Ex-Servicemen Welfare (Ministry of Defence)
 - o Army Welfare Placement Organisation, an NGO

Microsoft India Trains 5,000 Government Employees

- ❖ Microsoft India launched a program to train 5000 government employees over the next year on AI (artificial intelligence) and cloud computing skills.
- ❖ This program was inaugurated by Amitabh Kant, chief executive of NITI Aayog.
- ❖ The program, called 'Digital Governance Tech Tour', will comprise of physical and virtual workshops.
- ❖ It will be open for technocrats and IT professionals across the government, including employees of Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs).

Anubhav Awards 2019

- ❖ The Union Minister of State for Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions Jitendra Singh has presented the 4th ANUBHAV awards, 2019.
- ❖ The Anubhav portal was created in 2015 with a vision to 'preserve rich experience' of retired officials in digital form.





❖ An award scheme to incentivize and encourage more retiring employees to submit their write-ups was subsequently introduced in 2016.

National Digital Library of India

- Under the National Mission on Education through Information and Communication Technology, the Union HRD ministry has launched the National Digital Library (NDL) of India project.
- ❖ It would be a virtual repository of learning resources with a single-window search facility.
- ❖ NDL has been integrated with UMANG (Unified Mobile Application for New-age Governance) App.
- ❖ There are more than 3 crore digital resources available in NDL and contents cover almost all major domains of education and all major levels of learners.

September - Month of Poshan

- ❖ In his weekly radio interactive program 'man ki bhat' Prime Minister Modi addressed the nation to celebrate September 2019 as a month of nutrition.
- It is to be observed as a part of 'POSHAN Abhiyaan' (National Nutrition Mission-NNM).
- NNM is a flagship programme of the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development (MWCD).
- ❖ The program aims to achieve improvement in nutritional status of Children from 0-6 years, Adolescent Girls, Pregnant Women and Lactating Mothers in a time bound manner in three years (2017-20).
- ❖ A similar scheme to eliminate malnutrition of girl children had been launched by Gujarat state government in 2018, known as Purna.

Bureau of Police Research and Development Foundation Day

- ❖ Union Home Minister Amit Shah attended the 49th Foundation Day of Bureau of Police Research and Development (BPR&D) at New Delhi.
- ❖ On the occasion, the Home minister released BPR&D's new logo.
- ❖ The theme of the function was "promoting good practices and standards".

About

❖ BPR&D was set up on 28 August 1970 for the modernization of police forces.





❖ At present it has 4 divisions – Research, Development, Training and Correctional Administration.

'Fit India' Movement

- ❖ Prime Minister Narendra Modi has launched a nation-wide 'Fit India' Movement on the occasion of National Sports Day (August 29).
- ❖ The campaign is aimed at encouraging people to inculcate physical activity and sports in their day to day life.
- ❖ A 28-member committee, under the chairmanship of sports minister Kiren Rijiju has been formed to advise the government on the campaign.
- During the launch of the event, PM also paid tributes to hockey legend Major Dhyan Chand as it is his birth anniversary.

75 new Medical Colleges in 3 Years

- ❖ The Union Cabinet has approved setting up of 75 new Medical Colleges by 2021-22.
- ❖ The move will add 15,700 more MBBS seats in the country.
- ❖ This will be established in under-served areas having no such colleges with at least 200 bedded district hospitals.
- Preference will be given to Aspirational districts and district hospitals having 300 beds.

Facial Biometric Data of Seafarers

❖ India has become the 'first country in the world' to issue Biometric Seafarer Identity Document (BSID) capturing the facial biometric data of seafarers.







- Minister of State for Shipping Mansukh Mandaviya launched the project in New Delhi.
- ❖ Nine data collection centres have been set up at Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai, Noida, Goa, New Mangalore, Kochi, Vizag and Kandla for the issue of BSID.
- ❖ The total number of existing Indian seafarers who will be required to be issued BSIDs is around 3,50,000.

7th National Community Radio Sammelan

- ❖ Information and Broadcasting Minister Prakash Javadekar attended the 7th National Community Radio Sammelan (meet) held in New Delhi.
- ❖ Awards for excellence were given to different community radio channels for their valuable contribution in sensitizing local people.
- ❖ For the year 2019, "Friends Radio", Tripura bagged the first prize in the thematic category.
- ❖ Awards were given under 5 categories.

New images on tobacco packets

- ❖ The image on cigarette and other tobacco packets will be changed from September 1, 2019.
- ❖ The current image would be replaced by the image of a man who lost a part of his jaw and other parts owing to Buccal Mucosa cancer.
- ❖ Besides the new image, the health warning 'Tobacco causes painful death' and a number (1800-11-2356) to seek help for quitting tobacco would be displayed.
- ❖ Together they would fill 85% of the display area of all the tobacco products.

Leather Mission - KVIC

- Khadi and Village Industry Commission (KVIC) distributed as many as 50 leather kits and 350 Bee-Boxes with live bee colonies in tribal-dominated village in Sirohi district of Rajasthan on World Tribal Day.
- ❖ Sirohi is one of the aspirational districts in India identified by the NITI Aayog.





- * KVIC also launched a new programme 'Leather Mission' on World Tribal Day from the tribal-dominated village of Chandala.
- ❖ Under this new programme, KVIC will give Leather Kits to the leather artisans across the nation.
- ❖ International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples (or) World Tribal Day is celebrated on August 09 every year.

WTI Awards - NITI Aayog

- ❖ NITI Aayog launched fourth edition of Women Transforming India (WTI) Awards.
- ❖ WhatsApp has collaborated with NITI Aayog for WTI Awards 2019 and will be providing support amounting to US \$100,000 to award winners.

Women Transforming India (WTI) Award


- ❖ The Women Transforming India (WTI) Awards is being organized in collaboration with the United Nations to recognize women entrepreneurs from across India.

Child Well-being Index 2019


- ❖ Child Well-being Index is a part of the report released by the non-government organisation World Vision India and research institute IFMR LEAD.
- ❖ The report is an attempt to look at how India fairs on child well-being using a composite child well-being index.
- ❖ The dimensions of the index include healthy individual development, positive relationships and protective contexts.







- ❖ Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Himachal Pradesh and Puducherry topped the charts in the child well-being index.
- ❖ Meghalaya, Jharkhand and Madhya Pradesh featured at the bottom.







12th India Security Summit

- ❖ The 12th India Security Summit was held in New Delhi with the theme "Towards New National Cyber Security Strategy".
- ❖ India is the third largest user of internet and the cybercrime has increased manifold in the recent years.
- ❖ Various steps are taken by the Government to provide cyber security were discussed.

100% FDI in Coal

- ❖ The Union Cabinet has cleared the proposal to allow 100 % foreign investment in coal mining and contract manufacturing.
- 100 % FDI under automatic route in coal mining and sale of coal has been allowed to help attract international players to create an efficient and competitive coal market.

INTERNATIONAL

Shawala Teja Singh Temple in Pakistan

- ❖ Almost 1,000-year-old Shawala Teja Singh Temple located in Sialkot city of Pakistan has been re-opened for devotees for the 1st time since partition.
- ❖ It has been remaining sealed for the last 72 years since partition.
- ❖ It was built by Sardar Teja Singh and dedicated to Lord Siva.







Nagar Kirtan – 550th Guru Nanak Anniversary

- ❖ For 1st time since partition, the 'Nagar Kirtan' carrying Guru Granth Sahib which was taken out from Nankana Sahib district of Punjab province of Pakistan, arrived at Attari in Amritsar, India.
- ❖ Nagar Kirtan is a religious procession.
- ❖ This procession by devotees is to mark the 550th birth anniversary celebrations of Guru Nanak Dev, founder of Sikhism.
- It will culminate at Sultanpur Lodhi in Kapurthala district of Punjab in India.
- ❖ Guru Nanak Devji was born in 1469, in the village Talwandi now known as Nankana Sahib, is situated near Lahore, Pakistan.

Singapore Convention on Mediation

- ❖ The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister has approved the signing of the UN Convention on International Settlement Agreements (UNISA).
- ❖ UNISA was adopted in 2018. It will be officially signed in Singapore.
- ❖ This agreement will be known as "Singapore Convention on Mediation".
- ❖ It provides a uniform framework for the enforcement of 'international settlement agreements' resulting from mediation and for allowing parties to invoke such agreements.

India - Africa Relations

- ❖ President Ramnath Kovind returned to New Delhi after completion of his threenation visit to three African nations: Benin, Gambia and Guinea.
- ❖ This is the first ever visit by any President of India to the three West African countries.
- ❖ In Guinea, he received National Order of Merit which is the highest civilian award of the country.
- ❖ MoUs were signed in the field of traditional medicine, pan Africa e-Network Project, solar and renewable energy, E-education and Ayurveda.
- ❖ About pan Africa e-Network:
 - Started in 2009. Aims to provide 'seamless' and 'integrated' elite, fibre optics and wireless network to connect the African countries.
 - The idea for the project came from the then President of India, A P J Abdul Kalam in Johannesburg in 2004.





US-Russia Intermediate Range Nuclear Forces Treaty

- ❖ The US has formally withdrawn from the Cold War-era Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces Treaty (INF) with Russia.
- ❖ The treaty had banned the development, testing and possession of short and medium range ground-launched nuclear missiles with a range of 500-5,000 km.
- ❖ INF was signed by then US President Ronald Reagan and Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev in 1987.

Asean-India summits

- ❖ Series of Asean-India summits held in Thailand.
- ❖ External affairs minister S Jaishankar represented the country in the meetings.
- **❖** The summits are;
 - o Asean-India Ministerial Meeting,
 - o 9th East Asia Summit Foreign Ministers' Meeting,
 - o 26th ASEAN Regional Forum and
 - o 10th Mekong Ganga Cooperation Ministerial Meeting.



Kajin Sara Lake

- ❖ Kajin Sara lake, a newly-discovered lake in Nepal is likely to set a new record of being the world's highest lake.
- ❖ It is located at Singarkharka, Manang district of Nepal.
- ❖ Currently Tilicho Lake holds the title of the world's highest lake. It is situated at an altitude of 4,919 metres in Nepal.
- ❖ The 1.5 km long and 600 metres wide Kajin Sara Lake is located at an altitude of 5,200 metres, which is yet to be officially verified.





Reusable Launch Vehicles

- Chinese start-up Link Space completed its third test of a reusable rocket RLV-T5.
- ❖ The cost of access to space is the major deterrent in space exploration and space utilisation.
- ❖ A reusable launch vehicle is the unanimous solution to achieve low cost, reliable and on-demand space access.
- Other private companies involved in similar technology America's SpaceX, Chinese Firm iSpace.
- ❖ ISRO's Reusable Launch Vehicle Technology Demonstration Program (RLV-TD) is also working on a similar technology.

Russia on Kashmir issue

- * Russia became the first P-5 nation to formally state that abrogation of Article 370 is an internal matter for India.
- ❖ After the United States, United Nations, now Russia has asked India and Pakistan not to allow worsening of the situation in Kashmir.
- * Russia said that the differences between the two sides will be resolved by the provisions of the Shimla Agreement of 1972 and the Lahore Declaration of 1999.
- ❖ The erstwhile Soviet Union came to India's aid whenever any resolution on Kashmir was introduced in the UNSC, besides the 1971 War.
- ❖ The 100th veto in the UNSC was cast by Moscow in 1962 and in support of India's position on Kashmir.
- ❖ Earlier, the Soviet Union bailed out India in 1957 in the UNSC on the same issue by vetoing a resolution.

