TNPSC BITS

- ❖ First of its kind exhibition 'Banking on World Heritage' was Inaugurated at Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts, New Delhi.
- ❖ Ajit Pawar took oath as the Deputy Chief Minister of Maharashtra for the fifth time.
- ❖ The Home Minister laid the foundation stone of the country's first cooperativerun Sainik School near Mehsana in Gujarat.
- ❖ The three-day International Conference on Green Hydrogen (ICGH-2023) was held in New Delhi.

NATIONAL

700 MW nuclear reactor

- ❖ India's first indigenously developed 700 MW nuclear power reactor has started commercial operations.
- ❖ It is located at the Kakrapar atomic power project (KAPP)-3 in Gujarat.
- ❖ The Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited (NPCIL) is building two 700 MW pressurised heavy water reactors (PHWRs) at Kakrapar.
- ❖ The government has sanctioned building of 10 indigenously developed PHWRs in fleet mode at four locations.
- ❖ They are Gorakhpur in Haryana, Chutka in Madhya Pradesh, Mahi Banswara in Rajasthan and Kaiga in Karnataka.

- ❖ It aims to enhance fire safety infrastructure across the country.
- ❖ It ensures 'zero death' and minimum loss of property during disasters by strengthening disaster risk reduction system.



Bharat 6g alliance




❖ The Department of Telecommunications (DoT) has launched Bharat 6G Alliance.





- ❖ It aims to drive innovation and collaboration in next-generation wireless technology.
- ❖ Bharat 6G Alliance (B6GA) is a collaborative platform consisting of public and private companies, academia, research institutions, and standards development organizations.
- ❖ It will forge coalitions and synergies with other 6G Global Alliances.

Carbon Credit Trading Scheme, 2023



- ❖ The union government approved the formation of India's first domestic regulated carbon market.
- ❖ The 'Carbon Credit Trading Scheme, 2023' was first announced under the Energy Conservation Act, 2001.
- ❖ It aims to set up a carbon credit trading market in the country.
- ❖ The scheme would entail formation of a "National Steering Committee, a technical committee, an Accredited Carbon Verification Agency and the Central Electricity Regulatory Commission (CERC) as the carbon market regulator.
- The Grid Controller of India will be the registry for the Indian carbon market.
- ❖ The steering committee would be responsible for making the regulations, procedures and guidelines for the functioning of the carbon market.





- ❖ The technical committee will be responsible for compliance of the said rules and regulations.
- ❖ The Bureau has entrusted the existing power exchanges for the carbon credit certificate trading.

- ❖ It aims to inculcate the spirit of self-dependence among the women of Backward Classes under Term Loan.
- ❖ The women belonging to Backward Classes shall be eligible for loan under this scheme.
- ❖ The beneficiary women are not required to invest any amount of her own on the projects up to cost of Rs.2,00,000/.
- ❖ The rate of interest on the amount of loan is less as compared to the general loan scheme of the Corporation.

E-Saras App

- ❖ Deendayal Antyodaya Yojna- National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM) has launched the eSARAS mobile app.
- ❖ It aims to provide better marketing support and e-commerce opportunities for products made by women in self-help groups (SHGs).
- ❖ The eSARAS fulfilment centre will be managed by the Foundation for Development of Rural Value Chains (FDRVC).






- ❖ This fulfilment centre will be used for processing, packaging and shipping of products that customers purchase through the eSARAS portal and eSARAS mobile app.
- ❖ It will handle the logistics required to bring an online order to a customer's doorstep.



Lansdowne Cantonment Board rename



❖ The Lansdowne Cantonment Board, located in Uttarakhand, has decided to rename as Jaswantgarh after Rifleman Jaswant Singh Rawat.





- ❖ Lansdowne was a British politician who served as Viceroy of India from 1888 to 1894
- ❖ The Cantonment and Regimental Centre for the training of recruits of the Garhwal Rifles was located in a forest area popularly known as Kalundanda.
- ❖ Jaswant was awarded the Maha Vir Chakra posthumously while his battalion received the Battle Honour Nuranang.

INTERNATIONAL

Iran in SCO



- ❖ Iran became the new permanent member of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) at an India-hosted virtual summit.
- ❖ It acquired membership 18 years after got observer status in the security and trade cooperation organization.
- ❖ The SCO was founded at a summit in Shanghai in 2001.
- ❖ The initial members are Russia, China, the Kyrgyz Republic, Kazakhstan, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan.
- ❖ India and Pakistan became its permanent members in 2017.
- ❖ In March, Saudi Arabia's Cabinet approved a decision to join the organization.
- ❖ Last May, the United Arab Emirates (UAE) and Kuwait became dialogue partners of the SCO.


CMV and ToMV Viruses

❖ Tomato growers in Maharashtra and Karnataka have blamed two different viruses for the loss of yields.





- ❖ Farmers in Maharashtra have said their tomato crop was impacted by attacks of the cucumber mosaic virus (CMV).
- ❖ The Growers in Karnataka and other South Indian states have blamed the tomato mosaic virus (ToMV) for crop losses.
- ❖ The two plant pathogens have similar names and cause similar damage to crops.
- ❖ But they belong to different viral families, and spread differently.
- ❖ ToMV belongs to the Virgaviridae family and is closely related to the tobacco mosaic virus (TMV).
- ❖ ToMV hosts include tomato, tobacco, peppers, and certain ornamental plants.
- ❖ CMV has a much larger host pool that includes cucumber, melon, eggplant, tomato, carrot, lettuce, celery, cucurbits
- ❖ CMV was identified in cucumber in 1934, which gave the virus its name.
- ❖ ToMV spreads mainly through infected seeds, saplings, agricultural tools and often, through the hands of nursery workers.
- CMV is spread by aphids, which are sap-sucking insects.
- ❖ CMV can also spread through human touch, but the chances of that are extremely low.



STATES

India's First Pig Schools

The Bodoland Territorial Council (BTC) is scheduled to ink a deal with the Danish government for setting up India's first pig schools, preferably with a centralised academy.





- ❖ BTC rules the 8,970 sq. km region comprising four Bhutan-bordering districts of the Assam.
- ❖ 50 farmers travel to Denmark to learn various aspects of piggery from rearing to making pork products.
- ❖ The seeds of the pig schools were sown in September 2021.
- ❖ The State has 15.89% the highest of the total population of pigs in India.
- ❖ The pig school will be based on the Folk School concept that Dalum Landbrugsskole.
