TAMIL NADU NEWS

Tamil Nadu Rights Project




- ❖ The Tamil Nadu Rights (TN RIGHTS) project has launched a Social Registry Enrollment (SRE) census in eight districts.
- ❖ The project is implemented by the Department of Welfare for Differently-Abled Persons.
- It is supported by World Bank funds.
- ❖ The project aims to promote inclusion, accessibility, and opportunities for persons with disabilities (PwDs).
- ❖ The current phase of the census covers Coimbatore, Erode, Salem, Virudhunagar, Thoothukudi, Thanjavur, Perambalur, and Thiruvallur.
- ❖ The census is already underway in Chennai, Cuddalore, Tiruchirappalli, and Tenkasi.
- ❖ The volunteers will visit each household to identify persons with disabilities (PwDs).
- ❖ The data collected will include details on education, employment, therapy services, and access to welfare schemes.
- ❖ An estimated 13 lakh persons with disabilities (PwDs) live in Tamil Nadu.
- The state lacks exact data on the population of persons with disabilities (PwDs).





❖ The social registry will function as a one-stop platform for extending services to persons with disabilities (PwDs).

Road Accidents in Tamil Nadu 2023




- ❖ The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) released the Road Accidents in India 2023 report.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu recorded 67,213 road accidents in 2023, accounting for 14% of the national total.
- ❖ Road accidents in Tamil Nadu increased by 4.6% from 64,105 in 2022.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu reported 18,347 road accident deaths in 2023, a 2.5% rise from 17,884 in 2022.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu ranked second in total road accident deaths after Uttar Pradesh.
- Over speeding caused 13,363 crashes and 3,932 deaths in Tamil Nadu in 2023.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu has a high number of two-wheeler users, including children, but child-specific helmet norms are not yet enforced.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu released a Road Safety Policy in 2007, but has not maintained consistent implementation.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu requires a State Road Safety Action Plan with 2030 targets and science-based speed management guidelines.





Capacity of Stanley Reservoir

- ❖ The Stanley Reservoir at Mettur attained its Full Reservoir Level (FRL) of 120 feet for the sixth time in 2025 on September 2.
- ❖ The dam first reached full capacity on June 29, 2025, due to heavy rainfall in the catchment areas.
- ❖ The dam subsequently reached full level on July 5, July 20, July 25, and August 20, before filling again in September.



NATIONAL NEWS

Waqf (Amendment) Act 2025

- Supreme Court stays 'arbitrary' parts of Waqf (Amendment) Act 2025 but upholds the law.
- ❖ The Court stayed the rule requiring proof of practicing Islam for five years due to a lack of verification methods.
- ❖ It struck down the provision allowing waqf status loss on mere doubt of government ownership before inquiry.
- ❖ Property title disputes must be decided by the judiciary, not by executive authorities changing records.
- ❖ Waqfs cannot be dispossessed or have records altered until tribunal decisions are final.





- ❖ The Court limited non-Muslim members in Central and State Waqf Boards and advised Muslim CEOs.
- ❖ Mandatory waqf registration upheld; unregistered waqfs can still apply for registration.




Road accidents in India

- ❖ India reported 4,80,583 road accidents in 2023, resulting in 1,72,890 deaths.
- Over-speeding caused 68.1% of road accident deaths in India in 2023.
- ❖ Two- and three-wheelers were involved in 44% of total road accident deaths.
- ❖ Not wearing helmets led to over 54,000 deaths in 2023.
- ❖ Not wearing seat belts caused 16,025 deaths across India in 2023.
- ❖ Potholes caused 5,840 accidents and 2,161 deaths, showing sharp increases from 2022.
- * Wrong-side driving was responsible for 5.5% of total road accident deaths.
- ❖ Uttar Pradesh recorded the highest number of deaths at 23,652, while Andaman and Nicobar Islands had the lowest at 24.
- ❖ Vulnerable road users, including pedestrians, cyclists, and two-wheeler riders, accounted for 68% of total fatalities.





❖ Most victims were males aged between 18 and 45 years, forming 66.4% of total deaths.



Androth ship



- ❖ The Indian Navy received the second anti-submarine warfare shallow water craft (ASW-SWC) named 'Androth' on September 13, 2025.
- ❖ The ship was built indigenously by Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers (GRSE), Kolkata.
- ❖ 'Androth' is approximately 77 meters long and is the largest Indian naval warship powered by a diesel engine-waterjet combination.





- ❖ The ship enhances the Navy's anti-submarine warfare and coastal surveillance capabilities.
- ❖ The name 'Androth' is derived from Androth Island in the Lakshadweep archipelago.

General Meeting of IEC

- ❖ India will host the 89th General Meeting (GM) of the International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC) in New Delhi.
- ❖ This is the fourth time India is hosting the IEC GM, previously in 1960, 1997, and 2013.
- ❖ IEC membership includes about 170 countries representing 99% of the world's population, impacting nearly 20% of global trade by value.
- ❖ The GM will host over 150 Technical and Management Committee meetings and workshops on key themes like sustainability, AI innovation, e-mobility, and inclusive standards.
- ❖ Established in 1906, the IEC is the global leader in international standards for electrical, electronic, and related technologies, supported by 30,000 experts worldwide.



INTERNATIONAL NEWS

Pink tax

- Pink tax refers to gender-based price discrimination where women pay more for products or services designed for them.
- ❖ It is not an actual tax imposed by the government but a pricing phenomenon benefiting companies financially.