First US Missile Test Post INF Treaty Withdrawal

- ❖ The United States has announced that it has successfully tested a medium-range ground-launched Tomahawk cruise missile.
- ❖ This is first such test after US unilaterally withdrew from Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces (INF) Treaty, a Cold War-era pact with Russia.
- ❖ The 1987 INF Treaty had banned both parties from possessing, testing land-based missiles conventional/ nuclear, that could travel between 500 and 5,500 kilometers.





Zambian President's India visit

- ❖ The President of India, Ram Nath Kovind, received Edgar Chagwa Lungu, the President of Zambia, at Rashtrapati Bhavan on his first state visit to India.
- ❖ They signed six MoUs in various fields including the e-VBAB network project.

About

- ❖ In 2018, Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) and the Telecommunications Consultants India Ltd (TCIL) signed an Agreement for the implementation of e-VidyaBharati and e-AarogyaBharati (e-VBAB) Network Project.
- ❖ E-VBAB Network Project will provide free tele-education courses in various academic disciplines to 4000 students every year from African countries.

World Police and Fire Games' 2019

- ❖ World Police and Fire Games 2019 held at Chengdu, China's southwestern Sichuan province.
- ❖ Indian Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) sports personnel won 10 medals including 5 gold, 3 silver and 2 bronze medals.

About

- It is a worldwide Olympic-style sporting event which is held every two years.
- ❖ The 2021 edition will be held in Rotterdam, Netherlands and 2023 will be in Winnipeg, Canada
- ❖ In this Olympic-style competition, Athletes from more than 70 countries participated and competed in more than 60 sports.

Maritime Surveillance and Security - India and France

- ❖ India and France have formalised the development and launch of constellation of around 10 low-earth orbit satellites that will continuously provide maritime surveillance and security.
- ❖ It will cover a wide belt around the globe and specifically focus on the Indian Ocean region where France, with its Reunion Islands, has a strategic interest.
- ❖ The satellite-based Automatic Identification System (AIS) will
 - o detect, identify and track a range of vessels moving in the ocean region.
 - o guard against aggression, terrorism, piracy, smuggling, and also be useful for rescue.





- Other climate and ocean weather monitoring satellites jointly developed by India and France are
 - o Megha-Tropiques in 2011
 - o SARAL-AltiKa in 2013.

FATF - Pakistan Blocked

- ❖ Pakistan has been placed on the lowest rung or "blacklist" of the Financial Action Task Force's Asia Pacific Group (APG).
- ❖ It has been placed in the list for non-compliance and non-enforcement of safeguards against terror financing and money laundering.
- ❖ The Financial Action Task Force (FATF) had already 'grey listed' Pakistan for failing to curb anti-terror financing.
- ❖ FATF has no investigative authority.
- ❖ The FATF blacklist or OECD blacklist has been issued by the Financial Action Task Force since 2000.
- Main objective of FATF is to fight against money laundering, terrorist financing and other related threats to the security and integrity of the international financial system.

First Floating Nuclear Reactor - Russia

- * Russia has launched the world's first floating nuclear reactor, the Akademik Lomonosov.
- ❖ It is on a 5,000 km journey between port of Murmansk and Pevek in Siberia.
- ❖ When it arrives in Pevek, it will 'replace' a local nuclear plant and a closed coal power plant.
- ❖ Power produced from the plant will be used by Russia in the exploitation of hydrocarbons in the Arctic.
- Environmental groups have long warned of the dangers of the project, dubbing it a potential "Chernobyl on ice" and a "nuclear Titanic."





South-South and Triangular Cooperation

- ❖ An international dialogue on South-South and Triangular Cooperation was recently held in New Delhi.
- ❖ South-South cooperation is a broad framework of collaboration among countries of the Southern Hemisphere in the political, economic, social, cultural, environmental and technical domains.
- ❖ It is collaboration in which traditional donor countries and multilateral organizations facilitate South-South economic initiatives.








Modi in UAE

- ❖ The United Arab Emirates (UAE) honoured Prime Minister Narendra Modi with its highest civilian award the 'Order of Zayed'.
- ❖ The award in name of Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, founding father of UAE.
- ❖ UAE is India's 3rd-largest trade partner with an annual bilateral trade of about \$60 billion.
- ❖ UAE is also 4th-largest exporter of crude oil for India.
- ❖ Prime Minister launched the RuPay card here, making the UAE the first country in West Asia to initiate the Indian indigenous system of electronic payment.



About RuPay

- * RuPay card scheme was launched in 2012 to fulfil the Reserve Bank of India's vision to have a domestic, open and multilateral system of payments.
- * RuPay facilitates electronic payment at all Indian banks and financial institutions.
- India has already launched the RuPay card in Singapore and Bhutan.

WorldSkills event

- ❖ The 45th edition of a global skills competition called the WorldSkills, dubbed as 'Olympics of Skills', will begin in Kazan, Russia.
- ❖ It is the World's biggest international vocational skill competition.
- ❖ India, with a strong 48-member contingent, is one of the 63 countries participating in this event.





About

- WorldSkills organises the world championships of vocational skills.
- ❖ It is held every two years in different parts of the world.
- ❖ WorldSkills International, formerly known as the International Vocation Training Organisation (IVTO), was founded in the 1940s.
- ❖ It emerged from a desire to create new employment opportunities for young people in some of the economies that were devastated by the Second World War.
- currently it has 79 Member countries and regions.



45th G7 Summit at Biarritz, France

- ❖ The 45th G7 summit was held on 24–26 August 2019, in Biarritz, France.
- ❖ Attendees of the 45th summit of the G7 includes the leaders of the seven G7 member states (Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, United Kingdom, United States) and representatives of the European Union.
- ❖ 9 Countries including India were invited as guests Australia, Burkina Faso, Chile, Egypt, Rwanda, Senegal, South Africa and Spain.





South Asia Air Quality Tech Camp, Kathmandu

- ❖ The U.S. Embassy in Nepal has organized a South Asia Air Quality Tech Camp in Kathmandu.
- ❖ The aim of the camp is to address political, social and scientific facets of air pollution problem.
- Seven South Asian countries participated: Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan and Sri Lanka

ECONOMY

Easy External Commercial Borrowings

- * Reserve Bank of India has relaxed External Commercial Borrowing (ECB) norms for corporates, non-banking lenders as a move towards easing liquidity.
- ❖ It has liberalised the "end-use" stipulations for ECB.
- ❖ ECB is an instrument used in India to facilitate Indian companies to raise money outside the country in Foreign currency.

The Companies (Amendment) Bill, 2019

- ❖ The Parliament has passed Companies (Amendment) Bill, 2019.
- ❖ It amends the Companies Act, 2013.





It is aimed at

- o Tightening Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) compliance
- o Ensuring stricter action for non-compliance of the company law regulations
- o Ensure greater accountability and better enforcement of the corporate governance norms.

Failing Indian Economy - Rank 5 to 7

- ❖ India has slipped down to the 7th place in the global GDP rankings of 2018, reveals data compiled by the World Bank.
- ❖ According to the 2018 data, the UK and France once again moved ahead of India to reclaim their 5th and 6th spots respectively in the global GDP rankings.
- ❖ The United States continues to top the list with a GDP of \$20.5 trillion, followed by China at second place with GDP of \$13.6 trillion and Japan at third place with a GDP of \$5 trillion.
- ❖ India recorded a GDP of \$2.73 trillion in 2018.
- ❖ The present government aims to make India a \$ 5 trillion economy by 2025.
- ❖ According to economists, India has slipped to the 7th place in Global GDP ranking due to currency fluctuations and a slowdown in economic growth.



The Special Economic Zones (Amendment) Bill, 2019

- ❖ The Special Economic Zones (Amendment) Bill, 2019 has been passed by both houses of Parliament.
- ❖ It amends the Special Economic Zones Act, 2005.





- Under the original Act, the definition of a person includes an individual, a Hindu undivided family, a company, a co-operative society, a firm, or an association of persons.
- ❖ The Bill adds two more categories to this definition by including a trust, or any other entity which may be notified by the central government.

SBI and China's Payment System

- ❖ The State Bank of India's (SBI) Shanghai branch is now connected to China's National Advance Payment System (CNAPS).
- SBI is the only Indian bank to have obtained the license to do business in local currency and also inducted to the CNAPS by the People's Bank of China (PBOC).
- ❖ CNAPS, launched in 2008 by People's Bank of China (PBOC) provides real-time settlement services for all payments.

The Code on Wages 2019

- ❖ Parliament has passed the Code on Wages, 2019.
- ❖ It seeks to regulate wage and bonus payments in all employments where any industry, trade, business, or manufacture is carried out.
- The Code will apply to all employees.
- ❖ The central government will make wage-related decisions for employments such as railways, mines, and oil fields, among others.
- ❖ State governments will make decisions for all other employments.
- The Code replaces the following four laws
 - o The Payment of Wages Act, 1936
 - o The Minimum Wages Act, 1948
 - o The Payment of Bonus Act, 1965
 - o The Equal Remuneration Act, 1976.

Floor Wage


- ❖ Based on living standards of workers, the central government will fix a "Floor Wage".
- ❖ The "Minimum Wages" decided by the central or state governments must be higher than the floor wage.





Minimum Wage

- ❖ The Code prohibits employers from paying wages less than the minimum wages.
- ❖ Minimum wages will be notified and fixed by the central or state governments based on
 - Skill of workers
 - o Difficulty of work



Overtime

- ❖ In case employees work in excess of a normal working day, they will be entitled to overtime wage.
- ❖ The overtime wage must be at least twice the normal rate of wages.

Determination of bonus

- ❖ The bonus will be at least 8.33% of an employee's wages.
- ❖ An employee can receive a maximum bonus of 20% of his annual wages.

Advisory Boards

- ❖ The central and state governments will constitute Advisory Boards, which will advise the respective governments on various issues including
 - o Fixation of minimum wages
 - o Increasing employment opportunities for women.

Gender Discrimination

❖ The Code prohibits gender discrimination in matters related to wages and recruitment of employees for the same work or work of similar nature.

Penalties for Employers


- ❖ The Code specifies penalties for offences committed by an employer, such as paying less than the due wages, or for contravening any provision of the Code.
- ❖ Maximum penalty is imprisonment for three months along with a fine of up to one lakh rupees.





Anti-Dumping Duty on PTA

- ❖ India has imposed anti-dumping duty on all imports of purified terephthalic acid (PTA) from South Korea and Thailand.
- ❖ PTA is primary raw material in the manufacture of polyester chips, which in turn are used in textile, packaging, furnishings, consumer goods, resins and coatings.



The Companies (Amendment) Bill, 2019

❖ The Companies (Amendment) Bill, 2019 has been passed by both houses of Parliament. It amends the Companies Act, 2013.

Commencement of business


- ❖ A company may not commence business, unless it
 - Files a declaration within 180 days of incorporation, confirming that every subscriber to the Memorandum of the company has paid for the shares agreed to be taken by him
 - o Files a verification of its registered address with the Registrar of Companies (RoC) within 30 days of incorporation.
- ❖ Failure to comply with these provisions will result in removal of name from RoC.

Monetary Policy Statement

- ❖ As per advice of Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) Reserve Bank of India has cut Repo rate by 35 basis points to 5.40 %.
- It will make bank loans cheaper.
- * This was the fourth consecutive time that the MPC reduced the rates.
- This move is with the objective of
 - \circ Achieving the medium-term target for consumer price index (CPI) inflation of 4 %
 - Supporting Growth.

Second Largest Foreign Investment

- Mukesh Ambani-led Reliance Industries has announced that it was selling a 20% stake in its flagship oil and chemical business to Saudi Aramco for \$15 billion.
- ❖ This will be the second-largest foreign investment in India.
- ❖ Walmart-Flipkart deal is the largest ever foreign investment in India (\$16 billion).
- ❖ Saudi Aramco is the world's most profitable company.







