TNPSC BITS

- Industry body COAI named Pramod K Mittal, President of Reliance Jio Infocomm, as the new Chairperson of the association for 2022-23.
- Radha Iyengar Plumb, an Indian-American, was nominated to the position of Deputy Under Secretary of Défense for Acquisition and Sustainment of USA.
- India hosted a Special ASEAN-India Foreign Ministers' Meeting (SAIFMM) in order to commemorate 30 years of ASEAN-India Dialogue Relations.
- The Central bankers around the world are enacting most dramatic tightening of monetary policy since the 1980s.

NATIONAL

• It is risking recessions and upsetting financial markets as they try to deal with an unexpected spike in inflation.



10% quota for Agniveers

- The Centre announced a 10% reservation for Agni veers in the Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF) and Assam Rifles recruitment.
- The Ministry of Home Affairs also decided to grant a three-year age relaxation to Agni veers in the CAPFs and Assam Rifles who are between the ages of 17.5 and 21.
- The initial class of recruits will be given a five-year extension on the maximum age limit.





The central government increased the upper age limit for the scheme from 21 to 23 years in a one-time waiver.

INTERNATIONAL

Importer of Indian Broken Rice



- China has emerged as the largest importer or buyer of broken rice from India.
- China takes over the largest importer of broken rice in India, which were the African countries.





- During the pandemic, China took the lead as the largest importer of broken rice in India.
- ✤ 7.7 percent has been imported to China which is 16.34 lakh metric tonnes.
- ✤ India's total export is 212.10 Lakh metric tonnes in the year 2021-2022.

Total Renewable Power Addition in 2021



- ♦ India added around 15.4 gigawatts (GW) of renewable power capacity in 2021.
- ✤ India is the third highest after China (136 GW) and the United States (43 GW).
- China is the global leader in cumulative renewable energy capacity at the end of 2021.
- It is followed by the United States (398 GW), Brazil (160 GW), India (158 GW) and Germany (139 GW).

ECONOMY

Indian Funds in Swiss Banks







- Funds parked by Indian individuals and firms in Swiss banks, jumped to 2.55 billion Swiss francs (over Rs 20,700 crore) in 2020.
- It is including through India-based branches and other financial institutions.
- The increase in aggregate funds of Indian clients with Swiss banks, from 899 million Swiss francs (Rs 6,625 crore) at the end of 2019.
- This reverses a two-year declining trend and has taken the figure to the highest level in 13 years.

Payments Vision 2025

- The RBI released its vision on architecture of digital finance, in a document for payments systems.
- ✤ It aims to provide a safe and affordable e-payment options to every user.
- ✤ The document includes
 - o Regulations for BigTechs and fintechs in payments
 - o Guidelines on payments along with "Buy Now Pay Later" (BNPL) services
 - Introducing central bank digital currency (CBDC)
 - Linking credit cards as well as credit components of banking products with the Unified Payments Interface (UPI).

WTO on global trade deals



- 12th Ministerial Conference of WTO approved a series of trade agreements including commitments on fish, a partial waiver of intellectual property (IP) rights for COVID-19 vaccines, and pledges on health and food security.
- It prohibited certain forms of fisheries subsidies that contribute to overcapacity and overfishing.
- And it eliminates subsidies that contribute to Illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing (IUU-fishing).





✤ It allowed the developing countries to produce and export Covid vaccines.

Japan at NATO summit



- Japanese Prime Minister, Fumio Kishida, will attend this month's NATO summit in Madrid, Spain.
- He becomes the country's first leader to join the top meeting of the transatlantic alliance.
- Sweden and Finland, which have applied to join NATO, are sending delegations to the summit.
- South Korea's new President Yoon Suk-yeol will also be the first leader from his country to attend.

ENVIRONMENT

World's biggest plant



The world's largest living plant has been identified in the shallow waters off the coast of Western Australia.





- * The sprawling seagrass is a marine flowering plant known as Posidonia australis.
- ✤ It is believed to have spread from a single seed over at least 4,500 years.
- ✤ It is expanded for more than 112 miles (180 kilometres)
- ✤ It is present in Shark Bay, a wilderness area protected as a World Heritage site.

PERSONALITIES, AWARDS, AND EVENTS

Head of Press Council of India

- The Retired Supreme Court judge Ranjana Prakash Desai became the first women chairperson of the Press Council of India.
- She had recently headed the Delimitation Commission on Jammu and Kashmir which was set up to redraw the Assembly constituencies of the Union Territory.

Press Council of India

- ✤ PCI was established under the PCI Act of 1978.
- ✤ It Consists of a chairman and 28 other members.
- The PCI only overviews the functioning of print media.
- It does not have the power to review the functioning of the electronic media like radio, television and internet media.



Global Conference of Young Parliamentarians

 The Eighth Global Conference of Young Parliamentarians has been started in Sharm El Sheikh, Egypt to address climate change.





- The two-day conference is being jointly organized by the House of Representatives and the Inter-Parliamentary Union.
- Nagaland's first woman elected as Member of Parliament to Rajya Sabha, S.
 Phangon Konyak is representing India at the Conference.
- She will be sharing her thoughts on the 'Young MPs for Climate Actions'.

Global Skills Report 2022 G L O B A L S K I L L S R E P O R T 2022

- Coursera's latest Global Skills Report (GSR) 2022 has released recently.
- India's overall skills proficiency has slipped four places to be ranked at the 68th position globally.
- ✤ In Asia, India stands at the 19th position.





- ✤ India's technology proficiency levels from 38% to 46%, with the country strengthening its position by six spots.
- ◆ Proficiency in data science has dipped from 38% in 2021 to 26% in 2022,
- ✤ Thus, it is leading to a 12-rank drop.
- West Bengal leads the Indian states in terms of skills proficiency.
- West Bengal is ranked one state across the three domains.
