TNPSC BITS

- ❖ The Tamil Nadu assembly passed a resolution urging the Centre to conduct a caste-based census, along with the pending population census since 2021.
- ❖ The BJP's national president and Union Minister, JP Nadda, was appointed as the Leader of the House in the Rajya Sabha.
- ❖ The Universal AI University (UAIU), India's pioneering institution dedicated to Artificial Intelligence, has named Simon Mak, an international strategist and award-winning professor, as its vice chancellor.
 - He is the first non-Indian to hold the position of founding vice chancellor of an Indian institution.
- ❖ Indian cricketer Smriti Mandhana becomes first Indian woman to hit consecutive ODI centuries.

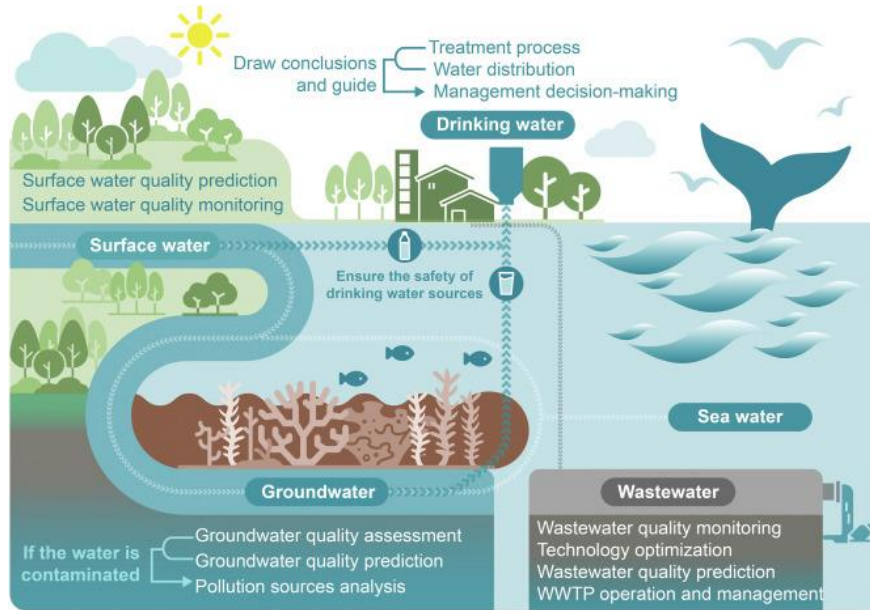
Female terracotta in Vembakottai



- ❖ A woman's head made of flint was found at Vembakottai-Vijayakariskulam in Virudhunagar district.
- ❖ The Vembakottai archaeological excavation has revealed that a rich civilisation had existed on the banks of the Vaippar near Sattur.
- ❖ It is on a par with the ancient civilisation found in Keeladi and Porunai civilisation.

- ❖ A broken Neolithic hand axe has been found in the ongoing excavations at Chennanur in Krishnagiri district.
- ❖ It reflects the evidence of Neolithic culture in this region.

TN Lake Quality Monitoring Project



- ❖ Tamil Nadu Lake Quality Monitoring Project is to be implemented in water bodies through real-time monitoring and artificial intelligence-based data analysis.
- ❖ The scheme will be implemented in the first phase in Poondi, Chembarambakkam, Udhagamandalam, and Kodaikanal lakes at a cost of ₹5 crore.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board (TNPCB) continuing to implement pollution abatement measures worth ₹100 crore through the TN Sustainably Harnessing Ocean Resources and Blue Economy project.

NATIONAL

Lok Sabha Speaker 2024

- ❖ The ruling NDA nominee, Om Birla, was elected as the Speaker of the 18th Lok Sabha for a second consecutive term by a voice vote.
- ❖ This year, the Lok Sabha witnessed contested election for Lok Sabha Speaker post between Om Birla and the INDIA bloc's nominee, Kodikunnil Suresh, the eight-time Congress MP from Kerala's Mavelikara.
- ❖ The Lok Sabha Speaker is the constitutional and ceremonial head of the House.