Injeti Srinivas Committee on Corporate social responsibility

- ❖ Injeti Srinivas, Secretary (Corporate Affairs), presented the Report of the High-Level Committee on Corporate social responsibility (CSR) to the Union Minister of Corporate Affairs, Nirmala Sitharaman.
- ❖ It made the following key recommendations for strengthening the CSR ecosystem
 - o Making CSR expenditure tax deductible
 - o Balancing local area preferences with national priorities
 - Violation of CSR compliance may be made a civil offence

India vs America: Solar Panel Case in WTO

- ❖ A ruling given by the World Trade Organization's (WTO) dispute settlement panel on renewable energy or the solar sector in favour of India has been challenged by the US.
- ❖ In June 2019, WTO panel ruled that subsidies given by America to its companies in the renewable energy sector are violative of global trade norms and against interests of India.
- ❖ Those relaxations were also found to be inconsistent with certain provisions of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT).
- ❖ GATT aims to promote trade by reducing or eliminating trade barriers such as customs duties.
- ❖ The US has challenged this ruling in the WTO's Appellate Body of WTO.

SAMARTH scheme

- ❖ 16 out of 18 states have signed pacts with the Ministry of Textiles to partner with it for skilling about four lakh workers as part of the 'Samarth' scheme.
- ❖ Jammu & Kashmir and Odisha, which were among the eighteen states that had earlier agreed to be on board, did not participate.
- ❖ The sixteen states that signed the MoUs include Arunachal Pradesh, Kerala, Mizoram, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Madhya Pradesh, Tripura, Karnataka, Manipur, Haryana, Meghalaya, Jharkhand and Uttarakhand.







Scheme for Capacity Building in Textile Sector (SAMARTH)

- ❖ It is skill development scheme of Union Ministry of Textiles.
- ❖ It covering the entire value chain of the textile sector excluding Spinning & Weaving in organized Sector.
- ❖ It was approved by Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) in December 2017.

e-commerce portal - Bharat Craft

- ❖ Union Minister Nitin Gadkari has announced plans to launch an e-commerce portal for MSMEs called 'Bharat Craft'.
- He inaugurated the 6th India International MSME Expo at New Delhi.
- ❖ Bharat Craft portal would be similar to e-portal such as Alibaba and Amazon.
- ❖ He also informed about the website called 'Samadhaan' where entrepreneurs can raise his/her problems.

Emergency Economic Measures - Finance Minister

❖ On concerns of a slowing economy Union Finance Minister Nirmala announced a number of measures to boost growth.






Some Key Measures

- ❖ ₹70,000 crore of capital infusion in public sector banks.
- * Rescinded ban on the purchase of new vehicles by government departments.
- ❖ From October 1, IT department summons should be generated by a centralised computer with a unique code only.
 - Any other summon, sent by tax authorities and without unique code is considered invalid.
- **♦** An additional ₹20,000 crore of liquidity to the housing finance companies.

1.76 Lakh crore transferred: RBI to Central Government

- ❖ The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) board headed by Governor Shakthi kanta Das has decided to transfer Rs 1.76 trillion in dividend and surplus reserve to the government.
- This follows the RBI board accepting the recommendation of a high-level panel headed by its former Governor Bimal Jalan on 'transfer of excess reserves to the government'.
- ❖ The highest that RBI has ever transferred so far was Rs 65,896 crore in 2014-15.
- The transfer is expected to
 - Act as a fiscal stimulus to the economy
 - Help government meet fiscal deficit target








TM Bhasin - Bank Fraud Board

- ❖ The Central Vigilance Commission has constituted Advisory Board for Banking Frauds (ABBF) to examine bank fraud of over 50 crore rupees and recommend action.
- ❖ The four-member board will be headed by former Vigilance Commissioner T M Bhasin.
- ❖ The banks will refer all large fraud cases above 50 crore rupees to ABBF.
- This will function as the first level of examination of all large fraud cases before interference of investigative agencies.

GDP Growth

- ❖ India's gross domestic product (GDP) growth rate slowed to a six-year low of 5% in the first quarter of the 2019-20 financial year.
- ❖ It was led by a dramatic slowdown in the manufacturing sector.
- ❖ The growth of Gross Value Added (GVA) stood at 4.9% in the first quarter of the financial year 2019-20, also the slowest in six years.







10 public sector banks to be merged

- ❖ 10 public sector banks are going to be merged into four.
- Canara Bank and Syndicate Bank are going to be merged.
- Union Bank, Andhra Bank and Corporate Bank are going to be merged.
- Punjab National Bank (PNB), Oriental Bank of Commerce (OBC) and United Bank of India are going to be merged.



- ❖ Indian Bank and Allahabad Bank are going to be merged.
- ❖ In place of 27 public sector banks in 2017, now there will be only 12 public sector banks.
- ❖ The largest of the mergers announced is that of Punjab National Bank with Oriental Bank of Commerce and United Bank.
- ❖ The above said amalgamated entity will become the second-largest public sector bank in India, after the State Bank of India.





SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

TOI 270 Planetary System - TESS

- ❖ NASA's Transiting Exoplanet Survey Satellite (TESS) has discovered a dwarf star and the planetary system by the name of TOI 270.
- ❖ TOI 270 is about 73 light years away from Earth.
- ❖ TOI 270 is the star around which Three exoplanets TOI 270b, TOI 270c, and TOI 270d orbit.
- ***** Exoplanets are planets outside the solar system.

TB Medicine Trial

- On July 15, 2019 the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) launched India's first large-scale trial for two new tuberculosis (TB) vaccines.
- There are two vaccines being tested in the latest trial
 - Immuvac (also known as mycobacterium indicus pranii or MIP) manufactured by Cadila Pharmaceuticals in Ahmedabad
 - o VPM1002 manufactured by Serum Institute of India in Pune.
- Currently BCG (Bacille Calmette-Guerin) (BCG) vaccine is used.
- ❖ But it is over 100 years old and provides poor protection against pulmonary disease in adolescents and adults.

BrahMos cruise missiles to Thailand

- ❖ Thailand is negotiating with India about its purchase of BrahMos supersonic cruise missiles.
- Possibly it will be the first sale of BrahMos supersonic cruise missiles to another country.
- ❖ Thailand has made a request for repair and refurbishing their Dornier maritime patrol aircraft.
- Discussions are on to integrate Thailand into India's coastal surveillance radar chain network.
- ❖ India, Thailand and Singapore trilateral naval exercise announced by Prime Minister at Shangri-La dialogue in June 2018 is scheduled to be held later this year.
- ❖ India will host the first edition of the exercise in September this year.





❖ The two navies already conduct a Coordinated Patrol (CORPAT) and a new bilateral exercise is also in the works apart from the trilateral.

Solar Cell from Kumkum

- The scientists at IIT Hyderabad have developed low-cost, environment-friendly solar cells by employing an off-the-shelf dye used to make Kumkum or vermilion in India.
- ❖ The Dye-Sensitised Solar Cell (DSSC) is based on New Fuchsin (NF) dye with aqueous electrolyte and platinum-free counter electrodes.
- ❖ High fabrication costs of the present silicon based solar cells is a deterrent for mass production and wide public usage.
- ❖ DSSC aims to address above concerns.

Electricity from Ocean Waves

- ❖ IIT-Madras has partnered with National Institute of Ocean Technology, Chennai to harness electricity from ocean waves.
- ❖ Both institutions will together develop turbines that can harness the power of ocean waves to generate electricity.
- ❖ The partnership is aimed at meeting renewable energy and climate change objectives of the government of India.
- IIT Madras is celebrating its 60th foundation day in 2019 (Found in 1959).

Biofuel from Used Cooking Oil

On the occasion of the World Biofuel Day (August 10), Petroleum and Natural Gas ministry has released the Expression for Interest (EOI) by National Oil Marketing Companies (IOC, HPCL and BPCL) for procurement of Biodiesel made from Used Cooking Oil (UCO).





- ❖ A sticker on RUCO (Repurpose Used Cooking Oil) and a mobile app to facilitate the collection of UCOs was also launched.
- ❖ The scheme is being launched in 100 cities across the country.
- ❖ The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India's (FSSAI) has recently instructed the food business operators using more than 50 litres oil a day to stop reusing the oil more than three times.

Iron Ion Batteries - IIT M

- ❖ IIT-Madras researchers have for the first time fabricated a rechargeable iron ion (Fe2+ ions) battery using mild steel as the anode.
- ❖ The iron ion battery is cost-effective and the amount of energy that can be stored in the battery is also high.
- ❖ To produce more electric vehicles, cheaper lithium ion batteries need to be produced.
- ❖ But there are no lithium reserves in India and there is global shortage of lithium reserves.





❖ Therefore, Iron which has favourable physio-chemical properties like lithium can be used for mass production of rechargeable batteries.



Lead in PVC Pipes

- ❖ The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has directed the Union Government to submit a report on standards of lead and to phase out lead as a stabiliser in Polyvinyl Chloride (PVC) pipes.
- ❖ The NGT was earlier informed that water passing through PVC pipes commonly used in most buildings may contain toxic materials like lead.
- ❖ Lead has a hazardous effect on human health.

NASA Mars Mission from Iceland

- ❖ NASA has chosen the Lambahraun lava field in Iceland as the site to prepare for the next mission to Mars in 2020.
- ❖ According to experts, Iceland which is a volcanic island in the middle of the North Atlantic, is in many ways reminiscent of Mars.
- ❖ NASA's upcoming Mars robotic space explorer will be trained on black basalt sands of Iceland.

Bone Implant from Egg Shells

* Researchers from IIT-Hyderabad and Dr. B.R. Ambedkar National Institute of Technology, Jalandhar, have developed a process by which bone implant materials can be synthesised from eggshells.





- Currently damaged and missing bones are replaced with bone from either the patient or a donor or artificial materials containing calcium, such as Plaster of Paris or phosphate compounds.
- ❖ Bio ceramics made from egg shells were used to replace artificial tricalcium phosphate implants (produced by using harmful chemicals).

Pretomanid Tablets - Treating Drug Resistant TB

- ❖ The United States has approved the use of Pretomanid Tablets to treat an extremely drug-resistant strain of tuberculosis.
- ❖ Pretomanid when used in combination with antibiotics bedaquiline and linezolid cured 89% of 107 patients with extensively drug-resistant TB after 6 months.
- ❖ The above three drugs together called BPaL regimen.
- ❖ Because of the new treatment, TB patients who were supposed to take 30 pills a day can now take only 5 pills a day.

HarmonyOs

- Chinese telecom giant Huawei unveiled its own operating system HarmonyOS
- ❖ It is also known as Hongmeng OS in Chinese language.
- ❖ The platform is open source, and it's actually more of a competitor to Google's upcoming Fuchsia.
- ❖ Honor is a smartphone brand owned by Huawei Technologies.
- ❖ Huawei was subjected to export restrictions by the United States government for violations of United States sanctions against Iran.

Parker Solar Probe - Completion of One Year

- On August 12, 2019 NASA's Parker Solar Probe completed a year in service.
- ❖ It is a part of NASA's "Living With a Star" programme that explores different aspects of the Sun-Earth system.
- ❖ The probe seeks to gather information about the Sun's atmosphere.
- ❖ It is the closest a human-made object has ever gone to the Sun.
- One of Parker's main objectives is to investigate why sun's corona is over a million degrees Fahrenheit while the solar layers below are only a few thousand degrees Fahrenheit each.





Biosimilar Medicines

- Dr. Reddy's Laboratories has launched the vital breast cancer treatment drug -Versavo (bevacizumab) in India.
- ❖ It is biosimilar of the internationally used Avastin drug.
- ❖ Biosimilarity means that the biological product is highly similar to the reference product not withstanding minor differences in clinically-inactive components.
- ❖ There are no differences in terms of safety, purity, and potency of the product.

