NATIONAL

Coastal clean-up campaign



- ❖ The Union Government announced a coastal clean-up initiative for 75 beaches in 2022.
- ❖ The Coastal Clean-up drive will start from July 3 and will conclude on September 17, 2022.
- ❖ This year, September 17 will also mark the 'International Coastal Clean-up Day 2022'.


Critical information infra

- ❖ The Ministry of Electronics and IT (MeitY) has declared the IT resources of ICICI Bank, HDFC Bank and UPI managing entity NPCI as 'critical information infrastructure'.
- ❖ It is implying that any harm to them can have an impact on national security.





- ❖ Any unauthorised person accessing these resources may be jailed for up to 10 years.
- ❖ Under the Information Technology Act of 2000, Centre has the power to declare any data, database, IT network or communications infrastructure as CII to protect that digital asset.



MoHUA NIPUN Initiative







- ❖ An Innovative project called "National Initiative for Promoting Upskilling of Nirman workers (NIPUN) was launched.
- ❖ This Initiative was launched for skill training of 100,000 construction workers.
- ❖ It has been launched under the flagship scheme of "Deendayal Antyodaya-Yojana National Urban Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NULM)".
- ❖ Under the scheme, the construction workers will be trained through fresh skilling and upskilling programs.
- ❖ The NIPUN Project will be implemented by the National Skill Development Corporation.

Deletion of 111 Political parties

- ❖ The Election Commission of India (ECI) has ordered the deletion of 111 registered unrecognized political parties that it found to be "non-existent".
- ❖ It referred three of the parties to the Department of Revenue for legal action for "serious financial impropriety".
- ❖ The Representation of the People Act, 1951 provides ECI to register and deregister the political parties.
- ❖ This was the second such action in the recent past against registered parties that have been found violating the RP Act, 1951.

INTERNATIONAL

Sri Lankan Constitutional Amendment

- ❖ Sri Lanka's parliament passed the 21st Amendment to the Constitution to curb the presidential powers.
- ❖ It grants more power to the parliament than before.
- ❖ It not only empowers the parliament but also holds the president accountable for the actions.

ECONOMY

India's largest trading partner

- ❖ As per Union Ministry of Commerce and Industry's latest data, United States has become India's largest trading partner.
- ❖ India's bilateral trade with the US has touched USD 119.42 billion





- It is exceeding India's trade with China.
- ❖ China was India's largest trading partner from 2013-2014 to 2017-2018 and 2020-2021.

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

India's first anti-gravity body suit



- ❖ AIIMS-Delhi developed the world's first anti-gravity body suit.
- ❖ It will help astronauts strengthen muscles and prevent loss of bone density minerals.
- ❖ It will also increase the weight of the astronauts by more than 70 percent in space to prevent them from floating.

ENVIRONMENT

'Single-use plastic' ban

- ❖ Union government has banned the use of 'single-use plastic' from July 1, 2022.
- ❖ Single-Use plastic refers to plastic items which are used once and discarded.





- ❖ Polythene bags under 75 microns was already banned in September 2021.
- ❖ From December 2022, polythene bags under 120 microns will also be banned.



STATES

International literary festival







- ❖ A three-day international literary festival called "Unmesha" was held at Gaiety Theatre in Shimla, Himachal Pradesh.
- ❖ This festival is India's largest international literary festival till date.

Kerala Migration Survey



- ❖ Kerala state has announced to conduct "Kerala Migration Survey 2022-23".
- ❖ It aims to prepare a data bank on Malayali expatriates across the world.
- ❖ As a part of the survey, a "Malayali Pravasi Portal" will be launched.
- ❖ This portal will be used to link Insurance and other welfare schemes for expatriates.
- ❖ An elaborate global registration campaign will also be held, to prepare the database.
- ❖ The first ever survey in 1998 showed that, around 1.5 million Keralites were then living outside India.
- ❖ In 2018, there are an estimated 2.12 million emigrants from Kerala worldwide.

IMPORTANT DAYS

World Sickle Cell Awareness Day - June 19

- ❖ It aims to enlighten the public about sickle cell disease and its treatments.
- ❖ The event also addresses the difficulties faced by patients, their families and caregivers.





❖ Sickle cell anaemia is a group of inherited disorders that cause red blood cells to become sickle instead of normal biconcave shape.



World Sauntering Day - June 19



- ❖ It was first established by W.T. Rabe in 1979 in response to jogging's growing popularity.
- ❖ It encourages people to walk gently while enjoying the beauty of nature.

International Day for the Elimination of Sexual Violence in Conflict – June 19

❖ On June 19, 2008, the 15-member United Nations Security Council adopted resolution to create this day.





- ❖ It aims to raise awareness about conflict-related sexual violence.
- ❖ The theme for this year is 'Prevention as Protection: Enhancing structural and operational prevention of conflict-related sexual violence.'



Father's Day - June 19



- ❖ Father's Day is a holiday of honouring fatherhood and paternal bonds, as well as the influence of fathers in society.
- ❖ It is celebrated on the third Sunday of June for the first time in 1910.


National Reading Day - June 19

- ❖ It aims to honour Puthuvayil Narayana Panicker (PN Panicker).
- ❖ He is considered as the Father of Library and Literacy Movement in Kerala.





Reading Day was started on June 19, 1996, by the Kerala Government along with the PN Panicker Foundation.



MISCELLANEOUS

World's Largest Freshwater Fish

- ❖ A 300 kg stingray was caught in the Mekong River in Cambodia.
- ❖ It is the biggest freshwater fish ever documented,
- ❖ It squashes previous record-holder, a 293kg Mekong giant catfish caught in Thailand in 2005.
- ❖ The Mekong has the third-most diverse fish population in the world.



Human Middle Ear

- ❖ As per the recent studies, middle ear of human has evolved from fish gills.
- ❖ Middle ear of human houses three tiny, vibrating bones.
- ❖ It helps in transporting sound vibrations into inner ear.





- ❖ Fossil and embryonic evidence proves that, human middle ear evolved from spiracle of fishes.
- ❖ However, origin of vertebrate spiracle is an unsolved mystery in vertebrate evolution.
