## TNPSC BITS

- ❖ The Regional Office of the Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority (APEDA) was inaugurated at Raipur, Chhattisgarh.
- ❖ India Post launched Speed Post 24 and Speed Post 48, a premium express delivery options within the Speed Post suite to provide faster mail delivery.
- ❖ Italy has conferred the Cavaliere dell'Ordine della Stella d'Italia on Goa-based industrialist Shrinivas Dempo.
- ❖ Indian army officer from Bengaluru, Major Swathi Shantha Kumar, has won the UN Secretary General's Award 2025 for her project Equal Partners, Lasting Peace.
- ❖ The first deck has been launched on India's first-ever road bridge, being built over an active Chennai Metro Rail Limited (CMRL) underground tunnel.
  - The Teynampet–Saidapet flyover in Chennai is the world's first road bridge constructed above a running metro tunnel.
- ❖ The National Institute of Information and Communications Technology (NICT), Japan, achieved the world's first 2 terabits per second (Tbit/s) free-space optical (FSO) communication.
  - The experiment used small optical terminals that can be mounted on satellites and High-Altitude Platform Stations (HAPS).
- ❖ The Indian Army has conducted Exercise "Sanjha Shakti" at Dighi Hills Range, Maharashtra, to strengthen civil–military coordination.
  - It is a Military–Civil Fusion exercise held under the Southern Command (Maharashtra, Gujarat and Goa Area).

### Tamil Nadu State Awards 2026

- ❖ The Thiruvalluvar Award 2026 will be given to Dr. Sathiyavel Muruganar.
- ❖ The Kamarajar Award 2025 will be given to Idhayathulla.
- ❖ The Mahakavi Bharathiya Award 2025 will be awarded to Nellai Jayantha, and the Pavendhar Bharathidasan Award 2025 will be given to poet Yugabharathi.
- ❖ The Thamizh Thenral Thiru. Vi. Ka. The Award 2025 will be given to the writer and former Chief Secretary Iraiyanbu.

- ❖ Scholar M.P. Sathiyavel Muruganar will receive the Ayyan Thiruvalluvar Award for spreading the ideals of Thiruvalluvar.
- ❖ Advocate A. Arulmozhi has been named for the Thanthai Periyar Award for work towards social justice.
- ❖ M. Sinthanai Selvan will receive the Annal Ambedkar Award for work for Adi Dravidar (Scheduled Caste) and tribal communities.
- ❖ Duraimurugan, a senior DMK leader and Minister, will be given the Perarignar Anna Award.

### Tamil Nadu Circular Economy Investment Policy 2026

- ❖ The Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu has released the Tamil Nadu Circular Economy Investment Policy, 2026, in Chennai.
- ❖ The policy aims to promote the recycling, resource efficiency, and investment in circular economy industries in Tamil Nadu.
- ❖ The policy provides special incentives for recycling units and technology enablers, in addition to incentives under the MSME Policy, 2021, and Facilitating MSMEs of Tamil Nadu (FaMe TN) Sponsorship Policy.
- ❖ Companies investing at least ₹20 crore and creating a minimum of 25 net new jobs are eligible for a capital subsidy of 10% of Eligible Fixed Assets (EFA), subject to a maximum of ₹3 crore.
- ❖ The capital subsidy will be disbursed over five years in equal annual instalments after the start of commercial operations.

- ❖ Eligible units will receive reimbursement of the employer's Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) contribution for one year with a limit of 50 employees.
- ❖ They can get up to ₹10,000 per employee per month for Tamil Nadu-domiciled workers.
- ❖ The policy also provides skilling incentives and a payroll subsidy.



### Tamil Nadu Warehousing Policy 2026

- ❖ The Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu released the Tamil Nadu Warehousing Policy, 2026, in Chennai.
- ❖ The policy aims to promote modern warehousing infrastructure and strengthen the supply chain and logistics in Tamil Nadu.
- ❖ The policy provides incentives to market participants, operators, and developers in the warehousing sector for a period of five years.
- ❖ Warehouses must be located in Tamil Nadu, and the developer or operator must have a registered office in the State to claim incentives.
- ❖ Greenfield warehouses starting operations during the policy period and brownfield expansions carried out during the period are eligible for incentives.

- ❖ The New warehouses can receive a green incentive of 25% of the cost of green initiatives, subject to a maximum of ₹2 crore.
- ❖ The policy also provides training subsidies and special incentives for warehouse development in Category C and Delta districts.

