NATIONAL

Medical devices park

- The Central government approved the setting up four medical device parks (MedSpark) in Andhra Pradesh, Telangana, Tamil Nadu and Kerala
- Country's first MedSpark is to be set up in Thonnakkal, Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala.
- It is the joint initiative of Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute for Medical Sciences & Technology (SCTIMST), an autonomous institute of the Department of Science and Technology (DST) and the Kerala State Industrial Development Corporation Ltd (KSIDC).

National Medical Commission

- The Union government has set up the National Medical Commission (NMC) along with four other autonomous boards while abolishing the Medical Council of India.
- The four autonomous boards include:
 - Undergraduate Medical Education Board.
 - Postgraduate Medical Education Board.
 - Medical Assessment and Rating Board.
 - Ethics and Medical Registration Board.
- These boards have been constituted to help the NMC in day-to-day functioning.
- The NMC Act received the assent of the President on August 8, 2019.
- ✤ The NMC comprises a chairman, 10 ex-officio members and 22 part-time members.
- Suresh Chandra Sharma will be the first chairman for three years.


Conference on Interaction and Confidence-Building Measures in Asia (CICA)

✤ The Special Ministerial conference of CICA was held recently with India participation.





- It is an inter-governmental forum for enhancing cooperation towards promoting peace, security and stability in Asia.
- The key idea of the Conference is based on the priority of the indivisibility of security, joint initiative and mutually beneficial interaction of small and large states.
- The CICA Summit is convened every four years in order to conduct consultations, review the progress of, and set priorities for CICA activities
- Meeting of the Ministers of Foreign Affairs is required to be held every two years.
- CICA has 27 member states; 8 observer states; 5 observer organizations.
- ✤ For becoming a member of CICA, a state must have at least a part of its territory in Asia.

Technology Vision for Cyber Security' for UCBs

- The Reserve Bank of India will implement the Technology Vision for Cyber Security' for Urban Co-operative Banks (2020-2023).
- It aims to enhance the IT security system of Urban Co-operative banking to prevent, detect, respond to and recover from cyber-attacks.
- ✤ RBI will achieve this objective using its five-pillared strategic approach 'GUARD'.
- ✤ GUARD denotes:
 - G Governance Oversight,
 - \circ U Utile Technology Investment,
 - A Appropriate Regulation and Supervision,





- R Robust Collaboration
- D Developing necessary IT, cybersecurity skills set.

PERSONALITIES, AWARDS, AND EVENTS

SPB passed away

- Legendary playback singer SP Bala subrahmanyam passed away recently.
- He made his singing debut in 1966 with Telugu movie Sri Sri Sri Maryada Ramanna.
- He has sung over 40,000 songs in as many as 16 languages including Telugu, Tamil, Malayalam, Kannada, and Hindi.
- He won six national awards and received the Padma Shri award in 2001 and Padma Vibhushan in 2011.



UNIATF award on control of non-communicable diseases

- Kerala bagged a United Nations award for its "outstanding contribution" towards the non-communicable diseases-related sustainable development goals.
- The award recognises achievements during 2019 on the multisectoral action in the prevention and control of NCDs, mental health and the wider NCD-related sustainable development goals (SDGs).
- This is the first time the state has been recognised for this annual award by the UN.
- Kerala is among the seven ministries of health across the World.







Jnanpith award

- The Jnanpith award announced in November last year was handed over to poet Akkitham Achuthan Namboothiri.
- His work Balidarshanam won the State and Central Sahitya Akademi awards in 1972-73.

<u>Jnanpith award</u>

- Inanpith is the highest literary award in India, given annually for the best creative literary writing to writers in any of the 22 scheduled languages of the Constitution.
- ✤ This Award was instituted in 1961.
- ✤ The first Jnanpith was awarded to poet G Sankara Kurup in 1965.

IMPORTANT DAYS

International Day of Awareness of Food Loss and Waste - September 29

- This year is the first ever observance of this International Day.
- The UN General Assembly, on 19 December 2019, designated 29 September as the International Day of Awareness of Food Loss and Waste.
- The Food and Nutrition Organization of the UN (FAO) and the UN Environment Programme (UNEP) will collaborate in facilitating the observance of the Day.







World Heart Day- September 29

- ✤ It aims to raise awareness around cardiovascular diseases (CVD) and how they can be prevented.
- ✤ It was created by the World Heart Federation.
- ✤ The first World Heart Day took place in 2000.
- ✤ Theme of the year is: "Use to Beat".



International Translation Day – September 30

- It aims to raise awareness about the translation profession and to pay tribute to the work of language professionals.
- It helps in promoting cultural heritage and mutual respect in our changing world.
- ✤ 30 September celebrates the feast of St. Jerome, the Bible translator, who is considered the patron saint of translators.
- ✤ The theme of 2020 is "Finding the words for a world in crisis".





Blasphemy Day – September 30

- It aims to educates individuals and groups about blasphemy laws and defends freedom of expression, especially the open criticism of religion which is criminalized in many countries.
- This Day was introduced as a worldwide celebration by the Centre for Inquiry in 2009.
- Blasphemy is the act of abusive or showing contempt or lack of respect to a deity, or sacred objects, or toward something considered sacred or inviolable.
