





TNPSC BITS

- ❖ The United Kingdom and India have officially launched the United Kingdom-India Infrastructure Financing Bridge (UKIIFB) initiative to strengthen their financial and professional services collaboration.
- ❖ HDFC Bank has unveiled GIGA, a new financial suite tailored specifically for gig workers and freelancers.
- ❖ For the 1st time in India, Star Health and Allied Insurance has introduced an insurance policy in Braille to empowering visually impaired individuals in India.
- ❖ The maiden Joint Commanders' Conference (JCC) was held at Lucknow under the theme 'Sashakt and Surakshit Bharat: Transforming Armed Forces'.
- ❖ The 2024 Edition of the Chief Science Advisers' Roundtable (CSAR) was taking place at the headquarters of UNESCO, Paris.
- ❖ Indian Coast Guard (ICG) participated in the 20th Heads of Asian Coast Guard Agencies Meeting (HACGAM) at Incheon, South Korea.
- Gensol Engineering have emerged as the lowest bidder for the EPC of India's first biomass to green hydrogen project.
 - o This project will process 25 tonnes of bio-waste daily, producing 1 tonne of green hydrogen using advanced gasification technology over 18 months.

TAMIL NADU

Eye donations in Tamil Nadu 2024



❖ Tamil Nadu contributes 25 per cent of eye donations nationwide.





- ❖ The state received 5,422 eye donations in 2021-22, 8,274 in 2022-23 and 9,400 in 2023-24.
- ❖ 92.85% of the donated corneas were utilised for transplantation.
- ❖ In the last three years, spectacles were provided for 4,87,469 school students after screening them through Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram.

Investment proposals of ₹900 crore

- ❖ The Tamilnadu State government has signed memoranda of understanding (MoU) with six companies for investment proposals to the tune of ₹900 crore.
- ❖ They would provide employment to about 4,100 people in Chennai, Coimbatore, and Madurai.
- ❖ The companies include Nokia, PayPal, Microchip, Infinx and etc.



NATIONAL

VisioNxt Initiative

- Union Ministry of Textiles launched the 'VisioNxt Fashion Forecasting Initiative' of National Institute of Fashion Technology (NIFT).
- ❖ It is a bilingual web portal and the India-specific Fashion Trend Book 'Paridhi 24x25'.
- ❖ NIFT VisioNxt is India's first-ever initiative that combines AI and EI to generate fashion trend insights and forecasts.





❖ Its mission is to identify, map, and analyse geo-specific trends, reflecting the positive plurality, cultural diversity, and socio-economic nuances of India.



Indian Ocean Biodiversity Ocean Information System



- ❖ The Centre for Marine Living Resources and Ecology (CMLRE), has conducted a national-level workshop on the Indian Ocean Biodiversity Information System (IndOBIS) at Kochi.
- ❖ IndOBIS is the Indian regional node of the global Ocean Biodiversity Information System (OBIS).
- ❖ OBIS is one of the largest global repositories of information on marine species, containing millions of records from thousands of datasets contributed by the researchers, governments, and organisations worldwide.






❖ It provides detailed information on species distribution across the world's oceans, including data on their occurrence, habitats, and environmental parameters.

Maximum graft complaints in 2023

- ❖ Of the total corruption complaints received by the Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) last year, the highest number of plaints was against railway employees.
- ❖ It is followed by those in Delhi's local bodies and public sector banks.
- ❖ As many as 74,203 graft complaints were received against all the categories of officers/employees in 2023.
- ❖ 66,373 were disposed of and 7,830 were pending.
- ❖ The highest 10,447 complaints were made against railway employees, followed by 7,665 against staffers of "local bodies except GNCTD"
- ❖ As many as 7,004 corruption complaints were received against employees of public sector banks in 2023.
- ❖ Of these, 6,667 were disposed of and 337 were pending.