- ❖ The term "pink tax" originated in California, United States, in 1994.
- * Recent study found personal care products for women cost 13% more than similar products for men.
- ❖ Women's accessories and clothing in the U.S. were found to be 7% and 8% more expensive, respectively.
- ❖ Dry cleaning for women's shirts in the U.S. was 90% costlier than for men's shirts.
- ❖ The United Nations urged member states in 2017 to end gender-based price discrimination to promote economic equality.
- ❖ According to the International Finance Students Association research, 67% of Indian individuals are unaware of the pink tax.
- ❖ In 2018, India's Union Government exempted sanitary napkins and tampons from the Goods and Services Tax (GST), previously levied at 12%.
- ❖ Consumers can avoid the pink tax by choosing gender-neutral or men's variants and comparing unit prices.



India and Norway - Non Proliferation Dialogue

- ❖ India and Norway held their inaugural Maritime Security, Disarmament, and Non-Proliferation Dialogue in Oslo, Norway.
- ❖ Both countries agreed to sustain a secure maritime environment following international law.





- ❖ The dialogue aimed to promote economic growth, peace, and progress in maritime affairs.
- ❖ The next round of the dialogue will be held in New Delhi.



SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY NEWS

Weather Forecasting with AI


- ❖ The Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare used AI to send monsoon forecasts to 3.8 crore farmers in 13 states in 2025.
- ❖ This is India's first targeted dissemination of AI-based weather forecasts for agriculture.
- ❖ Forecasts were sent via SMS under the m-Kisan platform up to four weeks before rainfall.
- ❖ AI models used included Google's Neural GCM (Global Circulation Model) and ECMWF's (European Centre for Medium-Range Weather Forecasts) Artificial Intelligence Forecasting Systems (AIFS).
- ❖ These models outperformed traditional forecasts in predicting monsoon onset and pauses.
- ❖ The AI forecasts correctly predicted a 20-day mid-season pause in monsoon progression.
- ❖ Farmers received weekly forecast updates until continuous rains reached their areas.





ENVIRONMENT NEWS

Brown trout reintroduction




- ❖ Brown trout was first introduced to Kashmir by the British in 1900 for sport fishing.
- ❖ The initial successful consignment included 1,800 trout fries introduced into the Panzagam stream in Dachigam in Kashmir.
- Unregulated angling caused a steady decline in the brown trout population over the decades.
- ❖ The Fisheries Department is now reviving brown trout under the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana (PMMSY).





- ❖ Introduction into streams is planned for October, during their non-cannibalistic breeding season.
- ❖ The revival is expected to boost game fishing and eco-tourism, though riverbed remains a threat to habitat.

Erra Matti Dibbalu



- Erra Matti Dibbalu, the red sand dunes along the Visakhapatnam-Bheemunipatnam beach road, have been added to the tentative list of UNESCO's Natural Heritage Sites.
- ❖ The site stands at heights of 10 to 30 feet and is already among India's 34 national geo-heritage sites.
- ❖ The dunes were formed around 18,500 years ago during the last glacial maximum when the sea had receded about 100 metres.
- * Red coloration of the sand is due to the presence of ferrous minerals that oxidize over time.

PERSONALITIES, AWARDS, AND EVENTS

Sarada Hoffman demise

- * Renowned Bharatanatyam exponent and Kalakshetra teacher Alladi Sarada (Sarada Hoffman) passed away in California.
- ❖ She was born on 15 June 1929, in the Theosophical Society campus at Adyar, Chennai.
- ❖ She was widely known as Chinna Sarada and the Sarada teacher in the Kalakshetra community.






- ❖ Sarada teacher played a key role in shaping and standardising the Kalakshetra methodology for Bharatanatyam.
- ❖ She received the Central Sangeet Natak Akademi Award in 1996 and the first Rukmini Devi Medal for Excellence in the Arts.



IMPORTANT DAYS

Hindi Diwas 2025 - September 14



- ❖ It aims to showing the importance and usefulness of Hindi.
- ❖ On 14 September 1949, the Constituent Assembly adopted Hindi as the official language of India along with the Devanagari script.
- ❖ This day was started being formally celebrated from 1953.
- ❖ On January 10th, 1975, the first World Hindi Conference was held in Nagpur.

7 Indian Natural Sites on UNESCO List

- ❖ In 2025, UNESCO added seven new Indian sites to its Tentative World Heritage List.
- ❖ These additions bring the total number of Indian sites on the Tentative List to 69.
- ❖ Of the 69 sites, 49 fall under the Cultural category, 17 under the Natural category, and three under the Mixed category.
- ❖ Deccan Traps at Panchgani and Mahabaleshwar (Maharashtra) were added for being one of the largest basaltic volcanic provinces in the world.
- ❖ St Mary's Island Cluster (Karnataka) was listed for its columnar basaltic lava formations from the Late Cretaceous period.
- ❖ Meghalayan Age Caves in East Khasi Hills (Meghalaya) were added for their extensive limestone cave systems.
- ❖ Naga Hill Ophiolite in Kiphire (Nagaland) represents exposed oceanic plate segments pushed onto continental plates.
- ❖ Erra Matti Dibbalu in Visakhapatnam (Andhra Pradesh) is a National Geoheritage Monument of red sand dunes showing sea level changes.
- ❖ Tirumala Hills in Tirupati (Andhra Pradesh) were listed for their combined ecological and spiritual significance.
- Varkala in Kerala was added for its unique coastal cliffs and important geological formations.