Piggery Development Project - Meghalaya


- ❖ The piggery development project is to be launched in Meghalaya financed by the National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC) along with the State Government.
- ❖ It is expected to boost domestic availability of meat in the entire North Eastern Region and also promote its exports thereby generating employment.
- ❖ Pig farming is very important component in North East India. 28% of India's pigs are grown here.
- ❖ Hampshire, HSX 1, Large White Yorkshire, Duroc and Landrace are the commonly grown breeds.

Chandrayaan -2: In Moon's Orbit

- ❖ On August 20, 2019 Chandrayaan -2 was placed into elliptical orbit around moon.
- ❖ It is now 114 km from the Moon's surface at its nearest and 18,072 km at the farthest.
- Soon it will place itself in a circular orbit of 100 km × 100 km around the Moon.
- Then Lander (Vikram) and Rover (Pragyaan) modules will detach themselves from here and descend into lower orbits before finally making a landing on September 7.








Measuring Inter Planetary Shock

- * Recently, NASA's Magnetospheric Multiscale (MMS) mission made the first high-resolution measurements of an interplanetary shock.
- ❖ Interplanetary shocks are a type of collision-less shock.
- ❖ Here particles transfer energy through electromagnetic fields instead of directly bouncing into one another.
- ❖ These shocks are made of particles and electromagnetic waves, are launched by the Sun.
- ❖ This phenomenon is observed in: supernovae, black holes and distant stars.







Fedor Robot


- * Russia has launched an unmanned rocket carrying life-sized robot to the International Space Station (ISS) from Baikonur cosmodrome in Kazakhstan.
- ❖ The robot is named Fedor (Final Experimental Demonstration Object Research).
- It is the first ever robot sent into space by Russia.



A New Planet for Beta Pictoris

- ❖ Astronomers have announced a new giant planet Beta Pictoris c for the Beta Pictoris system, 60 light-years from Earth.
- ❖ It is the second exoplanet orbiting young debris disk Beta Pictoris.
- ❖ It has a mass around 9 Jupiter masses, and orbits at around 2.7 au from Beta Pictoris.
- ❖ Beta Pictoris is located approximately 63 light-years away from Earth in the constellation of Pictor.
- ❖ Beta Pictoris c was detected indirectly through 10 years of observation of radial velocity data from the High Accuracy Radial Velocity Planet Searcher (HARPS) spectroscope.
- ❖ It is the project of the European Southern Observatory's ESO 3.6 m Telescope at La Silla Observatory in Chile.






World's first space-based automatic identification system (AIS)

- ❖ The world's first space-based automatic identification system (AIS) to track merchant ships on a real-time basis will be built and operated jointly by India and France.
- ❖ French space agency CNES and ISRO signed an agreement recently to start development and production of a constellation of satellites.
- ❖ The constellation carrying telecommunications (AIS), radar and optical remotesensing instruments will be capable of monitoring ships in the Indian Ocean.
- ❖ The satellite-based AIS will significantly boost India's coastal surveillance mechanism and maritime security.
- ❖ The International Maritime Organization's International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea (SOLAS) requires AIS to be fitted aboard all ships of 300 gross tonnage and upwards engaged on international voyages, cargo ships of 500 gross tonnage and upwards not engaged on international voyages and all passenger ships irrespective of the size.
- India has installed a Long-Range Identification and Tracking system (LRIT) for ships as well as a terrestrial-based AIS, but their range and functionality is limited.
- ❖ LRIT can predict the position of a ship every six hours or at least four times a day while the terrestrial-based AIS has a coverage range of 40 nautical miles.





IIT Jodhpur - hydrogen sensor

- ❖ A sensor that can detect hydrogen gas even when present at extremely low concentration of 1 part per million (ppm) has been developed by researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Jodhpur in collaboration with IIT Hyderabad.
- ❖ The sensor has 30% sensitivity to detect hydrogen at 1 ppm concentration and as high as 74% sensitivity when the concentration of the gas is 100 ppm.
- ❖ It takes about 25 seconds to detect hydrogen.
- ❖ Hydrogen gas is a pollution-free, renewable source of energy and is seen as a fuel of choice in the future.
- ❖ However, hydrogen is highly explosive and flammable in nature.
- ❖ It is a small molecule and can readily mix with air but detecting hydrogen gas leakage become quite difficult particularly as it is colourless and tasteless.
- ❖ So, a sensor that can detect it even when present at very low concentration becomes essential.





Waterproofing material using fly ash

- * Researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Hyderabad have developed a cheap waterproofing material by coating fly ash.
- ❖ Fly ash is a waste by-product from coal-based thermal power plants, with stearic acid, which is a surfactant.
- ❖ While fly ash is extremely water-loving (hydrophilic), it turns into a highly water-repelling surface once coated with stearic acid.
- ❖ Fly ash varies in size from 100 nanometres to a few microns and can thus provide surfaces with different roughness based on the size of the particles chosen.
- Stearic acid-coated fly ash surface can be made to behave like rose petals or lotus leaves.

Mars Sun Earth in Same Line: Solar Conjunction

❖ The daily exchange of data between antennas on Earth and those on NASA spacecraft at Mars will be stopped between August 28 to September 7 due to Mars solar conjunction (MSC).




- ❖ During MSC, Mars and Earth will be on opposite sides of the Sun.
- ❖ Sun's hot, ionised gas emitted from its corona can 'interfere' with radio communication between Earth and Mars.
- ❖ So, the spacecraft might show unexpected behaviour and commands will be corrupted.





Images sent by Chandrayaan -2

❖ ISRO has released images of the lunar surface captured by the Terrain Mapping Camera-2 of the Chandrayaan-2 spacecraft orbiting the Moon.



- ❖ The images show impact craters named after various scientists (Arnold) Sommerfeld (Germany), (Daniel) Kirkwood (US), Mitra (India), (Charles) Hermite (France) etc.
- Mitra (1890-1963), born in Bengal, was a physicist and Padma Bhushan winner.
- ❖ The system of nomenclature of lunar features is now standardised.
- ❖ According to a resolution by the International Astronomical Union in 1973,
 - o Crater and crater-like formations: named after astronomers or eminent scientists, posthumously
 - Mountains: named corresponding to the geographical names of mountains of the Earth
 - Extensive dark surfaces: names that correspond to the mental states of humans.


Why No Viral Infections in a Bacteria? - Molecular Scissors

- ❖ Scientists at the Indian Institute of Science Education and Research (IISER), Bhopal have determined the atomic structure of "McrBC".
- ❖ McrBC is a bacterial protein.





- ❖ It functions as a molecular scissor and prevents viral infections in bacteria.
- ❖ This is the first report of the high-resolution structure from India, determined using electron "cryomicroscopy", commonly known as cryo-EM.



Practical Applications

- ❖ The determination of the McrBC's structure has long-term implications in 'phage therapy' and could help combat "drug-resistant infections" in the future.
- ❖ Phages are groups of viruses that infect and kill bacterial cells.

e- cars in Indian Army

- The Indian Army has launched an ecological initiative with employing e-Cars for use of its officials in New Delhi in partnership with Energy Efficiency Services Ltd (EESL).
- ❖ The initiative was officially launched on 01 Aug 2019 with flagging off the first lot of E-Cars for Indian Army.
- ❖ EESL is Super Energy Service Company and leads the market related activities of the National Mission for Enhanced Energy Efficiency.
- ❖ EESL is a joint venture of four national Public-Sector Undertakings.

BS VI Norms Exception

- ❖ The Ministry of Road Transport & Highways has exempted Armoured and Specialised Vehicles of Armed/ Paramilitary Forces from BS-VI Emission Norms.
- ❖ The exemption has been granted due to security challenges and requirements of suitable BS VI engines which would require considerable time to develop.
- Other vehicles exempted:
 - Motor vehicles used for Government purposes relating to the defence of the country
 - Armoured vehicles used for maintenance of law and order and internal security.


Canine Distemper - Dogs to Tigers

- ❖ Wildlife biologists have raised concern about Canine Distemper Virus (CDV).
- ❖ It is a potential virus that can be transmitted from CDV-infected dogs living in wildlife sanctuaries to tigers.
- ❖ It is caused by a single-stranded RNA virus of the family Paramyxoviridae.
- ❖ It is similar to the measles virus in humans.
- ❖ There is no cure for canine distemper infection.
- ❖ Treatment typically consists of supportive care and efforts to prevent infections.
- ❖ In 2018, over 20 lions from the Gir forest have succumbed to the CDV infection.

Greenland lost 11 billion tons of ice

- ❖ The heat wave that smashed high temperature is recorded in five polar European countries.
- ❖ It is accelerating the melting of the ice sheet and causing massive ice loss in the Arctic.
- ❖ More than 11 billion tons of ice was lost to the oceans by surface melt on July 31st alone due to high temperature (21°C) from Greenland.
- ❖ This would be enough to permanently increase the world's sea levels by 0.1 mm.
- ❖ While the melt from the ice sheets in July contributed to a rise of half a millimetre in global sea levels.
- ❖ Greenland, the world's largest island, is a semi-autonomous Danish territory between the Atlantic and Arctic oceans that has 82% of its surface covered in ice.





Advanced Air Pollution Predictors

- * Researchers from China and the U.S. have developed a novel computer model that can help accurately "predict" air pollution levels in the region, a season in advance.
- ❖ The statistical model uses certain climatic patterns related to the oceans.
- ❖ Oceans have a regulatory effect on the wintertime air pollution over northern India.
- ❖ The study found that levels of wintertime aerosol pollution over northern India is regulated mainly by a combination of
 - El Nino a climate cycle in the Pacific Ocean with a global impact on weather patterns
 - o Antarctic Oscillation (AAO) a low frequency mode of atmospheric variability of the southern hemisphere.
- ❖ The new model could allow the government to forecast aerosol pollution conditions in winter and accordingly improve plans for pollution control.

Arctic Wildfires

- Wildfires ravaging parts of the Arctic are threatening to accelerate the melting of ice and permafrost (the permanently frozen ground layer).
- ❖ This will release greenhouse gases stored for thousands of years.
- * The magnitude of wild fires is the highest than any other in the 16-year record.





- ❖ Scientists warn that the forest fires will ignite peat fires.
- ❖ Peat stores large amounts of carbon, which on burning releases record amounts of carbon dioxide (CO2) into the atmosphere.

World Water Crisis

- ❖ According to new data from the World Resources Institute (WRI), 1/4 of the world's population faces huge water stress, with bulk of them living in India.
- ❖ Irrigated agriculture, industries, and municipalities withdraw more than 80% of their available supply on average every year.
- ❖ 17 countries are facing withdrawals of 80% or more from available supply. India is 13th among these 17 countries.
- ❖ Groundwater tables in Northern India aquifers declined at a rate of more than 8 cm per year between 1990 and 2014.
- ❖ The Aqueduct tool used by the World Resources Institute (WRI) ranks countries on the basis of "water risk scores", which are determined using 13 indicators of water risk.



India's Proposals to CITES

- India has submitted proposals regarding changes to the listing of various wildlife species in the CITES LIST.
- ❖ CITES (Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species on Wild Fauna and Flora) is an international treaty to ensure that trade in wild animals and plants do not threaten their survival.





❖ It aims to boost the protection of all the following animal species as they are facing a high risk of international trade.

Species

- Tokay gecko
- Wedgefish

Indian star tortoise

- ❖ India also proposed re-listing of the star tortoise from CITES Appendix II to Appendix I.
- The species faces two threats
 - Loss of habitat to agriculture
 - o Illegal harvesting for the pet trade

Smooth-coated otter and Small-clawed otter

❖ Proposed that the listing be moved from CITES Appendix II to Appendix I for the more endangered species.

