- ❖ The SpaceX launched shipments of ants, avocados, human-sized robotic arm toward the International Space Station.
 - o It will be SpaceX's 23rd mission for NASA in a decade.
- ❖ The Uttar Pradesh government is planning to change the name of Lok Sabha MP Maneka Gandhi's constituency Sultanpur after the name of Lord Ram's son (Kush Bhavanpur).
- ❖ The International Day for People of African Descent is celebrated for the first time on 31 August 2021.
 - The United Nations aims to promote the extraordinary contributions of the African diaspora around the world and to eliminate all forms of discrimination against people of African descent.
- ❖ The Prime Minister Narendra Modi has dedicated to the nation the renovated complex of Jallianwala Bagh Smarak in Punjab's Amritsar.
 - o This is to mark 102 years of the Jallianwala Bagh massacre.
- ❖ Kendrapara district of Odisha has become the only district in India where all three species of crocodiles.
 - o Salt-water, gharial and mugger are found here.
- ❖ Latham's Snipe is a shorebird that fly non-stop from Japan to Australia twice in a year.
 - The bird is also known as Japanese Snipe and is scientifically called as Gallinago hardwickii.
- ❖ The 11th Meeting of the BRICS High Representatives Responsible for National Security was held recently.
 - o The National Security Advisor of India Ajit Doval hosted the meeting since India is the chair for the 2021 BRICS summit.
- Sri Lanka declared a state of emergency over food shortages after private banks in the country ran out of foreign exchange to finance imports.
- ❖ At the ongoing Tokyo Paralympics 2020, Indian shooter Singhraj Adana has won the bronze medal in the P1 Men's 10m Air Pistol SH1 final.
 - o Chao Yang and Huang Xing of China won the gold and silver medals respectively.
- Petroleum Minister Hardeep Singh Puri will lead an official and business delegation to Russia to participate in the 6th Eastern Economic Forum EEF Summit in Vladivostok.





- o Prime Minister Narendra Modi will virtually address the Plenary Session of the EEF Summit, in which President of Russia Vladimir Putin will be present.
- ❖ Sharad Kumar won a bronze in the men's high jump T63 event at Tokyo paralympics 2020.
 - o Sharad Kumar was born in Muzaffarpur, Bihar.
- ❖ From September 1, 2021, Goa became the first state in India to supply water free of cost to its citizens for consumption up to 16,000 litres.
 - o This was introduced under the 'Save Water to Get Free Water' scheme.
- ❖ India's top paddler G Sathiyan beat Yevhen Ryshchepa of Ukraine in the final of the Czech International table tennis tournament at Olomouc in Czech Republic.
 - This is his third ITTF Challenger title following triumphs in Belgium Open 2016 and Spanish Open 2017.
- ❖ Perseverance, the Mars rover of NASA has successfully collected the first rock sample for return to the Earth.
 - o This search is believed to reveal about ancient life.
- ❖ Himachal Pradesh has become the first state to administer the first dose of the Covid-19 vaccine to 100% of its adult population.
- ❖ Saudi Arabia's first-ever batch of women soldiers has graduated from the Armed Forces Women's Cadre Training Centre.
- ❖ The year 2022 marks the 30th anniversary of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) India relation.
 - o It is also designated as the ASEAN-India Friendship Year.
- ❖ India achieved a new milestone in its Covid vaccination drive by administering over 1 crore doses on August 27th 2021.
 - o This is the highest single-day count so far.
- ❖ The Covid C.1.2 variant was first detected in South Africa.
 - o According to a study, the C.1.2 variant could be more infectious and has shown signs of evading protection provided by vaccines.
- ❖ In Paralympics 2020, India's ace archer Harvinder Singh has won the bronze medal in the men's individual recurve open.
 - The 31-year old has become India's first-ever archer to win a medal in the Paralympics.
- ❖ India is all set to host a key conference as part of the International Climate Summit 2020-21.
 - o This is to build a dialogue for India's transition to clean energy.
- ❖ Vartika Shukla took charge as the first woman Chairperson and Managing Director of public sector enterprise Engineers India Ltd.





- ❖ Chief Minister MK Stalin congratulated Balabharathi, who was chosen for Bal Sahitya Puraskar award given by Sahitya Academy.
 - o He was chosen for his Tamil work Marapachi Sonna Rahasiyam.
- ❖ The Supreme Court has said that the Governments should take the approval of the respective High Court before withdrawing criminal cases filed against MLAs/MPs.
- ❖ India's rising pair of G Sathiyan and Manika Batra clinched the mixed doubles title at the recent World Table Tennis Tour Contender Budapest 2021.
- ❖ The Union government on the anti-dumping duty on viscose staple fibre originating in or exported from China and Indonesia.
 - o The government revokes anti-dumping duty on viscose staple fibre, excluding bamboo fibre.
- ❖ The 28th edition of the Singapore-India Maritime Bilateral Exercise (SIMBEX) took place in the South China Sea.
- ❖ The Asian Development Bank (ADB) approved a \$150 million loan for a sustainable housing project for the urban poor in Tamil Nadu.
- ❖ The Western Railway runs the First 'Textile Parcel Train' from Gujarat's Surat to Bihar's Muzaffarpur.
- ❖ Mumbai became the first district to complete one crore vaccinations against Covid-19.
- ❖ Prime minister of Japan, Yoshihide Suga, will not run for re-election as the party leader for Liberal Democratic Party.
 - o He had been appointed as Prime Minister in 2020 after the resignation of Shinzo Abe.
- ❖ The National Bureau of Animal Genetic Resources (NBAGR) has recognised the Manda buffalo as the 19th unique breed of buffaloes found in India.
 - o It is found in the Eastern Ghats and plateau of Koraput region of Odisha.

Mariappan Thangavelu - Silver Medal








- ❖ Mariappan Thangavelu cleared a height of 1.86 metres in men's high jump Tokyo Paralympics 2020.

Tamil Nadu announces parks for future mobility, apparels



- ❖ An integrated apparel park in Virudhunagar district, a future mobility park in Krishnagiri district and a SIPCOT Industrial Park in Tiruvallur district were among the major announcements made by the Tamil Nadu government in the Assembly.
- ❖ Apparel Park to be opened at Kumaralingapuram in Virudhunagar district would boost the economic development in the southern districts.
- SIPCOT's initiative to open the future mobility park at Shoolagiri in Krishnagiri district is said to be the first of its kind in the country.





- ❖ The SIPCOT Industrial Park, proposed at Sengathakulam near Uthukottai in Tiruvallur, is expected to provide direct and indirect employment to about 3,000 persons.
- ❖ The government would set up a 'Ready Built Factory' at Nemili in Kancheepuram district.
- ❖ A state-of-the-art textile park would be opened in Karur district.

Valimai and Neidhal

- ❖ Tamil Nadu Cements Corporation Limited (TANCEM) will introduce a cement brand, 'Valimai', in addition to its existing Arasu brand.
- ❖ TANCEM is a State public sector unit.
- ❖ Likewise, Tamil Nadu Salt Corporation (TNSC) would introduce iodised crystal salt, refined free-flow iodised salt and double iron and iodine fortified salt under the brand 'Neidhal'.

Bill to repeal the Dr. J. Jayalalithaa University Act

- ❖ The Tamil Nadu government introduced a Bill to repeal the Dr. J. Jayalalithaa University Act.
- ❖ Another Bill to amend the Annamalai University Act 2013 to convert it from a unitary institution into an affiliating type university was introduced.
- ❖ The government also tabled a Bill to amend the Bharathidasan University Act.
- ❖ Annamalai University is to be converted into affiliating type, by affiliating [arts and science] colleges in Villupuram, Cuddalore, Kallakurichi and Mayiladuthurai districts
- ❖ Consequently, Bharathidasan University would no longer be the affiliating university for arts and science colleges in Mayiladuthurai.

Youth Literary Project

- The Youth Literature Project will be implemented to enhance children's creativity (speech, writing, painting, painting) and to teach moral education and to develop moral and social values.
- ❖ Under this project, the first phase of 100 children's literature books will be published by the Tamil Nadu Textbooks and Educational Works Corporation.






TNSCB renamed

- ❖ All government buildings to be constructed in Thoothukudi and Tirunelveli between September 5 this year and September 5 next year would be named after V.O.C.






Iyothee Thass Pandithar - Manimandapam

- ❖ He founded Oru Paisa Thamizhan and later ran it as Thamizhan.

Day of Social Justice



- ❖ The birth anniversary of social reformer and Dravidar Kazhagam founder 'Periyar' E.V. Ramasamy's birthday would be observed as 'Day of Social Justice' in Tamil Nadu on September 17 every year.
- ❖ The first amendment to the Indian Constitution came about because of Periyar, who never went to the Parliament.





• On that day there will be a pledge to follow the principles of self-respect, rationalism, brotherhood, equality, humanitarianism and social justice.

New archaeological sites

- ❖ The Tamilnadu State government will undertake archaeological excavations in three new places – Vembakkottai in Virudhunagar district, Thullukkarpatti in Tirunelveli district and Perumpalai in Dharmapuri district.
- ❖ It would be undertaken in addition to the ones under way in Keeladi, Sivagalai, Mayiladumparai and Gangaikondacholapuram.
- ❖ The government would also undertake scientific site inspections to locate Neolithic sites and those along the banks of Tamiraparani during 2021-22.
- ❖ The Institute of Archaeology would be restructured and renamed Tamil Nadu Institute of Archaeology and Museology.
- ❖ Sites where ancient inscriptions are found in Mudhalaikulam and Arittapatti in Madurai district, Poolankurichi in Sivaganga district, Thondur and Theganurpatti in Villupuram district would be declared protected monuments.
- Steps would be taken to bring back 'Leiden plates' from the Netherlands which throw light on the history of legendary Tamil king Rajaraja Chola and also Buddhist viharas in Nagapattinam district.
- ❖ The Efforts would be taken to locate the 'Anbil plates' which is featured in Epigraphia Indica, the official publication of Archaeological Survey of India.

Chair to workers in Tamilnadu

- ❖ It is mandatory for shops and showrooms across the State to provide seating facilities to employees who works standing.
- * This is a direct intervention of the State in the affairs of private sector
- ❖ The Bill was introduced by the Labour Welfare and Skill Development Minister CV Ganesan to amend the Tamil Nadu Shops and Establishments Act, 1947.
- It was started with Kerala.
- ❖ A State labour advisory board meeting unanimously approved the need to provide seating facilities for employees on September 4, 2019.

Education Ministry's announcements



- ❖ It will take the sitting strength to 60 against the sanctioned strength of 75.






- ❖ With the induction of S Srimathi, the number of women judges in the court will go up to a record 14, highest in the country.

Translation of Manimekalai

- ❖ Manimekalai, one of the five great epics of Tamil literature, has been translated into 18 eastern languages.
- ❖ It will be translated into Thai, Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Burmese, Malay, Vietnamese, Singhalese, Cambodian, Indonesian and Mongolian.
- ❖ Manimekalai is written by Seethalai Sattanar 1,500 years ago.
- ❖ The Central Institute of Classical Tamil has undertaken responsibility to translate it.
- ❖ It also embodies ideologies of Buddhism and Jainism.



Pulamai Pithan







- ❖ Lyricist and poet Pulamai pithan breathed his last at Chennai.
- ❖ He was born in Coimbatore in 1935
- ❖ Pulamaipithan served as the Deputy Chairman of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Council.

Porunai Excavation



- ❖ The Chief Minister M.K. Stalin announced the setting up of a museum, the Porunai Museum in Tirunelveli at a cost of ₹15 crore.
- ❖ The rice with soil was found in a burial urn in Sivakalai in Tirunelveli district.
- ❖ The carbon dating analysis has yielded the date of 1155 BCE.
- ❖ The Beta Analytic Testing Laboratory in Miami, in the United States released the test report in this regard.
- ❖ The finding has established that the Porunai River (Ancient name of Thamirabarani) civilization dates back to 3,200 years.
- ❖ This is the oldest time period established from findings in the excavations carried out in Tamil Nadu.





- ❖ It is much older than the Vaigai River civilization, which is believed to be 2,600 years old.
- ❖ The excavation in Keeladi had also established that an urban civilization existed on the banks of River Vaigai that was contemporary to the Gangetic plain civilization.
- ❖ The latest finding has once again narrowed the gap between civilizations in the south of Vindhyas and the Indus Valley Civilization (IVC).
- **A** Earlier it was believed that there was no city civilization in south India.
- ❖ The first urbanization in the sub-continent happened in the IVC.
- ❖ The second urbanisation happened on the banks of the Ganga at the end of the Mauryan period.
- Now it is found that even before the Mauryan period, there were silver coins found in Adichanallur.
- Adichanallur, Korkai and Sivakalai are all sites on the banks of the ancient Porunai (Thamirabarani river) presently in the Thoothukudi district of Tamil Nadu.



❖ Earlier, Adichanallur excavations established that a civilisation thrived even in the 980 BC.





- ❖ Adichanallur and Sivakalai have served as habitations, while Korkai was the port.
- ❖ Stalin said archaeological excavations would be carried out in other States and countries in search of Tamil roots there.
- ❖ In the first phase, studies would be undertaken at the ancient port of Musiri, now known as Pattanam in Kerala.
- ❖ Similar studies will be held at Vengi in Andhra Pradesh, Thalaikadu in Karnataka and Palur in Orissa.
- ❖ The State Archaeology Department would conduct research in Quseir al-Qadim and Pernica Anekke in Egypt.
- ❖ It was once part of the Roman empire as well as in Khor Rori in Oman.
- ❖ It is to establish Tamils' trade relations with these countries.
- Studies would also be conducted in South-East Asian countries such as Indonesia, Thailand, Malaysia and Vietnam, where the Chola King Rajendra had established supremacy.

Resolution against CAA, 2019

- ❖ The Tamil Nadu Assembly has adopted a resolution urging the Centre to repeal the Citizenship (Amendment) Act, 2019.
- ❖ With this, Tamil Nadu has joined states like Kerala and West Bengal in passing resolutions against CAA.
- ❖ The objective of the CAA, 2019 is to grant Indian citizenship to persecuted minorities Hindu, Sikh, Jain, Buddhist, Parsi and Christian from Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan.
- ❖ The Act does not apply to tribal areas of Tripura, Mizoram, Assam and Meghalaya because of being included in the 6th Schedule of the Constitution.
- ❖ Also, areas that fall under the Inner Line Permit notified under the Bengal Eastern Frontier Regulation, 1873, will also be outside the Act's purview.

Energy Island in Gulf of Mannar

- ❖ Tamil Nadu and Denmark have planned to create an energy island in Gulf of Mannar.
- ❖ It will be India's first offshore floating wind park.
- ❖ Gulf of Mannar lies between the west coast of Sri Lanka and south-eastern tip of India.





HRCE Announcements

- ❖ The Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments (HR&CE) will start 10 more colleges at a cost of ₹150 crore at Kolathur, Kilpauk, Vilathikulam, Thoppampatti, Anaikattu, Kalasapakkam, Thirukattupalli, Lalgudi, Kadayam and Thiruchengode.
- ♦ Old-age home at a cost of ₹5 crore will be set up in Chennai, Palani and Tirunelveli.
- ❖ If the marriage is conducted in the marriage hall temple, they need to pay just maintenance change.
- ❖ Tonsuring heads too would be free and the amount will be paid by the temple administration.
- ❖ Temple priests and workers will get new clothes for Pongal.
- ❖ It will soon introduce whole day 'annadhanam' at the famous Arulmigu Mariamman Temple in Samayapuram near Tiruchi.
- ❖ It will become the second major shrine in Tiruchi district to provide annadhanam for the whole day to devotees after Sri Ranganathaswamy Temple in Srirangam.
- ❖ Besides Samayapuram temple, the scheme is to be implemented at the Sri Subramanya Swamy temples at Tiruthani and Tiruchendur.
- Annadhanam was started at the Samayapuram Sri Mariamman temple in 2002.
- ❖ The Minister announced ₹150 crore for renovating Tiruchendur temple and ₹125 crore for improving infrastructure in Bhavani Amman temple in Periya palayam.





- ❖ Temples in Palani, Samayapuram, Tiruvannamalai, Tiruthani and Rameswaram will get ₹250 crore for creating amenities.
- ❖ The state government will melt into gold bars the tiny bits of jewellery offered by devotees at temples run by the Hindu religious and charitable endowments department and deposit them in banks to raise funds for development projects and welfare schemes at the temples.
- ❖ Big temples such as Tiruthani, Palani, Samayapuram and Tiruchendur would top in the stock of gold jewellery
- ❖ 2,000 kg of gold jewellery could get converted to gold bars.
- ❖ The department had been doing this exercise from 1978 till 2010.

IREDA and TANGEDCO

- ❖ The Indian Renewable Energy Development Agency (IREDA) has entered into a pact with Tamil Nadu Generation & Distribution Corporation (TANGEDCO).
- ❖ It is for providing technical expertise in developing of renewable energy projects and raising of funds.
- ❖ The Tangedco has planned to augment its renewable energy sources by 25,000 MW in the next 10 years.
- ❖ This includes 20000 MW solar energy, 3000 MW of hydro power and 2000 MW electricity generated by gas turbines.
- ❖ Its own generation from thermal power stations is only 4320 MW as against the average demand of 15,000 MW.



Information and Publicity announcements

❖ The Minister for Information and Publicity M P Saminathan announced these measures in the Tamilnadu State Legislative Assembly.





- ❖ He announced setting up of a Journalists' Welfare Board.
- ❖ Kalaignar Ezhudhukol Award will be awarded to journalists who contribute to the upliftment of the downtrodden
- Statues of Nobel Laureate Rabindranath Tagore and former President A P J Abdul Kalam will come up at the prestigious Queen Mary's College and Anna University in Chennai respectively.
- ❖ It is significant as Abdul kalam mentored students at the institute by staying in a hostel room before his ascension to Rashtrapati Bhavan in 2002.
- ❖ Statues of freedom fighters Veerapandia Kattabomban, and Marudhu Brothers will be installed in Gandhi Mandapam, Guindy at Chennai.
- ❖ The bust of Anjalai Ammal and Keezhapaluvur Chinnasamy will come up at Cuddalore and Ariyalur respectively.
- ❖ A statue will be erected at the Government Guest House in Chepauk in memory of Dravidian stalwart V R Nedunchezhian, who had served in the cabinets of C N Annadurai, M Karunanidhi, M G Ramachandran, and J Jayalalithaa.
- ❖ The Statues in memory of Dr Muthulakshmi Reddy, Moovalur Ramamirthan, and Dr Mu Varadarasanar will come up at Pudukkottai, Mayiladuthurai, and Ranipet districts.

Keeladi - Silver coin



- ❖ A silver punch marked coin was recently excavated from Keezhadi.
- ❖ It bore the symbols of the sun, the moon, the taurine and other geometrical patterns.
- ❖ Studies on this found the coin to date back to the 4th century BC.
- ❖ It is before the time of the ancient Maurya empire.
- ❖ Keezhadi excavations show that there was extensive literacy in Tamil Nadu by at least 600 BCE.
- So, it is found that even 2,600 years ago common folk could read in Tamil Nadu.





