#### TNPSC BITS

- ❖ The Ministry of Home Affairs has approved renaming Jalalabad in UP's Shahjahanpur district to "Parshurampuri," citing its mythological link as Parshuram's birthplace.
- ❖ The intermediate-range ballistic missile Agni-5 was successfully test-fired from the Integrated Test Range in Chandipur, Odisha.
- ❖ INS Aridhaman, India's third nuclear ballistic submarine under the Advanced Technology Vessel (ATV) project, is in final sea trials and set for induction by end-2025.
- ❖ The Gunmen attacked a mosque in Nigeria's northwest Katsina state during Fajr prayers.
- ❖ The World Entrepreneurs Day observed on August 21 celebrates the innovation resilience passion creativity and impact of entrepreneurs worldwide.

#### TAMIL NADU NEWS

#### CM's Breakfast Scheme expansion



- ❖ Tamil Nadu Chief Minister will launch the expansion of the Chief Minister's Breakfast Scheme to State-aided urban primary schools on August 26, 2025.
- ❖ Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann will attend the launch as the chief guest.
- ❖ The expansion will benefit approximately 3.05 lakh additional students across the State.
- ❖ As of February 2025, about 17.53 lakh students in 34,987 schools have benefited from the programme.





- ❖ The scheme began in 2022, initially for government-run primary schools and expanded progressively to include urban government and aided schools.
- ❖ Hitherto, the programme was implemented in government-run primary schools across the State and State-aided primary schools located only in rural areas.
- ❖ The Tamil Nadu government allocated ₹600.25 crore for the programme in 2025-26.
- ❖ Evaluations show the scheme increased attendance, improved children's health, reduced hospital admissions by 63.2%, and lowered serious illnesses by 70.6% in government primary schools.

#### Marine Elite Force unit



- ❖ Tamil Nadu will set up its second Marine Elite Force unit under the Chennai Wildlife Division.
- ❖ The first unit was established in May 2024 in Ramanathapuram to protect the Gulf of Mannar and Palk Bay marine ecosystems.
- ❖ The new unit will focus on safeguarding endangered Olive Ridley turtles along the Chennai coast, especially between Neelankarai and Marina nesting sites.
- ❖ The Marine Elite Force will patrol, enforce laws, and coordinate with agencies to reduce threats within five nautical miles of the coast.
- ❖ The force will support enforcement of the Wildlife (Protection) Act, 1972.
- ❖ It will collaborate with Tamil Nadu Coastal Security Group, Indian Coast Guard, fisheries department, NGOs, and fishermen's associations.





#### **NATIONAL NEWS**

#### Child nutrition in India


- ❖ India's healthiest children live in its north-eastern states and Kerala.
- ❖ The Gangetic belt states have among India's least healthy children.
- ❖ As per the Comprehensive National Nutrition Survey (CNNS) 37% of children under five are stunted.
- ❖ It is slightly lower than the 38.4% recorded in 2016.
- ❖ Nearly 7% of women aged 15-19 having begun childbearing.
- ❖ Only 11% of children under two receive a minimum acceptable diet combining diversity and frequency.
- Only 64% of infants under six months are exclusively breastfed.
- ❖ Caesarean deliveries, rising to over 22% in 2021, disrupt early breastfeeding initiation, affecting infant nutrition.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu ranked 11<sup>th</sup> in Overall child health ranking.

## **Draft Climate Finance Taxonomy**

- ❖ The Department of Economic Affairs (DEA) has released a Draft Framework for India's Climate Finance Taxonomy.
- ❖ This follows the Union Budget 2024–25 announcement to develop a taxonomy for climate finance.
- ❖ The draft aims to guide classification of climate-supportive projects aligned with India's Net Zero by 2070 target.
- ❖ It will support the green transition while ensuring reliable and affordable energy access for the long term.





**India - EAEU Free Trade Agreement** 



- ❖ India and the Eurasian Economic Union (EAEU) signed the Terms of Reference (ToR) to begin Free Trade Agreement (FTA) negotiations.
- ❖ The EAEU includes Russia, Armenia, Belarus, Kazakhstan, and the Kyrgyz Republic with a combined GDP of \$6.5 trillion.
- ❖ The trade between India and the EAEU reached \$69 billion in 2024, marking a 7% rise from 2023.





❖ The FTA aims to boost market access for Indian exporters and benefit micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs).

#### **RE100** initiative


- ❖ Suzlon Group pledges to use 100% renewable energy at all 15 manufacturing units by 2030.
- ❖ It became the first Indian energy company to join the global RE100 initiative for renewable electricity transition.
- ❖ Suzlon aims for carbon neutrality by 2035 and net zero emissions by 2040 across all emission scopes.
- ❖ Currently, its Dhule rotor blade unit operates entirely on renewable energy, achieving over 92% carbon neutrality.
- ❖ The company has installed about 21.1 GW of wind energy capacity in 17 countries globally.



