- Elon Musk has announced the very formation of a new political party in the US, named the 'America Party'

Fifth Tamil Nadu Police Commission - Prison deaths

TN Panel Recommends Pay Hike for Constables

The 5th Tamil Nadu Police Commission has recommended a pay hike for police constables, aligning their salaries with counterparts in the Union govt and other States. It proposed raising the pay scale from ₹18,200-₹52,900 to ₹21,700-₹69,100. The report also suggests increasing the minimum educational qualification to Class XII and addressing police mental health issues through periodic reviews and well-being programs.

The commission, formed in 2022, submitted its recommendations to Chief Minister M.K. Stalin recently.

- ❖ The Fifth Tamil Nadu Police Commission urged firm disciplinary action against abuse of authority and brutal handling of suspects by police personnel.
- ❖ The Commission emphasized prompt internal investigation and immediate action in cases of verbal abuse, wrongful detentions, false case registration, biased investigations, and selective law enforcement.
- ❖ It has recommended the strict implementation of the Supreme Court guidelines issued in the Arnesh Kumar vs. State of Bihar case to minimise the unnecessary arrests.
- ❖ Detention of women, children, medically unfit individuals, and persons under the influence of alcohol in police stations was strictly discouraged.





- ❖ Mandatory medical examination of all detained persons was recommended, along with follow-up action based on the medical findings.
- ❖ Sufficient police personnel must be assigned to guard any detained individual to ensure their safety in custody.

ADT 59 Paddy Variety



- ❖ The Tamil Nadu Rice Research Institute (TRRI), Aduthurai, has introduced a new short-duration paddy variety, ADT 59.
- ❖ It was gaining popularity among Cauvery delta farmers for the Kuruvai crop.
- ❖ ADT 59 delivers 15-20% higher yields compared to traditional varieties like ADT 37 and ASD 16.
- ❖ The Farmers have harvesting up to 4,000 kilograms per acre under the Kuruvai conditions.
- ❖ The variety requires only 50% of the fertilizer input used by conventional strains, making it cost-effective for farmers.
- ❖ ADT 59 shows strong resistance to salinity and pests such as stem borers, blast disease, and brown leaf spot, ensuring healthier crops.
- ❖ With a grain maturity period of 110-115 days, the variety is well-suited for the Kuruvai, Navarai, and summer seasons.

- ❖ Kuruvai (short-term rice) farming has started well in Tamil Nadu's Cauvery delta, with 3.09 lakh acres planted so far out of the 5.7 lakh-acre target.
- ❖ This is 60,000 acres more than last year, showing better progress even outside the main delta area.
- ❖ The Mettur dam, which is very important for the delta, is almost full with 93 tmcft (thousand million cubic feet) of water.





❖ In June, Tamil Nadu got 42.25 tmcft of water at Biligundlu, much more than the usual 9.19 tmcft.

Samooga Needhi Viduthigal

- ❖ All government-run hostels in Tamil Nadu will now be called 'Samooga Needhi Viduthigal' (Social Justice Hostels).
- ❖ This aims to remove the caste and religious labels and create equality among the students.
- ❖ The State runs 2,739 hostels, helping 1.79 lakh poor and marginalised students from various communities.
- ❖ The decision is followed the suggestions from a committee led by retired judge K. Chandru to reduce caste differences in schools and colleges.



Zaaroz app

- ❖ From July 1, restaurant owners in Namakkal stopped using Swiggy and Zomato due to high commission fees and hidden charges.
- ❖ Instead, they began using Zaaroz, a Tamil Nadu-based food delivery app from Chidambaram in Cuddalore district.





- **❖** Zaaroz runs on a very low-cost monthly subscription model—₹1,500 (+GST) for messes/bakeries, ₹3,000 (+GST) for restaurants—with no commission per order.
- ❖ Around 50 eateries have joined the platform, saving 90% in costs compared to the earlier aggregators who charged ₹20,000–₹30,000 monthly.
- ❖ Hotel owners in Tiruchengode and Rasipuram are also planning to join Zaaroz soon.