Ford exits India

- ❖ The US car firm Ford is to stop making cars in India.
- ❖ It is to shut down both of its plants in Gujarat (Sanad) and Tamilnadu (Maraimalai Nagar).
- ❖ In 2017, General Motors (GM) stopped making cars for the Indian market.
- ❖ In 2020, The USA bike firm Harley-Davidson stopped its manufacturing in India.



Ford Motors Leaving India

First generation graduate

- ❖ The condition that one should be a 'first graduate' to avail oneself of the special scholarship granted to students of the Backward Classes, the Most Backward Classes and the Denotified Communities would be amended as the 'first generation graduate'
- ❖ By doing this many from the same family could benefit from the scheme.
- The Minister for Backward Classes Welfare S.S. Sivasankar announced this.
- The Minister also announced the setting up of 'Semmozhi Noolagam'.

National Awards for Excellence in Energy Management

- ❖ The Golden Rock Railway Workshop (GOC), Tiruchchirappalli has bagged 22nd National Award for Excellence in Energy Management.
- ❖ It is instituted by the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII).
- ❖ It is the only workshop of Indian Railways to have received the award this year.


Mahakavi Day

- ❖ The death anniversary of firebrand poet and freedom fighter Subramania Bharathiyar would be commemorated as 'Mahakavi' Day on September 11.
- ❖ The Chief Minister MK Stalin announced this on the occasion of 100th death anniversary of Bharathi.





- ❖ A compilation of Bharati's poems and essays would be brought out in a book titled "Manathil Urithi Vendum" (Firmness in Mind).
- ❖ Events with the theme 'parengum Bharati' (Bharati everywhere), in collaboration with the World Tamil Associations would be organised.
- ❖ A separate wing 'Bharathiyal' would be set up to compile the books of Bharathiyar.
- ❖ The Women Livelihood Mission, implemented by the rural development department, will be named by Bharatiyar.
- * "Bharati young poet Award" will be presented through a state-level poetry competition for school and college students.
- ❖ Financial assistance will be given to maintain the house at Varanasi in Uttar Pradesh where Bharathi lived a century ago.
- ❖ PM Modi has announced that the Benares Hindu University in Varanasi would have a chair of Tamil Studies in memory of Bharathi.
- ❖ Modi also said, "India is proud to be home to the world's oldest language, Tamil."



About Bharathi


- ❖ Bharathi was also the first Asian poet to sing the glory of the 1917 Russian Revolution or Bolshevik revolution.
- ❖ Subramanya Bharati had to flee to Puducherry (a French colony then) in 1908 to avoid arrest by the British government.
- ❖ He worked as the assistant editor in Swadesa mitran newspaper.
- ❖ Bharathi passed away on September 11th in 1921 at Chennai.
- ❖ He delivered his last speech at Karungalpalayam Library in Erode.
- ❖ The last years of his life were spent in a house in Triplicane, Chennai.
- ❖ The Former CM CN Annadurai was the first to call Bharathiyar 'Makkal Kavi' (poet of the people).
- ❖ Va.Ra wrote a classic Tamil biography on the greatest poet of all time, "Mahakavi Bharatiyar".





Medical Exam - NEET

- ❖ The Tamil Nadu Assembly today passed the Tamil Nadu Admission to Undergraduate Medical Degree Courses Bill.
- ❖ It seeks to stop medical admissions on the basis of the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET) for students of the state.
- ❖ The Bill challenges a central law passed in the Concurrent list.
- ❖ It is to receive the Presidential assent.



Tamil Nadu State Commission for Scheduled Castes (SCs) and Scheduled Tribes (STs)

- ❖ The Chief Minister Stalin tabled a bill (called The Tamil Nadu State Commission for the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes Act, 2021) to set up panel for SC/ST members.
- ❖ It will have the powers of a civil court trying a suit under the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908.
- ❖ It will have a chairperson, a vice-chairperson and five other members.
- ❖ Three of them will be from SCs, two from STs and a woman member.
- ❖ The commission will inquire, Suo moto or on a petition presented to it by a victim or any person on his/her behalf.
- ❖ It will enquire the complaints of violation of any right provided under the Protection of Civil Rights Act, 1955, and the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989.
- ❖ The National Commission for the SCs and STs will prevail over the yet to be set up state commission.





- ❖ The commission can recommend action against public servants who are negligent in preventing such violations.
- ❖ The commission is expected to investigate and monitor safeguards present in various legislations, in the interest of SC/STs and promote awareness of the same.
- ❖ The state government will consult the commission on policy matters related to the community.
- ❖ The commission will also carry out research work to avoid discrimination.

Welfare for Scheduled Castes

- ❖ The Chief Minister Stalin said that ₹10 lakh reward as an incentive to panchayats following the practice of common crematoriums or graveyards.
- ❖ He announced setting up four new special courts in Salem, Krishnagiri, Madurai and Tirunelveli, since these places have more pending cases.
- ❖ He also said that schools run by the Adi Dravidar Welfare Department will be brought to the mainstream under the guidance of the School Education Department.

Jewel loan waiver

- ❖ Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M K Stalin announced that jewel loans availed by economically backward people from cooperative institutions would be waived up to five sovereigns of gold jewellery.
- ❖ The state government would allocate Rs 6,000 crore for this purpose.

Local Body elections in Tamilnadu

- ❖ Tamil Nadu State Election Commissioner V Palanikumar notified the dates for the rural local body polls in the nine newly constituted districts in the state.
- ❖ Elections are being held in Kanchipuram, Chengalpattu, Villupuram, Kallakurichi, Vellore, Ranipet, Tirupathur, Tirunelveli and Tenkasi districts.
- ❖ The polls will be held in two phases on October 6 and October 9 and the counting will take place on October 12.
- ❖ Indirect elections to posts like district panchayat and panchayat union chairpersons and vice-chairpersons will be held on October 22.





Announcement in Police Departments

- ❖ The Chief Minister Stalin announced the release of 700 life convicts to mark the birth anniversary of former Chief Minister C N Annadurai on September 15.
- ❖ He also announced that Avadi and Tambaram will be upgraded as police Commissionerate.
- ❖ He also proposed to set up a police commission to reform the police force.
- ❖ He announced the setting up of State Cyber Crime Investigation Centre to provide training and crack cybercrimes.
- ❖ A total of 1,000 youths from fishing communities would be appointed to work along with the Coastal Security Group (CSG).
- ❖ The Boys and Girls Clubs would be set up to ensure that children from socially and economically backward situations do not get involved in anti-social and illegal activities.
- ❖ A weekly off would be granted to police personnel from Constable Grade II to Head Constable
- * The receptionists would be appointed in each of the police stations.

Petrified wood

- ❖ A 100-million-year-old Petrified wood has been found at Pudukkottai.
- ❖ The wood dates back to the Cretaceous period, which is about 100 million years ago.
- ❖ That is, it belongs to the genus Gymnosperm, which precedes the existing flowering plants, such as angiosperm.
- ❖ It is considered a rare archaeological object.
- ❖ A 1300-year-old Pallava period painting has been found on the Sanjeevi hills near the village of Pakkam near Gingee in Villupuram district.

Human Resource Management department announcements

- ❖ The Government of Tamil Nadu has announced that the quota for women in the public employment through direct recruitment will be increased from 30% to 40%.
- ❖ Tamil language will be made compulsory in the qualifying examination in all competitive examinations.
- ❖ It has been announced that the age limit for direct appointment will be relaxed by 2 years due to delays in competitive exams for government jobs conducted by the Recruitment agencies such as TNPSC due to the Corona pandemic.





New statues

- Two crore and sixty lakh rupees has been allocated for setting up of a statue of freedom fighter Tali Palayakkar Malayandi Venkidu Pathi Ethalappa Nayakkar in Tirupur district.
- ❖ A full-length statue of former Chief Minister of Chennai Province Dr. P. Subba Rayan will have a statue built in Chennai and a stadium in Namakkal.
- ❖ A statue of Uttama Tyagi Eeswaran, who was instrumental in the formation of the Lower Bhavani Irrigation Project, will be built in Erode district.
- ❖ A stadium with a statue of the late Minister Govindasamy will be set up in Villupuram district.

Tamil Nadu's first Genetic Analysis Laboratory

- ❖ The Chief Minister M K Stalin inaugurated the Genetic Analysis Laboratory at DMS campus in Chennai.
- ❖ For the first time, a State has set up its own genetic laboratory in India.
- ❖ The lab will help authorities look for variants of SARS-CoV-2.
- ❖ The COVID-19 samples were sent to the Union Government-run genetic analysis laboratories in Karnataka and Telangana.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu has sent all samples to the Bengaluru-based Instem as per recommendations from the Centre.
- ❖ Instem is part of INSACOG (a consortium of 10 labs that track the presence of variants in Covid samples).



Land grabbing a non-bailable offence

- ❖ Tamilnadu has made the encroachment of properties of religious institutions a cognisable and non-bailable offence.
- ❖ The Tamil Nadu Assembly passed a Bill in this regard.






- ❖ It seeks to amend the Tamil Nadu Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments Act, 1959.
- ❖ It empowers anyone, who is having interest in the affairs of religious institution matters, to file a complaint against encroachers and temple land encroachment.
- ❖ It considered that criminal complaint may be filed by any person who are interested in the affairs of the religious institution.
- ❖ Till the bill was passed, only the Commissioner of the Hindu religious and charitable endowments department were empowered to file complaint against encroachment of temple land.

Amarnath Ramakrishna

- ❖ K. Amarnath Ramakrishna, the Superintending Archaeologist has been transferred back to the Archaeological Survey of India's Chennai Circle.
- ❖ He oversaw the first two phases of the Keeladi excavations.
- ❖ Currently, Mr. Ramakrishna is serving as Superintending Archaeologist in the Goa Circle.



Tamilnadu Legislations

- ❖ The State Assembly of Tamilnadu passed a Bill (Tamil Nadu Payment of Salaries Act, 1951).
- ❖ It was to give effect to the announcements made by the erstwhile AIADMK regime last year.
- ❖ The Bill was introduced by Minister Duraimurugan (holding legislature portfolio) in the House
- ❖ On March 24 last year, the then Chief Minister Edappadi Palani Samy announced that the lump sum allowance payable to the family of an MLA would be enhanced from ₹2 lakh to ₹5 lakh.





- ♣ He announced that the pension payable to former MLAs and former MLCs would be enhanced from ₹20,000 to ₹25,000.
- **❖** The family pension payable to the legal heir of the deceased MLAs and MLCs would be enhanced from ₹10,000 to ₹12,500
- ❖ A Bill to repeal a law on contract farming enacted during the previous AIADMK regime was also introduced.
- ❖ The Tamil Nadu Agricultural Produce and Livestock Contract Farming and Services (Promotion and Facilitation) Repeal Bill was introduced.
- ❖ The Tamil Nadu's contract farming and services legislation of 2019 was based on a model Bill then mooted by the Centre.

Tamilnadu Assembly Session

- ❖ The Tamilnadu Assembly's Budget session began on August 13.
- ❖ The House was later adjourned sine die on September 13th by the Speaker Appavu.
- ❖ This is also the first time since independence that the State Legislative Assembly would not have a nominated MLA from the Anglo-Indian community.
- ❖ A 104th Constitutional amendment in 2019 discontinued representation for Anglo-Indians both in the Lok Sabha as well as in all Legislative Assemblies across the country.


University Syndicate

- ❖ The Speaker has nominated several MLAs to syndicate members in various universities.
- ❖ All the MLAs will hold the post for three years.
- ❖ If they cease to be a member of the Assembly during this period, their tenure in the Syndicate will also come to an end.

Social Justice Day

- ❖ Tamil Nadu Government celebrated the 143rd birthday of E.V. Ramasamy Periyar as Social Justice Day on 17th September.
- ❖ The Chief Minister M.K. Stalin administered the social justice pledge to Government staff at the Secretariat.





Ravi - Governor of Tamilnadu



- ❖ The Chief Justice of the Madras High Court Justice Sanjib Banerjee administered the oath of office to RN Ravi.
- ❖ He is the 15th Governor of Tamilnadu since 1969.

Palmyra Development Mission







- * Chief minister Stalin launched this Mission.
- ❖ The Speaker Appavu donated one lakh palm seeds for promoting this
- ❖ Palmyra is the state tree of Tamilnadu.
- ❖ Under the scheme, 76 lakh palm seeds and one lakh palm saplings would be distributed to farmers with cent per cent subsidy by the Agriculture Department
- It will be planted on the bunds of lakes and ponds.
- ❖ As part of the mission, research on palm trees will be undertaken in govt agriculture college in Killukulam in Thoothukudi district.

Francis Kiruba




- * Renowned writer and Tamil poet Francis Kiruba recently passed away in Chennai
- ❖ He hails from Pathiniparai village near Nanguneri in Tirunelveli district.
- ❖ He wrote the screenplay and script for the biopic of 'Kamaraj'.

Communal G.O - 1921

- ❖ It was issued 100 years ago on this day (September 16th) by the Justice Party government.
- ❖ It sought "to increase the proportion of posts held by non-Brahmins," which also encompassed Indian Christians, Muslims and Adi-Dravidar, in the Provincial Services.
- ❖ It aims to empower non-Brahmins and securing the space due to them in administration and politics.
- ❖ B.R. Ambedkar had sought Political reservation for Dalits before the Southborough Committee in 1919.
- ❖ In 1928, Muthiah Mudaliar, the then Education Minister under the Subba Rayan Government, introduced the Communal G. O. to implement the 1921 order.








Indira Parthasarathy - Sahitya Academy

- ❖ After a gap of 25 years, the Sahitya Academy has chosen a Tamil litterateur, Indira Parthasarathy for its highest honour of Fellowship.
- ❖ He is commonly known as Ee. Paa.
- ❖ In 1996, D. Jayakanthan, aged 62, was the youngest to become a Fellow of the Academy.
- ❖ Before him, only two from the Tamil literary world.
- ❖ They were Rajaji or C. Rajagopalachari (1969) and T.P. Meenakshisundaram (1975).





- ❖ Though V. Raghavan (1979) and K.R. Srinivasa Iyengar (1985), both Tamils, were also given the Fellowship, they were recognised for their contributions to Sanskrit and the Indian writing in English.
- ❖ Indira Parthasarathy is author of over 40 books, including 16 novels, 10 plays and six collections of short stories.
- ❖ Prof. Parthasarathy is noted for his works on political themes.
- ❖ He considers the play Ramanujar his magnum opus.
- ❖ His Kurithi Punal, written against the backdrop of the 1968 Keezh venmani massacre of 42 poor farmers, fetched him the Sahitya academy award in 1977.
- ❖ He went on to win several prestigious awards, including the Bharatiya Bhasha Parishad Award and the Saraswati Samman.
- ❖ He is the only Tamil writer to be given awards by both the Sahitya and Sangeet Natak Academies.



Sahitya Academy prize for translation

- ❖ TES Raghavan and K Chellappan have been chosen for the Sahitya Academy prize for translation for the year 2020.
- * TES Raghavan has been chosen for this prize for translating Tirukural into Hindi.
- ❖ K Chellappan has been chosen for translating Gora, a novel in Bengali, authored by Rabindranath Tagore into Tamil.

Silambam in 'Khelo India'

- Silambam has been recognised under the 'Promotion of inclusiveness through sports' initiative of the 'Khelo India' programme of the Union Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports
- ❖ Silambam an Indian martial art developed by Tamils.







Keezhadi excavation

- ❖ The Excavations in the Keezhadi in Sivagangai district have uncovered dice made of ivory.
- ❖ This dice weighs 4 grams and has 5 cm cube with 1 point, (i.e) with 6 points marked on six sides.
- ❖ An ivory comb was found during the first excavation that had already taken place.
- ❖ Later, with the discovery of a 6th century silver coin, a gold earring was recently discovered during an excavation in the Agaram near the Keezhadi.
- ❖ The Pottery parts containing 13 letters (Tamil) have been found.
- ❖ The pot may have been written with thorns.
- **Earlier**, parts of pot with the names Aadan and Uthiran were found.
- ❖ With a maximum of parts of pottery containing 7 alphabetical letters found earlier, now this one with 13 letters is considered to be a testament to the fact that educated people lived here.
- ❖ Also at the bottom is a red grain container.
- ❖ Also, five more pots have been found in the pit where this pot was found.

Alternative Speakers of the legislature

- ❖ The Speaker Appavu has announced that when there is no Speaker in the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly, there will be four alternative speakers to hold the Assembly.
- ❖ Anbazhagan, SR Raja, Udayasooriyan and DRP Raja will be the alternate leaders.

Thirukkural Translation

❖ According to the Central Institute of Classical Tamil Studies, Thirukkural translations will be published in ten languages, including the Vakripoli language spoken by the Narikkurava people.





- ❖ The Central Ministry of Education has submitted to the Central Institute of Classical Tamil Studies a project to translate Thirukkural into 21 languages in the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India.
- ❖ The Institute has already published Thirukkural translations in Punjabi (2012), Manipuri (2012), Telugu (2014), Kannada (2014) and Gujarati (2015).
- ❖ In the coming October, Malayalam, Marathi, Oriya, Hindi, Nepali, Urdu, Arabic, Persian, Vakripoli (Narikkurava language), Paduku translations will be published in ten languages.
- ❖ In that respect, 20 books including U.V. Saminathaya Diary, U.V. Saminathaya Glossary and Sangam books Vocabulary, Natrinai (Kannada Translation), Tolkappiyam (Hindi Translation), Patiruppattu (Kannada Translation) will be published.

Ki.Ra. Award

- ❖ The Coimbatore Vijaya Publishing house's Vijaya Reader Circle's 2021 has announced that the Ki.Ra. award will be given to famous writer Konangi.
- Writer Konangi who is a story teller of modern Tamil literature belongs to Kovilpatti.
- ❖ Every year Ki.Ra. award and a cash prize of Rs 5 lakh is awarded in the name of Writer K. Raja Narayanan, who is known as the father of Karisal literature.
- ❖ This K.R. The award is presented by Shakti Masala.
- ❖ For the past 5 years the Vijaya Readers Circle of Coimbatore Vijaya Publishing house has selected Jayakanthan Award for Best Author, Poet Meera Award, Innovator Award, Shakthi Vai Govindan Award for Best Government Librarian and Vanathi Thirunavukkarasu Award for Best Bookseller.

Fisheries and Agriculture Department Announcements

- ❖ A weaving heritage park will be set up in Nagore in Nagai district at a cost of Rs 2 crores in 2021-2022.
- ❖ The Colour Fish Trade Centre at Kolathur, Chennai will be set up to international standards with Government and private participation.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu is the 7th state to bring a resolution in the Assembly against the Agriculture Act.
- ❖ Seven states, including Kerala, Chhattisgarh, Punjab and Rajasthan, have already passed resolutions against agricultural laws.