- ❖ He/she deals with the actual necessities and concerns of Parliament in the performance of its functions.
- ❖ According to the Indian Constitution, Article 93 provides for the election of both the Speaker and the Deputy Speaker.
- ❖ It is the members of the Lok Sabha who elect its presiding officer by a simple majority.
- ❖ The election of the Speaker is usually the first item of business in the newly constituted Lok Sabha.
- ❖ The process is overseen by the Pro-tem Speaker, who is appointed by the President of India.
- ❖ Notably, in the 72 years of the Lok Sabha Assembly, the election for the Speaker post has taken place only thrice, i.e., in 1952, 1967 and 1976.
- ❖ Notably, this is the sixth time that a Lok Sabha Speaker has been re-elected to the position and the fifth time for a consecutive second time.

HOW IS LOK SABHA SPEAKER APPOINTED

Once the date for the election of the **Speaker is approved by the President and notified by the Lok Sabha Secretariat**, any member may give notice in writing, of a motion that another Member be chosen as the Speaker of the House. The notice is addressed to the Secretary-General and has to be seconded by a third Member.

 **The notice must be submitted before noon on the day preceding the date of election.**

The name is normally proposed by the Prime Minister or the Minister of Parliamentary Affairs.

 **The Speaker is elected by a simple majority of members present and voting in the House.**

WHY IS THE SPEAKER'S POST CRUCIAL

The speaker of the Lok Sabha is the presiding officer of the Lok Sabha. A look at some of the powers bestowed on him.



The Speaker...

- + **Regulates debates** and proceedings in the House. He has the power to decide which member can address Parliament or raise questions.
- + **Presides over a joint sitting** of the two Houses of Parliament. The joint sitting of the Parliament is called by the President of India.
- + **Can adjourn the House** or suspend the meeting in absence of one-tenth of the total strength of the House.
- + **Decides** whether a bill is a money bill or not.
- + **Decides the questions** of disqualification of a member of the Lok Sabha.
- + **Constitutes** the Committees of the House.

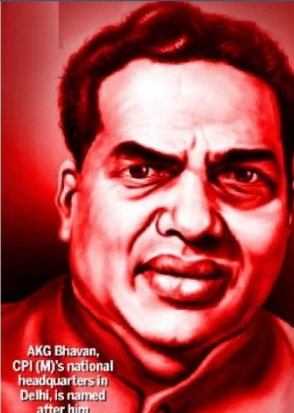
Does the Speaker vote?

 Normally the Speaker does not participate in voting. However, if there is a tie—when the House is evenly split on any issue—the Speaker is entitled to cast a vote. This is known as a Casting Vote, which is used to break the deadlock.

Lok Sabha's Leader of Opposition

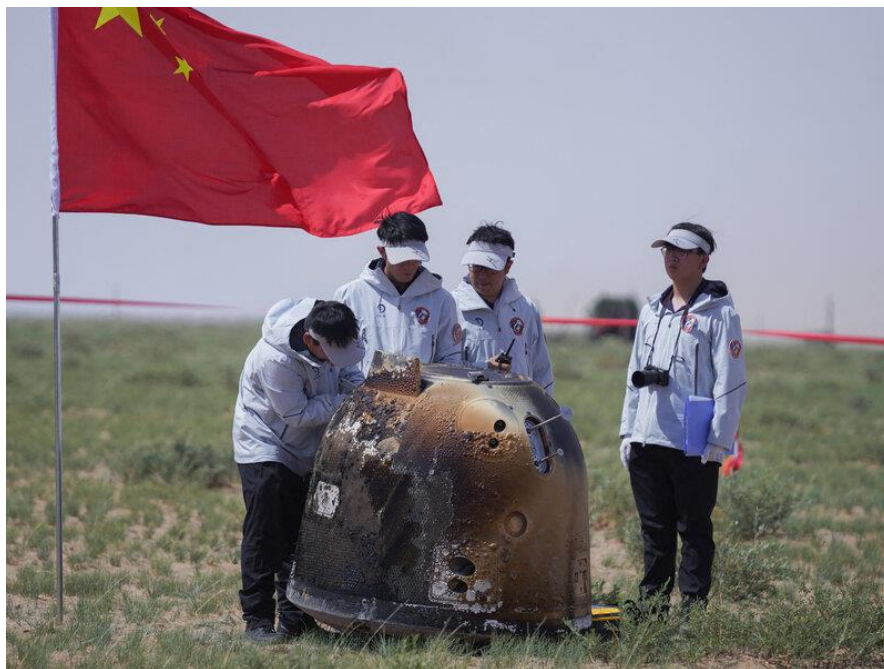
- ❖ Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla has recognised Rahul Gandhi as the leader of opposition.
- ❖ He has been recognised as the leader of opposition under Section 2 of the Salary and Allowances of Leaders of Opposition in Parliament Act, 1977.
- ❖ To get the post of Leader of Opposition, a party must have at least 10% of MPs in the House.