Indian rosewood

❖ For the Indian rosewood, the proposal is to remove the species from CITES Appendix II.

Irrigation and Changing Rainfall Patterns

- ❖ For the first time, researchers from IIT- Bombay have found that even a change in irrigation policy has
 - o potential to shift monsoon rainfall to North Western India.
 - o intensify extreme rainfall in Central India.

How it works?

- ❖ During the month of September, agriculture lands are 'highly irrigated' and the crops are matured.
- ❖ As a result, there is maximum evapotranspiration taking place, leading to highest contribution of moisture from the land to the atmosphere.
- ❖ As a result of increased moisture, rainfall pattern and intensity has increased.
- ❖ This study was based on land-surface model specifically taking into account Indian irrigation and agriculture system.
- The study did not cover southern India.





Tiger Census 2018

- ❖ The tiger census did not register any presence of the striped big cat in Buxa Tiger Reserve (TR) in West Bengal, Palamu TR in Jharkhand and Dampa TR in Mizoram.
- ❖ The report, Status of Tigers Co-predators & Prey in India 2018, was released by Prime Minister on 2019 July 29th of the International Tiger Day.
- ❖ In the Status report of 2014, the tiger population of Buxa, Palamu and Dampa stood at 2 (Bauxa TR), 3 (Dampa TR) and 3 (Palamu TR).


National Policy on Efficient Management of Resources

- ❖ The Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change (MoEFCC) has brought out the National Draft Policy on Efficient Management of Resources.
- The policy aims to achieve the following goals
 - o 100 per cent recycling of PET plastic by 2025
 - A total ban on disposal of any recyclable waste (plastic, metal, wood) into landfills by 2025
 - 90 per cent recycling of all vehicles made after 2000 that have reached the end-life stage
- ❖ For the first time in India, it introduces the idea of "extended producer responsibility"- i.e placing responsibility for a product's end-of-life environmental impacts on 'producers'.

First Global Analysis of Nematodes

- ❖ According to the first global analysis of nematodes published in the journal Nature, there are about 57 billion nematodes for every human being on Earth.
- ❖ These nematodes play a crucial role in the environment as they are responsible for production of about 19% of ammonia of the soil.
- ❖ They are responsible for 2.2% of the total carbon emission from soils.
- ❖ Sub-Arctic regions have the highest abundance of nematodes followed by Temperate and Tropical regions.





PET Bottles

- ❖ A comprehensive evaluation by the CSIR-Central Food Technological Research Institute (CFRTI), Mysore has determined that PET (Polyethylene Terephthalate) bottles are safe.
- ❖ The CFRTI analysis concluded that antimony, arsenic, barium, cadmium, chromium, cobalt, lead, mercury, selenium and zinc "were below" their detection limits (BDL) of 0.001 mg/kg.

Decline in Global Freshwater Animals

❖ International team of Scientists have now quantified the global decline of big freshwater animals.



- ❖ From 1970 to 2012, global populations of freshwater megafauna declined by 88 percent twice the loss of vertebrate populations on land or in the ocean.
- ❖ Large fish species are particularly threatened. Ex: sturgeons, salmons, giant catfishes.





- ❖ The baiji, a Chinese river dolphin, is likely the first dolphin species driven to extinction by humans.
- The two main threats are:
 - Overexploitation
 - Loss of free-flowing rivers

Geographical Indication (GI) Tag

- ❖ The Ministry of Commerce & Industry's Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade has registered 3 more new Geographical Indication (GI) tags.
- ❖ These are Tirur betel Leaf, Tawlhlohpuan and Mizo Puanchei.
- ❖ GI is an indication used on products that have a specific geographical origin and possess the qualities or reputation that are due to that origin.
- ❖ Tirur betel Leaf (Kerala) is valued both for its mild stimulant action and medicinal properties.
- ❖ Tawlhlohpuan (Mizoram) is compactly woven fabric from Mizoram.
- Mizo Puanchei (Mizoram) is colourful Mizo shawl. It is important and an essential possession for every Mizo lady.











Stubble Burning

- ❖ Burning of paddy crop residue declined by 41 per cent last year over 2016-level in Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and Delhi-NCR.
- ❖ It was done through the various efforts under the Central Sector Scheme on 'Promotion of Agricultural Mechanization for In-Situ Management of Crop Residue in the State of Punjab, Haryana, Uttar Pradesh and NCT of Delhi'.
- ❖ Happy Seeder/Zero Tillage Technology, which is a tractor-mounted device, has the capability to cut and lift the previous crop (ex- rice straw) and sow a new (wheat) crop in its place.
- ❖ Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) is implementing this scheme through its Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVKs).
- ❖ Crop residue burning in north-west India contributes to air pollution, health hazards, disruption of transportation, school closures and soil degradation.

KVK (Krishi Vigyan Kendra)

- Krishi Vigyan Kendra is a district level farm science centre which can help in speedy transfer of technology to the farmer's field by building bridges between SAUs/ research institutes and the farmers.
- The first KVK was established at Puducherry on 21st of March 1974.
 - Total KVK (India)= 634 (ICAR)
 - KVK (Jharkhand)= 16 (BAU)
 - Others = 7 (NGOs)

Largest Anthropogenic So2 Emitter - India

- ❖ According to NASA data and environmental NGO Greenpeace, India is the world's largest emitter of anthropogenic sulphur dioxide, which is produced from coal burning.
- ❖ India has more than 15% of all anthropogenic sulphur dioxide (SO2) hotspots in the world detected by the OMI (Ozone Monitoring Instrument) satellite.
- ❖ The Norilsk smelter complex in Russia being the largest SO2 emission hotspot in the world.
- ❖ But according to country-wise world rankings, India was found at the top position in emitting SO2 as it has the maximum hotspots.
- ❖ Tamilnadu is the highest emitter of anthropogenic sulphur dioxide, generated chiefly from coal fired power plants. Chennai is ranked 29 in world.





First Dead Glacier of Iceland - Okjokull Glacier

- ❖ Okjokull is the first Icelandic glacier to lose its status as glacier.
- ❖ What once was glacier now that has been reduced to a small patch of ice atop a volcano.
- ❖ It was officially declared dead in 2014 at the age of 700 when it was no longer thick enough to move.
- ❖ In Iceland, the loss of Okjokull glacier was commemorated by people with a plaque.

Illegal Trade in Tiger

- ❖ A new report by Traffic, an environmental NGO has quantified the illegal global trade in tigers and tiger parts over a 19-year period between 2000 and 2018.
- ❖ Although Tigers are listed in Appendix I of CITES recent years have revealed an increase in tiger captive breeding to fuel demand for various tiger products.
- ❖ All commercial international trade in animals listed in Appendix I of CITES is banned.
- ❖ The top three countries with the highest number of seizure incidents were India (625), followed by China and Indonesia.
- ❖ In terms of various body parts seized, India had the highest share among countries for tiger skins (38%), bones (28%) and claws and teeth (42%).

Harmful Nitrates - Girl Infants

- ❖ In a new World Bank report about water pollution worldwide, one aspect covered is the "long-term impact of nitrate exposure" experienced during infancy.
- ❖ Nitrate levels in groundwater aquifers in India exceeded permissible levels in more than 50 % of the districts across 19 states.
- ❖ An infant girl who has been exposed to nitrate levels above the safety threshold in the first three years of life experiences a 1-2 cm decrease in her adult height.
- ❖ Female adult height had increased by approximately 4 cm over the last century in India.
- ❖ Nitrate exposure will wipe out almost half of this gain in height.

Amazon Forest Fires

- ❖ The Amazon rainforest has been burning at a rate which has alarmed environmentalists and governments worldwide.
- ❖ Amazon has lost more than 344,500 hectares of forest cover between January and June 2019.
- ❖ Brazil's current Far-right President, Jair Bolsonaro has been blamed for encouraging wide spread tree-clearing activities for agriculture and mining.
- ❖ Though forest fires are common in Amazon between the July October dry season, most of them are due to natural reasons.
- ❖ Amazon rainforests are important because
 - o It produces 20 per cent of the oxygen in the Earth's atmosphere.
 - o It influences the water cycle on a global scale not just regional scale.
 - o An area of rich biodiversity and home to indigenous communities whose live is now under threat.







Global Coal Usage

- ❖ According to the findings of International Energy Agency (IEA) and 2019 BP Statistical Review, Asia is the world's largest producer and consumer of coal, accounting for 75 % of global demand.
- China is the world's largest consumer of Coal, followed by India, Japan and South Korea.

India's Air Quality Monitoring Sensors

- ❖ The Union Environment Ministry has tasked the CSIR–National Physical Laboratory with 'certifying' air quality monitoring instruments.
- ❖ The National Clean Air Campaign was launched in 2019 to reduce particulate matter (PM) pollution by 20%-30% in at least 102 cities by 2024.
- ❖ This has increased demand for low cost air quality monitoring instruments that can monitor levels of nitrous oxides, ozone and particulate matter.
- ❖ Delhi has maximum number of air quality sensors around 35.

CoP-18 on CITES at Geneva

- ❖ The Eighteenth Conference of the Parties (CoP-18) of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES) was recently held in Geneva.
- ❖ It was decided to move the smooth-coated otter (Lutrogale perspicillata) from CITES Appendix II to CITES Appendix I.
- ❖ The Tokay gecko (Gekko gecko) will be included in CITES Appendix II.
- ❖ The Indian star tortoise was upgraded to CITES Appendix I, giving it the highest level of international protection from commercial trade.

Plastic to Waste - IIP, Dehradun

- ❖ CSIR- Indian Institute of Petroleum (IIP) has set up a waste plastic to diesel plant in Dehradun, Uttarakhand as a step towards eradicating plastic.
- The plant has a capacity to produce 800-litre diesel from 1 tonne of plastic.
- ❖ On August 2018, India's first ever biofuel jet ran on biofuel produced by CSIR-IIP.





❖ Located at Dehradun, this institute was founded in 1960 and dedicated to R & D in in hydrocarbon sector.

Rejuvenation of Degraded Land: 50 lakh hectares

- Union Environment Minister Prakash Javadekar announced that India has committed to rejuvenate 50 lakh hectares (5 million) of degraded land between 2021 and 2030.
- ❖ About 29% (about 96.4 million hectares) are considered degraded in India.
- ❖ In January 2019, India became part of the "Bonn Challenge".
- ❖ Bonn Challenge is a global effort to bring 150 million hectares of the world's deforested and degraded land into restoration by 2020, and 350 million hectares by 2030.

Gooty Tarantula Spiders - Gingee, TN

- ❖ Gooty Tarantula spiders which is endemic to Eastern Ghats was spotted for the first time beyond its known habitat. (original habitat: Nandyala, Andhra Pradesh)
- ❖ It was spotted at in the Pakkamalai Reserve Forests near Gingee in Villupuram district.
- Scientific Name: Poecilotheria metallica Common Name: Peacock Parachute Spider
- IUCN Status: Critically endangered







STATES

AMBIS Biometric Criminal Tracking System in Mumbai

- ❖ A state-of-the-art tracking system for criminals arrested in Mumbai was launched.
- ❖ Named AMIBS (The Automated Multimodal Biometric Identification System) it is first of its kind to be used by a police force in India.
- ❖ AMBIS is connected to a central server and stores photographs, fingerprints and retinal scans of all criminals of record.
- ❖ It helps in identifying suspects at the click of a mouse and providing information about criminal elements to other police forces, be it within the country or abroad.

