TNPSC BITS

- ✤ An Indian-origin Sikh Volunteer Amar Singh has been honoured with the prestigious 2023 New South Wales Australian of the Year Award.
 - Amar Singh founded 'Turbans4Australia' 7 years ago.
- Google announced the winner of the Doodle for Google 2022 competition.
 - Shlok Mukherjee from Kolkata has been declared the winner for India for his inspiring Doodle India on the Center Stage.'
- An Iranian refugee Mehran Karimi Nasseri, who lived for 18 years in Charles de Gaulle Airport in Paris, passed away in that same airport.
 - His tale inspired the 2004 Steven Spielberg film "The Terminal".
- The 41st India International Trade Fair was organized started at Pragati Maidan in New Delhi.
 - This year the theme of the trade fair is Vocal For Local, Local to Global.
- New Zealand's Greg Barclay unanimously was re-elected as the International Cricket Council (ICC) chairman for another two-year term.
- Amazon becomes the World's First Public Company in History to lose a trillion dollars in market value.
 - It was a combination of rising inflation, tightening monetary policies and disappointing earnings updates.
- Reports from high courts on the pendency of criminal cases against sitting and former MPs and MLAs showed a 21% increase in three years from 4,122 in December 2018 to 4,984 in December 2021.
 - $\circ~$ Maharashtra registered the highest number of cases against sitting and former lawmakers.

NATIONAL

Aadhaar Rules

- The Central Government has amended Aadhaar regulations.
- It is advising card holders to update documents supporting their information at least once every 10 years.
- Updating documents is not mandatory but would be encouraged.





The users may update their documents to ensure the continued accuracy of their information in the Central Identities Data Repository.



'Eat Right Station' - Bhopal



- The Food Safety and Standard Association of India (FSSAI) awarded Bhopal Railway Station a 4-star 'Eat Right Station' certification for providing "highquality, nutritious food to passengers".
- Chandigarh Railway station was the fifth Indian railway station to receive a 5star 'Eat Right Station' certification.
- The other railway stations with this certification include Anand Vihar Terminal Railway Station; (Delhi), Chhatrapati Shivaji Terminus; (Mumbai), Mumbai Central Railway Station; (Mumbai), and Vadodara Railway Station.





✤ 'Eat Right India' movement is a large-scale effort by FSSAI to transform the country's food system to ensure safe, healthy and sustainable food for all Indians.

India's first Hydrogen Fuel Cell Catamaran Vessel

- ✤ Cochin Shipyard has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Inland Waterways Authority of India to build the country's first hydrogen fuel cell catamaran vessel for Varanasi in UP.
- ✤ It will pave the way for the reduction in the usage of fossil fuels and thereby further reducing the emissions in India's national waterways.

* Islamic Banking

- * 1947 to 1960:
- No possible decision could be taken in this era to eliminate interest from the Banking World. * 1960 to 1977:
- In this era, the Council of Islamic Ideology (CII) put a lot of reports in front of Government to guide the Govt. that Interest is prohibited in Islam. 1977 to 1980:
- the Council of Islamic Ideology (CII) and State Bank of Pakistan took some steps to remove interest from the economy. The steps are:
- In Feb, 1979 financial institutions which are (ICP, NIT, HBFC) were targeted for elimination of interest





- The Pakistan Government is planning to implement an interest-free banking system in the country from 2027 under the Islamic law.
- It will operate based on ethical standards and prevents Muslims from paying or receiving any kind of interest.
- ✤ It is considered to be an effective tool to achieve the economic objectives of Islam.
- However, Pakistan is bound to honour the existing international financial commitments, though they do not comply with the sharia laws.


Sea Vigil 22

Mock drills and simulation of terror attacks will be conducted on Wednesday

- The third edition of the 'pan-India' coastal defence Exercise 'Sea Vigil-22' is conducted by the Indian Navy.
- Sea Vigil is a national-level coastal defence exercise which was conceptualised in 2018.
- The exercise is being conducted by the Indian Navy in coordination with the Coast Guard and other ministries involved in maritime activities.
- ✤ The exercise validates various measures that have been instituted towards enhancing maritime security since '26/11'.
- Sea Vigil and TROPEX together will cover the entire spectrum Maritime Security challenges.





