TNPSC BITS

- Indian Oil Corp. Ltd. became the first Indian company to receive the International Sustainability & Carbon Certification (ISCC) under CORSIA for Sustainable Aviation Fuel (SAF) production at its Panipat refinery, Haryana.
- ❖ Vincent Keymer of Germany won the Quantbox Chennai Grand Masters 2025, becoming the first sole champion and entering the world's Top 10 live ratings.
- ❖ The Indian tricolour was hoisted for the first time at Seattle's 605-feet Space Needle on India's 79th Independence Day, marking the first foreign flag raised at the landmark.
- Alajasthan's Manika Vishwakarma has been crowned Miss Universe India 2025.
- ❖ Foxconn has started iPhone 17 production at its Devanahalli facility near Bengaluru, Karnataka.
 - o The unit is Foxconn's second largest outside China, built with a \$2.8 billion (₹25,000 crore) investment.
- ❖ Gugga Naumi is a folk religious festival celebrated across Rajasthan, Haryana, Punjab, Jammu & Kashmir, and Uttar Pradesh.
 - It is observed on the ninth day of Krishna Paksha in the Bhadrapad month, usually after Janmashtami.


Coral blooms in the Gulf of Mannar

- Coral reefs in the Gulf of Mannar have been severely damaged by climate change and human activities like coral mining since the 1960s.
- ❖ The Scientists from Suganthi Devadason Marine Research Institute (SDMRI) and Tamil Nadu Forest Department have conducted annual underwater coral restoration surveys for over 20 years.
- ❖ A total of 51,183 coral fragments from 20 species were transplanted onto 5,550 artificial substrates.
- ❖ It restored about 40,000 sq. m. of degraded reef area.
- ❖ Survival rates of transplanted corals ranged from 55.6% to 79.5%.
- ❖ Acropora intermedia showing the highest survival (89.1%) and growth rate (16.7 cm/year) after five years.





- ❖ Between 2015 and 2019, 10,600 artificial reef modules (triangular artificial reef TAR and perforated trapezoidal artificial reef PTAR) were deployed.
- ❖ It is increasing coral recruit density from 1.23 in 2004 to 76.01 in 2020 on PTARs.
- ❖ Live coral cover at restored sites increased from 2.7% in 2006 to 18.8% in 2020, compared to only 1.8% at unrestored sites.
- ❖ Fish density rose dramatically from 14.5 in 2006 to 310.0 in 2020 at restored sites.
- ❖ They support 63 fish species in Vaan Island and 51 species in Koswari Island.
- ❖ The Tamil Nadu government launched the Tamil Nadu Sustainably Harnessing Ocean Resources (TNSHORE) project to deploy 8,500 artificial reef modules and restore degraded coral reefs and seagrass beds.



Chief Minister's State Youth Award 2025

- ❖ Reigning Carrom World Champion M. Khazima won the Chief Minister's State Youth Award 2025.
- ❖ The Chief Minister's State Youth Award 2025 Tamil Nadu recognizes a young individuals aged 15 to 35 for their voluntary contributions to community development.
- ❖ The award includes a cash prize of ₹1,00,000, a certificate of appreciation, and a medal.





❖ Government employees and educational institution staff are not eligible for the award.



NATIONAL NEWS

Plumeria Garden inauguration



❖ President Droupadi Murmu inaugurated the Plumeria Garden, Banyan Grove, and Babbling Brook at Amrit Udyan in the Rashtrapati Bhavan, New Delhi.





- ❖ The new gardens are open to the public until September 14, 2025.
- Plumeria Garden features curated plantations and grass mounds.
- ❖ Banyan Grove includes reflexology paths, Panchtatva trails, and forest-inspired soundscapes.
- ❖ Babbling Brook offers cascades, sculptural spouts, stepping stones, and a reflecting pool.

India's Moon mission

- Prime Minister of India announced that India will land an astronaut on the Moon by 2040.
- ❖ He said the Bharatiya Antariksha Station (space station) will be ready by 2035.
- ❖ Mars and Venus exploration missions are also planned in India's space roadmap.
- ❖ India's first human spaceflight mission, Gaganyaan, is scheduled for early 2027.




Tourism Vision 2047

- ❖ India's tourism industry plans to increase employment from 50 million to 200 million jobs.
- ❖ The Tourism Vision 2047 roadmap targets a \$3 trillion tourism economy.
- ❖ It aims to attract 100 million inbound tourists and generate 20 billion domestic visits.





- * The national tourism conclave was held under the Federation of Associations in Indian Tourism and Hospitality (FAITH).
- ❖ The sector aims to increase its contribution to India's GDP from 5% to 10% by 2047.

❖ The Central Groundwater Board (CGWB) and state governments have assessed dynamic groundwater resources every year since 2022.