- ❖ The four places, namely Melmalaiyanur, Vallam of the Villupuram District, Madhanur of Tirupathur District and Harur of Dharmapuri District will be set up with Agricultural Extension Centres.
- ❖ A new Seed Testing Station will be set up at Tirupur.
- ❖ A 'one day program with farmers' will be implemented to go to the villages and listen to the grievances of the farmers.
- ❖ 4 organic farmer manufacturing companies will be set up at Dharmapuri, Cuddalore, Ranipet and Thiruvarur.
- ❖ An animal feed factory will be set up in Thanjavur district.
- ❖ National Poultry Breeding Farm and Poultry Incubation Establishment will be established at Abikesampatti farm, Tirunelveli District.
- ❖ A multipurpose hospital and research centre for pets will be set up at Nandanam, Chennai.
- ❖ Dharmapuri, Krishnagiri-based Tirukkachiruppu Sheep's Research Centre will be set up on 800 acres in Dharmapuri.
- ❖ A resource centre for the conservation of poultry (Siruvidai kozhi) in Tamil Nadu will be set up at the Madhavaram Poultry Research Station.
- ❖ In Orathanadu Veterinary College and Research Institute (Thanjavur), Tamil Nadu's Pattanam Sheep and Goat Resource Centre will be established.
- ❖ 50 Special markets would be set up at a cost of ₹8 crore in Chennai, Coimbatore, Madurai, Tiruchi and Salem to showcase the products of products of farmerproducer organisations
- ❖ An agri course in agriculture engineering would be started at the Agriculture Engineering College and Research Institute in Kumlur, Tiruchi.
- ❖ Three Government agriculture colleges will come up in Karur district, Kilvelur in Nagapattinam district and Chettinadu in Sivagangai district.

Public Welfare Department Announcements

- ❖ A red blood cell freezing unit will be set up at the Rajiv Gandhi Hospital in Chennai.
- ❖ Awareness will be created to reduce the use of sugar, salt and oil under the 'Slightly Reduce' (சற்றே குறைப்போம்) scheme.
- ❖ For the first time in India, a Siddha Medical University will be established near Chennai.
- ❖ For the first time in Tamil Nadu, a 24-hour Nursing Monitoring Centre will be set up.





Tamil Development department Announcements

- ❖ These were released by the Minister Thangam Tennarasu in the Legislative Assembly during the demand for grants on the Tamil official Language and Tamil Culture and Archaeology Department.
- ❖ The Books of Tamil scholars will be nationalized and a sum of money will be given.
- Accordingly, the books of Dr. T. Paramasivan, Silamboli Su.Sellappan, Puluvar Ilangumaranar, Murugesa Bhagavathar, Sankaravalli Nayakam and Pulavar Se. Rasu will be nationalized.
- ❖ In the temples, Tirukkural classes are conducted along with Thevaram, Thiruvasam and the Naalayira Divya Prabhandam.
- ❖ Tamil classes will be conducted through the media under the name 'Theerak Kadhal Thirukural'.
- * Rs. 1 crore will be allocated to form the 'Tamil Campaign Association' (தமிழ் பரப்புரைக் கழகம்) in order to teach Tamils living abroad and in other states.
- ❖ In particular, the Minister stressed that when writing a name in Tamil, the initials should also be written in Tamil.

L Murugan - BJP's RS candidate



- · He holds LLM and PhD in Law from Madras University
- ❖ The BJP named Union minister of state L Murugan, as its candidate for the Madhya Pradesh Rajya Sabha seat vacated by Thawarchand Gehlot.





- ❖ Murugan headed BJP's Tamil Nadu unit till July.
- He was then inducted into the Union cabinet by Prime Minister Narendra Modi as MoS information and broadcasting, and fisheries, animal husbandry and dairying.
- ❖ This necessitated his election to Parliament in six months.
- ❖ Madhya Pradesh's Rajya Sabha vacancy emerged after Gehlot was appointed the Karnataka Governor.

Trans Kitchen



- ❖ Trans Kitchen, a hotel run by a group of transgender people, was inaugurated near Goripalayam junction, Madurai
- ❖ It is a first-of-its-kind initiative in the city.
- Swasti organization funded the initiative, in association with organizations like Aroghyam, Virutti, and Sri Lakshmi Pengal Munnetra Sangam.

Mass feeding scheme

- ❖ Chief Minister M.K. Stalin virtually inaugurated the day-long annadhanam scheme.
- ❖ The scheme was launched at Subramanya Swamy temple in Tiruchendur, Mariamman temple in Samayapuram, and Subramanya Swami temple in Tiruttani.
- ❖ Devotees could have food anytime between 8 a.m. and 10 p.m. under this scheme.
- Arulmigu Aranganathaswamy temple in Srirangam and Arulmigu Dhandayuthapani swamy temple in Palani are the other two temples under the department where the day-long annadhanam scheme is being implemented at present.

- ❖ A 165-page Report was submitted by the retired Justice AK Rajan Committee on the impact of NEET.
- ❖ The Report stated that NEET should be eliminated immediately.
- ❖ It said that NEET would affect the healthcare infrastructure of Tamil Nadu, bringing a shortage of doctors' appointments in primary health centres and government hospitals.
- ❖ The report also stated that students from rural regions and poor backgrounds might lose access to medical education.
- ❖ The committee also pointed out that the admission to MBBS course before the NEET days for Tamil medium students was 14.44 per cent while it has fallen to a negligible 1.7 per cent in 2020-21.

- ❖ Tamil Nadu's Pavithra Venkatesh won gold in the women's pole vault event at the 60th National Open athletics meet.
- ❖ It was held at the Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium in Warangal.
- ❖ The 19-year-old, who hails from Salem, cleared the bar at 3.90m.





Gandhi Dhoti Centennial Celebrations



- ❖ The centennial year of the Mahatma 'changing his attire to dhoti' was celebrated on 22, September.
- ❖ An incident on September 22nd of 1921 at Madurai made Gandhi to wear dhoti.
- ❖ Commemorating this occasion, Ramraj Cotton organised a grand event 'Dhoti 100' at Tirupur.
- ❖ 100 martyrs and 100 weavers were honoured and 100 saplings were planted on the occasion.
- ❖ Dancers from Kalakshetra Foundation, Chennai, performed a traditional dance drama on 'Gandhiya Vazhiyil RamRaj'.

\$1 trillion economy - TN

- ❖ The five-year strategy for economic growth was unveiled by Chief Minister MK Stalin as TN targets a \$1 trillion economy by quadrupling its exports in nine years.
- ❖ TN will adopt a two-pronged approach,
 - o export promotion and
 - o export diversification
- ❖ This is to achieve its aim of a \$1 trillion economy by 2030.
- ❖ The State is setting up an Export Promotion Council under the Chief Secretary to boost exports.
- ❖ TN is also looking at developing two economic employment enclaves, in Mannasellore and Thoothkudi, in one phase.





Fully Solar Powered Central Station

- ❖ The Puratchi Thalaivar Dr. M.G. Ramachandran Central or Chennai Central railway station has met the 100% day energy requirement target by solar panels installed on the platform shelters of the station.
- ❖ The Station comes under the Southern Railway.
- ❖ The station has installed solar power capacity of 1.5MW.
- ❖ The Southern Railway is the first on Indian Railways to come up with the concept of 'Energy Neutral' railway stations.



Jal Jeevan Mission - Tamilnadu

- Union Minister of State for Jal Shakti, Prahlad Singh Patel lauded Tamil Nadu for the implementation of the Jal Jeevan Mission.
- ❖ Patel appreciated the provision of 100 per cent drinking water connections to State-run schools, anganwadi and Primary Healthcare Centres and government buildings.

Universal Postal Union - India



- ❖ India has won the elections for membership of two key bodies of the Universal Postal Union (UPU), during the 27th UPU Congress in Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire.
- ❖ India got elected to the Council of Administration (CA).
- ❖ The country received the highest votes in CA elections from South Asia and the Oceania region.
- ❖ Apart from this, India has also been elected to the Postal Operations Council (POC).
- ❖ India will now work with all to strengthen cooperation in the Universal Postal Union.





Ashok and 7 other ITDC hotels

- ❖ Under the government's target of monetising "under-utilized public sector assets", 'The Ashok' 5-star hotel will be leased out to private operators in four years.
- ❖ The Ashok and the Hotel Samrat are among eight India Tourism Development Corporation (ITDC) properties that Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman listed in the National Monetisation Pipeline (NMP).

The Ashok group of hotels

- ❖ These are the flagship hotel chain under ITDC, having a brand value developed in last 40-50 years.
- ❖ These hotels been the centre stage for all government events that are organised by various ministries and public sector entities.

POSHAN Maah



- ❖ The Union Ministry of Women and Child Development has planned to organise and celebrate Thematic POSHAN Maah in September 2021.
- ❖ Under the Poshan Abhiyaan, the month of September is observed as Poshan Maah i.e., Nutrition month every year, since 2018.
- ❖ POSHAN Maah is celebrated to ensure community mobilization and bolster people's participation.

Neeraj Chopra Stadium

- ❖ The Union Defence Minister, Rajnath Singh visited the Army Sports Institute, Pune and named the Army Sports Institute stadium as "Neeraj Chopra Stadium".
- ❖ The focus of the Indian Army (in the field of sports) is to identify and train promising sportspersons in 11 disciplines.





- ❖ The Indian Army's "Mission Olympics" programme was launched in 2001.
- ❖ It was launched with the intent to deliver medal-winning performances in the Olympics and other international events.

Note

❖ The Athletics Federation of India has decided that javelin throw day will be on 7th August every year in honour of Olympic gold medallist Neeraj Chopra.



BH-series

- ❖ The Union Ministry of Road Transport and Highways launched the BH-series to facilitate seamless transfer of vehicles.
- ❖ The Vehicle with this registration mark will not require assignment of any new registration mark when owner of the vehicle shifts from one state to other.
- ❖ The Vehicle registration facility under this series will be available on voluntary basis to Defense personnel, employees of Central or State Government, Central or State Public Sector Undertakings and private sector companies or organizations, having their offices across four or more States or Union territories.








- ❖ Section 47 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988 provides that a person cannot keep the vehicle for more than 12 months in any state other than the state where vehicle is registered.
- ❖ Instead, a new registration can be made with the new state- registering authority within 12 months.
- ❖ Considering this difficulty, new BH-series were launched.

Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana

- ❖ Under the Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY) the number of bank accounts have increased to 43 crores with total deposits of Rs 1.46 lakh crore.
- ❖ The flagship financial inclusion scheme, PMJDY, has completed seven years of implementation.
- ❖ This scheme was announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in the Independence Day address on August 15, 2014.
- ❖ It was launched on August 28 with the objective of bringing financial inclusion.
- ❖ It was launched to ensure that people have access to financial services, like banking, credit, insurance, remittance and pension in an affordable manner.



Coast Guard Ship Vigraha

- ❖ The defence minister Rajnath Singh has dedicated to the nation, the indigenously built Coast Guard Ship 'Vigraha' in Chennai, Tamil Nadu.
- ❖ According to the defence ministry, the 98-meter vessel will be based in Andhra Pradesh's Visakhapatnam (Vizag).
- ❖ The ship has been designed and built indigenously by Larsen & Toubro Ship Building Limited.







Liberalized Drone Rules

- ❖ The Union ministry of civil aviation (MoCA) notified the liberalized Drone Rules.
- ❖ These liberalized rules will replace the unmanned aircraft system (UAS) Rules 2021.
- ❖ A Digital sky platform will be developed as a user-friendly single-window system.

Digital sky platform

- ❖ It is an initiative by MoCA.
- ❖ It seeks to provide a secure and a scalable platform in order to support the drone technology frameworks like 'No permission, no take-off'.
- ❖ It has been designed to enable flight permission digitally and manage unmanned aircraft operations & traffic in an efficient manner.




New Rules on Poultry Farms

- ❖ The Department of Animal Husbandry, Dairying and Fisheries under the Union Ministry of Agriculture has released a set of new guidelines for poultries.
- ❖ It classifies poultry farmers based on the number of birds in the farm.





- o Small 5,000-25,000 birds
- o Medium 25,000 1 lakh birds
- o Large more than 1 lakh birds
- A farm should be set up
 - o 500m away from a residential area,
 - o 100m from rivers, lakes, canals and drinking water sources,
 - o 100m from national highways and
 - o 10-15m from village footpaths and rural roads.
- ❖ In the new guideline, a farmer of medium-sized poultry farm will have to obtain a certificate of Consent from State Pollution Control Board under the Water Act, 1974 and the Air Act, 1981.
- ❖ The permission will be valid for 15 years.
- ❖ The Animal Husbandry Department will be responsible for implementing the guidelines at the state and district level.



Oath of office

- ❖ The Chief Justice of India (CJI), NV Ramana, administered oath of office to Nine new judges, including three women.
- ❖ Three out of these nine new judges namely, Justice Vikram Nath, Justice BV Nagarathna and Justice PS Narasimha, are in line to become the CJI.
- ❖ With the addition of 9 judges, total strength of the Supreme Court increases to 33 out of the sanctioned strength of 34, including the CJI.
- ❖ This is the highest number of women judges ever in the Supreme Court (4 judges).
- ❖ It was the first time as many as nine judges were sworn in to the Supreme Court in a single stroke.






❖ Again, it was the first time the Supreme Court allowed a live telecast of the oath ceremony.

Note

- ❖ In over 71 years, only eight women judges have been appointed till date.
- ❖ First women judge was M Fathima Beevi, appointed in 1989.
- ❖ Justice Indira Banerjee is the long serving woman judge in the supreme court.



Online Marketplace e-Source

❖ IIT Madras is in process of developing an online platform called e-Source that will be used to tackle electronic wastes (e-waste).





- ❖ E-Source will be used to tackle e-waste by linking stakeholders of the formal and informal economy.
- ❖ E-Source will act as an exchange platform to serve as an online marketplace for Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE).
- ❖ This initiative is being headed by Indo-German Centre for Sustainability (IGCS).

Navy Exercise - India and Algeria



- ❖ The Indian and Algerian navies conducted their first ever naval exercise off the coast of Algeria.
- * The exercise reflects increased maritime cooperation among two countries.
- ❖ Stealth ship INS Tabar represented India while Algeria was represented by its naval ship ANS Ezager.

World's highest movie theatre

- ❖ The world's highest movie theatre has recently been inaugurated in Ladakh.
- ❖ It got its first-ever mobile digital movie theatre in the Paldan area of Leh, at an altitude of 11,562 feet.
- ❖ The inflatable theatre can operate in -28 degrees Celsius.
- ❖ The initiative aims to bring cinema watching experience to the remotest areas of India.







Entry age increase in National Pension System

- ❖ The Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority (PFRDA) has increased the entry age for the National Pension System (NPS) from 65 years to 70 years.
- ❖ Earlier the eligible age to invest in NPS was 18-65 years.
- Now it is revised to 18-70 years.
- ❖ As per the revised norms, any Indian Citizen, resident or non-resident and Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) between the age of 65-70 years can join NPS and continue or defer their NPS Account up to the age of 75 years.
- ❖ If a person joins NPS after 65 years, then the Normal Exit shall be after 3 years.



Rabobank's 2021 Global Top 20 Dairy Companies list

- ❖ Amul, Gujarat Cooperative Milk Marketing Federation has ranked 18th in this list
- ❖ Amul was placed at 16th spot in 2020.
- ❖ French-based dairy company Lactalis has topped the list as the world's largest dairy company.





- ❖ It has unseated Switzerland-based global behemoth Nestle, which dominated the list for decades.
- * Rabobank's Global Dairy Top 20 Report is released annually to rank the dairy industry upon their sales data and financial statements.

World's highest motorable way

- ❖ A road connecting Leh to the Pangong Lake was inaugurated recently.
- ❖ The stretch passing through the Kela Pass at 18,600 feet is the world's highest motorable way.
- ❖ The road was constructed by 58 Engineer Regiment of the Indian Army.
- ❖ It will reduce the distance between Leh (Zingral to Tangtse) to Pangong Lake crossing the Kela Pass by 41 kms.

First meeting with Taliban - India

- According to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), its Ambassador to Qatar Deepak Mittal, met the head of the Taliban's political office, Sher Mohammad Abbas Stanekzai
- ❖ With this meeting, the Government of India has softened its stance on the Taliban.
- ❖ India's only concern was that "Afghanistan's soil should not be used for any anti-Indian activities and terrorism".

NABARD and NABFOUNDATION's new initiative

- ❖ In Tripura, Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman has inaugurated a project called 'My Pad, My Right' initiated by NABARD and NABFOUNDATION.
- ❖ It was inaugurated at Killa village in Gomati district.
- ❖ The project aims to bring livelihood and menstrual hygiene closer to rural women by way of grant, wage support and capital equipment.
- ❖ The Union Minister also flagged off the mobile ATM van of Tripura State Co-Operative Bank Limited.

Floating ATM at Dal Lake

- ❖ State Bank of India has opened a floating ATM on a Houseboat at Dal Lake in Jammu and Kashmir's Srinagar.
- ❖ The floating ATM was inaugurated by SBI Chairman Dinesh Kumar Khara.





- ❖ This is not the first time that SBI has launched a floating ATM as back in 2004, the bank took this initiative in Kerala.
- ❖ The SBI installed a floating ATM at Jhankar yacht, which operates between Ernakulum and Vaypeyan region.



Gaganyaan Service Module Propulsion System

- ❖ Indian Space Research Organisation said it successfully conducted the first hot test of the System Demonstration Model of the Gaganyaan Service Module Propulsion System.
- ❖ It was done at the test facility of Propulsion Complex, Mahendragiri, Tamil Nadu.
- ❖ The test conducted for 450 seconds met the test objectives and matched the pretest predictions.
- ❖ The Gaganyaan Service Module Propulsion System is a part of the Gaganyaan Orbital module of the Gaganyaan Mission, India's first human spaceflight mission.







Grenades made by private sector

- ❖ The first batch of one lakh privately 'made in India' modern hand grenades were handed over to the Indian Army by Economic Explosives Ltd. (EEL).
- ❖ EEL a Nagpur based private company.
- ❖ This is the first instance of ammunition being manufactured by the private industry in India.



Saath initiative

- ❖ Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor, Manoj Sinha, launched the Rural Enterprises Acceleration Programme called 'Saath'.
- ❖ This initiative was launched with the aim of transforming the lives of rural women associated with SHGs.
- ❖ This initiative will help about 48000 SHGs in which about four lakh women are connected, in Jammu and Kashmir.
- ❖ Saath initiative will focus on mentoring and market linkages of products that created by these women.
- ❖ Saath initiative was launched in line with the Umeed scheme that enabled women to start their own business.

Ladakh adopts State animal and bird

- Ladakh adopted two endangered species, snow leopard and black-necked crane, as State animal and State bird
- ❖ Black-necked cranes are only found in Ladakh's Changthang region.
- ❖ The bird is classified as Near-Threatened, as per the IUCN classification.
- Snow leopard has been classified as 'vulnerable'.









