TNPSC BITS

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi has launched the Kindle version of Swami Chidbhavananda's 'Bhagavad Gita'.
 - Swami Chidbhavanandaji is the founder of Sri Ramakrishna Tapovanam Ashram at Thirupparaithurai, Tiruchirapalli, Tamil Nadu.
- The Sangay volcano of Ecuador was recently erupted.
- The BRICS Contact Group on Economic and Trade Issues (CGETI) leaders held their first meeting under India's Chairship.
 - The theme of BRICS this year is "BRICS@15: Intra BRICS Cooperation for Continuity, Consolidation, and Consensus".
- The Uttar Pradesh government ordered the removal of all religious structures on public roads.
- The Jharkhand cabinet has approved the employment policy of mandating the private sector units to reserve 75 per cent of jobs for local people.
 - Before Jharkhand, Haryana government had also approved a similar policy.

Gowsalya Shankar

- The U.S. Consulate honoured Tamil Nadu-based anti-caste activist and human rights defender Gowsalya Shankar with the International Woman of Courage (IWOC) Award.
- Gowsalya was U.S. Mission India's nominee for the 2021 U.S. Secretary of State's IWOC Award.

NATIONAL

4th Global Ayurveda Festival 2021

- It showcases Ayurveda as a global treatment programme.
- The Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industries is the festival and industry partner.
- International Ayurveda Seminar will be organised under the Theme "Strengthening Host Defence System – Ayurveda A Potential Promise".





- The International Delegate Assembly will be organised under the Theme "Globalizing Ayurveda – Scope, Challenges and Solutions".
- The "International Business Meet" will be organised under the Theme "Global Ayurveda Pharmacy – Practices, Possibilities and Policies".

Sahitya Akademi Award 2020

- Sahitya Akademi have announced the names for the "Sahitya Akademi Award 2020".
- The award is conferred to the most outstanding books of literary merit.
- It is given for the works published in any 24 major Indian languages.
- The languages include Hindi and other 22 languages of the Eighth Schedule of Constitution along with English.
- Subramaniam have won the award for her poetry collection called "When God is a Traveller" in English.
- Veerappa Moily has been named for his epic poetry called "Sri Bahubali Ahimsa Digvijayam" in Kannada language.
- Tamil writer Imayam won the Sahitya Akademi Award for 2020 for his novel Sellatha Panam.
- He calls himself a writer of the Dravidian movement.
- ✤ He is the first writer from 'Nadu Nadu' Cuddalore, Villupuram and Arcot districts of Tamil Nadu to win the award.

INTERNATIONAL

China's New Five-Year Plan

- ♦ China formally approved the outline of its 14th Five-Year Plan (2021-2025).
- It includes the first dam in Tibet on the lower reaches of the Yarlung Zangbo or Brahmaputra and a Sichuan-Tibet railway line near the India border.
- It aims to develop the Polar Silk Road as a component of the wider Belt and Road Initiative.





ECONOMY

Global Survey of Chief Executive Officers

- The findings are part of leading consultancy PwC's 24th Annual Global CEO Survey.
- ✤ India has emerged as the fifth most attractive growth destination
- ✤ The United States is the number one market.
- China is at the second spot.
- ✤ Germany and United Kingdom captured 3rd and 4th Spots respectively.

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

Johnson & Johnson's COVID-19 vaccine

- The World Health Organization (WHO) issued emergency use authorization for Johnson & Johnson's coronavirus vaccine
- Johnson & Johnson's coronavirus vaccine is the first single-dose vaccine to be listed by the WHO.
- ✤ This vaccine needs to be stored at -20 degrees.
- The WHO had earlier listed the Pfizer/BioNTech, AstraZeneca-SK Bio and Serum Institute of India vaccines for emergency use.

STATES

Kalanamak Rice Festival

- The Uttar Pradesh government organised "Kalanamak Rice Festival" in the Siddharth Nagar district, Uttar Pradesh.
- ✤ The Kala Namak Rice is grown in this region.
- ✤ The rice is a geographical indication (GI) tagged rice.

IMPORTANT DAYS


Pi Day – March 14

- ✤ Pi is the ratio of a circle's circumference to its diameter.
- The value of Pi is 3.14 and the initial of the number is 3.
- Thus, it is observed in March as it is the third month in the annual calendar.





- ◆ The symbol of Pi was discovered by William Jones in the year 1706.
- The value of the Pi was first calculated by Mathematician, Archimedes of Syracuse.
- UNESCO started observing Pi Day as 'International Day of Mathematics' from the year 2019.
- ◆ Pi Approximation Day is observed on July 22 (22/7 in the day/month format).



World Consumer Rights Day – March 15



- ✤ The 2021 theme is "Tackle Plastic Pollution".
- The history of World Consumer Rights Day starts with the USA President John F Kennedy.
- On March 15, 1962, he sent a special message to the US Congress to address the consumer rights issue.
- He was the first world leader to do so.





✤ The first World Consumer Rights Day was observed on 15 March 1983.
