# **TNPSC BITS**

- Prime Minister laid the foundation stone of India's first Digital Science Park in Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala as part of state's major infrastructure push worth Rs 1,500 crore.
- French President Emmanuel Macron has signed into law of pension reforms which raises the state pension age from 62 to 64.
- The United Nations' High-Level Advisory Board on Effective Multilateralism recently launched a new report titled "A Breakthrough for People and Planet: Effective and Inclusive Global Governance for Today and The Future".

### **Misinformation Combat Alliance**



- The Misinformation Combat Alliance (MCA) is an alliance of media companies set up in March 2022.
- ✤ It aims to combat misinformation and build tools to aid fact-checking.
- Recently, it has approached the government to act as a self-regulating body to flag fake news online in line with the IT Rules, 2021.





- It is currently a network of 14 digital publishers which includes publications such as Boom Live, Factly, The Logical Indian, Vishwas News and The Quint.
- Membership in the MCA is open to any organization that applies.

# **INTERNATIONAL**

#### **Multilateral exercise Orion**

- For the first time, four Rafale fighter jets took part in multilateral exercise Orion at Mont-de-Marsan, France.
- Ex Orion is one the largest exercises held by France in recent times involving around 12,000 troops, including NATO.
- Besides the India and the France, Air Forces from Germany, Greece, Italy, Netherlands, Spain, U.K. and U.S. was also part of this multilateral exercise.




#### Oxford's malaria vaccine







- Ghana has become the first country in the world to approve a new malaria vaccine from Oxford University.
- The R21/Matrix-M vaccine is the first to exceed the World Health Organization's target of 75% efficacy.
- It has been cleared for use by Ghana's Food and Drugs Authority in children aged 5-36 months.
- They are the group at highest risk of death from malaria in the country.
- In Ghana, the disease is both endemic and perennial, an estimated 5.3m cases and 12,500 estimated deaths were recorded.



#### **25 Years of Good Friday Agreement**

- The Good Friday Agreement was signed on April 10, 1998.
- It was signed between factions of Northern Ireland, and the governments of Britain and Ireland.
- It aims to end decades of violence in Northern Ireland among those who wished to remain with the United Kingdom (UK) and those who wanted to join Ireland.

## SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY


#### **Myelin Sheath**

- Scientists have fabricated monolayers of pure myelin basic protein (MBP), a major protein component of myelin sheath.
- It is a protective membrane that wraps around the axon of nerve cells and acts as a model protein in studying diseases like multiple sclerosis (MS).






- ✤ MBP helps in compactification of the myelin sheath.
- The fabricated tailored monolayers can give an in-depth understanding of the role of MBP in forming multi-lamellar myelin sheath structure.



#### **Electromagnetic Ion Cyclotron waves**



- Scientists have identified Electromagnetic Ion Cyclotron (EMIC) waves, a form of plasma waves in the Indian Antarctic station, Maitri.
- These waves play an important role in precipitation of killer electrons.
- The killer electrons are the electrons having speed close to speed of light, which form the radiation belt of planet Earth.
- The study can help understand the impact of energetic particles in the radiation belts on the low orbiting satellites.






✤ The Electromagnetic Ion Cyclotron (EMIC) are the traversing plasma waves observed in the Earth's magnetosphere.

### **REPORTS AND INDICES**

#### The Status of Women in Agrifood Systems

- ◆ The Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) recently released this report.
- It explains the gender disparities in agriculture and its impact on global economy and food security.
- Currently, over 345 million people are estimated to experience acute food insecurity.
- There is a 24% gender gap in land productivity between farms managed by men and women of the same size.
- In wage employment in agriculture, women earn 82 cents for every dollar that men earn, indicating a gender wage gap.
- In sub-Saharan Africa, 66% of women's employment is in agrifood systems, while in southern Asia, it is 71%.



#### Logistic Performance Index (LPI) – 2023

- India has climbed six places on the World Bank's Logistic Performance Index (LPI) 2023.
- It is now ranking 38th in the 139 countries index.
- India was ranked 44th on the index in 2018 and has now climbed to 38th in the 2023 listing.
- India's performance has drastically improved from 2014, when it was ranked 54th on the LPI.
- ✤ India's rank moved up five places in infrastructure score from 52<sup>nd</sup> in 2018 to 47<sup>th</sup> in 2023.





- It climbed to the 22<sup>nd</sup> spot for international shipments in 2023 from 44<sup>th</sup> in 2018 and moved four places up to 48<sup>th</sup> in logistics competence and equality.
- According to the report, the average dwell time for containers between May and October 2022 was three days for India and Singapore.
- ✤ The dwell time for the U.S. was seven days and for Germany, it was 10 days.

  - o Char Balidanga- Nadia,






- o State Horticulture Research and Development Station campus Nadia,

- The existing four BHS in Bengal are: Chilkigarh Kanak Durga in Jhargram, Baneswar Shiv Dighi in Cooch Behar, Tonglu and Dhotrey in Darjeeling.