200 Army personnel for Zapad exercise

- ❖ One of the contingents of the Indian armed forces is participating in Exercise Zapad
- ❖ ZAPAD 2021 is one of the theatre level exercises of Russian armed forces and will focus primarily on operations against terrorists.
- Multiple countries will be part of this exercise.
- ❖ Pakistan and china are part of this exercise as observer states.







New secretary general

- ❖ The Rajya Sabha Chairman Venkaiah Naidu has appointed Dr PPK Ramacharyulu as the secretary general.
- ❖ He is the secretary in the Rajya Sabha Secretariat since 2018.
- He succeeds Desh Dipak Verma.

Defence Expo 22



- ❖ The next Defence Expo will be hosted by Gujarat in 2022.
- ❖ This was announced by chief minister Vijay Rupani.
- ❖ Defence Expo-2022 will be held in Gandhinagar.
- ❖ The aim of Defense Expo 2022 is to move from Make in India to make for the world.
- ❖ The Defence Expo-2022 will focus on making India a Defence manufacturing hub.

Note

- ❖ Def Expo was traditionally held in Delhi until 2014.
- ❖ After 2014 it has seen a string of new venues Goa (2016), Chennai (2018) and Lucknow (2020).

125th birth anniversary of ISKCON founder

- ❖ Prime Minister Narendra Modi virtually unveiled a special commemorative coin of Rs 125 to mark the 125th birth anniversary of ISKCON founder Srila Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada.
- ❖ In July 1966, Prabhupada founded the International Society for Krishna Consciousness (ISKCON) commonly known as the 'Hare Krishna movement'.





- ❖ The spiritual leader was born as Abhay Charan De on September 1 in Calcutta.
- ❖ Later he was to be known by the honorific A.C. Bhaktivedanta Swami Prabhupada.



Royal Jelly

- ❖ The Indian Royal Jelly was found to surpass top-quality sellers; those are produced in Thailand and Taiwan.
- This is according to Pune-based researchers.
- Royal Jelly is known for being a good antioxidant.
- It helps women with fertility issues.

- It will be organised to recognise the valuable contributions of teachers and to take National Education Policy 2020 ahead.





President's Color to Indian Naval Aviation

- ❖ The President of India, will award the President's Colour to Indian Naval Aviation at the ceremonial parade to be held at INS Hansa, Goa.
- ❖ The President's Colour is the highest honour bestowed on a military unit in recognition of its exceptional service to the nation.
- ❖ The Indian Navy was the first amongst the Indian Armed Forces to be awarded the President's Colour.
- ❖ It was awarded on 27 May 1951 by Dr Rajendra Prasad, the then President of India.



Manthan 2021

❖ The Bureau of Police Research and Development (BPR&D), in coordination with the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), launched an online hackathon "Manthan 2021".







- ❖ It aims for the identification of innovative concepts and technology solutions to address the challenges faced by intelligence agencies.
- ❖ The BPR&D was established under the Ministry of Home Affairs in the 1970s.
- ❖ It was launched with the primary objective of modernisation of the Police Force.
- ❖ AICTE is a national-level apex advisory body to conduct a survey on the facilities available for technical education and to promote development in the country in a coordinated and integrated manner

Y Break app

- ❖ The Union AYUSH Minister, Sarbananda Sonowal has launched 'Y Break' Yoga protocol mobile application in New Delhi.
- ❖ The app has been developed by Morarji Desai National Institute of Yoga.
- ❖ The Y-Break (or the "Yoga Break) mobile application is a unique five-minute Yoga protocol app.
- ❖ It is designed especially for working professionals to de-stress, refresh and refocus at their workplace.



Kisan Store

- ❖ Amazon India announced the launch of Kisan Store.
- ❖ The store was launched by Union Minister for Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, Narendra Singh Tomar.
- ❖ Kisan Store is an online platform that enable farmers of India to get access of more than 8,000 agriculture inputs like farm tools & accessories, seeds, plant protection, nutrition etc.
- These products are listed by small and medium businesses (SMBs).
- Products will be delivered at the doorstep of farmers.
- ❖ Kisan store will be available in languages like Hindi, Telugu, Kannada, Tamil, and Malayalam.





Tunnel at the Delhi Legislative Assembly

- ❖ A mysterious tunnel has been discovered at the Delhi Legislative Assembly.
- ❖ The tunnel connects the legislative assembly to Red Fort.
- ❖ It was used by the Britishers to avoid reprisal while moving freedom fighters.



Karbi Peace Accord



- ❖ The Centre signed a tripartite "Karbi Peace Accord".
- This accord is significant because insurgency by Karbi group has a long history in Assam which is marked by killings, ethnic violence, abductions and taxations since 1980s.
- * Karbi is a major ethnic community in Assam and are dotted by several factions and splinters.

AYUSH AAPKE DWAR

❖ Ayush Ministry launched the campaign called "AYUSH AAPKE DWAR" from some 45 locations across India.





- ❖ Campaign was launched by Minister of State for Ayush from Ayush Bhawan by distributing medicinal plants to staff.
- ❖ AYUSH AAPKE DWAR campaign was launched with the aim of distributing medicinal plant saplings to 75 lakh households in India in one year.



Integrated anti-Submarine warfare Defence Suits



- ❖ The Ministry of Defence signed a contract worth Rs. 1,349 Crores with Mahindra Defence Systems (MDS) Limited.
- ❖ This is in order to buy 14 Integrated Anti-Submarine Warfare (ASW) Defence Suits (IADS) for the Indian Navy.





- ❖ Integrated Anti-Submarine Warfare Defence Suits is high-end underwater equipment that uses the latest technology.
- ❖ The system is designed to detect and protect warships from underwater threats.

Plastics pact

- ❖ India has become the first Asian Country to launch a Plastics pact.
- ❖ This new platform was developed by World-Wide Fund for Nature-India (WWF India) in collaboration with the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII).
- ❖ It will help to promote a circular system for plastics.
- ❖ The Commitments under the pact are aimed at keeping plastic packaging in the economy and out of natural environment.



CORBEVAX

- ❖ The Drug Controller General of India (DCGI) gave approval to another indigenous COVID-19 vaccine candidate called CORBEVAX for two clinical trials.
- ❖ This vaccine is also called as BioE COVID-19 vaccine.
- ❖ This COVID-19 vaccine candidate has been developed by Indian biopharmaceutical firm Biological E. Limited (BioE) in collaboration with the Baylor College of Medicine, Houston in the United States and the American company Dynavax Technologies (DVAX).
- Vaccine is a protein subunit vaccine.
- ❖ Biological E received approval to conduct phase two and three clinical trials on children between five to eighteen years of age.
- ❖ The vaccine has also received financial assistance under Mission COVID Suraksha and a financial support under COVID-19 Research Consortia through National Biopharma Mission, BIRAC.







Court rules against EWS reservation

- ❖ The Madras High Court ruled that the Centre ought not to have provided 10% reservation for economically weaker sections (EWS) of society in the All India Quota medical seats without obtaining the express approval of the Supreme Court.
- ❖ Chief Justice Sanjib Banerjee and Justice P.D. Adikesavalu held that Centre's July 29 notification was permissible only with respect to
 - o 15% reservation for Scheduled Castes,
 - o 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes and
 - o 27% reservation for Other Backward Classes (OBCs).





- ❖ Tamil Nadu recently announced to set up India's first Dugong Conservation Reserve in the Palk Bay on the southeast coast.
- ❖ It will also construct a Dugong Marine Conservation Reserve in the Gulf of Mannar and Palk Bay areas.





- ❖ Dugong or sea cow is an endangered marine mammal.
- ❖ It is the only living species of the order Sirenia.
- ❖ Dugong is found in Gulf of Mannar and at Palk Bay in Tamil Nadu.
- ❖ The IUCN has listed dugong as a "vulnerable to extinction species".

24th meeting of FSDC

- ❖ The union minister for Finance & Corporate Affairs Nirmala Sitharaman has chaired the 24th meeting of the Financial Stability and Development Council (FSDC).
- ❖ The finance minister is the chairperson of FSDC.
- ❖ It must be noted that FSDC Sub-Committee is chaired by the Governor, RBI.
- ❖ It is the apex level forum set up by the Government of India for strengthening and institutionalizing the mechanism for maintaining financial stability, enhancing inter-regulatory coordination and promoting financial sector development.

Financial Stability and Development Council

The FSDC, set up in 2010, is a body consisting all regulators and the Ministry of Finance. It is the highest forum in matters relating to financial stability. The Council is chaired by the Union Finance Minister



India at Tokyo Paralympics

- ❖ China topped the medal table in this version (207 96 golds, 60 silvers and 51 bronzes).
- * It is the fifth time; China tops the medal table since Athens (2004).





- ❖ India won a total of 19 medals at Tokyo Paralympics 2020, including 5 gold, 8 silver and 6 bronze.
- ❖ The 19 medals were clinched by Indian para-athletes across five sporting disciplines including shooting, javelin throw, badminton, athletics and archery.
- ❖ India have finished at 24th position out of 162 nations in terms of overall medal tally.
- ❖ India made its first appearance at the Paralympics in 1968.
- ❖ India won only 12 medals from 1968 to 2016.
- ❖ It had won four medals at Rio 2016 and four at the 1984 Paralympics.
- ❖ This is the first time that badminton and taekwondo has been added to the Paralympics.
- ❖ Tokyo has been the first city to host two Paralympic Games since the city held the 1964 Paralympics.
- ❖ Avani was India's flag-bearer at the Tokyo Paralympics closing ceremony.
- ❖ The Indian gold medallists at Tokyo Paralympics include shooter Avani Lekhara, javelin thrower Sumit Antil, shooter Manish Narwal and shuttlers Pramod Bhagat and Krishna Nagar.
- ❖ Shooters Avani Lekhara, who won a gold and bronze, and Singh raj Adhana, who won a silver and bronze, were the top performers for India with two medals each.

Other Medallists

- ❖ India's ace archer Harvinder Singh has won the bronze medal in the men's individual recurve open.
- ❖ He has become India's first-ever archer to win a medal in the Paralympics.
- ❖ Indian shooters Manish Narwal and Singh raj Adhana clinched the gold and silver medal respectively in the P4 − Mixed 50m Pistol SH1 final (Shooting).
- ❖ Suhas Yathi raj, current district magistrate of Noida, has become the first IAS officer to win Paralympics medal.
- ❖ He won the silver medal in in the men's singles at Badminton SL4 class final.
- ❖ Pramod Bhagat and Manoj Sarkar had won a gold and a bronze respectively in men's singles at Badminton SL3 category.
- ❖ Pramod claimed India's first badminton gold at the Paralympics.
- Krishna Nagar won the second Para-Badminton gold for India.
- ❖ He becomes the first-ever SH6 gold medallist in the history of the Indian Paralympics.

- ❖ The Ministry of Information and Broadcasting constituted a committee to review the existing guidelines of Journalist Welfare Scheme.
- ❖ The committee will be headed by Prachar Bharati Board Member Ashok Kumar Tandon.

News Broadcasters Federations

- ❖ The Ministry of Information and Broadcasting has officially recognized the News Broadcasters Federations (NBF) self-regulatory body.
- ❖ Presently, it is the only body in the country that has successfully demonstrated compliance with national standards in the domain of news media.

Gambusia fish

❖ The Firozabad district administration in Uttar Pradesh has released Gambusia fish (mosquitofish) that eat dengue-breeding mosquito larvae in ponds.





- ❖ This Insectivorous fish is known to check the spread of mosquito-borne diseases like malaria and dengue.
- ❖ Gambusia eats about 100 larvae daily.
- ❖ Besides Gambusia, guppy fish is used to check the spread of mosquito-borne diseases.



Prophylactic Medicines

- ❖ The Ayush Ministry kickstarts campaign to distribute prophylactic medicines
- ❖ The kit of Ayurveda prophylactic medicines for Covid-19 contains Sanshamani Vati (also known as Guduchi or Giloy Ghan Vati) and Ashwagandha Ghan Vati.
- ❖ The kit and the guidelines have been prepared by the Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Medicines (CCRAS).
- Prophylactic means a preventive measure.

National Teachers' Award 2021

- ❖ National Teachers' Award 2021 was awarded to 44 persons by the President Ram Nath Kovind.
- ❖ The award was also bestowed upon Pramod Kumar Shukla of Eklavya Model Residential School (EMRS), Chhattisgarh.
- ❖ It is the second award in a row for an EMRS established under the Ministry of Tribal Affairs.







Shikshak Parv - 2021

- ❖ The Prime Minister Narendra Modi has inaugurated the Shikshak Parv 2021.
- ❖ The theme is "Quality and Sustainable Schools: Learnings from Schools in India".
- ❖ The event was organised by the Ministry of Education.
- ❖ The objective of the Shikshak Parv-2021 is to encourage innovative practices to ensure not only continuity of education at all levels but to improve quality, inclusive practices and sustainability in the schools across the country as well.



NIRF 2021

- ❖ The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) has been released by the Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan.
- It lists top universities and colleges in India.
- ❖ In 2021, the participated number of institutions in this ranking was 6000.
- ❖ It has been announced for eleven categories -- Overall, University, Management, College, Pharmacy, Medical, Engineering, Architecture, ARIIA (Atal Ranking of Institutions on Innovation Achievements), Law and Research Institutions.
- ❖ The ranking framework judges' institutions under five broad generic groups of parameters of Teaching, Learning and Resources (TLR), Research and Professional Practice (RP), Graduation Outcomes (GO), Outreach and Inclusivity (OI) and Perception (PR).

Key findings

- ❖ IIT Madras remains the best institute in the overall category in the country.
- ❖ The IIT Madras has topped the list for the sixth consecutive year in the Engineering Category.
- ❖ The IIT Madras has bagged the second position in the newly introduced 'research' category.





- ❖ The IIM Ahmedabad has topped in the Management Category.
- IISc Bangalore has topped in the university category
- ❖ IISc Bengaluru is also the top-ranking institute in newly introduced category research.
- ❖ University of Delhi's Miranda House has been ranked first in the college category.
- ❖ The Jamia Hamdard, New Delhi tops in the Pharmacy category.
- ❖ All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) Delhi tops in the medical category
- Christian Medical College, Vellore ranks third in medical.



Tamilnadu

- ❖ Tamil Nadu has a total of 19 institutions in the top 100.
- ❖ Last year, Anna University ranked 20 in the overall category but this year its rank has dropped to 25.
- Similarly, University of Madras ranked 47 this year but ranked 41 last year.
- ❖ Bharathiar University of Coimbatore ranked 22 this year but ranked 21 last year.
- ❖ But NIT-Trichy improved from 24 last year to 23 this year.
- ❖ Chennai's Loyola College ranked third in this year from 6th in the last year.

New Governors in India

- ❖ The President of India Ramnath Kovind appointed new governors of Tamil Nadu, Uttarakhand, and Nagaland.
- ❖ The former Nagaland governor R. N. Ravi is appointed as the Governor of Tamil Nadu.





- ❖ The present Governor of Tamil Nadu Banwarilal Purohit, who was holding additional charge of the Governor of Punjab, is appointed as regular Governor of Punjab.
- ❖ Jagdish Mukhi, Governor of Assam is appointed to discharge the functions of the Governor of Nagaland in addition.
- ❖ Gurmit Singh was appointed as Governor of Uttarakhand
- The President also accepted the resignation of Baby Rani Maurya as the Governor of Uttarakhand.



GM soy meal

- ❖ India allowed imports of GM soy meal for the first time to help the poultry industry.
- ❖ Besides the Nhava Sheva Port in Mumbai, traders could now import soy meal via the Mumbai Sea Port, the Tuticorin Sea Port, and the Visakhapatnam Sea Port.
- ❖ The imports could take place from countries like Argentina, Europe and the US
- ❖ Soymeal is a protein-rich solid leftover raw material after extracting oil from soyabean seed.
- ❖ There are three types of GM foods, one with Genetically Modified Organism (GMO), second with Living Modified Organism (LMO) and third with Non-Living Modified Organism (NLMO).
- ❖ The soymeal is NLMO.


GM crops

- ❖ A GM or transgenic crop is a plant that has a novel combination of genetic material obtained through the use of modern biotechnology.
- ❖ GM crop can contain a gene(s) that has been artificially inserted instead of the plant acquiring it through pollination.
- ❖ The Genetic Engineering Appraisal Committee (GEAC) is the apex body that allows for commercial release of GM crops.





- ❖ Use of the unapproved GM variant is punishable under the Environment Protection Act, 1986.
- ❖ The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) is the authorised body to regulate the imported crops in India.



Tocilizumab



- ❖ The Drugs Controller General of India (DCGI) has approved the generic version of Tocilizumab for emergency use for the treatment of Covid-19 among adult patients.
- ❖ It is produced by the Hyderabad-based pharmaceutical company Hetero.
- ❖ The medicine would be available under the brand name of Tocira.
- ❖ Hetero's Tocilizumab is the bio-similar version of Roche's Actemra/RoActemra.





Swachh Survekshan Grameen 2021



- ❖ It will be launched under the Swachh Bharat Mission Phase -2, as a part of the 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsay'.
- ❖ The Survekshan 2021 aims to assist in the acceleration of ODF plus interventions and results in India.
- ❖ The Department of Drinking Water and Sanitation (DDWS) had earlier commissioned Swachh Survekshan Grameen (SSG) in 2018 and 2019.

PRANA portal



- ❖ The Union environment minister Bhupendra Yadav launched a portal called PRANA portal.
- ❖ It will be used to track the progress of the National Clean Air Programme (NCAP).
- ❖ It aims to comply with India's commitment to ensure clean air and blue skies to everybody.





- ❖ The Non-attainment cities are those cities that failed to meet the National air quality standards in a five-year period.
- ❖ The Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) seeks to achieve 20-30 percent reduction in particulate matter (PM10 as well as PM2.5) concentrations in India by 2024.

Deity is owner of land attached to temple

- ❖ According to supreme court bench, Deity is the owner of land attached to a temple.
- ❖ A priest cannot be treated as Bhumi swami (owner of land).
- ❖ The priest holds the land just for the management of property of the temple.
- ❖ Priest is only a grantee to manage the property of the deity.

MSP for Rabi



- ❖ The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs (CCEA) has approved the increase in the MSP for all mandated Rabi crops for the Rabi Marketing Season 2022-23.
- ❖ MSP is the rate at which the government buys grains from farmers.
- ❖ Currently, it fixes MSPs for 23 crops grown in both Kharif and Rabi seasons.
- ❖ It is based on a calculation of at least one-and-a-half times the cost of production incurred by the farmers.





- ❖ The Union Budget for 2018-19 had announced that MSP would be kept at levels of 1.5 the cost of production.
- ❖ The MSP is fixed twice a year on the recommendations of the Commission for Agricultural Costs and Prices (CACP).

75% quota for locals

- **❖** Jharkhand State aims to provides 75% reservation for locals in private sector jobs with a monthly salary of up to ₹40,000.
- ❖ Once notified, Jharkhand will become the third State, after Andhra Pradesh and Haryana, to pass such a law.