Theatre Level Readiness Operational Exercise (TROPEX) is an inter-service military exercise conducted every two years.

Operation Barkhane

- France announced the end of the decade-long military Operation Barkhane in Africa.
- France began its military operations in Sahel region in January 2013 with the title Operation Serval.
- It aimed to target Islamic extremists linked to al-Qaeda who took control of northern Mali.

ECONOMY


India's Agri Exports 2021/22

- India's agricultural exports this year are on track to surpass the \$50 billion mark achieved in 2021-22.
- ✤ After petroleum, electronics, gold and coal, vegetable oils are now the country's fifth largest import item.





- India has turned into a net cotton importer primarily due to lower domestic production.
- In pepper, Vietnam, Sri Lanka, Indonesia and Brazil have outcompeted India, while Guatemala has gained market share in cardamom.



SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

Indian Biological Data Center (IBDC)



- The Union Minister of state for Science and Technology Jitendra Singh recently dedicated Indian Biological Data Center (IBDC) to the nation.
- ✤ It is India's first national repository for life science data.





- It will store all life science data generated from publicly funded research in the country.
- ✤ It operates with the assistance from the Department of Biotechnology (DBT).
- It was established at the Regional Centre of Biotechnology (RCB) in Faridabad, Haryana.
- It has a data "disaster recovery" site in National Informatics Centre (NIC) in Bhubaneshwar.
- It has a data storage capacity of around 4 petabytes.
- ✤ It hosts the 'Brahm' High Performance Computing (HPC) facility.

LOFTID mission

- NASA completed the technology demonstration of its Low-Earth Orbit Flight Test of an Inflatable Decelerator (LOFTID) mission.
- The cone-shaped structure will have an inflatable structure that is capable of holding its shape against drag forces.
- It will also have a protective flexible thermal protection system that will protect it from the heat generated during re-entry.


E-waste (management) rules 2022

 It will come into force from 1 April next year and apply to every manufacturer, producer refurbisher, dismantler and recycler of e-waste.





- India is the third-largest e-waste generator in the world after China and the USA as per the Global E-waste Monitor 2020.
- E-Waste refers to all items of electronic and electrical equipment (EEE) and its parts that have been discarded by their owner as waste without the intent of reuse.
- Under E-Waste Management Rules 2016, it is mandatory for the organization to comply with the Extended producer responsibility of recycling e-waste.
- In this, the Extended Producer Responsibility Certificates (similar to carbon credit mechanism) will allow the offsetting of e-waste responsibility to a third party.
- It restricts the use of hazardous substances (such as lead, mercury, and cadmium) in manufacturing electrical and electronic equipment.
- It increases the range of electronic goods covered e.g., laptops, mobile, cameras etc.
- Producers of electronic goods have to ensure at least 60% of their electronic waste is collected and recycled by 2023 with targets to increase them to 70% and 80% in 2024 and 2025, respectively.
- The 'Environmental compensation' is to be provided by the companies that don't meet their target.



14th meeting of the Conference of the Contracting Parties

- The 14th meeting of the Conference of the Contracting Parties (COP14) to the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands was co-hosted by Wuhan (China) and Geneva (Switzerland).
- During the event, the Wuhan Declaration was adopted and a report on Ramsar sites was released.
- ✤ Information on 75 per cent of wetlands in the list of Ramsar Sites is outdated.






 Parties to the Ramsar Convention are required to update the Ramsar Information Sheets (RIS) for their Ramsar sites at least once in every six years.





Dynamic Ground Water Resource Assessment 2022 Report







- An assessment report on groundwater by the Central ground water board under the Ministry of Jal Shakti was released recently.
- ✤ India is the largest user of Groundwater, accounting for 1/4th of total withdrawal.
- Water Extraction is very high in Haryana, Punjab and Rajasthan etc.
- ✤ 87% of Ground Water is used for Irrigation.

REPORTS AND INDICES

Citizen Perception Survey (CPS)

- The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) launched CPS to directly capture the perception of citizens with respect to the quality of life.
- It carries 30% weightage in the Ease of Living Index and is undertaken by the National Institute of Urban Affairs and Quality Council of India.
- It was the part of the Ease of Living Index.
- The Ease of living index and Municipal Performance Index are the assessment tools used by the Ministry of Housing & Urban Affairs to evaluate the quality of life and the impact of various initiatives for urban development in the city.