Mobile Library Buses in Delhi

- ❖ The Union Minister of State for Culture and Tourism has launched Mobile Library Buses in New Delhi.
- ❖ They were procured under (Corporate Social Responsibility) CSR assistance from Airports Authority of India.
- ❖ The Mobile Library Buses were launched under the "Ghar Ghar Dastak Ghar Ghar Pustak" Scheme of the Delhi Public Library (DPL).
- ❖ Under this scheme, DPL aims to provide books to the citizens of Delhi, especially, the residents of slums, resettlement colonies and rural areas.
- ❖ DPL is a national library established in 1951 with the aid Of UNESCO and Union Government.

The Jammu and Kashmir Reservation (Amendment) Bill, 2019

- ❖ The Jammu and Kashmir Reservation (Amendment) Bill, 2019 has been passed by both Houses of Parliament.
- ❖ The Bill amends the Jammu and Kashmir Reservation Act, 2004 and replaces an Ordinance promulgated on March 1, 2019.
- ❖ The Bill now extends reservation in appointment and promotions in certain state government posts to persons belonging to socially and educationally backward classes for those persons living in areas adjoining the International Border also.
- ❖ Earlier only people living in areas adjoining the Actual Line of Control were eligible for reservation.






- ❖ In the 2004 Act, people who live in areas adjoining the Actual Line of Control and earning more than 3 lakhs were not eligible for reservation.
- ❖ The amendment extends the provision to people living in areas adjoining the International Border also.

Assam's Maijan Gold Tea - New world record

- ❖ A rare variety of tea in Assam was auctioned for Rs. 70, 501 a kg at the Guwahati Tea Auction Centre (GTAC).
- ❖ Orthodox Golden Tips, from the Maijan tea estate, smashed the record set by another specialty tea-the Manohari Gold-that was sold for Rs. 50,000 at the same auction.
- ❖ The specialty tea comes from the Maijan garden in Assam's Dibrugarh district.
- ❖ The garden is owned by the Assam Company India, the oldest tea company in the world.

Kosi-Mechi River Interlinking Project

- ❖ Union Government has approved Rs 4,900 crore Kosi-Mechi Interlinking project for interlinking of Kosi and Mechi rivers of Bihar.
- ❖ This is the second major river interlinking project in the country to be approved by government after the Ken-Betwa project in Madhya Pradesh.



- * The project is expected to
 - o Relieve North Bihar (especially Seemanchal region) from menace of recurring floods
 - o Irrigate 2.14 lakh hectares of command areas





Rajasthan Honour Killing and Mob Lynching Bill

- ❖ The Rajasthan Prohibition of Interference with the Freedom of Matrimonial Alliances in the Name of Honour and Tradition Bill, 2019 was passed by the Rajasthan government.
- ❖ It aims to curb incidents of 'honour killing' and mob lynching in the State.
- ❖ Provisions have been made for death penalty or life imprisonment for murdering couples in the name of family honour.
- ❖ Manipur was the first state to pass a law in December, 2018 curbing lynching cases. Now Rajasthan became the 2nd state.

Haryana Control of Organised Crime Bill, 2019

- ❖ The Haryana Assembly passed the Haryana Control of Organised Crime Bill, 2019.
- ❖ The bill aims to make special provisions for prevention and control of criminal activity by organised crime syndicates.
- ❖ It empowers the state government with powers to intercept wire, electronic or oral communication to control crimes.

Uniform Civil Code in Goa

- ❖ The Goa government has announced that it would amend the Portuguese-era Uniform Civil Code (UCC) so as to allow non-Goans register their marriages in the state.
- Registration of marriage of non-Goans is currently banned in Goa.
- ❖ UCC was introduced in goa in the year 1870 by the erstwhile Portuguese rulers.
- ❖ It was retained even after the territory was merged with India in the year 1961.
- ❖ In 1987 Goa was made a separate State.

Tripura - National Liberation Front of Twipra

- ❖ A peace agreement was signed between Government of India, State government of Tripura and Tripura's banned insurgency group National Liberation Front of Twipra (NLFT-SD) led by Sabir Kumar Debbarma.
- ❖ As per the agreement NLFT-SD has agreed to abjure path of violence and join mainstream.





- ❖ NLFT has been banned under Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) since 1997.
- ❖ The surrendered cadres will be given surrender benefits as per 'Scheme for Surrender-cum-Rehabilitation of Militants in the North-East, 2018' of Ministry of Home Affairs.

Tribal Welfare measures in Madhya Pradesh

- ❖ The State government in Madhya Pradesh will provide debit cards with an 'overdraft limit' of Rs 10,000 to every tribal
- ❖ It also announced that the all loans taken by tribals from local money lenders will be waived.
- ❖ From now on, every tribal family in Madhya Pradesh will be given 50kg foodgrains in case of a birth and 100kg in case of death in the family.
- ❖ A museum in the memory of tribal kings Shankar Shah and Raghunath Shah will be built at Jabalpur.

Gogabeel Lake

- ❖ Gogabeel, an ox-bow lake in Bihar's Katihar district, has been declared as the state's first 'Community Reserve'.
- ❖ Gogabeel is formed from the flow of the rivers Mahananda and Kankhar in the north and the Ganga in the south and east.
- ❖ In 2004, Gogabeel, including the neighbouring Baghar Beel and Baldia Chaur, were given the status of an IBA (Important Bird Area of India) by the IBCN (Indian Bird Conservation Network).

Reservation in Chhattisgarh

- Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel announced an increase in reservations for OBCs and Scheduled Castes in state government jobs and education.
- ❖ It will make Chhattisgarh to have a total of 72 % reservation (32 % for STs, 13 % for SCs and 27 % to OBCs).
- ❖ This makes it the highest reservation in the country and far above the 50 % cap on quotas mandated by the Supreme Court.





India's first underwater train - Kolkatta

- ❖ India's first underwater train project in Kolkata is almost complete.
- * The rail route is under Hubli river.
- ❖ This 16-kilometer long Kolkata Metro project will connect Salt Sector 5 with Howrah Maidan.



Small Savings Incentive Scheme - Odisha

- ❖ Odisha government has launched a novel Small Savings Incentive Scheme.
- ❖ People can deposit a minimum amount of Rs. 2,000/- in any post office or bank within Odisha.
- ❖ They will be issued a free web-based coupon from the office of the Collectors, Sub Collectors and BDOs.
- Lucky draw will be held and people will be given gifts so as to encourage small savings and protect people from loan sharks and money lenders.

Mukhya Mantri Krishi Ashirwad Yojana - Jharkhand

- ❖ Vice President Venkaiah Naidu inaugurated the Mukhya Mantri Krishi Ashirwad Yojana in Jharkhand.
- ❖ It aims to benefit over 13.5 lakh farmers:
 - o farmers holding land of an acre or less would be eligible for receiving Rs 5,000.
 - o farmers with five acres of land would be eligible to receive Rs 25,000 in two fixed instalments.





❖ This is the first scheme initiated by the state in which 100 per cent settlement would be through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) medium.

Bunker Museum

- ❖ President Ram Nath Kovind inaugurated the underground Bunker Museum at Raj Bhavan in Mumbai.
- ❖ The bunker dates back to the pre-World War I era.
- ❖ Earlier, the President also unveiled the foundation stone for the proposed reconstruction of Jal Bhushan, the Governor's office-cum-residential building.
- ❖ Jal Bhushan has a history of nearly 200 years.



UP Tree Planation Drive

- ❖ The Uttar Pradesh government set a world record by planting over 22 crore saplings in a day on the 77th anniversary of the Quit India Movement.
- ❖ During the state-wide plantation drive 'Vriksharopan Mahakumbh', five crore saplings were planted in one hour.
- ❖ The state has entered the Guinness World Records for distributing 76,823 saplings simultaneously in six hours.
- ❖ The UP's chief minister also launched the plantation drive by planting 'Harishankari', which is a combination of peepal, pakar and banyan planted together.





Jung-e-Azadi Memorial

- ❖ On the eve of the 73rd Independence Day, Chief Minister Capt Amarinder Singh inaugurated the third phase of Jung-e-Azadi Memorial at Kartarpur near Jalandhar.
- ❖ The third phase is dedicated to the martyrs of the Jallianwala Bagh massacre and the unsung heroes who were incarcerated in Andaman Cellular Jail during freedom struggle.
- ❖ Punjab government's 'Connect with Your Roots' programme, helps youth visiting as part of programme to personally see rich cultural legacy of state at Jung-E-Azadi Memorial, Partition Museum at Amritsar and Virasat-E-Khalsa (Anandpur Sahib city).



Aadi Mahotsav

- ❖ Aadi Mahotsav or National Tribal Festival will be organised at Polo Ground, Leh-Ladakh.
- It aims to boost tribal economy in Ladakh.





- ❖ It is being held at Ladakh for the first time.
- ❖ It is a joint initiative of Union Ministry of Tribal Affairs and Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation of India (TRIFED).
- ❖ Theme of festival: A celebration of the spirit of Tribal Craft, Culture and Commerce.
- Ladakh is known for pashmina shawls and apricots.
- ❖ In Ladakh tribals make up 70% of population.

New Education Model

- ❖ A new higher education model has been launched in Rajasthan.
- ❖ It is titled Resource Assistance for Colleges with Excellence (RACE).
- ❖ It aims for the distribution of faculties and movable assets among the government colleges at the district level to rationalise the availability of resources.

Madhya Pradesh - Latest Legislative Council

- ❖ The Madhya Pradesh government has indicated that it plans to initiate steps towards creation of a Legislative Council.
- Currently, six states have Legislative Councils.
- ❖ Jammu and Kashmir too had one, until bifurcation.


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Chilika and Ansupa lakes - Odisha

UP

- ❖ The Odisha Wetland Authority has approved implementation of an integrated management plan to conserve two of its largest lakes.
 - Chilika India's largest brackish water lagoon, famous for its endangered
 Irrawaddy dolphins and migratory birds during winter.
 - o Ansupa Odisha's largest freshwater lake, famous for sweet water fish. It is also wintering ground for 32 species of migratory birds.







Kutch Desert - A Former Tropical Forest

- ❖ A team of Indian and French researchers have concluded that the hot arid desert of Kutch was once a humid sub-tropical forest with a variety of birds, freshwater fish and possibly giraffes and rhinos.
- ❖ Their conclusions are based on the discovery of a tranche of vertebrate fossils from nearly 14 million years ago in a geological period known as the Miocene.
- ❖ The fossils were found at a place called Palasava.
- ❖ The findings point to clues on how mammals dispersed between Africa and the Indian subcontinent nearly 300 million years ago.

Amazon at Hyderabad

- ❖ Amazon has opened its largest campus in the world in Hyderabad.
- ❖ The campus covers 1.8 million square feet and can accommodate 15,000 workers.
- ❖ This is Amazon's first owned-building outside of the US and is also its largest tech base outside the Seattle headquarters.

Highest ever rainfall in 70 years

- ❖ Himachal Pradesh received the highest ever rainfall for a 24-hour period, since records began almost 70 years ago.
- ❖ The state as a whole received 102.5 mm and this was 1,065 per cent more than normal for this day.
- ❖ The highest rainfall of 252 mm was recorded in Bilaspur district, which was 2,586 per cent more than its normal level.

Women Government Drivers

- ❖ The Kerala government has decided to appoint women drivers in government departments and public sector undertakings.
- ❖ This is the first time any state government has decided to allow women to drive government vehicles.





Google and Telangana

- ❖ The Telangana Government has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Google India for 'Digital Telangana'.
- ❖ The MoU will improve and get more local language content online using Google's digital publishing tool "Navlekha".
- ❖ Google would provide support to overall digitalisation drive of the state.

Karnataka suspends Golden Chariot

❖ The Karnataka State government has temporarily suspended the operation of South India's only luxury train - the Golden Chariot.



