TNPSC BITS

- Puducherry launched a campaign named "Zero Covid by Feb28".
 - It aims to ensure that there are no COVID-19 cases by the end of February 2021 in the union territory.
- Meghna Pant has penned a new book "The Terrible, Horrible, Very Bad Good News".
- The Prime Minister virtually laid the foundation stone of the Maharaja Suheldev Memorial in Bahraich, Uttar Pradesh.
- ✤ The International Solar Alliance has announced Dr Ajay Mathur as its new Director-General.
- Justice Puligoru Venkata Sanjay Kumar has been sworn-in as the Chief Justice of Manipur High Court.
- Maharashtra government has signed an MoU with Flipkart to promote wooden toys, local artefacts, handicrafts.
- The former European Central Bank Chief Mario Draghi has been sworn in as the new Prime Minister of Italy.

NATIONAL

Mahatma Gandhi National Fellowship Programme (MGNF)

- The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship recently rolled out this programme in all the districts India.
- This programme was earlier working across 69 districts.
- The Fellows under this Programme will acquire the academic expertise and technical competency.
- ✤ MGNF is a two-year fellowship programme.
- ✤ The fellows should be aged between 21 to 30 years to get enrolled.
- ✤ It has been designed under the SANKALP scheme.

Rashtriya Sanskriti Mahotsav

- ✤ The 11th Rashtriya Sanskriti Mahotsav was inaugurated at West Bengal.
- It is a flagship programme of the Ministry of Culture.





- ✤ It is organised under the Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat Programme, since 2015.
- ✤ It aims to celebrate the idea of unity in diversity.

Commercial Jute seed distribution scheme

- The Union Textile Minister Smriti Irani has launched the commercial Jute seed distribution scheme.
- It was launched in the backdrop of MoU signed between the Jute Corporation of India and the National Seeds Corporation.
- ✤ The MoU 2020 was for the commercial distribution of 1 thousand Metric Tonne certified jute seeds in the year 2021-22.
- ✤ The Golden Fibre Revolution in India is associated to the jute production.

e-Chhawani Portal

- The Defence Minister of India Rajnath Singh has launched the e-Chhawani portal.
- Using this portal, the residents of Cantonment areas can now register their complaints with respect to the civic issues.
- ✤ The cantonment board is a civic administration body.
- It functions under the Ministry of Defence in India.
- The board is constituted of the elected members, ex-officio members and nominated members in accordance with the Cantonments Act-2006.

INTERNATIONAL

New START nuclear disarmament treaty

- The United States has extended the "New START" nuclear disarmament treaty with Russia for a period of five years.
- ◆ The new strategic arms reduction treaty was formally signed on April 8, 2010.
- ✤ After ratification, it entered into force on 5 February 2011.
- ✤ The New START treaty was set to expire on February 5, 2021.
- But both the parties have further extended it for five more years, till February 2026.





ECONOMY

8-member expert panel

- The Reserve Bank of India has constituted an eight-member expert committee on Primary (Urban) Co-operative Banks (UCBs).
- ✤ It aims to examine issues and suggest a road map for strengthening the sector.
- The committee will be chaired by the former RBI Deputy Governor N. S. Vishwa nathan.


Corporate India Risk Index

- ICICI Lombard has launched the 'Corporate India Risk Index'.
- This is intended to be a unified, standardised corporate risk index that spans industries and companies.
- This will help the companies to understand the level of risk that their business is facing.
- ✤ It will also assist in developing a successful risk aversion plan.

ENVIRONMENT

Fossils of 'Dickinsonia'

- Researchers have discovered three fossils of the earliest known living animal, the 550-million-year-old 'Dickinsonia'.
- It was discovered on the roof of the Bhimbetka Rock Shelters near Bhopal.
- ♦ One fossil is 17 inches long, the other two are much smaller.







STATES

Rajasthan Prison Rules – 1951

- The Rajasthan government has amended the Rajasthan Prison Rules, 1951 recently.
- The move was aimed to do away with the caste-based assignment of labour.
- ◆ Earlier, every person entering to the prison are asked about his caste.
- ✤ Once their caste was identified, the menial jobs such as cleaning toilets, sweeping the prisons etc are assigned to them.

One Nation One Ration Card system reform

- Punjab has become the 13th State in the country to successfully undertake "One Nation One Ration Card system" reform.
- Thus, the State has become eligible to mobilise additional financial resources of Rs.1,516 crore through Open Market Borrowings.
- Permission for the same was issued by the Department of Expenditure of the Union.

Sanctuary Lifetime Service Award - 2020

- ✤ S. Theodore Baskaran, a naturalist and an activist, has won the Sanctuary Lifetime Service Award, 2020.
- ✤ The award was instituted by the Sanctuary Nature Foundation.
- ✤ He was chosen for the award in the light of his dedication to the wildlife conservation.
- Earlier, he was awarded a Lifetime Achievement Award (Iyal Virudhu) for his writing on nature in Tamil.
- The award was given by the Canada Literary Garden in the year 2014 at Toronto.
