- El Salvador becomes world's first country to make Bitcoin an official currency or legal tender.
- Mumbai is the first South Asian city to work on climate action plan.
 - This has been done following Mumbai's commitment to C40 Cities climate leadership group.
- The Tamilnadu Chief Minister MK Stalin announced that the retiring age of cooks and cooking assistants of the nutritious meal centre would be increased to 60 from 58.
- 1200-year-old sculpture of Goddess Durga was recovered from river Jhelum at Pandrethan in Srinagar in Jammu and Kashmir.
- Uttarakhand Governor Baby Rani Maurya submitted her resignation to President Ram Nath Kovind.

India's Sherpa for G20


- Piyush Goyal, Union Minister for Commerce and Industry, Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, and Textiles has been appointed as India's Sherpa for the G20.
- Piyush Goyal has replaced Suresh Prabhu as India's Sherpa.
- ✤ The next G20 Summit (2021) will be held in October under the Italian presidency.
- India will hold the G20 presidency from December 1, 2022, and convene the G20 Leaders' Summit in 2023 for the first time.
- India will be a part of the G20 Troika (preceding, current, and incoming G20 presidencies) from December 2021, till November 2024.
- ◆ In 2022, Indonesia and in 2024 Brazil will head the G20.

- ✤ GMR led Delhi International Airport Limited (DIAL) has won the prestigious awards of CII 'National Energy Leader' and 'Excellent Energy Efficient Unit'.

- DIAL is Asia Pacific's first Level 4+ (transition) accredited airport under Airport Council International's Airport Carbon Accreditation (ACA) programme.
- Hyderabad International Airport is also a carbon neutral airport having Level 3
 + "Neutrality" accreditation.




Latest Red List of Threatened Species

- The International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) has released this report.
- Some 902 species are officially extinct according to the latest Red List
- The Red List also shows that 30 per cent of the species (38,543) that it assessed (138,374) face the threat of extinction.
- Some 80 species are extinct in the wild, 8,404 are critically endangered, 14,647 are endangered, 15,492 are vulnerable and 8,127 are near threatened.
- ✤ The Atlantic bluefin tuna moved from endangered to least concern.
- ✤ The Southern bluefin tuna moved from critically endangered to endangered.
- The world's largest living lizard, the Komodo dragon has been moved from vulnerable to endangered.
- The species is endemic to Indonesia and occurs only in the World Heritagelisted Komodo National Park.

Pollen Calendar

- Chandigarh gets its first pollen calendar.
- Pollen calendars are graphical representations of the time dynamics of airborne pollen taxa in a certain geographic area.
- Pollens are considered major outdoor airborne allergens responsible for allergic rhinitis, asthma and atopic dermatitis in humans.

Yamin Hazarika - Woman of Substance Award

- Writer Namita Gokhale has been chosen as the recipient of the seventh Yamin Hazarika Woman of Substance Award.
- She is a co-founder and co-director of the Jaipur Literature Festival.
- The award was organised by a collective of women professionals from the year 2015.
- The annual award honours Yamin Hazarika, the first woman from Northeast India to be selected for DANIPS.

International Day for South-South Cooperation – September 12

- The day celebrates the economic, social and political developments made in recent years by regions and countries in the south.
- The history of the South-South cooperation begins in 1949 with the establishment of the UN technical aid programme by the Economic and Social Council and the creation of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) in 1969.