- The service has been stopped due to heavy loss.
- ❖ It connects the important tourist spots in the Indian states of Karnataka, Goa, Kerala & Tamil Nadu as well as Pondicherry.
- ❖ It is named after the Stone Chariot in the Vitthala Temple at Hampi.
- ❖ The train, along with the Deccan Odyssey, is designed on the lines of the more popular Palace on Wheels.

Ravish Kumar - Magsaysay Award

- ❖ NDTV journalist Ravish Kumar has been honoured with the 2019 Ramon Magsaysay Award.
- He was awarded for "harnessing journalism to give voice to the voiceless" and his "unfaltering commitment to a professional, ethical journalism of the highest standards"
- ❖ Magsaysay is the highest honour given to Asian individuals and organizations and often referred to as the Asian version of the Nobel Prize.
- Other Awardees:



World Debating Championship

- ❖ An Indian team emerged world champion at the World Debating Championships 2019, defeating Canada.
- ❖ The five-member Indian team includes Tejas Subramaniam (PSBB School), Chennai.
- ❖ The tournament, which was held in Thailand, saw 600 participants from 64 nations, and the Indian team reportedly did not lose a single round.
- ❖ After an elaborate selection process, the five students were chosen by the Indian Schools Debating Society (ISDS) and trained for months.





Sushma Swaraj passed away

- ❖ Former External Affairs Minister Sushma Swaraj, 67 who is appreciated for brining empathy and human approach to India's diplomacy has passed away.
- ❖ Ms. Swaraj had many firsts to her credit
 - o India's youngest-ever Cabinet Minister of Haryana State (Aged 25 in the year 1977)
 - o First woman Chief Minister of Delhi in 1998
 - o First woman spokesperson for any national political party
 - Second woman to hold the External Affairs Minister (2014-19) after Indira Gandhi.
 - o Indian Parliament's first and the only female MP honoured with the Outstanding Parliamentarian Award.
 - BJP's first female Chief Minister, Union Cabinet Minister, general secretary, Spokesperson, Leader of Opposition and Minister of External Affairs.
 - Second Female to the Office of Leader of opposition in the Lok Sabha (2009-14) after Sonia Gandhi (1999-2004).






- ❖ This award is to recognize and reward journalists who have actively contributed towards the field of space science, applications, and research.

❖ The book was released in Chennai at a function organized by Information and Broadcasting Ministry.

Vikram Sara Bhai - 100th Birth Anniversary

- ❖ Google celebrated the 100th birth anniversary of scientist and innovator Vikram Sarabhai on August 12th, with a doodle.
- ❖ The lander on India's moon mission Chandrayaan II which will finally land near the South Pole of the moon on September 20, 2019 is named Vikram in his honour.

- He was the founder Chairman of Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) from 1963 to 1972.
- ❖ He was also the Founder and Chairman (1963–1971) of Space Applications Centre at Ahmedabad.

- On the other hand, Manish Narwal finished with silver with bettering his own junior finals World Record.
- ❖ In women's 10m air pistol final, Nisha Kanwar clinched gold medal.
- ❖ Her teammate, Rubina Francis took bronze.

Vinesh Phogat - Wrestling Tournament

- ❖ Indian Wrestler Vinesh Phogat won gold in women's 53kg category at Poland Open wrestling tournament in Warsaw (capital of Poland).
- ❖ She defeated wrestler Roksana of Poland in finals of competition.
- ❖ This is her 3rd consecutive gold in women's 53kg category after Spain and Turkey.



Transgenders Cricketers in Australia

- Cricket Australia has announced new transgender inclusive policy.
- ❖ This policy will enable transgender players to play the game of cricket at the highest levels.
- ❖ The decision is in accordance with the International Cricket Council's (ICC) gender recognition policy and gender diversity guidelines.
- ❖ Australia has set out a testosterone limit for transgender and gender-diverse players who want to play for state and national women's teams.





BCCI – National Anti-Doping Agency

- ❖ The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has agreed to come under the ambit of the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA).
- ❖ Till now, Sweden-based International Dope Testing Management (IDTM) was collecting cricketers' samples on behalf of BCCI and submitting them to the National Dope Testing Laboratory (NDTL).
- ❖ NADA will now collect samples of all cricketers during domestic tournaments, bilateral series, IPL Tournament.

About

- NADA was established in 2005 as registered society under Societies Registration Act of 1890 with a mandate for 'dope free' sports in India.
- ❖ It is responsible for promoting, monitoring and coordinating doping control program in sports in all its forms in India.

Hasim Amla retirement

- ❖ The South African Cricket player Hashim Amla has retired from all international cricket.
- ❖ Hashim Amla is the only South African to score a triple century in a Test and First South African batsman to score 25 centuries in ODIs.
- ❖ In June 2014, Amla became South Africa's first permanent non-white Test captain.
- ❖ Three days before South African fast bowler Dale Steyn also announced his retirement from Test Cricket.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

Tests

- Posted an unbeaten 311 off
 529 balls vs England at The Oval in July 2012 — the only triple hundred by a South African batsman in Tests.
- His best series in terms of run-aggregate was in 2009-10 in India, scoring 490 in three innings (two Tests) at an average of 490.00, including three centuries. His three consecutive hundreds being 253 not out at Nagpur and 114 & 123 not out at Kolkata.
- He has amassed 1,000 runs or more three times in a calendar

year — 1249 (ave.78.06) in 11 Tests in 2010; 1161 (ave.52.77) in 15 Tests in 2008 and 1064 (ave.70.93) in 10 Tests in 2012.

- ❖ He won gold at the Junior World Championships in Talinn, Estonia.

Ultimate Table Tennis Title

- ❖ Chennai Lions got victory over Dabang Delhi to clinch the Ultimate Table Tennis crown in New Delhi.
- ❖ The Chennai team was spearheaded by Sharath Kamal, a professional table tennis player from Tamil Nadu.



Junior Track Cycling World Championships

- ❖ The Indian junior cyclists clinched their first-ever gold in the men's team sprint medal at the Junior Track Cycling World Championships in Frankfurt, Germany.
- The trio of Esow Alben, Ronaldo and Rojit Singh Yanglem landed the historic gold medal for India.
- ❖ With the team sprint win, India registered its first-ever cycling gold at the world level.
- ❖ Esow Alben also added two medals already in this tournament by winning silver in the Men's Sprint individual event and by winning bronze in the men's keirin final.





Para Swimmer Satendra Singh Lohia

- ❖ Indian Para Swimmer Satendra Singh Lohia has become the first Asian to cross the Catalina Channel of America.
- ❖ He also holds the Asian record of crossing both the English and Catalina channels.
- ❖ He led the Indian Para Relay team along with 5 teammates and crossed the Catalina Channel and covered the distance of 42 km in 11 hours 34 minutes.

3rd Nation's Cup 2019

- ❖ India's junior women boxers' team has clinched 12 medals at the 3rd Nation's Cup 2019 held in Serbia.
- ❖ It includes 4 gold, 4 silver and 4 bronze medals.
- ❖ The gold medal winner, Tamanna won the 'Best Foreign Boxer' award.

- ❖ Navneeth Murali, an Indian-American teenager from New Jersey, has won the 2019 South Asian Spelling Bee contest.
- ❖ The South Asian Spelling Bee (SASB) is an annual spelling bee platform in the US for children of South Asian descent.
- ❖ The competition is open to any student at or below the age of 14, who has at least one parent or grandparent who is of South Asian descent, or whose lineage can be traced to Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Nepal, Pakistan, and/or Sri Lanka.







PV Sindhu - BWF World Championships

- ❖ PV Sindhu defeated Japan's Nozomi Okuhara 21-7, 21-7 in the women's singles final to become the first Indian to win Gold at the BWF World Championships.
- ❖ This is Sindhu's fifth medal at the World Championships. (1 gold, 2 bronze, 2 silver)
- ❖ This record is the joint highest in women's singles in the history of the tournament along with Xhang Ning of China, a two-time Olympic gold medallist.
- ❖ In men's category, Sai Praneeth won the Bronze medal.



First Substitute Player in Test Match

- ❖ In the second Ashes cricket Test match (2019), Marnus Labuschagne of Australia became the first ever "concussion substitute" player for Steve Smith.
- ❖ He is also the first ever 'substitute player' to bat in a Test innings.
- ❖ ICC approved such a move in July 2019.

About concussion

❖ A Concussion temporarily affects brain functioning.





❖ Symptoms: Loss of consciousness, memory loss, headaches, difficulty with thinking and concentration or balance, nausea, blurred vision, sleep disturbances and mood changes.

129th Durand Cup - Kerala Team Wins

- ❖ Gokulam Kerala FC won Durand Cup 2019 football tournament by beating West Bengal's Mohun Bagan team in final held at Salt Lake Stadium in Kolkata.
- ❖ This was Gokulam Kerala FC's debut season.
- ❖ Golden Ball & Golden Boot award was won by Gokulam Kerala FC forward and captain Marcus Joseph.
- ❖ Golden Glove was won by the same team's goalkeeper CK Ubaid.
- ❖ Durand Cup or Durand Football Tournament is a football tournament in India founded in 1888.
- ❖ It is Asia's oldest football tournament and 3rd oldest football tournament in world.
- It is co-hosted by Durand Football Tournament Society (DFTS) and Osians.

Shooting World Cup - Elavenil Valarivan

- ❖ India's Elavenil Valarivan grabbed the Gold medal in the ISSF World Cup tournament.
- ❖ She secured top spot in the 10-metre Air Rifle category (Women) in the tournament.
- ❖ The competition took place in Rio de janeiro in Brazil.
- ❖ Elavenil hails from Cuddalore in Tamil Nadu.







❖ Elavenil has won a Gold in the ISSF Junior World Cup tournament in 2018.

Manasi Joshi - Para Badminton

- Manasi Joshi has won the BWF Para Badminton World Championships.
- ❖ The tournament is held at Basel in Switzerland.
- ❖ Joshi had previously won a bronze in the 2017 edition.
- ❖ Overall, India has bagged 12 medals in the BWF Para Badminton World Championships.
- ❖ Manasi became the first Indian to win the gold at the BWF World Champion.

Vismaya – 400m gold

- ❖ Vismaya clocked 52.12 seconds to clinch a gold in women's 400m run at the International Athletic Meeting.
- ❖ M.P.Jabir won the men's 400m hurdles.
- ❖ The event is held at Brno, Czech Republic.
- ❖ Men: 400m hurdles: M.P. Jabir (49.86s).
- ❖ Women's 400m:
 - 1. V.K. Vismaya (52.12s)
 - 2. M.R. Poovamma (53.47s)
 - 3. V. Subha (53.67s).





IMPORTANT DAYS

Scout Scarf Day - August 01

- ❖ Scout Scarf Day is observed around the world on August 01.
- ❖ The date of the event commemorates the very first Scout Camp on Brown sea Island in 1907.
- ❖ It encourages current and former scouts to wear their scarves in pride as a symbol of the Scout's promise and the spirit of Scouting.



World Breastfeeding Week - August 1 to 7

- ❖ World Breastfeeding Week (WBW) is annually held from 1 to 7 August.
- ❖ It aims to promote exclusive breastfeeding for the first six months of life which has huge health benefits.







