TNPSC BITS

- ❖ The Andhra Pradesh Tourism Department received the Global Tourism Award 2025 for its contributions to making the state a top tourist destination in India.
- ❖ World Vegetarian Day is celebrated on October 1 to promote plant-based diets for health, ethics, and the environment.

NATIONAL NEWS

Mission for Aatmanirbharta in Pulses



- Cabinet approved a six-year mission for self-reliance in pulses with a total outlay of ₹11,440 crore.
- ❖ The target is to produce 350 lakh tonnes of pulses and cover 310 lakh hectares by 2030–31.
- ❖ 100% procurement of tur, urad, and masoor will be done under the Price Support Scheme (PSS) of Pradhan Mantri Annadata Aay Sanrakshan Abhiyan (PM-AASHA).





- ❖ A total of 126 lakh quintals of certified seeds and 88 lakh free seed kits will be distributed to farmers.
- ❖ 1000 post-harvest processing units will be established with a subsidy of up to ₹25 lakh per unit.

Virtual Mental Health Series

- ❖ The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) and All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) will conduct a Virtual Mental Health Series from October 4 to 10, 2025.
- ❖ The program targets principals, teachers, counsellors, parents, and students in CBSE-affiliated schools to promote mental well-being and reduce stigma.
- ❖ The series aims to build psychological resilience and address academic stress, culminating on World Mental Health Day, October 10.



INTERNATIONAL NEWS

International Civil Aviation Organization Council

- ❖ India was re-elected to Part II of the Council of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) during its 42nd Assembly in Montreal, Canada.
- ❖ Part II includes countries that contribute significantly to international civil air navigation facilities.





❖ India has been a continuous member of the ICAO Council since 1944 and reaffirmed its commitment to global aviation safety, security, and sustainability.



ECONOMY NEWS

Payments Regulatory Board



❖ The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) formed the Payments Regulatory Board on May 9, 2025.





- ❖ It was replacing the earlier Board for Regulation and Supervision of Payment and Settlement Systems.
- ❖ The board is headed by the RBI Governor and includes the Deputy Governor and Executive Director in charge of Payment and Settlement Systems.
- ❖ The board is responsible for regulating and supervising all domestic and cross-border, electronic and non-electronic payment systems.

SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY NEWS

India's Private Helicopter Assembly Line



- ❖ Tata Advanced Systems Limited (TASL) is set to establish India's first privatesector helicopter Final Assembly Line in Vemagal, Karnataka.
- ❖ It will manufacture the Airbus H125 helicopter.
- ❖ This will support the growth of civil and para-public markets while meeting the Indian armed forces' needs for a light multi-role helicopter, especially for operations in the Himalayan region.
- ❖ The facility will also produce a military version, the H125M, with a high degree of indigenous components and technology.
- ❖ The first delivery of the 'Made in India' H125 is expected by early 2027, with plans to export helicopters across South Asia.






❖ This marks TASL as the first private company in India to manufacture helicopters and complements their existing Airbus assembly line for the C295 military aircraft in Gujarat.

REPORTS AND INDICES

NCRB report on suicides 2023




- ❖ The 2023 National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) report shows a 3.2 percent rise in suicides due to illnesses, increasing from 31,484 in 2022 to 32,503 in 2023.
- ❖ Illness was the second leading cause of suicide in India in 2023.
- ❖ It is accounting for 19 percent of total suicides, after family problems which accounted for 32 percent.
- ❖ Suicides due to mental illness were highest under the illness category at 13,978 cases.
- ❖ Suicides due to cancer rose by 14 percent from 1,251 in 2022 to 1,428 in 2023.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu reported the highest number of suicides due to illness at 21 percent of the national total.
- ❖ It is followed by Maharashtra at 12 percent and Karnataka at 10 percent.
- ❖ A 10 percent rise in heart attack-related sudden deaths was recorded in 2023, increasing from 32,457 in 2022 to 35,715 in 2023.
- ❖ Total sudden deaths rose by 13 percent from 56,450 in 2022 to 63,643 in 2023, with the highest burden among the 45–60 age group (34 percent).
- ❖ Deaths due to abortion increased by 59 percent, rising from 80 in 2022 to 127 in 2023, within a total of 1,131 pregnancy-related deaths.





❖ Deaths of women during pregnancy increased by 5.4 percent from 1,073 in 2022 to 1,131 in 2023, as reported by the NCRB.