- ❖ The main duty of the Leader of Opposition is to serve as the voice of the opposition in the House.
- ❖ Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha is considered as a shadow Prime Minister with a shadow Cabinet.
- ❖ They are ready to take over the administration if the Government resigns or is defeated on the floor of the House.

China's Chang'e-6 mission 2024



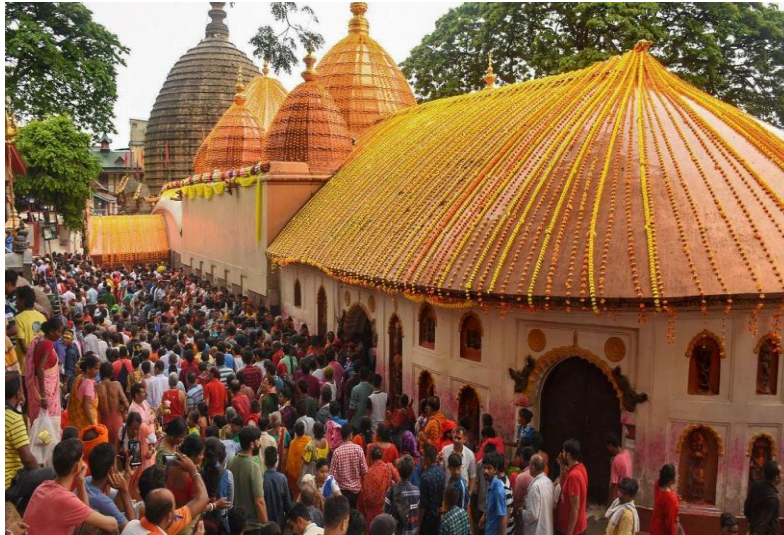
- ❖ China's Chang'e-6 mission's capsule returned by carrying the first soil samples collected from the far side of the Moon.

- ❖ Thus, China became the first country to successfully bring rock and soil samples from the far side of the moon.
- ❖ The probe landed in northern China in the Inner Mongolian region.
- ❖ Earlier, countries like US and Russia (Soviet Union) collected samples from the moon's near side.

STATES

Ambubachi mela 2024

- ❖ The Ambubachi Mela is a prominent annual festival held at the Kamakhya Temple in Guwahati, Assam.
- ❖ This special event celebrates the annual menstruation of Goddess Kamakhya, symbolising fertility and womanhood.
- ❖ This year saw a large gathering of sadhus, including Naga sadhus and holy men from around the world, including Nepal and Canada.



SPORTS

U-17 Asian Wrestling Championship 2024

- ❖ India concluded their campaign at the Under-17 Asian Wrestling Championships in Amman, Jordan.
- ❖ The young Indian contingent clinched a total of 11 medals, including four gold, two silver, and five bronze medals.

- ❖ Women wrestlers grabbed all four gold medals - Dipanshi in 46 kg, Muskan in 53 kg, Rajnita in 61 kg, and Mansi Lather in 69 kg.
- ❖ On the men's front, Samarth Gajanan Mhakave bagged a silver medal in the fiercely contested 55 kg category.



IMPORTANT DAYS

International Day of the Tropics 2024 - June 29



- ❖ It celebrates the extraordinary diversity of the tropics while highlighting unique challenges and opportunities nations of the Tropics face.
- ❖ This date is to remember the first 'State of the Tropics Report,' started by Myanmar's Nobel Laureate, Aung San Suu Kyi, in 2014.



- ❖ The Tropics are a region of the Earth, roughly defined as the area between the tropic of Cancer and the tropic of Capricorn.
- ❖ The Tropics host nearly 95% of the world's mangrove forests by area and 99% of mangrove species.
- ❖ The Tropics have just over half of the world's renewable water resources (54%).