Kasanoi Erappila Thittam (TN-KET)

- ❖ Tamil Nadu has become the first Indian state to integrate a predictive model for tuberculosis (TB) deaths into its TB elimination programme.
- ❖ The model was developed by the Indian Council of Medical Research National Institute of Epidemiology (ICMR-NIE).
- ❖ It used data from 56,000 TB patients treated in state-run facilities between July 2022 and June 2023.
- ❖ The goal is to identify the severely ill TB patients early, speed up their admission, and begin immediate treatment to reduce deaths.
- ❖ The new system is built into the state's TB SeWA (Severe TB Web Application).
- ❖ It will be used under the Tamil Nadu Kasanoi Erappila Thittam (TN-KET) care initiative.





❖ The application flags the patients based on risk factors like very low body weight, inability to stand, or co-infection with HIV (Human Immunodeficiency Virus).

- ❖ The Tamil Nadu state government extends the term of Special Officers (SOs) for administering rural local bodies by six more months, till January 5, 2026.
- ❖ The extension covers 9,581 village panchayats, 314 panchayat union councils, and 28 district panchayats across 28 districts.
- ❖ An ordinance will be promulgated to formalise the extension, to be replaced by a bill in the next Assembly session.





- SOs were appointed after the elected representatives' term ended on January 5, 2024.
- ❖ The government cited delays in reorganisation of local bodies and pending ward delimitation as reasons for the extension.

NATIONAL NEWS

Faculty Rules 2025



- ❖ The National Medical Commission (NMC) introduces new faculty regulations to expand medical education in India.
- ❖ Medical council revises faculty eligibility norms to boost medical college capacity.
- NMC's 2025 rules ease faculty requirements, enable growth of medical seats.
- ❖ New NMC regulations focus on competency to widen medical faculty pool.
- ❖ NMC 2025 guidelines allow non-teaching hospitals as medical teaching centers.
- ❖ Medical faculty rules have been updated to support the expansion of MBBS and MD/MS seats.


National Biobank

- ❖ Centre has inaugurated the Phenome India National Biobank at CSIR-Institute of Genomics and Integrative Biology (CSIR-IGIB), Delhi.
- ❖ The Biobank will gather genomic, lifestyle, and clinical data from 10,000 diverse Indian participants.






- It is modeled on the UK Biobank.
- ❖ It aims to improve the early disease diagnosis and personalized treatments for conditions like diabetes, cancer, and rare genetic disorders.
- ❖ It focuses on India-specific health issues such as the central obesity and complex heterogeneous conditions.



ENVIRONMENT NEWS

Mauna Loa Climate Station



❖ The United States government plans to stop for funding the Mauna Loa Climate Observatory in Hawaii.





- ❖ This may result in the shutdown of one of the world's longest-running carbon dioxide monitoring stations after 65 years.
- ❖ The Mauna Loa station was established in 1958 by scientist Charles Keeling.
- ❖ It has provided consistent data on atmospheric carbon dioxide (CO₂), forming the iconic "Keeling Curve."
- ❖ The observatory's high-altitude and remote location enabled accurate tracking of CO₂ levels, helping confirm human-driven climate change.

STATES' NEWS

Free Educational Kits in Andhra Pradesh



- ❖ The Andhra Pradesh state government launched the 'Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan Vidyarthi Mitra Kits' scheme.
- ❖ This scheme is to provide the free educational kits to over 35 lakh students in government and aided schools for the 2025–26 academic year.
- ❖ Kits include the uniforms, shoes, belts, socks, school bags, textbooks, notebooks, workbooks, and dictionaries.
- This scheme replaces the previous 'Jagananna Vidya Kanuka' kits.

MISCELLANEOUS NEWS

The Trust of Dalai Lama - Gaden Phodrang

- ❖ The 14th Dalai Lama in Dharamshala at Himachal Pradesh asserted for the first time that the line will continue after him.
- ❖ The succession or the 15th Dalai Lama would be decided by the Gaden Phodrang Trust.





- ❖ It cites a Qing dynasty tradition of picking the Dalai Lama's successor through lots from a "Golden Urn".
- ❖ Dalai Lama has lived in India since 1959.
- ❖ He fled Lhasa in Tibet years after the Chinese annexed Tibet in 1951.
- ❖ Gaden Phodrang was the name of the Tibetan government.
- ❖ It was established by the 5th Dalai Lama, Ngawang Lobsang Gyatso or 'the Great Fifth', as both the Spiritual and Political head of a unified Tibet.
- ❖ It was coined from the name of the historical estate of the Dalai Lamas at the Drepung Monastery.
- ❖ In 2011, the 14th Dalai Lama set up the Gaden Phodrang Trust as he decided to separate the Spiritual and Political powers of his post.
