TNPSC BITS

- The Ministry of Mines awarded seven-star ratings for the first time to three mines

 Ultratech Cement's Naokari limestone mine, Tata Steel's Noamundi iron ore
 mine, and Sandur Manganese and Iron Ore Ltd.'s Kammatharu mine.
- The three-day Sakambari festival was held at the Kanaka Durga Temple on Indra Keeladri Hill in Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh.
- Kerala's first skin bank will be launched at Thiruvananthapuram Government Medical College Hospital.
- Assam's first bagless tea brand, Woolah Tea, has been granted a 20-year patent for its innovative 'compressed true whole leaf tea dips and method thereof.
- Vatsala, believed to be Asia's oldest female elephant at over 100 years, passed away at Panna Tiger Reserve, Madhya Pradesh.
- ◆ Punjab has launched a Mukhya Mantri Sehat Yojana, a universal health cover promising free and cashless medical treatment up to ₹10 lakh per year for every family of the state, irrespective of income.
- Trinidad and Tobago has become the first Caribbean nation to enable financial transactions through India's BHIM app using the UPI.
- The Indian Coast Guard and the Japanese Coast Guard are conducting a joint exercise, codenamed Jaa Mata (meaning "see you later" in Japanese), in Chennai.
- ✤ The 11th Edition of the India Maize Summit was held in New Delhi.
- Switzerland has granted the first approval for Coartem® (artemetherlumefantrine) Baby, a malaria medicine designed for small infants.
- Bulgaria has been approved to adopt the euro effective 1 January 2026, which would make it the 21st member state of the eurozone.
- The World UFO Day is observed annually on July 02 to spread awareness among people about UFOs (Unidentified Flying Objects) and encourage scientific thinking.

TAMIL NADU NEWS


Heat stress in cities

The report titled "Urban Growth and Thermal Stress: A Decadal Assessment of Built-Up Area and Climate Interactions in Tamil Nadu" was prepared by the Tamil Nadu State Planning Commission.





- It reveals that the rising temperatures driven by urban sprawl, deforestation, and changes the land use are putting the people, ecosystems, and infrastructure at increasing risk.
- ✤ The Blocks such as Chennai (with 74% built-up area as of 2015), Coimbatore, and Tiruppur have seen significant urban sprawl.
- Out of 389 blocks analysed, 94 have shown very severe long-term increases in temperature, while 64 currently experience extreme heat stress.
- Significantly, 25 blocks, including the parts of Chennai, Karur, and Ramanatha puram, fall into both categories, making them the most vulnerable hotspots in Tamil Nadu.
- ✤ High-altitude regions have also recorded noticeable warming, up to 0.7°C in Kodaikanal and 1.2°C in Tiruttani.
- Tamil Nadu could experience annual air temperature increases of 0.9°C to 2.7°C by 2050.



NATIONAL NEWS

Indian PM's Visit to Brazil

- During the visit to Brazil, the Indian Prime Minister was presented with the Grand Collar of the National Order of the Southern Cross, the country's highest civilian honour.
- ✤ Also, India and Brazil signed six agreements during the visit.





- They also cover cooperation in security, digital infrastructure, renewable energy, agriculture, and intellectual property.
- ✤ Both countries set a bilateral trade target of \$20 billion within five years (2030).



INTERNATIONAL NEWS

FATF's Update on Terrorist Financing Risks



- ✤ The report was titled 'Comprehensive Update on Terrorist Financing Risks'.
- The Financial Action Task Force has included a separate section on statesponsored terrorism in its report for the first time.





- It raised concerns over the misuse of e-commerce platforms and online payment services by terrorist organisations.
- India's 2022 National Risk Assessment (NRA) on Money Laundering and Terror Financing flagged state-sponsored terrorism as a major concern.

ECONOMY NEWS

India's Invisible Trade 2024/25

- India's exports of goods rose almost fivefold, from \$66.3 billion to \$318.6 billion, between 2003-04 and 2013-14.
- Thereafter, it flattened out and witnessed a fall and rise.
- After 2022-23, India's goods exports have dipped again to \$441.4 billion in 2023-24 and \$441.8 billion in 2024-25.
- On the other hand, the receipts from "invisible" surged to \$576.5 billion in 2024-25.
- ✤ It was \$53.5 billion in 2003-04.
- An invisible trade includes the exports of services, cross-border remittances and other non-physical transactions.
- The Software services also grew from \$12.8 billion in 2003-04 to \$180.6 billion in 2024-25.

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY NEWS

Miniature Plasma Loops

✤ Astronomers found small and short-lived loops in the Sun's lower atmosphere.





- These may reveal how the Sun stores and unleashes magnetic energy.
- ◆ These miniature coronal loops are only 3,000–4,000 km long and <100 km wide.
- They were previously undetectable due to their size and the brief lifespan (lasting just a few minutes).