Best Tourism Villages

- Meghalaya's Whistling village, Kongthong, has been nominated by the Ministry of Tourism for the UNWTO (World Tourism Organisation) 'Best Tourism Villages' award.
- ❖ The two other villages in India that have also been nominated for UNWTO 'Best Tourism Villages' award are Ladhpura Khas in Madhya Pradesh and Pochampally in Telangana.



NSCN Agreement

- ❖ A ceasefire agreement has been signed between the Union Ministry of Home Affairs and the National Socialist Council of Nagaland (NSCN) Khaplang (K) led by Nikki Sumi for one year.
- ❖ The main objective of the organization is to establish a sovereign Naga State "Nagalim".





❖ It will consist of all the areas that have been inhabited by the Naga people in Northeast India as well as Northwest Myanmar.

Emergency Landing Facility

- ❖ The Union Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and Union Highways Minister Nitin Gadkari inaugurated the Emergency Landing Facility on the Satta-Gandhav stretch of National Highway (NH) 925A in Barmer in Rajasthan.
- ❖ For the first time, a National Highway will be used for the emergency landing of aircraft of the Indian Air Force (IAF).



100-day plan for Civil Aviation

- ❖ The 100-day plan for boosting India's civil aviation sector will begin with the construction of 4 new airports across Kushi nagar, Agartala, Dehradun, and Jewar in the next 100 days.
- ❖ The first airport will be in Kushi nagar in Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖ Kushi nagar will become the focal point of the Buddhist circuit.

India's first bio-brick based building

- ❖ India's first building made of bio-bricks from agro-waste has been inaugurated at IIT Hyderabad.
- ❖ The sample building is made up of bio-bricks supported by a metal framework.
- * The roof is also made of bio-bricks over PVC sheets to reduce heat.
- ❖ It is part of the Bold Unique Idea Lead Development (BUILD) project to demonstrate the strength and versatility of the material.






5th World Conference of Speakers of Parliament

- ❖ The 5th World Conference of Speakers of Parliament (5WCSP) and first global parliamentary summit on counter terrorism is organised at Vienna, Austria.
- ❖ Both the events in Vienna are being organised by the Inter- Parliamentary Union (IPU), Geneva, and the Parliament of Austria with the support of the United Nations.
- ❖ It will be the first physically attended global parliamentary event post Covid-19 pandemic.
- ❖ The Lok Sabha Om Birla and the Deputy Chairman of Rajya Sabha attended these events.



Atma Nirbhar Bharat corners







- ❖ Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation of India (TRIFED) in collaboration with the Ministry of External Affairs, is setting up an Atma Nirbhar Bharat corner in 75 Indian Missions/ Embassies across the world.
- ❖ The first such Atma Nirbhar Bharat corner was successfully inaugurated at Indian Embassy in Bangkok, Thailand.
- ❖ The 75 countries include Jamaica, Ireland, Turkey, Kenya, Mongolia, Israel, Finland, France, and Canada, Singapore, Russia, the US, Indonesia, Greece and Cyprus among others.

IROAF

- ❖ The Indian Railways Organization of Alternate Fuel (IROAF) has been shut down by the Railways Ministry.
- ❖ IROAF was an organization that was formed to promote green energy across the Indian Railway Network.
- ❖ The work of IROAF will now be transferred to the Northern Railways and the Railway Board.

ADB in Jharkhand

- ❖ Asian Development Bank (ADB) and the Government of India have signed a deal to develop water supply infrastructure in Jharkhand.
- ❖ It also aims to strengthen the capacities of urban local bodies (ULBs) for improved service delivery in four towns in the state of Jharkhand.
- ❖ This is the first project of ADB in the state of Jharkhand.

Eyes in Sky Project



❖ The Government of India gave its final approval to build 6 AEW&C (Airborne Early Warning and Control) aircraft.






- ❖ It aims to bolster the surveillance capability of the Indian Air Force (IAF) along the borders with China and Pakistan.
- ❖ These aircrafts are regarded as powerful 'eyes in the sky' in modern warfare.
- ❖ The IAF currently operates 3 Israeli Phalcon AWACS mounted on Russian IL-76 transport aircraft.
- ❖ The IAF has 2 indigenous 'Netra' aircraft fitted on smaller Brazilian Embraer-145 jet.

MRSAM

- ❖ A medium-range surface-to-air-missile (MRSAM) system has been successfully inducted in the Indian Air Force (IAF).
- ❖ The missile system is capable of knocking out aerial threats at a range of 70 km.
- ❖ The system has been jointly developed by DRDO and Israel Aerospace Industries.
- ❖ The naval version of MRSAM has already been deployed on few Indian warships.



National Minorities Commission

- ❖ The Former IPS officer Iqbal Singh Lalpura has been chosen as chairman of National Commission for Minorities.
- ❖ The last chairperson of the commission was Syed Ghayorul Hasan Rizvi.
- ❖ It has been setup under the National Commission for Minorities Act, 1992.





- Six religious' communities, viz; Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, Buddhists, Zoroastrians (Parsis) and Jains have been notified as minority communities in India.
- ❖ In 2014, Jains were the last to be notified as a minority community.



Digital Population Clock


- ❖ It was inaugurated at the Institute for Economic Growth inside the University of Delhi.
- ❖ The Union Minister of State for Health & Family Welfare, Bharati Pravin Pawar, inaugurated this.
- ❖ It was launched in order to provide minute by minute estimate of India's population.
- ❖ It will also capture data on Total Fertility Rate, Infant Mortality Rate as well as Maternal Mortality Rate.

Nipah Virus

- ❖ It is recently found in the Kozhikode district in Kerala.
- It is a zoonotic virus caused by the fruit bats.
- Human beings can get infected if they come in close contact with the infected animal — bats or other animals such as pigs — or its body fluids such as saliva or urine.
- ❖ The initial jump of the virus from animal to human is known as a 'spill over' event in an outbreak.
- ❖ Once the infection has moved to humans, person-to-person the spread of virus can occur.
- ❖ It can also be transmitted through contaminated food, or directly between people.
- ❖ In India, the outbreaks have so far been limited to West Bengal and Kerala.








Medicine from the Sky

- It is the first such project in India.
- ❖ The project will help deliver medicines and vaccines to remote areas with the help of drones.
- ❖ It is an initiative of the Telangana government in collaboration with the NITI Aayog, World Economic Forum and HealthNet Global.








Gujarat New Chief Minister

- ❖ Senior BJP leader Bhupendra Patel will be the new Chief Minister of Gujarat.
- Vijay Rupani has become the fourth Chief Minister to resign this year.
- ❖ It is after Karnataka Chief Minister BS Yeddyurappa, Uttarakhand Chief Minister Trivendra Singh Rawat and Assam Chief Minister Sarbanand Sonowal.



Resident Certificate

- ❖ The Ladakh administration has decided to issue "Resident Certificate" only to the Permanent Resident Certificate holders of the region.
- ❖ In Jammu and Kashmir, new domicile laws allowed outsiders too to apply for jobs, land and other facilities.

100 percent vaccination

- ❖ A total of 6 states and union territories (UTs) in India have achieved the milestone of administering the first dose of COVID-19 vaccine to 100 per cent of their eligible adult population.
- ❖ These 6 states and UTs are Himachal Pradesh, Goa, Ladakh, Sikkim, Lakshadweep, Daman & Diu, and Dadar and Nagar Haveli.
- ❖ Goa has become the second state in India to complete 100% covid vaccination of the first dose for all its eligible residents.
- ❖ Himachal Pradesh was the first state to achieve this feat.
- ❖ The Nilgiris became the first district in Tamil Nadu to achieve 100% coverage of the first dose.

Renewable energy in India

❖ India recently crossed the 100-gigawatt (GW) milestone of installed renewable energy capacity.





- ❖ India has a total installed power generation capacity of 383.73 GW.
- ❖ The Indian renewable energy sector is the fourth most attractive renewable energy market in the world.
- ❖ India was ranked fifth in wind power, fifth in solar power and fourth in renewable power installed capacity, as of 2019.
- ❖ The installed solar energy capacity stands at 41.09 GW.
- ❖ India is running the world's largest clean energy programme.
- ❖ India has also enhanced its ambition to install 450 GW of renewable energy capacity by 2030.
- ❖ If large hydro is included the installed Renewable Energy capacity increases to 146 GW.
- ❖ It contributes to about 37% of the country's total capacity
- ❖ India's per capita emission is one-third of the world average.

INS Dhruv



❖ India's first nuclear-missile tracking ship, named INS Dhruv, has been commissioned from Visakhapatnam in Andhra Pradesh.





- ❖ The 10,00 tonnes satellite and ballistic missile tracking ship has been built by the Hindustan Shipyard Limited in collaboration with the DRDO and National Technical Research Organisation (NTRO).
- ❖ India now joins an elite list of countries consisting of France, the US, the UK, Russia, and China.

National Company Law Appellate Tribunal (NCLAT)



- ❖ Justice M. Venugopal has been named as the new Acting Chairperson of this Tribunal.
- ❖ The NCLAT was constituted under the Companies Act, 2013 for hearing appeals against the orders of the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT).
- ❖ It is also an appellate tribunal for hearing appeals against the orders passed by NCLT under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC), and by the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (IBBI).
- ❖ It is also the appellate tribunal to hear and dispose of appeals against any direction issued or decision made or order passed by the Competition Commission of India (CCI).

PM Adarsh Gram Yojna

- Tribal Affairs Minister Arjun Munda informed recently this.
- ❖ This ministry will start Pradhan Mantri Adarsh Gram Yojna covering 36 thousand villages across the country.
- ❖ The villages with 50 percent tribal population will be given priority under the rural development programme.
- Under this Yojna, roughly 1,700 tribal villages in Assam will be converted into model villages.
- ❖ Pradhan Mantri Adarsh Gram Yojana (PMAGY) is a rural development programme.





❖ It was launched by the central government in fiscal year 2009–10 for the development of villages that have a higher ratio (over 50%) of people belonging to the scheduled castes.



Jayant Opencast Coal Project

- ❖ It is in Singrauli District of Madhya Pradesh.
- It is one of the largest projects of Coal India Limited under the Ministry of Coal
- ❖ It is working towards a mission of land restoration and enhancing green cover each passing day along with coal mining activity.
- ❖ The Project is one of many greenfield projects that aim at simultaneous backfilling of land after opencast coal mining operations and dense plantation to maintain environmental balance.

Project Udaan

- IIT-Bombay launched its "Project Udaan" on the occasion of Hindi Diwas.
- ❖ It was launched with the aim of breaking the language barrier that many students face while joining the institutes of higher education.
- ❖ It enables the translation of textbooks and other study material of the engineering and other streams from English to Hindi & other Indian Languages.
- ❖ It is a donation based and Artificial Intelligence-based translation ecosystem.







Speed limit for Vehicles

- ❖ The Madras High Court (HC) has set aside the 2018 notification of Central government.
- ❖ That had fixed a speed of 120 km/hour as the limit on highways and expressways.
- ❖ The order of HC was given on an appeal arising under the Motor Vehicles Act.
- Over speeding is the main killer and responsible for most of the accidents.
- Citing this, the notification was quashed.

Geeta Samota



- ❖ She became the "fastest Indian" to summit two peaks located in Africa and Russia.
- ❖ She successfully climbed Mount Kilimanjaro, the highest peak in Africa.
- ❖ Africa's Mount Kilimanjaro is the highest single free-standing mountain in the world which has three volcanic cones on its summit.
- ❖ She became the youngest Asian girl to climb Kilimanjaro.
- ❖ Geeta scaled another highest peak situated in Europe, Mount Elbrus, in Russia.
- ❖ She is a Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) officer.
- CISF is a central paramilitary force working under the command of the Union home ministry.





Sansad television

- ❖ The Vice President of India M Venkaiah Naidu, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla jointly launched Sansad TV.
- ❖ In February 2021, the decision to merge Lok Sabha TV and Rajya Sabha TV was taken.
- ❖ When the Parliament is in session, Sansad TV will have two channels so that the proceedings of both the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha can be aired simultaneously
- ❖ Sansad TV programming will primarily be in four categories functioning of Parliament and democratic institutions, governance and implementation of schemes/policies, history and culture of India and issues/interests/concerns of contemporary nature.
- ❖ The Lok Sabha TV (LSTV) was founded in July 2006.
- ❖ It was the brainchild of former Lok Sabha Speaker Somnath Chatterjee.
- ❖ The Rajya Sabha TV was formed in 2011.



National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) report




- ❖ There was a 28% increase in the registration of cases in 2020 compared to 2019.
- ❖ It is primarily owing to the violations of COVID-19 norms across the country.





- ❖ Crimes against Scheduled Castes showed an increase of 9.4%.
- ❖ There was 8.30% decline in cases of crime against women.
- ❖ The States reporting high charge-sheeting rate under IPC crimes were Gujarat (97.1%), Kerala (94.9%) and Tamil Nadu (91.7%).
- ❖ The cases of sedition declined from 93 in 2019 to 73 last year, with Manipur reporting 15 cases, Assam 12, Karnataka eight, Uttar Pradesh seven, Haryana six, Delhi five and Kashmir two cases.

The Crimes rates in India



- ❖ It was revealed by the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB).
- ❖ Amongst the 19 Metropolitan Cities, cities reporting highest charge-sheeting rate under Indian Penal Code (IPC) Crimes are Surat (96.7%), Coimbatore (96.6%) and Ahmedabad (96.3%).
- ❖ Assam recorded the highest rate of crime against women in the country for the fourth consecutive year.
- ❖ The rate is calculated as the number of crimes recorded per 100,000 population.
- Odisha came at the second place.
- Delhi came at the third place.
- ❖ West Bengal and Odisha registering the highest increase.
- Uttar Pradesh registered the biggest drop
- ❖ Lucknow of Uttar Pradesh occupies the first place in crimes against women in the category of Metro cities at the rate of highest level.





- ❖ In the category of low rate of crime against women, Coimbatore occupies 1st place, Chennai 2nd place and Kerala's Kochi occupies third place.
- All Rajasthan recorded the highest number of rape cases followed by Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra and Assam.
- ❖ Among all crimes against women, the highest number of cases was recorded under "cruelty by husband or relatives" in 2020.
- Uttar Pradesh (31) and Madhya Pradesh (27) recorded the instances of rape-cummurder/gang rape.
- Uttar Pradesh topped in the crime rate for dowry deaths.
- ❖ Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Bihar recorded the highest rate of crimes against the SCs.
- ❖ Among cities, Kanpur and Jaipur registered the highest rate.
- Kerala, Rajasthan and Telangana recorded the highest rate of crimes against the STs.

Sputnik Light



- ❖ The Drug Controller General of India (DCGI) gave its approval to conduct Phase-3 trials of the Sputnik Light COVID-19 vaccine on the Indian population.
- ❖ Sputnik Light is the single-dose COVID-19 vaccine version of Sputnik V.
- * Russia had launched the single-dose Sputnik Light.

Global Buddhist Conference

- ❖ India is set to host the first-ever Global Buddhist Conference in November, 2021 at in Nalanda, Bihar.
- ❖ The academic conference will be organised by Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR).





❖ Four regional conferences in India (Telangana, Sarnath, Gangtok and Dharamshala) and abroad (Japan, South Korea, Thailand and Cambodia) will be organised, in the run-up to the conference.

Shoonya campaign



- ❖ The NITI Aayog, in association with the RMI and RMI India, launched this campaign.
- ❖ The main purpose of the campaign is to eliminate pollution from urban freight sector.
- ❖ It was launched with the aim of accelerating the adoption of electric vehicles (EVs) in urban delivery segment.

iRASTE


- Union Minister for Road Transport, Nitin Gadkari launched 'iRASTE'.
- ❖ It is an Artificial Intelligence-powered project.
- ❖ The project aims to help reduce road accidents, understand the factors responsible for these events and come up with solutions to mitigate them.
- ❖ iRASTE stands for Intelligent Solutions for Road Safety through Technology and Engineering.
- ❖ It has been launched on a pilot basis in Nagpur, Maharashtra.
- ❖ It is launched jointly by the Centre, Intel, INAI, IIIT-Hyderabad, CSIR-CRRI (Central Road Research Institute), Mahindra & Mahindra and Nagpur Municipal Corporation (NMC).







Hybodont sharks



- ❖ These have been reported for the first time from the Jurassic rocks.
- ❖ The Jurassic period refers approximately, between 160 and 168 million-years-old
- ❖ It is found at the Jaisalmer region of Rajasthan by a team of the Geological Survey of India (GSI).
- ❖ Hybodonts, an extinct group of sharks, was a dominant group of fishes in both marine and fluvial environments during the Triassic and early Jurassic time.
- ❖ They finally became extinct at the end of the Cretaceous time 65 million years ago.
- ❖ With this discovery, the genus Strophodus is discovered for the first time in the Indian subcontinent.
- ❖ It is only third such discovery from Asia after Japan and Thailand.





- ❖ The Geological Survey of India (GSI) was set up in 1851 primarily to find coal deposits for the Railways.
- ❖ Headquartered in Kolkata, GSI is an attached office to the Ministry of Mines.

Surya Kiran

- ❖ Exercise Surya Kiran between Indian Army and Nepali Army is commenced at Pithoragarh of Uttarakhand.
- ❖ It is 15th Edition of Indo Nepal Joint Military Training.



World's largest expressway

- ❖ The Delhi-Mumbai Expressway will be the world's largest expressway in India.
- ❖ It will be 1,380-km long and 8-lane wide.
- ❖ It will run through Gujarat, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Haryana, and Delhi.
- ❖ It will be the first expressway that will have wildlife corridors (5 corridors).







Justice delivery at doorstep

- ❖ The Ministry of Law and Justice has launched a Pan-India Special Campaign called "Ek Pahal Drive" for Justice Delivery at doorstep.
- ❖ It was launched by Department of Justice and National Legal Services Authority (NALSA).
- ❖ It is to encourage mass registration under Tele-Law.

Gupta Period Inscriptions

- ❖ The Archaeological Survey of India discovered remains of an ancient temple dating back to the Gupta period in a village in Uttar Pradesh's Etah district.
- ❖ The discovery becomes significant since only 2 other structural temples from the Gupta age have been found so far.
- ❖ They are Dashavatara Temple (Deogarh) and Bhitargaon Temple (Kanpur Dehat).
- ❖ The Guptas were the first to build structural temples, distinctly different from the ancient rock-cut temples.

Reforms in Urban Planning Capacity

- ❖ The NITI Aayog launched a report on measures to ramp up urban planning capacity in India.
- ❖ India is home to 11% of the total global urban population.
- ❖ By 2027, India will surpass China as the most populous country in the world.
- ❖ The report recommends a Central Sector Scheme '500 Healthy Cities Programme', for a period of 5 years.
- Under this priority cities and towns would be selected jointly by the states and local bodies.







NCC Committee

- ❖ The Ministry of Defence has constituted a High-Level Expert Committee, for a comprehensive review of the National Cadet Corps (NCC).
- ❖ Baijayant Panda will be the Chairperson of the Committee.
- ❖ It will also include Cricketer MS Dhoni and Mahindra Group Chairman Anand Mahindra as members.
- ❖ The NCC is the largest uniformed organisation.
- ❖ It aims at developing character, discipline, a secular outlook and ideals of selfless service amongst young citizens.