### India's First Sovereign AI Park

- ❖ The Government of Tamil Nadu signed a MoU with Sarvam AI to set up India's first ₹10,000-crore Sovereign Artificial Intelligence (AI) Park.
- ❖ The project will be established as a full-stack AI district with compute infrastructure, secure data systems, research labs, and innovation clusters.
- ❖ It will generate about 1,000 high-skilled deep-tech jobs in Tamil Nadu.
- ❖ The AI Park will include an Institute for AI in Governance to support public sector use of AI.
- ❖ Data, models, and computing will remain within the State's trust boundary to ensure a sovereign and secure AI ecosystem.

- ❖ Sarvam AI, selected under the IndiaAI Mission, will build foundational AI models for Indian languages, voice, and reasoning.



### **Gopuram Construction at Pazhayarai Temple**

- ❖ The Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments (HR&CE) Department has started building a seven-tier gopuram at the Somanathar Temple in Pazhayarai near Kumbakonam.
- ❖ The National Institute of Technology (NIT) studied the soil and the existing temple structure before recommending the construction of a seven-tier gopuram instead of the earlier five-tier plan to match the broad foundation.
- ❖ The temple previously had a neglected east-facing gopuram, called the mottai gopuram (unfinished tower).
- ❖ Pazhayarai was an important Chola capital before moving to Thanjavur.
- ❖ A royal order by Uttama Chola was recorded from the Pazhayarai palace, highlighting its historical importance.
- ❖ The temple is one of the important Saivite temples, praised in verse by Appar, Sambandar, and Sundarar.
- ❖ It is also called Kara Koil because its mahamandapam (main hall) is designed like a chariot.
- ❖ As per K.A. Nilakanta Sastri notes, Pazhayarai had the Arulmolideva-Isvara Temple, with a palace that was the residence of Rajaraja Chola's sister Kundavai, and for some time, of Rajaraja himself.

- ❖ The construction is part of the Tamil Nadu government's programme to restore and repair 1,000-year-old temples, under which around 4,000 temples have already undergone kumbabishekam (ritual consecration).


## Seven Tier Gopuram Rises At Pazhayarai

**The HR&CE Department has begun constructing a seven-tier gopuram at the Somanathar Temple in Pazhayarai near Kumbakonam, at a cost of ₹7.95 crore. HR&CE minister P. K. Sekarbabu said the temple is part of efforts to restore ancient shrines. Pazhayarai holds major Chola-era significance, having served as an early royal residence before the capital shifted to Thanjavur, during early Cholas.**

- ❖ Tamil Nadu is close to eliminating malaria, with 33 out of 38 districts reporting zero indigenous cases in the past three years.

- ❖ Chennai, Ramanathapuram, Thoothukudi, Chengalpattu, and Salem are the five districts still reporting cases, accounting for 37%-45% of the State's malaria cases.
- ❖ Malaria cases in Tamil Nadu have declined from 5,587 in 2015 to 321 in 2025. Cases in Chennai have reduced from 173 in 2023 to 121 in 2025.
- ❖ The Most reported cases in recent years have been imported rather than locally transmitted: 330 of 384 in 2023, 208 of 347 in 2024, and 203 of 321 in 2025.
- ❖ The Directorate of Public Health and Preventive Medicine conducts surveillance through blood smear testing, monitoring fever cases at Primary Health Centres (PHCs) and Government Hospitals (GHs), and tracking migrant labourers.
- ❖ Annual Parasite Incidence has fallen below 1%, and there have been no malaria outbreaks in the past three years.

## NATIONAL NEWS

### District-Led Textiles Transformation (DLTT) Initiative




- ❖ The Ministry of Textiles launched the District-Led Textiles Transformation (DLTT) initiative at the National Textile Ministers Conference in Guwahati.
- ❖ The scheme aims to develop 100 Global Export Champion districts and 100 Aspirational districts in the textile sector.
- ❖ These Districts are selected using data on exports, Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), and workforce strength.
- ❖ Champion districts will get Industry 4.0 technology and Mega Common Facility Centres for advanced growth.

- ❖ Aspirational districts will receive skill training, Raw Material Banks, and support to Self-Help Groups (SHGs).