- ❖ It is jointly organized by World Alliance for Breastfeeding Action, WHO (World Health Organization) and UNICEF.
- ❖ It was first celebrated in 1992 and is now annually observed in more than 100 countries.
- ❖ The Food and Nutrition Board, Ministry of Women and Child Development, is organizing a number of activities on the theme "Empower Parents, Enable Breastfeeding" during the WBW.
- Breastfeeding is important because
 - o It prevents infections like diarrhoea and acute respiratory infections in early infancy and thus reduces infant mortality
 - o It decreases the risk of mothers developing breast cancer, ovarian cancer, type 2 diabetes, and heart disease

National handloom day - August 7

- ❖ India celebrates National handloom Day on August 7th of every year.
- ❖ The first such day was celebrated on August 7th, 2015.
- ❖ August 7 was chosen so as to commemorate Swadeshi Movement which was launched on 07.08.1905 in Calcutta Town Hall to protest against the partition of Bengal by the British government.
- ❖ The day is celebrated to honour the handloom weavers in the country, increase the income of weavers and also highlight handloom industry's contribution to Indian economy.
- ❖ The 2019 main event of National Handloom Day will be held in Bhubaneswar, Odisha.

International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples - August 9

- International Day of the World's Indigenous Peoples is celebrated annually on 9 August.
- ❖ The day aims to protect the rights of indigenous peoples and recognize the contributions that indigenous people make to improve world issues such as environmental protection.
- ❖ It was first pronounced by the General Assembly of the United Nations in December 1994.
- ❖ Indigenous people make up less than 5 per cent of the world's population, but account for 15 per cent of the poorest.





- ❖ They speak an overwhelming majority of the world's estimated 7,000 languages and represent 5,000 different cultures.
- ❖ This year's observance (2019) is dedicated to Indigenous Peoples' Languages in view of 2019 being marked as the International Year of Indigenous Languages.

World Biofuel Day

- ❖ World Biofuel Day is observed every year on 10th of August.
- ❖ It is being observed by the Ministry of Petroleum & Natural Gas since 2015.




- ❖ The purpose of the observance is to create awareness about the importance of non-fossil fuels as an alternative to conventional fossil fuels and highlight the various efforts made by India in the biofuel sector.
- ❖ This year the theme of the World Biofuel Day is "Production of Biodiesel from Used Cooking Oil (UCO)".

World Lung Cancer Day - August 1

- ❖ World Lung Cancer Day, the observance intended to raise awareness about the impact of lung cancer is held every year on August 1.
- ❖ It is responsible for nearly 1 in 5 cancer deaths according to the World Health Organization.
- ❖ The factors that play a role in cancer development include tobacco products, industrial products (uranium, radiation, asbestos) air pollution, and nutritional deficiencies.








World Wide Web Day - August 1

- ❖ August 1 was World Wide Web Day.
- ❖ Tim Berners-Lee invented the World Wide Web in 1989.
- ❖ The World Wide Web (WWW) was conceived in 1989 at the CERN lab, a European research organization, at Geneva of Switzerland, as a way for scientists to share knowledge.



- ❖ The world's first website (http://info.cern.ch) at CERN, went online on August 6, 1991.
- ❖ A NeXT Computer was used by Sir Tim Berners-Lee as the world's first web server and also to write the first web browser WorldWideWeb in 1990.
- On April 30, 1993, CERN announced that the World Wide Web would be free to anyone, with no fees due.





❖ The World Wide Web Consortium (W3C), the main international standards organisation for the World Wide Web, was founded by Tim Berners-Lee after he left CERN in October 1994.

International Cat Day - August 8

- ❖ International Cat Day is a celebration which takes place on 8 August, every year.
- ❖ It was created in 2002 by the International Fund for Animal Welfare.



National Deworming Day - August 8

- ❖ The National Deworming Day is an initiative of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.
- ❖ It is aimed at deworming all preschool and school-age children (enrolled and non-enrolled) between the ages of 1-19 years through the platform of schools and Anganwadi Centres.







- ❖ Albendazole tablets are orally administered for the children during the programme.
- ❖ In India it is celebrated twice as in February 10 and August 8.
- ❖ India's first National Deworming Day took place on the 10th February 2015.

Nagasaki Day - August 9

- ❖ At the end of Second World War, the USA's war plane Bockscar dropped a plutonium implosion bomb (Fat Man) on Nagasaki in Japan on August 9 in 1945.
- ❖ Japan surrendered to the Allies on August 15, six days after the bombing of Nagasaki and the Soviet Union's declaration of war.

World Lion Day - August 10

- ❖ World Lion Day is observed annually on August 10.
- ❖ It is dedicated to the majestic creatures in an effort to help save them from extinction.
- ❖ In India, Lions, also known as Asiatic Lions, are restricted to the Gir National Park in the Indian state of Gujarat.
- ❖ The lion is one of five pantherine cats inhabiting India, along with the Bengal tiger, Indian leopard, snow leopard and clouded leopard.







World Elephant Day - August 12

- ❖ World Elephant day is observed annually on August 12.
- ❖ It is dedicated to the preservation and protection of the world's elephants.
- ❖ It was conceived in 2011 by Elephant Reintroduction Foundation, Thailand and Canadian filmmakers Patricia Sims and Michael Clark.
- ❖ African elephants are listed as "Vulnerable" and Asian elephants as "Endangered" on the IUCN Red List of threatened species.
- ❖ The first International Elephant Day was held on August 12, 2012.
- ❖ Poaching, habitat loss, human-elephant conflicts, mistreatment in captivity are major concerns in elephant conservation.

Elephants

- ❖ Project Elephant was launched in 1992 by the Government of India Ministry of Environment and Forests.
- The Project is being mainly implemented in 16 States, viz. Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Odisha, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, Uttarakhand, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal in India.
- ❖ Indian elephant is the national heritage animal of India since October 22, 2010.
- Bandipur National Park of Karnataka along with Nilgiri Biosphere Reserve is the largest protected area in southern India and the largest habitat of wild elephants in India.
- ❖ The South Indian states of Karnataka, Kerala and Tamil Nadu are home to nearly 44% of the elephants, 35% of the tigers and 31% of the leopards in India.
- ❖ The state of Karnataka alone is home to 22% of the elephants, 18% of the tigers and 14% of the leopards in India.
- ❖ The Northeast Indian states of Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Mizoram, Meghalaya and Tripura together with West Bengal account for 30% of the elephants and 5% of the tiger population in India.

International Youth Day (IYD) - August 12

- ❖ 12th August was designated International Youth Day by the UN General Assembly in 1999.
- ❖ The first IYD was observed on 12 August, 2000.
- ❖ 2019 Theme: "Transforming education".








National Librarian's Day - August 12

❖ Siyali Ramamrita Ranganathan is considered to be the father of library science, documentation, and information science in India.



- ❖ He was born on August 9th in 1892 at Sirkali, Tanjavur.

- ❖ He also wrote a book "The Five Laws of Library Science".








- ❖ International Left Handers Day is an international day observed annually on August 13.

- ❖ The Union Ministry of Health & Family Welfare launched 6th World and 1st ever Indian Organ Donation Day and Organ Donation Congress in 2010 in New Delhi.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu has been honoured with the Best Performing State for Organ Donation for the 4th time in a row.





World Honey Bee Day - August 17

- ❖ World honey bee day was observed on August 17, 2019 (Every Third Saturday in August).
- ❖ It was started by beekeepers in the USA in 2009. Gradually other countries also started observing it every year.
- ❖ The day aims to build community awareness of the bee industry, through education and promotion.

World Humanitarian Day - August 19

- ❖ World Humanitarian Day is observed every year on August 19.
- ❖ It is an international day dedicated to recognize humanitarian personnel and those who have lost their lives working for humanitarian causes.
- ❖ The day commemorates the August 19th, 2003 incident in which UN Diplomat Sérgio Vieira de Mello and 20 others were killed in the bombing of the UN Headquarters in Baghdad, Iraq.
- ❖ Five years later, the UN General Assembly officially adopted a resolution designating 19th August as the world humanitarian day.
- ❖ The theme of the day for 2019 is 'Women Humanitarians'.
- ❖ It is as a mark of respect to women humanitarians who have been working on the front lines in war and other affected areas of the world.








World Photograph Day - August 19

- ❖ The World Photography day is celebrated every year on August 19th.
- ❖ It is an annual, worldwide celebration of the art, craft, science and history of photography.



World Mosquito Day - August 20

- ❖ World Mosquito Day is observed annually on 20 August.

- ❖ Mosquitos are attracted more to O type bloods and they can smell carbon dioxide from 100 metres away.








Sadbhavana Diwas (Communal Harmony Day) - August 20

- ❖ In 2017, the UN General Assembly designated August 21 as such a day to honor the victims and survivors of terrorism.
- ❖ It is observed since 21 August, 2018.

World Senior Citizen's Day - August 21

- ❖ The World Senior Citizen's Day is celebrated on August 21 each year.
- ❖ The day is dedicated to increase awareness about the issues that affect older adults.






- ❖ It also recognises and acknowledges the contributions of older people to the society.
- ❖ The day was first conceived in 1988 by former US President Ronald Reagan and later proclaimed by UN General Assembly in 1990.

Madras Day - August 22

- ❖ Madras Day is a festival organized to commemorate the founding of the city of Madras (now Chennai) in Tamil Nadu on 22 August every year.
- ❖ On 22 August 1639, it is being the widely agreed date for the purchase of the village of Madraspatnam or Chennapatnam by East India Company from Damarla Venkatadri Nayaka.
- ❖ Madras Week will be celebrated from August 18 to 25 with various events.
- ❖ The first recorded celebration of the founding of Madras was its commemoration in 1939.
- ❖ Recent idea to mark Madras Day celebrations was started by Chennai Heritage Foundation in 2004.







International Day for Victims of Acts of Violence based on Religion or Belief – August 22

- ❖ On 22 August 2019, for the first time, the world is observing 'International Day Commemorating the Victims of Acts of Violence Based on Religion or Belief'.
- ❖ It aims to honour victims and survivors of heinous acts who often remain forgotten.
- ❖ United Nation General Assembly on 28 May 2019, adopted resolution for designating 22 August as this International Day.



International Day for the Remembrance of the Slave Trade and its Abolition - 23 August

- ❖ The "International Day for the Remembrance of the Slave Trade and its Abolition" is observed every year on 23 August.
- ❖ The date August 23 is chosen to commemorate the August 22 to August 23, 1791 rebellion by "slaves" against slave trade in the island of St. Dominique (now known as Haiti).
- ❖ It was a major factor in the abolition of the Transatlantic slave trade.
- ❖ The day was first celebrated in Haiti on August 23, 1998.

International Day against Nuclear Tests - August 29

- ❖ On 2 December 2009, the 64th session of the United Nations large-scale Assembly declared 29 August the International Day against Nuclear Tests.
- ❖ The resolution was initiated by Kazakhstan together with several sponsors and cosponsors to commemorate the closure of the Semipalatinsk Nuclear Test Site on August 29, 1991.





National Sports Day - August 29

- Every year on August 29, India celebrates National sports day.
- ❖ August 29 is the birth anniversary of hockey legend Major Dhyan Chand.
- Dhyan Chand is the Indian hockey player who won gold medals in Olympics for India in the years 1928, 1932 and 1936.



International Day of the Victims of Enforced Disappearances - August 30

- ❖ The International Day of the Disappeared is a day created to draw attention to the fate of individuals imprisoned at places and under poor conditions unknown to their relatives and/or legal representatives.
- It is observed on August 30 of each year.
- ❖ The day was established by the UN General Assembly on December 21, 2010.
- ❖ The day also allows states to consider the fulfilment of their obligations under the International Convention for the Protection of All Persons from Enforced Disappearance (the Convention).





National Small Industry Day - August 30

- Small industry day is celebrated on 30 Aug every year in support and promotion of small Industries.
- ❖ Small Industry day is celebrated as a part of its effort to provide balanced growth to existing small, medium and large-scale enterprises.
- ❖ It seeks to render assistance for setting up new industries to boost the state's financial health.