Rail Kaushal Vikas Yojana

- ❖ It has been launched by the Central Government under the aegis of Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana.
- ❖ Under the programme, entry-level training will be provided to the youth in industry-relevant skills through Railway Training Institutes.
- ❖ Skill training will be provided to 50,000 candidates over a period of three years.








NIELIT

- ❖ The luxury travel offering in the form of the indigenous cruise will take guests on-boards to some of the most popular Indian and international tourist destinations such as Goa, Diu, Kochi, the Lakshadweep islands, and Sri Lanka.



SPIN Scheme

- ❖ The Khadi and Village Industries Commission (KVIC) launched the Strengthening the Potential of India (SPIN) Scheme and set up a pottery cluster under SFURTI Scheme in Varanasi to empower the marginalized potters.
- ❖ SPIN Scheme is a specially-designed no-subsidy program that enables to make potters self-sustainable.
- ❖ It enables the registered potters to get easy direct loans from the banks under Pradhan Mantri Shishu Mudra Yojana.
- Under the SPIN Scheme, KVIC is acting as a facilitator for financial aid to potters through RBL bank and also providing training to the artisans.
- ❖ There will be no financial burden on the exchequer and the loan will be repaid by the potter in easy instalments.

Shining Sikh Youth of India book

- ❖ The Union Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has released a book titled 'Shining Sikh Youth of India' in New Delhi.
- ❖ He released this as a part of the commemoration of the 400th birth anniversary of Guru Tegh Bahadur, the ninth Guru of Sikhs.
- ❖ The book has been authored by Dr Prabhleen Singh, administrative officer at the Punjabi University, Patiala.





❖ It covers 100 inspirational and motivational success stories of Sikh youth in India.



National Snakebite Awareness Summit

- It was recently organised in virtual mode.
- ❖ It was organised by the Integrated Health and Wellbeing Council, New Delhi.
- ❖ The summit was held on the eve of the International Snakebite Awareness Day, observed on 19 September every year.

Snakebite cases in India

- ❖ In the 20-year period from 2000 to 2019, the country recorded 1.2 million snakebite deaths with an average of 58,000 deaths every year.
- ❖ As much as 97 per cent of these deaths happened in villages and more than half of the dead were men in their most productive years.

Blue Flag certification

- ❖ Two more beaches in India have been awarded "Blue Flag" certification.
- ❖ With the addition of two beaches, the total number of such beaches in India have reached to 10.
- ❖ "Blue Flag" certification is an international eco-level tag.
- ❖ The two beaches to receive the certification this year are Kovalam in Tamil Nadu and Eden in Puducherry.
- ❖ The Foundation for Environment Education (FEE), Denmark, accords the Blue Flag certification.
- ❖ The other eight beaches got the Blue Flag certification in 2020.
- ❖ Beaches with Blue Flag certification are considered as the cleanest beaches across the world.







IAS & IPS officers - gifts from Foreign Dignitaries

- ❖ As per the existing rules, these officers were allowed to accept gifts from their near relatives or from personal friends having no official dealings with them, on the occasions like weddings, funerals, anniversaries, and religious functions.
- ❖ However, they are required to make a report to the government if the value of such gift is more than Rs 25,000.

Amended rule

- ❖ A new subsection has been added to the All-India Service (Conduct) Rules, 1968.
- ❖ According to it, a member of the service may receive and retain gifts from foreign dignitaries as per the provisions of the Foreign Contribution (Acceptance or Retention of Gifts or Presentations) Rules, 2012.

R N Ravi resigns as Centre's interlocutor for Naga Peace Talks







- * R N Ravi resigned from the post of the Centre's interlocutor for Naga peace talks after serving for the post since 2014.
- ❖ During his tenure as the interlocutor, Ravi negotiated key insurgent groups for signing the Naga Peace Accord.
- ❖ The Central government had deputed Ravi as Tamil Nadu Governor due to increased disapproval of his ways to handle the Naga Peace process.

Trans fat-free India - 2022







- ❖ India is all set and is on the right track to become industrial trans fat-free by 2022.
- ❖ This is as per Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) study.

Trans fat

- ❖ Trans fat is considered as the worst type of fat.
- ❖ Unlike other dietary fats, trans fat or trans-fatty acids increases bad cholesterol and lowers the good cholesterol.
- ❖ A diet comprising of trans fat increases the risk of heart disease.

SC dismissed Centre's plea to postpone Women's entry into NDA

- ❖ The Supreme Court has rejected a plea by Central Government to postpone the entry of women into National Defence Academy (NDA) till May 2022.
- ❖ It refused to modify August 18 interim order, that allowed women candidates to appear in the NDA and the Naval Academy Examinations and to train at the NDA.

Centre's view

❖ The Centre had told the supreme court that women cadets' entry into the NDA is not possible in the year 2021 because several facilities had to be developed for them before they are allowed into the academy.

Plant Discoveries 2020

- ❖ The Botanical Survey of India, in its new publication Plant Discoveries 2020 has added 267 new taxa/ species to the country's flora.
- ❖ The 267 new discoveries include 119 angiosperms; 3 pteridophytes; 5 bryophytes, 44 lichens; 57 fungi, 21 algae and 18 microbes.
- ❖ There are 14 new macro and 31 new micro fungi species recorded from various parts of India.
- ❖ 22% of the discoveries were made from the Western Ghats followed by the Western Himalayas (15%), the Eastern Himalayas (14%) and the Northeast ranges (12%).

Fortified Rice Kernels

- ❖ Centre government, for the first time issued uniform specifications for Fortified Rice Kernels (FRK) for grade A & Common Rice.
- ❖ The specifications have been issued by the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution.





❖ The fortified rice is to be distributed under various government schemes, including the public distribution system (PDS) and midday meals in schools, by 2024.

Need for Rice fortification

- ❖ According to the Food Ministry, every second woman in the country is anaemic and every third child is stunted.
- ❖ India ranks 94 out of 107 countries and is in the 'serious hunger' category on the Global Hunger Index (GHI).

Note

❖ Food fortification is defined as the practice of adding vitamins and minerals to commonly consumed foods during processing to increase their nutritional value.

Mobile Music Bus

- ❖ Deputy Chief Minister of Delhi Manish Sisodia launched a mobile music classroom and recording studio which aims to assist children of Delhi government schools.
- This helps in pursuing their passion in music.
- ❖ The Delhi government claimed that it is India's first 'Mobile Music Bus'.



3rd Samudra Shakti

- ❖ Samudra Shakti is a bilateral exercise between the navies of India and Indonesia that was conceived in 2018.
- ❖ It is conducted at sunda strait.
- ❖ The exercise aims to strengthen the bilateral relationship, enhance mutual understanding and interoperability in maritime operations between the two navies.







External auditor of the International Atomic Energy Agency




- ❖ India's Comptroller and Auditor General, GC Murmu was selected as the external auditor of the International Atomic Energy Agency.
- ❖ International Atomic Energy Agency is a prestigious institution that promotes the peaceful use of nuclear energy.

National Single Window System

- ❖ The union minister for Commerce and Industry, Piyush Goyal has launched the 'National Single Window System (NSWS)'.

- ❖ The portal has been developed jointly by the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade along with Invest India.





Arjun tank procurement


- ❖ The Ministry of Defence has placed an order to procure 118 Main Battle Tanks (MBTs) Arjun for the Indian Army.

- ❖ Arjun tank has been designed and developed by the Defence Research & Development Organisation (DRDO).

- ❖ The Union education ministry has formed a 12-member committee to develop new curriculums for school, early childhood, teacher and adult education.

- ❖ The unique ID will help in availing all-farm-related services of various agricultural schemes and credit facilities seamlessly.
- ❖ The IDs will also help the central and state government to plan better.

World's highest EV charging station

- ❖ The world's highest electric vehicle charging station has been inaugurated in Kaza.
- ❖ Kaza is in the Lahaul and Spiti district of Himachal Pradesh.
- ❖ Kaza, situated at an elevation of 3650 m above sea level, is the largest township and commercial centre of the Spiti valley.

Rs.50,000 for each COVID-19 death

❖ The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) issued guidelines on exgratia for COVID-19 deaths out of state disaster relief funds.





❖ It recommended that Rs 50,000 should be paid to the kin of those who died of COVID-19.



"Vaccine Maitri" programme


- ❖ India will resume export of surplus COVID-19 vaccines in the fourth quarter of 2021 under the "Vaccine Maitri" programme.
- ❖ This is to meet its commitment to the COVAX global pool.
- ❖ India stopped the export of COVID-19 vaccines after the second wave of the pandemic hit the country in April this year.
- * COVAX is a worldwide initiative aimed at equitable access to COVID-19 vaccines.

India's clean energy commitments at UN summit

- ❖ India has made commitments to increase the renewable energy installed capacity to 450 GW by 2030.
- ❖ India has also committed to develop and implement a National Hydrogen Energy Mission.
- * This is in order to boost the annual green hydrogen production to 1 MT by 2030.
- ❖ It also announced to start a Production Linked Incentive Scheme which will help in adding 10 GW solar PV manufacturing capacity by 2025.
- ❖ India also announced to establish a 15 MMT production capacity of compressed biogas by 2024.
- ❖ It also announced to achieve 20 percent ethanol blending in petrol by the year 2025-26.







MSP for Oilseeds

- ❖ The Union government announced very high Minimum Support Price (MSP) for rabi crops such as oilseeds and pulses to boost their production.
- ❖ The 50% rise in price of edible oils is mainly due to labour shortages and crop failures in major edible oil-producing nations Indonesia, Malaysia, Argentina, etc.
- ❖ So, the government increased MSP for oilseeds to,
 - Cut down India's dependence on foreign oil imports by boosting domestic production, and
 - o Protect Indian consumers from price shocks due to global factors.

National Cooperative Conference

- ❖ Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation, Amit Shah has inaugurated and addressed the first-ever National Cooperative Conference (Sehkarita Sammelan).
- It was inaugurated at the Indira Gandhi Indoor Stadium in New Delhi.
- ❖ This conference was India's first such cooperative conference, to provide a platform for accelerating and strengthening Indian cooperatives on the global stage.
- ❖ The conference was organised jointly by the IFFCO, National Cooperative Federation of India, Amul, Sahakar Bharti, NAFED, KRIBHCO and all cooperatives together.









Right to Government Aid, not a Fundamental Right

- ❖ The Supreme Court said that the right to receive Government Aid of an institution (whether a majority or minority institution) is not a fundamental right, but only a matter of policy.
- ❖ The Supreme Court also said that the grant of aid brings with it conditions that the institution receiving it is bound to comply with.
- ❖ If an institution does not want to accept the conditions, it can decline the grant but cannot say that the grant must be on its own terms.
- ❖ It said if the government made a policy call to withdraw aid, an institution cannot question the decision as a "matter of right".
- ❖ As per Article 30 (2), the state shall not, in granting aid to educational institutions, discriminate against any educational institution on the ground that it is under the management of a minority, whether based on religion or language.

ICMR Report on cancer cases







- ❖ The Indian Council of medical research (ICMR) recently released its report titled "Clinicopathological Profile of Cancers in India: A Report of Hospital Based Cancer Registries, 2021".
- The report provides data on cancer cases in India.
- ❖ It was prepared by ICMR- National Centre for Disease Informatics and Research, Bengaluru.
- ❖ As per report, total of 6.10 lakh cancers have been reported in India in between 2012 to 2019.
- ❖ Out of these, 52.4 percent cases were reported among males while 47.6 percent cases were reported among females.

Cyclone Gulab



- ❖ The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a red alert for Odisha and Andhra Pradesh after the 'Cyclone Gulab' made landfall over Northwest and adjoining West-central Bay of Bengal.
- ❖ The Cyclone Gulab was named by Pakistan.
- ❖ The word "Gulab" refers to Rose in English.

4th Indo-US Health Dialogue

- ❖ The Union Minister of State for Health and Family Welfare Dr Bharati Pravin Pawar has led the Indian delegation at the 4th Indo-US Health Dialogue.
- . It was held in New Delhi.
- ❖ The US delegation for the dialogue is led by Ms Loyce Pace.





❖ The two-day Dialogue is a platform to deliberate upon multiple ongoing collaborations in the health sector between the two countries.

Akash Prime

- ❖ The Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) has tested a new version of Akash Missile called 'Akash Prime'.
- ❖ It was launched from the Integrated Test Range (ITR) of Chandipur, Odisha.
- ❖ Akash Missile is a medium-range mobile surface-to-air missile (SAM) system.
- ❖ Akash Prime is based on the existing Akash SAM.
- ❖ It is equipped with an improved active radio-frequency (RF) seeker.



Swachh Survekshan

- ❖ The Housing and Urban Affairs Minister Hardeep Singh Puri launched the seventh consecutive edition of Swachh Survekshan in New Delhi.
- Swachh Survekshan is the largest urban cleanliness survey of the world.
- ❖ It is conducted by Swachh Bharat Mission-Urban.
- ❖ This programme is designed with "People First" as its driving philosophy.
- ❖ Swachh Survekshan 2022 was launched with the objective of capturing initiatives of cities for welfare and well-being of frontline sanitation workers.





INTERNATIONAL

Talibans against co-education

- ❖ Taliban has banned co-education in Afghanistan by their first fatwa.
- Men are not allowed to teach girls.
- ❖ They call co-education as the root of all evil in society.

G20 Ministerial Conference on Women's Empowerment

- ❖ The First-ever G20 Ministerial Conference on Women's Empowerment was held at Santa Margherita Ligure, Italy.
- ❖ It was held in mixed format i.e., people participated in physical form and via video conference also.
- ❖ The Union Minister of Women & Child Development, Smriti Irani addressed the meet on behalf of India.

Hurricane Ida



- ❖ Hurricane Ida made landfall in Louisiana recently.
- ❖ It is the Category 4 storm that has hit on the same date as the Hurricane Katrina that ravaged Louisiana and Mississippi of America in 2005.
- ❖ Hurricane Ida will most definitely be stronger than Katrina, the costliest storm in American history.





Note

- ❖ Hurricanes are categorized on the Saffir-Simpson Hurricane Wind Scale.
- ❖ It rates them on a scale of 1 to 5 based on wind speed.
- ❖ Hurricanes that reach category three or higher are called 'major hurricanes'.

UNSC adopts resolution (1267) on Afghanistan



- ❖ The United Nations Security Council, under the Presidency of India, adopted a resolution on the situation in Afghanistan.
- ❖ The resolution demanded that Afghanistan is not be used to threaten or attack any nation or shelter terrorists.
- ❖ The Resolution was put forward by the US, UK and France.
- ❖ It was adopted with the votes of 13 Council members in favour.
- ❖ The Permanent members Russia and China abstained from the voting.

FDA Approves First COVID-19 Vaccine







- ❖ U.S. Food and Drug Administration approved the first COVID-19 vaccine.
- ❖ The vaccine has been known as the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine.
- ❖ It will now be marketed as Comirnaty, for the prevention of COVID-19 disease in individuals 16 years of age and older.

8th Meeting of Agricultural Experts of BIMSTEC Countries

- ❖ India hosted the 8th Meeting of Agriculture Experts of Bay of Bengal Initiative for Multi-Sectoral Technical and Economic Cooperation (BIMSTEC).
- ❖ The meeting was chaired by Dr Trilochan Mohapatra.
- ❖ He is the Secretary, Department of Agricultural Research & Education & Director General of ICAR.
- During this meet, Chairman highlighted the UN Food System Summit 2021 and transformational aspects that are happening across agriculture and food systems globally.
- ❖ BIMSTEC comprise of seven Member States including,
 - o Five from South Asia (Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal, Sri Lanka), and
 - o Two from Southeast Asia, including Myanmar and Thailand.
- ❖ BIMSTEC was formed in 1997.
- ❖ It earlier included six sectors.
- ❖ Sectors were later expanded to 14 (technology, trade, energy, agriculture etc.).








Mu Variant

- ❖ Mu Variant of the coronavirus was first identified in Colombia.
- Now, the World Health Organization (WHO) is monitoring this variant.
- ❖ Mu variant is scientifically known as B.1.621 and has been classified as a "variant of interest".
- ❖ According to WHO, variant has constellation of mutations indicating a risk of resistance to vaccines.



New Development Bank - new members



- New Development Bank by BRICS group of nations has added United Arab Emirates, Uruguay and Bangladesh as its new members.
- New Development Bank was launched in 2015.
- ❖ It was launched by the BRICS Members (Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa).
- It was formerly referred as "BRICS development bank".





- It is headquartered in Shanghai.
- ❖ The first regional office of the NDB was set up in Johannesburg, South Africa.
- ❖ The second regional office was established in 2019 in Brazil, followed by in Russia.
- ❖ The bank mobilises resources for infrastructure and sustainable development projects in the member countries as well as in other developing nations.

Protected Areas in Central Africa 2020

- ❖ This report was produced under the Central Africa Forest Observatory which is a specialised unit of Central African Forests Commission.
- ❖ According to the report, Central Africa can develop itself sustainably if the resources are shared equitably and its environment is protected.



First road-rail transport link to Indian Ocean







- ❖ The first shipments on a newly-launched railway line from the Myanmar border to the key commercial hub of Chengdu in western China was made recently.
- This project provides China a new road-rail transportation channel to the Indian Ocean
- ❖ The transport corridor involves a sea-road-rail link.
- ❖ This passage connects the logistics lines of Singapore, Myanmar and China.
- ❖ It is currently the most convenient land and sea channel linking the Indian Ocean with southwest China.

Russia to remain part of ISS

- ❖ NASA Administrator Bill Nelson said that Russia will remain a part of the International Space Station through the end of the decade.
- ❖ The International Space Station (ISS) is a modular space station in low Earth orbit.
- ❖ It is a multinational collaborative project involving five participating space agencies:
 - o NASA (US),
 - Roscosmos (Russia),
 - o ESA (Europe),
 - o CSA (Canada) and
 - o JAXA (Japan).







Note

* Russian space agency, Roscosmos, had announced in February 2015 that it would remain a part of the ISS till 2024.

World Social Protection Report 2020 - 22

- ❖ This report was released by International Labour Organisation (ILO).
- ❖ As per report, more than half of the world population is not getting any form of social protection.
- ❖ People in Europe and Central Asia are among the best covered population.
- ❖ Just one in four children in the world gets a social protection benefit.



Global Leader Approval Tracker Morning Consult

- ❖ According to this US-based consult, approval rating of Prime Minister Narendra Modi was the highest among thirteen world leaders who were surveyed.
- ❖ He is ahead of President of Mexico Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador, Prime Minister of Italy Mario Draghi, German Chancellor Angela Merkel, President of USA Joe Biden, Prime Minister of Australian Scott Morrison, Prime minister of Canada Justin Trudeau, UK Prime Minister Boris Johnson and Prime Minister of Brazil Jair Bolsonaro.