NCRB report on Road Deaths 2023



- ❖ A total of 1,73,826 people were killed in 4,64,029 road accidents across India in 2023.
- ❖ The number of fatalities increased by 2,726 from 1,71,100 deaths in 2022.
- ❖ Over-speeding had caused 58.6 percent of the deaths, amounting to 1,01,841 fatalities.
- ❖ Two-wheelers accounted for the highest share of deaths at 79,533, or 45.8 percent.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh reported the most two-wheeler deaths at 11,490 and 8,370.
- ❖ National highways saw 60,127 deaths, forming 34.6 percent of total road accident fatalities.

STATES' NEWS

India's child marriage-free district

- ❖ The 'Child Marriage-Free India' campaign was launched on August 27, 2024.
- ❖ Under this campaign Balod district in Chhattisgarh has been declared the first child marriage-free district in the country.





- ❖ No child marriage cases were reported from the district in the past two years, verified through legal and document checks.
- ❖ The Chhattisgarh government aims to declare the entire state child marriage-free by the year 2028–2029.




IMPORTANT DAYS

Telugu Language Day 2025 - August 29

- ❖ The day marks the birth anniversary of Telugu linguist and reformer Gidugu Venkata Ramamurthy.
- ❖ Telugu is one of the six classical languages of India with rich literary and historical significance.
- ❖ It is spoken predominantly in Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, and the union territory of Yanam.
- ❖ The language is often called "The Italian of the East" for its mellifluous sound.
- ❖ Telugu is the largest member of the Dravidian language family with over 75 million speakers.





International Coffee Day 2025 - October 01




- ❖ It was established by the International Coffee Organisation (ICO) in 2014.
- ❖ The first official celebration was held during Expo 2015 in Milan, Italy.
- ❖ The day aims to celebrate coffee culture and raise awareness about the challenges faced by coffee growers.
- ❖ The theme for 2025 is "Embrace Collaboration For Collective Action More Than Ever."
- ❖ Brazil is the world's largest coffee producer, followed by Vietnam and Colombia.






❖ Arabica and Robusta are the two dominant species used in global coffee production.

International Day of Older Persons 2025 - October 01



- ❖ It aims to honour the contributions of older persons and promote their rights, dignity, and well-being.
- ❖ The day was first proclaimed by the UN General Assembly in 1990.
- ❖ It was first celebrated on October 1, 1991.
- ❖ The theme of 2025 is "Older Persons Driving Local and Global Action: Our Aspirations, Our Well-Being and Our Rights."

International Day of Non-Violence 2025 - October 02







- ❖ October 2 is celebrated as both Gandhi Jayanti in India and the International Day of Non-Violence globally.
- ❖ The United Nations adopted a resolution in 2007 to observe this day.
- ❖ Gandhi's principle of "Ahimsa" (non-violence) continues to inspire the global movements.
- ❖ The day promotes peace, tolerance, and understanding through education and public awareness.

MISCELLANEOUS NEWS

100 years of RSS

- ❖ Prime Minister released a ₹100 coin and a commemorative postage stamp at the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) centenary celebration.
- ❖ The ₹100 coin features Bharat Mata in Varad Mudra, a lion, and swayamsevaks paying respect; the national emblem appears on the reverse side.
- ❖ The coin bears the Sangh's guiding motto: "Rashtraya Swaha, Idam Rashtraya, Idam Na Mama."
- ❖ This marks the first-ever depiction of Bharat Mata on Indian currency since independence.
- ❖ The RSS was founded on Vijayadashami day in 1925 by Dr. Keshav Baliram Hedgewar at Nagpur.
- ❖ The RSS's Panch Parivartan (five changes) framework aims to address current challenges like social harmony, environmental protection, and safeguarding national unity.







Hurun India Rich List 2025



- ❖ Among billionaires, Ambani leads with a wealth of Rs 9.55 lakh crore, followed by Gautam Adani with Rs 8.14 lakh crore.
- ❖ Shah Rukh Khan (59) entered the billionaire club for the first time with a wealth of Rs 12,490 crore.
- ❖ Chennai-born Aravind Srinivas (31), founder of Ai-focused company Perplexity, debuted with Rs 21,190 crore.
- ❖ This was making him the youngest billionaire on the list.
- ❖ Roshni Nadar of the HCL Group is the youngest in the Top 10.
- ❖ The combined wealth of those on the Rich List 2025 stands at Rs 167 lakh crore nearly half of India's GDP.
- ❖ Mumbai remains the billionaire capital with 451 entrants, followed by Bengaluru (116), Hyderabad (102), Chennai (94) and Pune (66).