World's top plastic polluter

- ❖ India is responsible for around one-fifth of global plastic emissions of around 9.3 million metric tonnes (Mt) per year.
- ❖ After India, it's Nigeria and Indonesia that hold the second and third position in the plastic emissions, with 3.5 Mt and 3.4 Mt, respectively.
- ❖ India's official waste generation rate is about 0.12 kilograms per capita per day,





- * Before this, China was identified as the top global polluter, but the country has dropped to fourth position.
- ❖ The global plastic waste emissions reached 52.1 Mt in 2020.
- ❖ Notably, 69% of global plastic waste emissions, or 35.7 Mt per year, originate from 20 countries.



ENVIRONMENT

Atlas moth



- ❖ The Atlas moth (Attacus atlas) is considered endemic to South East Asia and to be one of the largest moths in the world.
- ❖ It was spotted by a birdwatcher in Kalvarayan Hills in the Eastern Ghats recently.
- ❖ This is the first sighting of the species in Kalvarayan Hills in Kallakurichi district.






- This is one of the largest moths found in India.
- ❖ These moths are typically found at 500-3,000 feet above sea level in tropical dry forests.
- ❖ They rest during the day and remain active at night.

STATES

Green Haryana manifesto - 2024



- ❖ In a first-of-its-kind initiative, environmentalists in Haryana released the 'Green Manifesto 2024' to focus on ecological issues.
- ❖ It was raising various pressing issues such as air pollution, waste management, depleting ground water level, and the need to protect the Aravalis.
- ❖ The State had the lowest forest cover in India, a mere 3.6% as compared to the national average of 21%.
- ❖ It is also having eight of the 50 most polluted places in the world.





- ❖ The main demand in the 'Green Manifesto 2024' is to legally designate the Aravallis including the Bhood areas and the Shivaliks as 'Critical Ecological Zones'.
- ❖ It also demands legislating a 'Tree Act' for Haryana on the line of the strict Delhi Preservation of Trees Act 1994.

Sootea Day – Assam



- ❖ Assam Chief Minister announced that August 20 will be observed and celebrated as Sootea Day.
- ❖ It aims to mark the region's importance in the freedom movement.
- ❖ Under the leadership of the late Biman Chandra Bora, they hoisted the national flag at Sootea Police Station on August 20, 1942.

TIME100 Most Influential People in AI 2024

- ❖ TIME Magazine unveiled its 'TIME100 Most Influential People in AI 2024' list.
- ❖ This list includes many Indians like Google and Alphabet CEO Sundar Pichai and Microsoft CEO Satya Nadella.





- ❖ Other Key Indian figures include Ashwini Vaishnaw, Nandan Nilekani and actor Anil Kapoor.
- ❖ In 2023, a New Delhi court ruled infavor of Anil Kapoor, curbing entities from misusing his image.
- ❖ Kapoor emphasized protecting personality rights against AI misuse for commercial purposes.



Lance Naik Charan Singh - 100th birthday



- ❖ The Indian Army celebrated the 100th birthday of World War 2 veteran Lance Naik (Retired) Charan Singh.
- ❖ He was enrolled into the Army at Firozepur Cantonment on August 26, 1942.






- ❖ He served with the Army Service Corps during World War 2.
- ❖ His service took him from Singapore to Lahore and finally to Yol Cantonment in Himachal Pradesh.
- ❖ Singh received the Burma Star Award and the Indian Independence Medal during his tenure in the Army.

IMPORTANT DAYS

World Physical Therapy Day 2024 - September 08



- ❖ It honours the work of physiotherapists and promotes the importance of physiotherapy in healthcare.
- ❖ It was first designated in 1996 by World Physiotherapy, formerly known as the World Confederation for Physical Therapy (WCPT).
- ❖ The date, September 8, commemorates the founding of WCPT in 1951.

UN International Day to Protect Education from Attack 2024 - September 09

- ❖ It aims to raise awareness about the plight of children living in conflict torn countries around the world.
- ❖ This day observed on since 2020 after a resolution moved by Qatar in the UN General Assembly.
- ❖ In 2023, around 32,990 grave violations against 22,557 children were occurred.





- ❖ More than 72 million children worldwide are out of school due to conflict.
- ❖ In 2022 and 2023 alone, over 10,000 students and educators were victims of these attacks.