Panjshir Valley

Afghanistan: Panjshir, stronghold of Taliban resistance



- ❖ Panjshir Valley is located to the north of Kabul in Afghanistan.
- ❖ The valley is home for Afghanistan's largest concentration of ethnic Tajiks.
- ❖ Taliban claims to have captured the control of the Panjshir Valley.
- ❖ The fall of Panjshir marks the success of the Taliban and the Pakistan military, and is a setback for India.
- Iran became the first country to protest against the Taliban blockading the valley.

Rashid Rover



- ❖ 'Lake of Dreams,' also known as Lacus Somniorum, is the main site chosen by the United Arab Emirates (UAE) Lunar Mission's team for the landing of the 'Rashid Rover' on the moon's surface.
- ❖ It will be launched between August and November 2022





❖ The UAE is the first in the Arab world and the fourth worldwide in lunar exploration.

UAE's Green Visa



- ❖ The United Arab Emirates has announced a new class of visas.
- ❖ Under the green visa, foreigners will be allowed to work in the UAE without being sponsored by an employer.
- ❖ The program will also allow the holder a grace period of up to three months to look for a new job if they lose their old one.
- ❖ It is intended to ease the restrictions faced by foreigners in pursuing employment opportunities in the country.
- ❖ In 2019, the UAE launched the 10-year "golden visa", aimed at welcoming rich residents and highly skilled workers into the country.
- ❖ Besides UAE, Saudi Arabia and Qatar have recently opened up their countries to wealthy investors.

Inspiration4

- ❖ SpaceX is going to launch 'Inspiration4', the world's 1st all-civilian, non-governmental spaceflight soon.
- ❖ This mission will take 4 private citizens into space in the Crew Dragon spacecraft, which will be privately operated by SpaceX.
- ❖ This mission involves circling the Earth for 3 days at the height of 575km (low Earth orbit), and then splashing down into the Atlantic Ocean.
- ❖ This will be the farthest distance travelled by a crewed mission since 2009, when astronauts went to repair the Hubble telescope (547km).





❖ The journey will present an opportunity for collecting many health data.



India's Sherpa for G20



- ❖ Piyush Goyal, Union Minister for Commerce and Industry, Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, and Textiles has been appointed as India's Sherpa for the G20.
- ❖ Piyush Goyal has replaced Suresh Prabhu as India's Sherpa.
- ❖ The next G20 Summit (2021) will be held in October under the Italian presidency.
- ❖ India will hold the G20 presidency from December 1, 2022, and convene the G20 Leaders' Summit in 2023 for the first time.
- ❖ India will be a part of the G20 Troika (preceding, current, and incoming G20 presidencies) from December 2021, till November 2024.
- ❖ In 2022, Indonesia and in 2024 Brazil will head the G20.







Agreement between India and Portugal

- ❖ The Union Cabinet has approved the signing of an agreement between India and Portugal.
- ❖ It will open doors for Indian migrant workers in a European Union member nation Portugal.

New Cabinet of Afghanistan



- ❖ Taliban in Afghanistan has announced the formation of the new cabinet.
- It is an all-male cabinet.
- ❖ The government will be led by Mullah Hasan Akhund as the 'acting' Prime Minister.





Abdala and Soberana



- Cuba has become the first country in the world to vaccinate children as young as two years old.
- ❖ However, the jabs given to the children are homegrown which has not been recognized by the World Health Organization (WHO).
- Cuba completed clinical trials on minors with its Abdala and Soberana vaccines.
- ❖ The Cuban vaccines, the first developed in Latin America, have not undergone international and scientific peer review.
- ❖ They are based on recombinant protein technology the same used by the United States' Novayax and France's Sanofi.
- ❖ Novavax and Sanofi are also awaiting the WHO approval.
- Unlike many other shots in use, recombinant vaccines do not require extreme refrigeration.

13th BRICS Summit

- ❖ The Prime Minister of India chaired the 13th BRICS Summit virtually.
- ❖ The Indian Chair of BRICS in 2021 also coincides with the 15th anniversary of BRICS.
- ❖ The theme for the 13th BRICS Summit 2021 will be 'BRICS@15: Intra BRICS cooperation for continuity, consolidation, and consensuses.
- ❖ The leaders of the five nations will deliberate on significant regional and global issues, including Afghanistan.
- ❖ This will also be the second time that Prime Minister Modi chairs the BRICS summit after in 2016 Goa Summit.
- ❖ BRICS is the grouping of five major emerging economies: Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa.





❖ In BRICS, originally the first four were grouped as BRIC before South Africa was inducted in 2010.



2021PJ1

- ❖ The Jet Propulsion Laboratory of NASA has marked the 1,000th Near-Earth Asteroid named '2021 PJ1'as it passed Earth.
- ❖ The asteroid was not a threat to Earth but it was a historic event.
- ❖ The Near-Earth Asteroids and comets are collectively referred to Near-Earth Objects (NEOs).
- The first radar observation of the asteroid '1566 lcarus' was conducted in 1968.

Naval exercise with Morocco

- ❖ India which has been at the forefront in developing a Maritime Domain Awareness network in the Indian Ocean Region (IOR) recently conducted bilateral naval exercises with Morocco and Algerian navies.
- ❖ According to the Indian Navy, INS Tabar made a port call at Casablanca in Morocco.
- ❖ Morocco is strategically located in the Maghreb region and is the largest country of Africa.
- ❖ INS Tabar (F44) is the third of the Talwar-class frigate of the Indian Navy.





Qeqertaq Avannarleq

- ❖ It is a tiny, uninhabited and previously unknown island discovered recently off the coast of Greenland.
- ❖ It has now become the new northernmost piece of land on Earth.
- Before this, Oodaaq was marked as the Earth's northernmost terrain.









2021 International Young Eco-Hero award

- ❖ The oldest record of the Antarctic ice currently dates back to about 800,000 years.







ASOSAI

- ❖ The Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) of India, GC Murmu was elected as the chairman of the assembly of the Asian Organization of Supreme Audit Institutions (ASOSAI) for a period of three years from 2024 to 2027.
- ❖ India will host the 16th assembly of ASOSAI in 2024.
- ❖ The ASOSAI is one of the regional groups of the International Organisation of Supreme Audit Institutions (INTOSAI).



Orca - Iceland

- ❖ The world's largest plant designed to capture carbon dioxide out of the air began its operations in Iceland.
- The plant is named Orca.
- ❖ It will suck out up to 4,000 tons of CO2 per year.
- ❖ The carbon dioxide captured directly from the air will be deposited underground at a depth of 1,000 metres, where it would be turned into rock.







Gaofen-5 02

- China successfully launched this new Earth observation satellite.
- ❖ It was launched from the Taiyuan Satellite Launch Centre in north China's Shanxi Province.
- ❖ It is to monitor environmental protection efforts and boost its natural resources surveillance.

13th BRICS Summit

- ❖ Prime Minister of India, Narendra Modi has chaired this summit.
- ❖ PM Modi called for enhanced BRICS cooperation under the motto of 'Build-back Resiliently, Innovatively, Credibly and Sustainably'.
- ❖ The Summit concluded with the adoption of the 'New Delhi Declaration'.
- ❖ This was the third time that India hosted the BRICS Summit.
- ❖ Prior to this India held the Presidency of the BRICS in 2012 and 2016.
- ❖ This is the second time that Prime Minister Modi has chaired the BRICS Summit.
- ❖ He had previously chaired the Goa Summit in 2016.



2+2 Ministerial Dialogue

- ❖ The first-ever 2+2 Ministerial Dialogue between India and Australia started in New Delhi.
- ❖ The Afghanistan crisis will be on the top of the agenda.
- ❖ It is the Ministerial Dialogue between the Foreign and Defence minister of Australia and India.







Tejaus Chauhan

- ❖ He was appointed Regional Director for South Asia in the International Court of Arbitration (ICA) of International Chamber of Commerce (ICC) based in Singapore.
- ❖ Chauhan will be the 2nd Indian to be appointed for the regional director post.
- ❖ The ICC has three regional centres in North Asia, South Asia, and the Middle East.
- ❖ The ICA is the world's leading arbitral institution established in 1923.



England - Electric Vehicle Chargers

- ❖ All the newly built homes and offices will require to feature electric vehicle chargers in England.
- ❖ England is the first country in the world in this regard.

WHO SEARO

- ❖ The Seventy Fourth Regional Committee Session of WHO South-East Asia Regional Office (SEARO) was hosted by Nepal.
- ❖ The session focussed on the elimination of measles and rubella by 2023.






Africa Food Prize 2021

- ❖ The US-India Agenda 2030 Partnership was announced by President Joe Biden and Prime Minister Narendra Modi at the Leaders' Summit on Climate in April 2021.

Dosan Ahn Chang

- ❖ The South Korea successfully test-fired its own submarine-launched missile.
- ❖ It is the locally developed 3,000-tonne class submarine ballistic missile.
- ❖ By launching this South Korea become 8th country.
- ❖ It joined with USA, Russia, China, United Kingdom, France and India.



Iran and IAEA

❖ Iran agreed to allow nuclear surveillance by the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA).







- ❖ Iran has allowed the international inspectors to install new memory cards into surveillance cameras across its sensitive nuclear sites.
- ❖ Iran is now enriching small amounts of uranium to its closest levels to weaponsgrade purity because its stockpile continues to increase.

Groundswell report on climate change



- It was recently released by the World Bank.
- ❖ It examined how the impacts of slow-onset climate change, such as water scarcity, decreasing crop productivity and rising sea levels.
- ❖ These could lead to millions of what it describes as "climate migrants" by 2050.

Third Dose on Covid

- ❖ According to a report published in the Lancet, vaccine efficacy against severe Covid-19 is so high.
- ❖ The booster doses for the general population are "not appropriate" at this stage of the pandemic.
- ❖ The review was provided by the scientists from World Health Organization (WHO) and US Food & Drug Administration (FDA).
- ❖ Countries like Israel, Italy, France and Russia have already rolled out the third dose of Covid-19 vaccines.

Bangladesh - sea level by 2050

- ❖ 17 per cent of Bangladesh could be submerged by the rising sea level by 2050.






- ❖ As per the WEF report, Bangladesh has the 3rd largest number of more than 4 million people who got displaced from their homes during disasters in 2019.


QUAD Meeting

- ❖ The theme of the 2nd India Africa Defence Dialogue will be 'India Africa: Adopting Strategy for Synergizing and Strengthening Defence and Security Cooperation.







SCO Summit



- ❖ The 21st meeting of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) Council of Heads of State will be held in Dushanbe, Tajikistan in a hybrid format.
- ❖ The President of Tajikistan Emomali Rahmon will chair the SCO Summit.
- ❖ This will be the first SCO Summit that will be conducted in a hybrid mode.
- ❖ This is the 4th Summit that India will participate as a full-fledged member of the SCO.
- ❖ The Summits of the SCO Council of Heads of State is held annually at alternating venues.
- ❖ The SCO Summit 2020 was chaired by Russia.


- ❖ The Indian military contingent is participating in the Exercise PEACEFUL MISSION -2021.

- ❖ The Montreal Protocol theme has been selected for the International Day for the Preservation of the Ozone Layer 2021
- ❖ The theme for World Ozone Day 2021 is 'Montreal Protocol- Keeping us, our food, and vaccines cool'.
- ❖ The Montreal Protocol was the first to be ratified by all the 197 countries of the United Nations.

First women head - UNCTAD



- ❖ Rebecca Grynspan will serve as the Secretary-General of UNCTAD (United Nations Conference on Trade and Development) for the period of four years from 2021.
- She became the first woman and Central American to hold such post.
- ❖ She is the former Vice-President of Costa Rica.
- She succeeded Dr. Mukhisa Kituyi.
- ❖ Kituyi was also the first Kenyan to head the UN trade agency from 2013 to 2021.

First all-tourist crew - "Earth circling trip"

- The SpaceX rocket blasted off from NASA's Kennedy Space Centre.
- ❖ This crew included Chris Sembroski, Sian Proctor, Jared Isaacman and Hayley Arceneaux.





- ❖ The crew of the Inspiration4 is now officially in orbit, according to SpaceX.
- ❖ It is the first-ever orbital flight crewed entirely by tourists.
- ❖ The passengers will now spend three days aboard their 13-foot-wide Crew Dragon capsule in orbit at a 350-mile altitude.
- ❖ Dragon capsule is aimed for an altitude of 575 km, beyond the Hubble Space Telescope.

- ❖ The first project of AUKUS will be to help Australia acquire a nuclear-powered conventionally-armed submarine fleet.




CPTPP - China


- ❖ The Indian Nobel Laureate Kailash Satyarthi was appointed as Sustainable Development Goals Advocate by the United Nations


- ❖ Shefali Juneja from India has become the first woman Chairperson of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) Aviation Security Committee.

- ❖ The GII is launched by the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO).
- ❖ WIPO is a specialized agency of the United Nations.
- ❖ The GII aims to capture the multi-dimensional facets of innovation ranking and rich analysis referencing around 132 economies.
- ❖ Switzerland, Sweden, U.S., and U.K. continue to lead the innovation ranking, and have all ranked in the top 5 in the past three years.





❖ The Republic of Korea joins the top 5 of the GII for the first time in 2021.

India's Performance

- ❖ India performs better in innovation outputs than innovation inputs in 2021.
- ❖ This year India ranks 57th in innovation inputs.
- ❖ As for innovation outputs, India ranks 45th.
- ❖ India ranks 2nd among the 34 lower middle-income group economies.
- ❖ India ranks 1st among the 10 economies in Central and Southern Asia.

France recalls ambassadors - AUKUS security pact

- ❖ France is recalling its ambassadors from the United States and Australia over the recent trilateral security pact between US, UK and Australia that involves the building of nuclear-powered submarines.
- ❖ The AUKUS military agreement was signed to counter the military threats in the Indo-Pacific region and it involves the delivery of a nuclear-powered submarine fleet to Australia.
- ❖ The submarines will be built in Australia with the support from UK and the US.

Oldest living identical twins



- ❖ Guinness World Records has certified two Japanese sisters as the "oldest living identical twins" of the world.
- ❖ Twin sisters that have set the Guinness World Records are Umeno Sumiyama and Koume Kodama.
- ❖ Both the sisters are at 107.





Food grain production - India

- ❖ India's food grain production is expected to touch a record of 150.50 million tonne in the Kharif season of 2021 with a better rice output.
- ❖ This is according to the Agriculture Ministry.
- * Record production is expected in rice, sugarcane and cotton.

Charger for electric vehicles

- ❖ The Automotive Research Association of India (ARAI) has developed its indigenous charger for electric vehicles.
- ❖ ARAI has developed indigenous technology for EV charger called AC001.
- ❖ It has been taken up for manufacturing and promotion by the Bharat Electronics.
- ❖ ARAI is also setting up its new centre in Takwe, at Maharashtra.

- ❖ As per the Global Trade Outlook report, the country's position on the list will jump to the fourth position by 2030 with a 3.9 per cent share.

- ❖ The World Health Organization set the new standards in the first update of its air quality guidelines since 2005.
- ❖ PM 2.5 norms for 24 hours average has been changed to 15 micro-g/m³ against 25 micro-g/m³ in 2005.
- ❖ While the PM 2.5 norms for annual average has been changed to 5 micro-g/m³ against the 10 micro-g/m³ in 2005.
- ❖ The revised guidelines for air quality released by the World Health Organisation means that nearly entire India will be considered a polluted Zone for most of the year.





WHO Director-General

- ❖ France and Germany along with other European Union nations have nominated WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus of Ethiopia for a second term at the post.
- ❖ This is the first that a candidate has not been nominated by the home country for the top post at the UN Health Agency.

Agreement on Food Security

- ❖ The United Nations World Food Programme (WFP) and the International Crops Research Institute for the Semi-Arid Tropics (ICRISAT) have signed an agreement on Food security.
- ❖ Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed on programmes and research in order to improve food, nutrition security and livelihoods across India.
- ❖ ICRISAT is headquartered in Patancheru, Hyderabad.
- ❖ WFP is founded in 1961, with headquarter in Rome.

International start-up hubs ranking 2021

- ❖ This ranking was recently compiled and published by Start-up Genome for its annual Global Start-up Ecosystem Report 2021.
- ❖ As per this London, Mumbai and Bangalore have been featured among the world's top start-up hubs.





- ❖ Bangalore has also been ranked at 23rd position.
- Delhi was ranked at 36th.
- Mumbai has been ranked at first position in the Emerging Ecosystems ranking, outperforming the fast-growing ecosystems in areas of performance, funding, talent and market research.
- * Karnataka is also the 4th largest technology and innovation cluster in the world.

World Giving Index 2021

- ❖ Charities Aid Foundation (CAF) published the report recently.
- ❖ India has been ranked at the 14th spot.
- ❖ CAF report notes that, India is one of the fastest climbers on the Index.
- ❖ According to the report,
 - o 61% Indians have helped a stranger during the Covid-19 pandemic in 2020.
 - o 36% of Indians donated money.
 - 34% Indians volunteered for social causes in India.
 - o The most generous country across the world is Indonesia.

❖ The International Astronomical Union (IAU) has named a Lunar crater at the south pole of the moon after the Arctic explorer Matthew Henson.






❖ Matthew Henson was a Black man who was one of the first people who stand at the very top of the world, in 1909.

- ❖ Prime Minister Narendra Modi addressed the 76th session of the United Nations General Assembly in New York.
- ❖ PM Modi is the first world leader who addressed the UN General Assembly.
- ❖ The theme for General Debate for the year 2021 is "Building Resilience through hope to recover from Covid-19, rebuild sustainably, respond to the needs of the planet, respect the rights of people, and revitalize the United Nations".

WHO Ambassador for Global Health Financing







- ❖ The WHO announced the appointment of Gordon Brown as WHO Ambassador for Global Health Financing.
- ❖ He is the former Prime Minister of the United Kingdom.
- ❖ He is widely credited with preventing a second Great Depression through his stewardship of the 2009 London G20 summit.

U.S. rules out adding India, Japan to AUKUS

- U.S. President Joe Biden, Australian Prime Minister Scott Morrison, and British Prime Minister Boris Johnson jointly announced the formation of the trilateral security alliance AUKUS.
- Under this Australia would get a fleet of nuclear-powered submarines for the first time.
- ❖ The United States has ruled out adding India or Japan to the new trilateral security partnership with Australia and Britain to meet the challenges of the 21st century in the strategic Indo-Pacific region.

Same-sex marriage - Switzerland

- ❖ The Voters in Switzerland decided to legalize same-sex marriage.
- * It makes Switzerland one of the last countries in Western Europe to do so.
- ❖ Under the amended law, same-sex couples will be able to have a civil wedding.
- ❖ They will be granted the same institutional and legal rights as heterosexual couples.









India's GDP growth in Q1 FY22








- ❖ According to the data of Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation, economic growth of India accelerated to a record high in the quarter through June 2021.
- ❖ As per data, the Gross domestic product has increased to 20.1% in the three-month period as compared to contraction of 24.4% in the same quarter in 2020.
- ❖ This is India's fastest growth since the quarterly data started being released.
- ❖ This growth is bit lower than the projection of Reserve Bank of India (21.4%).