Vera C Rubin Observatory

Rubin's Simonyi Survey Telescope, which has the world's largest camera, can observe an area of the sky equivalent to 40 full moons arranged in a line



This observatory in Chile has released its first test images.





- It was showcasing its potential to transform astronomy by detecting millions of celestial events, asteroids, and dark matter signals every night.
- It is located 8,684 feet above sea level atop the Cerro Pachón Mountain in the Chilean Andes.
- The telescope has the world's largest digital camera and boasts a staggering resolution of 3,200 megapixels.

Increase in Earth's Rotation Speeds



- Earth is expected to spin faster than usual, leading to slightly shorter days.
- On July 9, July 22, and August 5, 2025, the position of the moon will influence Earth's rotation.
- This was making each day between 1.3 and 1.51 milliseconds shorter than the standard 24 hours.
- Earlier on July 5, 2023, Earth completed its spin 1.66 milliseconds faster than normal.

ENVIRONMENT NEWS

Melting ice and Volcanic eruptions

- ✤ A new study suggests that the climate crisis could trigger a surge in volcanic eruptions.
- The melting glaciers and ice caps relieve the pressure on underground magma chambers.
- This phenomenon has been observed in Iceland.
- Glaciers tend to suppress the volume of eruptions from the volcanoes beneath them.





But when glaciers retreat due to climate change, these volcanoes go on to erupt more frequently and more explosively.



STATES' NEWS

Chhattisgarh Auxiliary Armed Police Act



- In July 2011, the Supreme Court directed the State of Chhattisgarh to stop using SPOs in any activities related to countering Maoist insurgency.
- Then the state passed the Auxiliary Armed Police Force Act and authorised the creation of an auxiliary force to assist security forces in maintaining public order and combating Maoist violence.
- The petition was challenging the State's enactment of the law after its earlier order restricting the use of Special Police Officers (SPOs) in the anti-Maoist operations.
- ✤ This case is known as Nandini Sundar and Ors. Vs State of Chhattisgarh.





- Now, the Supreme Court has upheld the validity of the Auxiliary Armed Police Force Act, 2011.
- The Court emphasised the complete power of the legislature to enact laws within constitutional limits, even if such laws alter or override judicial decisions.

IMPORTANT DAYS

National Chartered Accountants Day 2025 - July 01



- This day marks the foundation of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) in 1949.
- It was established under the Chartered Accountants Act, 1949, passed by the Indian Parliament.
- This day honours the commitment, knowledge, and moral principles maintained by chartered accountants.

Goods and Services Tax Day 2025 - July 01

- In August 2016, the Constitution (101st Amendment) Act was passed by the parliament.
- \clubsuit It gave the central government the authority to impose and collect GST.
- ♦ GST in India was officially launched on July 1, 2017.
- The GST has replaced multiple indirect taxes levied by the Central and State Governments, such as the excise duty, service tax, value-added tax (VAT), and others.





It brought uniformity in the tax structure across India, eliminating the cascading effect of taxes.



World Sports Journalists Day 2025 - July 02



- ✤ It aims to celebrate the services of sports journalists for the promotion of sports.
- Sports journalism is a form of reporting that focuses on matters pertaining to any subject or topic related to sports.
- Sports journalists work on various media platforms, including print, broadcast, and the internet.
- The International Sports Press Association (AIPS) established the World Sports Journalist Day in 1994.





The theme for 2025 is "Championing Fair Play: Reporting with the Integrity and Impact".

USA Independence Day 2025 - July 04

- This year marked 249 years since the Declaration of Independence was adopted in 1776.
- This day marked the separation of British colonies from Great Britain.
- ✤ The struggle for independence began in 1775.
- The 13 American colonies sought freedom from British rule under King George III.



International Day of Cooperatives 2025 - July 05



International Day of Cooperatives Driving Inclusive and Sustainable Solutions for a Better World 5th July 2025

- ✤ It is observed annually on the first Saturday of July.
- ✤ The International Cooperative Alliance (ICA) first celebrated it in 1923.
- ✤ In 1995, the United Nations officially recognised this day.





- The theme for 2025 is "Cooperatives: Driving Inclusive and Sustainable Solutions for a Better World."
- The UNGA also declared 2025 as the International Year of Cooperatives (IYC2025)

World Zoonoses Day 2025 - July 06

- This day aims to raise awareness about zoonotic diseases and promote measures for their prevention and control.
- ✤ On this day in 1885, Louis Pasteur administered the first successful rabies vaccine.
- Over 60% of infectious diseases in humans are zoonotic in origin, and about 75% emerging infectious diseases come from animals.
- The term "zoonoses" (plural of zoonosis) derives from the Greek words Zoon (animal) and Nosos (disease).