## Marine fish production in 2023–24

- ❖ India's marine fish production rose from 34.76 lakh tonnes in 2020–21 to 44.95 lakh tonnes in 2023–24 with 8.9% annual growth.
- ❖ The Indian Council of Agricultural Research Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute (ICAR-CMFRI) assessed 135 marine fish stocks in 2022.
- ❖ Around 91.1% were found to be sustainable and in good health.
- ❖ One hundred Coastal Fishermen Villages (CFV) are being upgraded as Climate Resilient Coastal Fishermen Villages (CRCFV).





### INTERNATIONAL NEWS

## Lipulekh Pass revival



- ❖ The recent agreement between India and China to reopen border trade through the Lipulekh Pass in Uttarakhand has triggered an issue in Nepal.
- ❖ Nepal claims that the Lipulekh falls within its territory.
- ❖ The India-Nepal border was defined by the 1816 Sugauli Treaty, which set the Kali River as the boundary.
- ❖ As per Nepal's view, the Kali River originates in Limpiyadhura, making the disputed region its territory under the Sugauli Treaty.
- ❖ As per India, the river begins in Kalapani village, meaning the region falls within Indian territory.






#### ISA's Research Hub in India

- ❖ The International Solar Alliance (ISA) will establish 17 centres of excellence in different countries by year-end, offering testing, lab training, and startup ecosystems.
- ❖ ISA plans to create a Global Capability Centre in India to act as a hub connecting these centres, similar to a "Silicon Valley for solar."
- ❖ India has installed about 119 GW of solar capacity as of July 2025, with solar comprising 48% of its non-fossil power capacity.
- ❖ ISA aims to unlock \$1 trillion in solar investments by 2030 and support global solar adoption with human capital from India.



#### SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY NEWS

#### Solar Tornado








- \* Romanian scientist captured rare images of a massive solar tornado and a giant plasma eruption occurring together on the Sun.
- ❖ The solar tornado reached about 130,000 km high, taller than stacking ten Earths, shaped by the Sun's magnetic field.
- ❖ The eruptive prominence spanned roughly 200,000 km and released a coronal mass ejection (CME) that poses no threat to Earth.
- ❖ This event highlights the Sun's dynamic magnetic activity as it nears the peak of its 11-year solar cycle.

#### **ENVIRONMENT NEWS**

## Saltwater crocodile population

- ❖ The saltwater crocodile population in Sundarbans Biosphere Reserve (SBR) increased in 2025, with 213 direct sightings recorded.
- ❖ The estimated population ranges between 220 and 242 crocodiles, up from 204 to 234 in 2024.
- ❖ The encounter rate in 2025 is approximately 0.18 crocodiles per kilometre, or one crocodile per 5.5 km of creek studied.
- ❖ The survey covered 1,168 km of creeks, accounting for 64% of the significant creek length in the SBR.
- ❖ Saltwater crocodiles prefer creeks and rivers with high tide widths below 180 metres and tolerate a wide range of water salinity.
- ❖ The West Bengal government has conserved crocodiles through the Bhagabatpur Crocodile Project since 1976, releasing 577 crocodiles into the wild until 2022.



## Pampa river under National River Conservation Plan



- ❖ Kerala's Pampa River is the state's third-longest river, measuring 176 km in length.
- ❖ The river originates from Pulachimalai hill in the Peermade plateau at an altitude of 5,410 ft.
- It flows through the districts of Pathanamthitta, Idukki, and Alappuzha.
- ❖ The Pampa River basin covers an area of 2,235 sq km and includes 30 panchayats and Chengannur municipality.
- ❖ The Union Jal Shakti Ministry has requested a detailed report from the Kerala government for inclusion in the National River Conservation Plan (NRCP).

## Kalai-II Hydroelectric Project








- ❖ The Arunachal Pradesh conducted a public hearing for environmental clearance to the proposed Kalai-II hydroelectric project in Anjaw district.
- ❖ The 1,200 MW project is planned on the Lohit River.
- ❖ Kalai-II is one of 13 stalled hydro projects revived through agreements with central public sector units.
- ❖ It aims to enhance energy security in the Northeast.

#### **IMPORTANT DAYS**

## Indian Akshay Urja Day 2025 - August 20

- ❖ The day commemorates the birth anniversary of former Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi, India's youngest PM.
- ❖ It was first celebrated in 2004.
- ❖ The day was established by the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE).
- ❖ The aim is to raise awareness about the importance and adoption of renewable energy in India.
- ❖ August 20 is also observed as Sadbhavana Divas, or "Day of Harmony," to mark the birth anniversary of Rajiv Gandhi.



# International Day of Remembrance and Tribute to the Victims of Terrorism 2025 - August 21

- ❖ The day was established by the UN General Assembly in resolution 72/165 in 2017.
- ❖ The aim is to honour and support victims and survivors of terrorism and uphold their human rights.





❖ The theme for 2025 is "United by Hope: Collective Action for Victims of Terrorism."



## World Senior Citizens' Day 2025 - August 21



- ❖ The day was founded in 1988 by U.S. President Ronald Reagan through Proclamation 5847.
- ❖ It was first celebrated in 1991 and later recognized as a global observance by the UN in 1990.
- ❖ The aim is to honour the contributions of senior citizens and raise awareness about their rights and needs.
- ❖ The 2025 theme is "Empowering Elderly Voices for an Inclusive Future".