Rule of Law Index 2022

- ✤ World Justice Project released this report.
- It said that the global Rule of Law has declined for the fifth year in a row.
- ✤ India has been ranked 77 (out of 140 countries).






- It was topped by Denmark.
- The World Justice Project (WJP) is an international civil society organization with the stated mission of "working to advance the rule of law around the world".



Global Vaccine Market Report 2022



The WHO has released this report to capture the implication of COVID-19 on global vaccine markets.






- As per the report, the Vaccine supply is concentrated in hands of a few countries and a few manufacturers.
- Only 10 manufacturers provide 70% of the vaccine doses (excluding the COVID vaccine).
- ✤ Africa received only 3% of the total COVID vaccine doses.

STATES

9th Schedule and Jharkhand



- ✤ Jharkhand government has passed a bill increasing the reservation in vacant government posts and services to 77%.
- Thus, it is violating the 50% mandate of the Supreme Court (Indra Sawhney Case).
- The government has further called for putting the bill in the 9th Schedule to avoid Judicial Review.
- The Ninth Schedule (inserted Article 31B by the 1st Constitutional Amendment) contains a list of central and state laws which cannot be challenged in courts.
- Currently, 284 such laws are shielded from judicial review.
- ✤ Article 31B can be applied retrospectively.





- Although Article 31B excludes judicial review, laws under the Ninth Schedule are open to scrutiny if they are violative of the basic structure of the Constitution (I R Coelho case 2007).
- So, any law that was added to the Ninth Schedule after April 24, 1973, can be contested.

STREET Project


- The Kerala Tourism has bagged the prestigious Responsible Tourism Global award at the World Travel Mart held in London.
- The award was given for the STREET project implemented by the Responsible Tourism Mission under the Kerala Government.
- STREET is an acronym for Sustainable, Tangible, Responsible, Experiential, Ethnic, and Tourism hubs.

KERALA TOURISM LAUNCHES "STREET" PROJECT

STREET is an acronym for "Sustainable, Tangible, Responsible, Experiential, Ethnic, Tourism hubs". Under the project, themes like Green Street, village life experience street, cultural street, experiential tourism street, water street, agri-tourism street, and art street have been planned. These streets will be in line with the peculiarities of the select locations and will also focus on experiential tourism.

Sir David Butler







- Dubbed as the "father of modern election science" or psephologist, he has died at the age of 98 in London.
- Butler developed upon a long forgotten Edwardian equation called "the cube rule" for his research on elections.
- He discovered that he was able to estimate the total number of seats won from the polling numbers
- ✤ In 1955, he introduced the swingometer to the BBC's election night broadcast,
- It went on to become a staple of election coverage all over the world.



Bihari Puraskar

- Noted writers Madhu Kankariya (Hum Yahan The) and Dr Madhav Hada (Pachrang Chola Pahar Sakhi Ri) were awarded the 31st and 32nd Bihari Puraskar, respectively.
- The Bihari Puraskar is given every year for an outstanding work published in the last 10 years by a Rajasthani author in Hindi or Rajasthani.
- The Bihari Puraskar is one of the three literary awards instituted by KK Birla Foundation in 1991.

SPORTS

Women's World Boxing Championship 2023



- India will host the Women's World Boxing Championships in 2023 at Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium in New Delhi.
- It is the biennial amateur boxing competition organized by the International Boxing Association (IBA).
- Notably, India has never conducted the men's world championship.





- But it will be the third time that the elite women's competition will be held in India.
- ✤ The Women championship was held in 2006 and 2018 in New Delhi.

IBSA Blind Football Women's Asian/Oceania Championship 2022

- Kerala Governor Arif Muhammad Khan inaugurated this cup at Kochi, Kerala.
- It will be India's biggest para football event.
- Ten teams are participating in the event including India, China, Thailand, Malaysia, Kazakhstan, South Korea, Japan, Iran, Australia, and Uzbekistan.
- This is the first time in India that a para football event will have 10 men's teams and 2 women's teams.
