TNPSC BITS

- ❖ Google launched its first-ever credit card globally in India, which is linked with UPI and Google Pay for merchant payments.
- ❖ India's first dedicated Forest University will be established in Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖ Tesla opened its first electric vehicle charging station in Gurugram, Haryana.
- ❖ Jammu and Kashmir has achieved a significant milestone with the inauguration of its first Gen Z Post Office at the AIIMS Vijaypur campus.
- ❖ The Indian Navy has commissioned INAS 335 'Ospreys' as its second operational squadron of MH-60R multi-role helicopters at INS Hansa in Goa.
- ❖ India and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) began the joint military exercise Desert Cyclone-II in Abu Dhabi.
- ❖ Brazil has formally handed over the BRICS (18th) presidency to India for 2026.
- ❖ The Reserve Bank of India released the 10th edition of its statistical publication, "Handbook of Statistics on Indian States, 2024-25".
- ❖ Jammu and Kashmir is hosting its first International Indian Style Wrestling (Dangal) event along with the Rustam-e-Jammu Kashmir Title 2025.
 - The championship aims to revive traditional Dangal wrestling, encourage fitness, promote sports tourism, and showcase local talent.
- Oman awarded its highest civilian honour, the First Class of the Order of Oman, to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, making him the first Indian leader to receive it.
 - o This marked the 29th international award he has received.

TAMIL NADU NEWS

Orderly System Abolition

- The DGP of Tamil Nadu ordered the complete removal of the orderly system.
- Police personnel must not be posted to the residences of serving or retired police officers.
- ❖ The Madras High Court ruled that using orderlies for non-official work is against the law.
- ❖ A Government Order issued in 1979 had already abolished the orderly system.
- ❖ All senior police officers were instructed to review and ensure full compliance.





❖ Any orderly found at an officer's residence must be withdrawn immediately.



NATIONAL NEWS

Private Bill on Marital Rape 2025



❖ Congress MP Shashi Tharoor has recently introduced a private member's Bill in the Lok Sabha to remove the marital rape exception in criminal law.





- ❖ He has also introduced two other private member's bills in the Lower House of Parliament
 - To amend the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 and
 - o Establish a State and UT Reorganisation Commission to recommend the reorganisation of states and Union territories to the Centre.
- ❖ A Private Member's Bill is a legislative proposal introduced in Parliament by a member (MP) who is not a minister.
- ❖ Only 14 private members' bills have ever been passed into law, and none by both Houses since 1970.
- Section 63 of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023 (Section 375 of the IPC) Marital rape is not a specific criminal offence under the penal code if the wife is over 18 years of age.
- ❖ Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act (2005) Marital rape is treated as a form of domestic violence, and prescribes a lighter penalty compared to non-marital rape.

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

Foreign Terrorist Organization - Venezuelan Regime



❖ The US government designated the Venezuelan regime of President Nicolás Maduro as a Foreign Terrorist Organization (FTO).





- ❖ The designation cited terrorism, drug smuggling, human trafficking, and other illegal activities.
- ❖ US President Donald Trump announced the designation in mid-December 2025.
- ❖ The declaration was made public through official statements and social media posts.
- ❖ The US ordered a naval blockade of sanctioned Venezuelan oil tankers to pressure the regime.
- ❖ The designation increased existing US sanctions and diplomatic tensions with Venezuela.

Israel-Egypt Natural Gas Deal

- ❖ Israel and Egypt signed a long-term natural gas export agreement valued at about 34.6 billion United States dollars (USD).
- ❖ Israeli company NewMed Energy will supply around 130 billion cubic metres of natural gas to Egypt.
- ❖ The gas will be sourced from offshore fields in the Mediterranean Sea.
- ❖ Egypt will act as a regional hub for the processing and distribution of the gas.



Agricultural Cooperation Plan 2025–27

India and Argentina signed the ICAR-INTA Work Plan for 2025-27.





- ❖ ICAR stands for Indian Council of Agricultural Research and INTA stands for National Institute of Agricultural Technology, Argentina
- ❖ The plan focuses on sustainable farming, biotechnology, digital agriculture, and livestock improvement.
- ❖ Cooperation includes joint research projects, germplasm exchange, expert interactions, and training programmes.
- ❖ Key crops for exchange include soybean, sunflower, maize, blueberry, citrus, guava, and wild papaya species.
- ❖ Annual monitoring and review meetings will track progress and ensure effective implementation.




Water Crisis in Iran 2025

- ❖ Iran is facing a severe water crisis, with Tehran, the nation's capital, under extreme stress due to critically low water levels.
- ❖ Tehran's metropolitan area, home to around 15 million people, is at risk of running out of water completely.
- ❖ Major reservoirs supplying Tehran are nearly empty: Latyan Dam (9% full), Amir Kabir Dam (8% full), and overall reservoir levels are at about 11% capacity.
- ❖ Mashhad, Iran's second-largest city, has reservoirs at only 3% capacity, threatening the water supply for around 3 million people.
- ❖ Iran has endured six consecutive years of drought, the worst in 40 years, compounded by water-guzzling industries and swelling urban populations.






- ❖ Water scarcity is visible from space, highlighting the magnitude of the crisis across the country.
- ❖ Agriculture consumes around 90% of Iran's water, with rice, wheat, and other thirsty crops contributing to shortages.
- ❖ Iranian authorities now propose to move their capital to the city of Makran near Iran's southern Makran coast.



SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY NEWS

Nanoparticle Therapy for Alzheimer's Disease



❖ Scientists from the Institute of Nano Science and Technology (INST), Mohali, developed a nanoparticle-based pathway for Alzheimer's therapy.





- * The research was carried out under the Department of Science and Technology.
- ❖ The therapy uses EGCG (Epigallocatechin-3-gallate), dopamine, and tryptophan combined in one nanoparticle.
- ❖ These nanoparticles target amyloid plaques, oxidative stress, inflammation, and nerve cell damage.
- ❖ Brain-Derived Neurotrophic Factor (BDNF) was added to support neuron growth and repair.

ENVIRONMENT NEWS

New Snakehead Fish Species - Channa Bhoi



- Scientists discovered a new species of snakehead fish named Channa Bhoi in Meghalaya.
- ❖ It was found in a small mountain stream near Iewmawlong village, Ri-Bhoi district.
- ❖ The species is named after the Bhoi people, an indigenous group of the Khasi tribe in the region.
- Channa Bhoi belongs to the Gachua group of snakehead fishes, known for high diversity in the Eastern Himalayas.






❖ Phylogenetic analysis shows it is a sister species to Channa bipuli, raising India's total recorded Channa species to 26.

REPORTS AND INDICES

Global Doping Violations Report 2025

- ❖ The report was released by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA).
- ❖ India recorded the highest number of doping violations in the world for the third year in a row.
- ❖ The World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) reported 260 doping cases involving Indian athletes in 2024.
- ❖ India's positivity rate was 3.6 per cent, the highest among countries with large-scale testing.
- ❖ The National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) of India conducted 7,113 doping tests during the year.
- Other countries like France, Russia, China, and the United States reported fewer violations.



BofA Report 2025

❖ India has become the world's largest market for AI apps by daily and monthly active users.





- ❖ The finding was released by Bank of America (BofA) Securities in its latest report.
- ❖ Popular AI apps used widely in India include ChatGPT, Google Gemini, and Perplexity.
- ❖ The report states that high smartphone use and low-cost mobile data support this growth.
- ❖ Increased AI app use may lead to higher average revenue per user (ARPU) for the telecom operators.

MLAs Salary hike - Odisha

❖ The Odisha Assembly passed a Bill to triple the monthly salary of the Chief Minister, Ministers, and Members of the Legislative Assembly (MLAs).





- ❖ Under the revised structure, an MLA will receive ₹3.45 lakh per month, up from ₹1.10 lakh in 2007.
- ❖ The Chief Minister's monthly pay is ₹3.74 lakh, including salary of ₹1 lakh, car allowance of ₹91,000, and sumptuary allowance of ₹1.83 lakh.
- ❖ The Deputy CM will get ₹3.68 lakh, Cabinet Ministers ₹3.62 lakh, and Ministers of State ₹3.56 lakh per month.
- ❖ The Speaker's salary is ₹3.68 lakh, the Deputy Speaker's ₹3.56 lakh, and the Leader of Opposition and Government Chief Whip's ₹3.62 lakh.
- ❖ Odisha's per capita income is ₹1,82,548 per year, below the national average of ₹2,05,324.

West Bengal University Bills



- ❖ The President of India rejected the West Bengal Assembly amendment bill proposing the CM as Chancellor of state universities.
- ❖ Governor Dr. C. V. Bose had reserved the bill for the President's consideration on 20 April 2024.
- ❖ Another amendment bill related to Aliah University, proposing the CM as Amire-Jamia or Chancellor, was also rejected.
- ❖ The existing arrangement remains unchanged, and the Governor continues as Chancellor under the current legal framework.






* The bills aimed to replace the Governor with the CM in the role of Chancellor, but the proposal was not approved.

PERSONALITIES, AWARDS, AND EVENTS

Ram Sutar Demise

- ❖ Renowned sculptor Ram Vanji Sutar passed away at the age of 100 in Noida, Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖ He was the chief designer of the Statue of Unity in Gujarat, the world's tallest statue.
- ❖ His famous works include statues of Gandhi and Chhatrapati Shivaji at the Parliament complex.
- ❖ He was awarded the Padma Shri (1999) and Padma Bhushan (2016).
- ❖ He also received the Maharashtra Bhushan Puraskar, the highest civilian award of Maharashtra.



Prestigious Travel Awards

- ❖ Air India won the Best Domestic Airline title at the Travel + Leisure India & South Asia Awards 2025 for the second consecutive year.
- ❖ The award is entirely based on the reader (passenger) votes and reflects service quality, comfort, reliability, and overall travel experience.
- ❖ Air India is undergoing a major transformation, including fleet modernization with 570 new aircraft orders and a USD 400 million retrofit programme.





- ❖ Singapore Changi Airport was named the World's Best International Airport 2025 at the same awards, based on global reader votes.
- ❖ Changi Airport is recognised for passenger comfort, innovative design, indoor gardens, the world's tallest indoor waterfall, and immersive leisure zones.

International Migrants Day 2025 - December 18



- ❖ The day aims to protect the rights and dignity of migrants.
- ❖ It was officially proclaimed by the UN in the year 2000.





- ❖ It is celebrated to recognize the contributions of migrants and the challenges they face.