### Fertiliser Production in 2025

- ❖ India has produced 524.62 lakh tonnes of fertilisers in 2025, meeting nearly 73 percent of domestic demand.
- ❖ This includes urea, DAP (Di-Ammonium Phosphate), NPKs (Nitrogen, Phosphorus, Potassium), and SSP (Single Super Phosphate).
- ❖ Fertiliser production has steadily increased over five years, from 433.29 lakh tonnes in 2021 to 467.87 lakh tonnes in 2022.
- ❖ It was 507.93 lakh tonnes in 2023, 509.57 lakh tonnes in 2024, and reaching 524.62 lakh tonnes in 2025.



### All India Major Port Cultural Meet

- ❖ The 25th All India Major Port Cultural Meet 2025–26 concluded at Paradip Port, Odisha.
- ❖ The event was organized by the Paradip Port Authority (PPA) in association with the Major Ports Sports Control Board.
- ❖ The Syama Prasad Mookerjee Port Authority was declared the Overall Champion, Mumbai Port Authority was the Runners-up, and Deendayal & Cochin Port Authorities were Joint Second Runners-up.

- ❖ The meet promotes cultural exchange, unity, and camaraderie among India's port employees and strengthens national integration in the maritime sector.



## ECONOMY NEWS

### India's Fish Production in FY 2024-25

**INDIA'S BLUE REVOLUTION**

**RECORD GROWTH IN FISH PRODUCTION**

- ⌚ **106% growth** over a **decade**
- ⌚ **Fish Production** increased to **197.75 lakh tonnes** in **FY 2024-25** from 95.79 lakh tonnes in **FY 2013-14**
- ⌚ **4.77 tonnes per hectare increase** in **average aquaculture productivity**

- ❖ India's Fish production has increased to 197.75 lakh tonnes in FY 2024-25.

- ❖ It was 95.79 lakh tonnes in FY 2013-14 and increased 106%.
- ❖ Average aquaculture productivity has increased to 4.77 tonnes per hectare.
- ❖ India exported 16.98 Lakh tons of seafood worth Rs ₹62,408 crore during 2023-24.
- ❖ India's seafood exports touched an all-time high in value during the financial year 2024-25 to Rs 62,408 crore.
- ❖ India exports over 350 seafood products to 130 countries, with aquaculture contributing 62% of export value.

## ENVIRONMENT NEWS

### Kashmir Markhor



- ❖ The Kashmir markhor (*Capra falconeri cashmeriensis*), India's rarest wild goat, is facing local extinction with only 200–300 individuals left.
- ❖ It is a subspecies of Markhor (*Capra falconeri*) and shares the overall species status of Near Threatened on the IUCN Red List.
- ❖ The species is endemic to Jammu & Kashmir, mainly in Kazinag National Park, Hirpora Wildlife Sanctuary, Tattakuti Wildlife Sanctuary, and Khara Gali Conservation Reserve.
- ❖ Kashmir markhor is an ecological indicator, prey for snow leopards, leopards, and wolves, and helps maintain mountain vegetation and soil health.

- ❖ The name “markhor” comes from Persian, meaning “snake-killer”, reflecting ancient folklore.

## STATES' NEWS

### Boda Tyohar 2025

- ❖ The month-long festival "Boda Tyohar", was commenced in Nahan, Himachal Pradesh.
- ❖ It is also called "Magho ko Tyohar".
- ❖ The festival is a part of the primitive traits and distinct culture of the Hati tribe.
- ❖ It is also celebrated in the Jaunsar Babar tribal belt of Uttarakhand.
- ❖ This festival symbolises the importance of women in Hati culture.
- ❖ Hati community was declared a Scheduled Tribe in August 2023.
- ❖ Though Polyandry is illegal under Indian law, the Himachal Pradesh revenue law has upheld the Hatti tribe's tradition of Jodidara.



## MISCELLANEOUS NEWS

### Zehanpora Buddhist Complex in Kashmir

- ❖ The 2,000-year-old Zehanpora Buddhist stupa complex in Baramulla, Jammu & Kashmir, has been scientifically excavated.
- ❖ The site dates to the Kushan period (1st–3rd century CE) and spreads over 10 acres.

- ❖ It includes the multiple stupas, apsidal chaityas (prayer halls), viharas (monk residences), urban settlements, and artefacts.
- ❖ Zehanpora lies along the ancient Silk Route linking Kashmir with Gandhara (Afghanistan–Pakistan region).
- ❖ Buddhism in Kashmir began under Emperor Ashoka (3rd century BCE) and flourished during Kushan rule under Kanishka and Huvishka.