- ❖ According to the 2024 CGWB report, 102 districts are over-exploited, 22 are critical, and 69 are semi-critical for groundwater.
- ❖ The Ministry of Jal Shakti launched the Jal Shakti Abhiyan (JSA) in 2019, targeting 256 water-stressed districts.
- ❖ The JSA Catch the Rain (CTR) campaign began in 2021 and expanded nationwide with focused districts each year.
- ❖ The 2023 JSA CTR prioritized 150 districts identified by the Jal Jeevan Mission.
- ❖ The 2024 campaign focused on 151 districts identified by CGWB under the theme Nari Shakti se Jal Shakti.
- ❖ The 2025 JSA CTR campaign targets 148 districts identified by CGWB with emphasis on grassroots participation and innovative financing.
- ❖ A total of 148 Central Nodal Officers has been assigned to the 148 high-focus districts for the 2025-2026 campaign.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

Rubella Elimination - Nepal



- Nepal has eliminated rubella as a public health problem, confirmed by the WHO.
- ❖ The rubella vaccine was introduced in Nepal's immunization program in 2012.





- * Rubella is a contagious viral infection that can cause serious birth defects if pregnant women are infected.
- ❖ By 2024, over 95% of Nepal's population had received at least one dose of the rubella vaccine.
- ❖ Nepal is the sixth country in the WHO South-East Asia Region to achieve rubella elimination.
- * The South-East Asia Region targets measles and rubella elimination by 2026.

Sakura Science Program 2025

- ❖ The Sakura Science Programme is organized by the Japan Science and Technology Agency (JST).
- ❖ It aims to promote scientific learning and cultural exchange among youth.
- ❖ India joined the programme in 2016 and has since sent 619 students and 91 supervisors to Japan.
- ❖ In 2025, 34 Indian students and 2 supervisors from Jawahar Navodaya Vidyalayas and government schools across Andaman & Nicobar, Ladakh, Mizoram, Nagaland, and Tripura will visit Japan.


Off-budget borrowings of states

❖ Off-budget borrowings (OBB) rose to ₹29,335 crore in FY25 from ₹21,251 crore in FY24.





- ❖ Off-budget borrowings had peaked at ₹67,181 crore in FY21 during the Covid-19 pandemic.
- ❖ The central government discontinued its own off-budget borrowing practices from FY23.
- ❖ Since FY22, the Centre has included debt raised by state-owned entities under Article 293(3) borrowing limits.
- ❖ States are opting for the Centre's Special Assistance to States for Capital Investment (SASCI) scheme offering 50-year interest-free loans.
- ❖ A CareEdge Ratings report says budgets of 13 major states project a 3.2% fiscal deficit in FY26.
- Maharashtra topped off-budget borrowings in FY25 at ₹13,990 crore, followed by Karnataka at ₹5,438 crore.
- ❖ Telangana and Kerala recorded ₹2,697 crore and ₹983 crore, respectively, in FY25.
- ❖ In FY24, Maharashtra had ₹7,700 crore in off-budget borrowings, followed by Kerala at ₹4,688 crore.



❖ States like Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal, and Uttar Pradesh rely heavily on central government transfers.






- * Richer states like Haryana, Telangana, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, and Maharashtra finance most of their budgets through their revenues.
- ❖ States use off-budget borrowings to fund welfare schemes and infrastructure without breaching fiscal deficit targets.
- Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu each borrowed over ₹1.2 lakh crore through open market sources in FY25.

Electronics exports in Q1

- ❖ India's electronics exports rose over 47% in Q1 of 2025-26.
- ❖ Electronics production grew from \$31 billion in 2014-15 to \$133 billion in 2024-25.
- ❖ Mobile manufacturing units increased from 2 in 2014 to over 300 in 2025.
- ❖ India is the world's second-largest mobile phone manufacturer.

Parallel Web Systems

❖ Ex-Twitter CEO Parag Agrawal launched a new AI startup called Parallel Web Systems.






- ❖ The startup builds infrastructure for AI agents to use the web in real time.
- ❖ Parallel aims to make AIs the primary users of the internet.



Naegleria fowleri amoeba



- ❖ Naegleria fowleri amoeba is found in well water in Kozhikode.
- ❖ Naegleria fowleri is a rare, deadly amoeba that causes primary amoebic meningoencephalitis (PAM), a severe brain infection.






❖ This is the third PAM case reported in the Kozhikode district in 2025.

ENVIRONMENT NEWS

Invasive plants in Assam



- Grassland invaders are threatening Assam's Dibru-Saikhowa National Park (DSNP).
- ❖ DSNP is the only habitat of feral horses in India.
- ❖ Native plants Bombax ceiba (Simalu) and Lagerstroemia speciosa (Ajar) have joined invasive species to alter the riverine ecosystem.
- ❖ The invasive plants include Chromolaena odorata, Ageratum conyzoides, Parthenium hysterophorous, and Mikania micrantha.
- ❖ In 2000, grasslands covered 28.78% of DSNP, but by 2013, shrubland had expanded, causing a significant decline in grassland area.
- ❖ Degraded forest increased to 80.52 square kilometers (23.47%) by 2024, which negatively impacts biodiversity.
- ❖ The loss of grassland threatens several species, including the Bengal florican, hog deer, and swamp grass babbler.

❖ It aims to honour the art of photography and its power to inspire, preserve memories, and create change.





- ❖ The day marks the invention of the daguerreotype process by Louis Daguerre in 1839
- ❖ The theme for 2025 is "My Favourite Photo".