PayU to acquire BillDesk

- ❖ Netherlands-based Prosus NV has announced to acquire the Indian digital payments provider BillDesk and merge it with its own fintech service business PayU.
- ❖ The size of the deal is \$4.7 billion.
- ❖ This acquisition will make the combined entity of PayU and BillDesk as the leading online payment providers globally and in India by total payment volume.



CBDC Scheme



❖ Central banks in Australia, Singapore, Malaysia and South Africa launched a Central Bank Digital Currencies (CBDC) Scheme recently.






- ❖ CBDC scheme is a cross border payments trial that uses different central bank digital currencies (CBDC) in order to assess if this allows transactions to be settled in a cheap and easy manner.
- CBDCs are digital forms of existing currencies.

Committee on NUE licenses

- ❖ The Reserve Bank of India will set up a committee to scrutinize applications and give recommendations on New Umbrella Entity (NUE) licenses.
- ❖ The 5-member committee will be headed by P. Vasudevan.
- ❖ The committee will be responsible for looking into several aspects of NUE, from the macroeconomic impact of such a step to the security risks.

Note

- ❖ The New umbrella entities will be set up for profit entities that will manage payments in the retail space.
- ❖ The RBI invited companies to create a new Umbrella Entities network that would rival the National Payments Council of India.



Special Drawing Rights - India's quota

- ❖ The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has made an allocation of Special Drawing Rights (SDR) 12.57 billion to India. (approx. USD 17.86 billion).
- ❖ With this, the total SDR holding of India has gone up to SDR 13.66 billion (equivalent to around USD 19.41 billion).
- ❖ SDR is one of the components of the Foreign Exchange Reserves (FER) of India.
- Hence the Foreign Exchange Reserves (FER) has also increased now.





History of SDRs

- Special drawing rights were created by the IMF in 1969 and were intended to be an asset held in foreign exchange reserves under the Bretton Woods system of fixed exchange rates.
- After the collapse of Bretton Woods system in the early 1970s the SDR has taken on a far less important role. Acting as the unit of account for the IMF has been its primary purpose since 1972.
- SDRs were created to the Fund Articles of Agreement in 1969.

Alternate Investment Fund



- ❖ ASK Investment Managers (ASK IM), registered with SEBI, is one of the largest Portfolio Management Service providers in India.
- ❖ It has launched India's First Digital Alternate Investment Fund (AIF).
- ❖ An alternative investment is a financial asset that does not fall into one of the conventional investment categories.
- ❖ Alternative investments include private equity or venture capital, hedge funds, managed futures, art and antiques, commodities, and derivatives contracts.





Digital Payment Scorecard

- ❖ The Bank of Baroda tops in the MeitY (Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology) Digital Payment Scorecard for the month of February and March 2021.
- The scorecard ranks 44 banks (Public Sector Banks, Private Banks, Foreign Banks, Payments Banks, Small Finance Banks) on various parameters on the digital business.

PM-KUSUM scheme

- ❖ Haryana becomes the first state in the country to install solar pumps.
- ❖ Under the scheme, the solar pumps are being installed in the state with 75% subsidy.
- ❖ The pumps can be installed by farmers for irrigation purpose only.

Millet Mission

- Chhattisgarh launches 'Millet Mission' for farmers.
- ❖ The Chief Minister Baghel signed MoUs with the Indian Institute of Millet Research (IIMR), Hyderabad in this regard.
- ❖ This initiative will help the state become India's millet hub.
- ❖ The year 2023 will be celebrated as the International Year of Millet.

PMGDISHA

- The Pradhan Mantri Gramin Digital Saksharta Abhiyan (PMGDISHA) drive for 100% Digital Literacy of all digital villages has been launched under PMGDISHA scheme
- ❖ It is a flagship Digital Literacy scheme of the Government for rural areas.
- ❖ It envisages to make six crore persons in rural areas digitally literate in 2020.
- ❖ It aims to cover one member from every household where there is no digitally literate person
- Under the campaign, a three-day certification drive for rural citizens especially women and disadvantaged communities will be conducted.
- ❖ The Common Service Centre (CSC) is also proposed to make all the Digital Villages 100 percent Digital Literate.







UPI and PayNow



- ❖ India and Singapore have announced the linking of the Unified Payments Interface (UPI) and PayNow.
- ❖ It aims to enable users to make instant, low-cost fund transfers.

States borrowing

- ❖ The Central government has allowed 11 states to borrow an additional fund of Rs 15,721 crore from the market.
- ❖ They achieved the capital expenditure target that finance ministry had set for June quarter the fiscal year 2021-22.
- ❖ Additional open market borrowing permission equivalent to 0.25% of their Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) was granted.
- ❖ Out of total net borrowing ceiling of 4% of GSDP, about 0.50% of GSDP has been kept for incremental capital expenditure to be incurred by states during FY22.
- ❖ These states are Andhra Pradesh, Bihar, Chhattisgarh, Haryana, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Nagaland, Rajasthan and Uttarakhand.

Subsidy on stubble burning

The Central Government has released the amount for four states - Uttar Pradesh, Delhi, Punjab, and Haryana to subsidize the machinery for the issue of stubble morning.





- ❖ It is required for in-situ management of the crop residue during 2021-22.
- ❖ It aims to address the problem of air pollution in Delhi and the National Capital Region (NCR).
- ❖ It is because of stubble burning in the adjoining states of Haryana, Punjab, and Uttar Pradesh.

Digital India Land Records Modernisation Programme (DILRMP)

- ❖ It is a Central Sector scheme by the Department of Land Resources.
- ❖ According to union government, land records have been integrated with the eportal of central government, by most states except three.
- ❖ Three states that have not integrated their digital land records with the nodal procurement agency, Food Corporation of India (FCI) include Assam, Uttarakhand and Jammu & Kashmir.
- ❖ Cross-checking land records before procurement will help in ensuring that the MSP reaches to the farmers and not traders.
- ❖ Crop cultivated by farmers, either in their own land or rented property, will be procured by the government.

Objective of Program (DILRMP)

- To develop a modern, comprehensive and transparent Land Records Management System in the country
- Conclusive land titling system with title guarantee
- Minimize scope of land/property dispute, enhance transparency in the land records maintenance system
- Effective and Efficient on line service deliveries to citizen
- Delivery of RoR and Cadastral maps
- > Registered document

Cohort under Regulatory Sandbox

- ❖ The Reserve Bank of India has announced the theme for the Third Cohort under the Regulatory Sandbox (RS) as 'MSME Lending'.
- * Regulatory Sandbox (RS) refers to live testing of new products or services in a controlled/test regulatory environment for which regulators may (or may not) permit certain regulatory relaxations for the limited purpose of the testing.





- ❖ First Cohort Retail Payments in December 2020.
- ❖ Second Cohort Cross Border Payments in December 2020.

Army Chief's conclave

- ❖ The 8th edition of the Indian Army Chief's Conclave was organised at New Delhi.
- ❖ It is a gathering of serving and former Chiefs of Army Staff of the Indian Army.
- ❖ The invitation was extended to former Chiefs of the Nepali Army, who were also Chiefs of the Indian Army.



Notified Airport

- ❖ The Central Board of Indirect Taxes and Customs (CBIC) has declared Kushi nagar Airport as a Customs notified airport.
- ❖ This would also facilitate international passenger movements including that of Buddhist pilgrims.
- ❖ The Kushi nagar airport is an international airport in the state of Uttar Pradesh.






- ❖ Infosys launched Infosys Equinox to help the enterprises.

Trade and Development report 2021

- ❖ The UNCTAD report has noted that India's GDP growth rate is expected to grow at 7.2% in 2021.
- ❖ With this growth rate, India will be the fastest growing economy after China
- ❖ In 2022, even with a slower growth rate of 6.7%, the country will still be the fastest-growing major economy.



Food delivery under GST







- ❖ E-commerce operators Swiggy & Zomato will come under GST regime.
- ❖ They are now required to pay GST on restaurant service supplied through by them.
- ❖ It is because tax is charged at point of delivery.
- **&** Earlier, restaurants used to pay the tax.

'Doing Business' rankings

- ❖ The World Bank Group has decided to discontinue the publication of its 'Doing Business' rankings of country business climates.
- ❖ In August 2020, the World Bank found a number of irregularities were reported regarding changes to the data.
- ❖ The irregularities in Doing Business reports had affected four countries.
- ❖ They are China; Saudi Arabia; United Arab Emirates; and Azerbaijan.



'Bad bank' setup

- ❖ The government has set up two new entities to acquire stressed assets from banks and then sell them in the market.
- ❖ To make it work, the government has okayed the use of Rs 30,600 crore to be used as a guarantee.
- ❖ The NARCL-IDRCL structure is the new bad bank.
- ❖ The "National Asset Reconstruction Company Limited" (NARCL) has already been incorporated under the Companies Act.
- ❖ It will acquire stressed assets worth about Rs 2 lakh crore from various commercial banks in different phases.
- ❖ Another entity is India Debt Resolution Company Ltd (IDRCL).
- ❖ Bad Bank are set up to resolve the problem of bad loans which are impacting the public sector banks.





Central Government guarantee to back Security Receipts issued by
National Asset Reconstruction Company Limited (NARCL) for acquiring of stressed loan assets



India's 1st Euro Green Bond

- ❖ Power Finance Corporation Ltd (PFC) has issued its first Euro 300 million 7-year Euro Bond.
- ❖ It is the leading Non-Banking Financial Company (NBFC) in power sector of India.
- ❖ It is the first ever Euro denominated green bond issuance from India.
- ❖ It is the first ever Euro issuance by an Indian NBFC.
- ❖ It is also the first Euro bond issuance from India since 2017.
- ❖ Green bond is a fixed-income instrument designed specifically to support specific climate-related or environmental projects.



45th GST council meeting

- ❖ Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman chaired the 45th Meeting of the Goods and Services Tax (GST) Council.
- ❖ This is the first time that a GST Council meeting took place in Lucknow, capital of Uttar Pradesh.





- ❖ It is also the first physical meeting of the GST Council following the outbreak of COVID-19.
- ❖ The GST Council members made it clear that they do not want petroleum products to be included under GST.
- ❖ It has decided to exempt the following life-saving drugs from the GST taxation
- ❖ They are Zolgngelsma and Viltepso (cost around Rs 16 Cr), Drugs to treat muscular atrophy.
- ❖ Transport of export goods by vessels and air is also exempted from GST.



Fastest orbiting asteroid




- ❖ The Astronomers at the Carnegie Institution of Science (CIS) of USA announced that they have discovered the fastest orbiting asteroid ever spotted in the solar system.
- ❖ The fastest orbiting asteroid, 2021 PH27, was detected using the Dark Energy Camera (DEC).
- ❖ It is 1 kilometer in diameter and completes its orbit in just 113 Earth days.

Recombinant protein-based COVID-19 vaccine

- ❖ The Reliance Life Sciences (RLS) will be conducting the trials of its recombinant protein-based COVID-19 vaccine candidate.
- ❖ The recombinant protein COVID-19 vaccine uses the spike protein of SARS-CoV-2 as the antigen.
- ❖ This helps the human body to recognize and develop a strong booster response to fight off the COVID-19 infection.







World's first 'Plant based' Smart Air-Purifier "Ubreathe Life"

- ❖ This product is being developed by Urban Air Laboratory which is a start-up company of IIT Ropar.
- ❖ Product is being claimed as world's first, state-of-the-art 'Smart Bio-Filter', which can make breathing fresh.
- ❖ Technology used in this product is called as 'Urban Munnar Effect' and patentpending "Breathing Roots".
- ❖ IIT Ropar is a designated iHub AWaDH (Agriculture and Water Technology Development Hub) by the Department of Science and Technology of government.








Largest scientific collaboration

- ❖ A worldwide COVID-19 study led by the experts of the UK and conducted at Indian hospitals among others around the world has been awarded the 'Guinness World Records' title for the world's largest scientific collaboration.
- ❖ The study involved over 1,40,000 patients in 116 countries.
- ❖ The record for 'Most authors on a single peer-reviewed academic paper' is now held by the Birmingham and Edinburgh University.
- ❖ This record was awarded after 15,025 scientists around the globe contributed to the major research into the impact of Coronavirus on surgical patients.

IISc and ISRO - Microbial experiments

- Researchers from the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) and Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) have developed device to conduct microbial experiments in outer space.
- * This modular, self-contained device can be used to cultivate microorganisms.
- This in turn will enable scientists to carry out biological experiments even in outer space.
- This study was published in Acta Astronautica.
- * Researchers showed how this device can be used to activate and track the growth of a bacterium called Sporosarcina pasteurii.

Hub for pandemic and epidemic intelligence



❖ The World Health Organization opened a center in Berlin.






- ❖ Here the information can be shared to help prepare the world for the next global health crisis.
- ❖ The center is known as the Hub for Pandemic and Epidemic Intelligence.
- ❖ The initiative aims to track, collect, analyse, and use data from outbreaks, epidemics, and pandemics to better prepare for, predict, and manage them.

Chandrayaan-2

- ❖ Chandrayaan-2 spacecraft has completed 9,000 orbits around the moon.
- ❖ It has detected minor elements of manganese and chromium through remote sensing for the first time from the surface of the moon.
- ❖ The discovery was clearly a surprise as these elements are less than one weight percentage on the moon.
- ❖ The two elements, Chromium and Manganese, were detected at few places during the intense solar flare events.
- ❖ So far, the presence of these elements on the lunar surface was only known through soil samples which were collected during the earlier missions.
- ❖ ISRO Chief K Sivan, also the Secretary of the Department of Space, released the science and the data product documents from the mission.

pgSIT



- ❖ The Researchers from California have developed CRISPR-based system to safely restrain mosquito vectors via sterilization.
- pgSIT is a new scalable genetic control system that uses a CRISPR-based approach to engineer deployable mosquitoes that can suppress populations.
- ❖ It alters genes linked to male fertility creating sterile offspring and female flight in Aedes aegypti.





- ❖ Aedes aegypti, the mosquito species, is responsible for spreading wide-ranging diseases including dengue fever, chikungunya, and Zika.
- * CRISPR technology is basically a gene-editing technology that can be used for the purpose of altering genetic expression or changing the genome of an organism.

Asia's First Hybrid flying car

- ❖ Union Civil Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia reviewed the concept model of Asia's First Hybrid flying car.
- ❖ The Minister said that the flying cars will be used for transporting people and cargo and for medical emergencies as well.
- ❖ It will be a fully autonomous hybrid-electric VTOL vehicle capable of accommodating two passengers.
- ❖ It is being built by Chennai-based Vinata Aero mobility.



Dark energy

- ❖ Recently, an international team of researchers made the first direct detection of dark energy.
- ❖ They noticed certain unexpected results in the XENON1T experiment and write that dark energy may be responsible for it.
- ❖ Dark Energy is a hypothetical form of energy that exerts a negative, repulsive pressure, behaving like the opposite of gravity.
- ❖ XENON1T is the world's most sensitive dark matter experiment.





❖ It was operated deep underground at the INFN Laboratori Nazionali del Gran Sasso in Italy.

Centre on Quantum Technologies

- ❖ The Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Delhi has set up a 'Centre of Excellence (CoE) on Quantum Technologies'.
- ❖ This CoE will bring synergy and coherence in the activities that are being carried out at IIT Delhi.
- ❖ It will also support the principal investigators to pitch in for several significant projects from the DST and other agencies.



ENVIRONMENT

Leaded petrol eradicated

- The use of leaded petrol has been eradicated from the globe as per the observation made by UNEP
- ❖ Achieving of this milestone will prevent more than 1.2 million premature deaths.
- ❖ It will also save world economies over \$2.4 trillion annually.
- ❖ Algeria was the last country to use the fuel.
- ❖ India banned leaded petrol in March 2000.





After nearly a century, the end of leaded petrol

First introduced in 1922, Algeria was the last country to stop using the toxic additive in July 2021. Countries still using leaded petrol in 2002.



Countries still using leaded petrol in 2012




Air Quality Life Index report

- ❖ India is the most polluted country in the world with about 40% of its population living in the Indo-Gangetic plains in the north India.
- ❖ The pollution levels have regularly exceeded there than those found anywhere else in the world.
- ❖ This was stated in the Air Quality Life Index report by the University of Chicago.
- ❖ The report says that the people living in Northern India are on track to lose more than 9 years of life expectancy.
- ❖ It also says that the pollution has now increased so in the states of Madhya Pradesh and Maharashtra.





❖ For example, an average person in these states is losing an additional 2.5 to 2.9 years of life expectancy, relative to early 2000.



Red-Eared Slider Turtle

- ❖ The Red-Eared Slider Turtle has recently been found accidently from the Malankara dam in Idukki.
- ❖ It is a native of the southern U.S. (Mississippi river) and northern Mexico.
- ❖ It is identified as exotic and enlisted in the 100 most invasive species in the world.
- ❖ It is also known to be a carrier of human-infected bacteria such as salmonella.







Erosion of India's coastline

- ❖ As much as 32 per cent of India's coastline underwent sea erosion and 27 per cent of it expanded between 1990 and 2018.
- ❖ This is according to a report published by the National Centre for Coastal Research (NCCR) under the Union Ministry of Earth Sciences.
- ❖ The West Bengal coastline has been particularly vulnerable with 60 per cent of the coastline erosion.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu underwent 41 per cent erosion.
- ❖ Odisha coast expanded by 51 per cent.
- ❖ In Tamil Nadu it is 22 per cent.

Atlas of Mortality and Economic Losses from Weather, Climate and Water Extremes (1970-2019)



- ❖ It was released by the UN's world meteorological organization.
- ❖ The developed nations incurred the bulk of \$3.6 trillion in economic losses because of severe weather events in past five decades.
- ❖ The High death tolls in poorer countries have been partly reduced by better evacuation.
- ❖ Three out of 10 world's costliest disasters occurred in 2017 alone namely hurricanes Harvey (\$96.9bn), Maria (\$69.4bn) and Irma (\$58.2bn).


Sand and Dust Storms Risk Assessment in Asia and the Pacific

- ❖ The findings were published in the Asian and Pacific Centre for the Development of Disaster Information Management (APDIM) report.
- ❖ APDIM is a regional institution of the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP).





- ❖ The report identified 'east and northeast Asia', 'south and southwest Asia', 'central Asia' and the 'Pacific' as the four main sand and dust storm corridors of Asia-Pacific.
- ❖ The region is the second-largest emitter of mineral dust.
- ❖ Sand and dust storms contribute significantly to poor air quality in Karachi, Lahore and Delhi in 'southwest Asia'.
- ❖ Sand and dust storms are a transboundary meteorological hazard.
- ❖ Much of this dust is characterized by high salt content, making it toxic for plants.
- ❖ It reduces yield, posing a significant threat to the production of irrigated cotton and other crops.
- ❖ More than 500 million people in India and more than 80 per cent of the entire populations of Turkmenistan, Pakistan, Uzbekistan, Tajikistan and the Islamic Republic of Iran are exposed to medium and high levels of poor air quality due to sand and dust storms.
- ❖ Very high dust deposition also occurs in the Himalaya-Hindu Kush Mountain range and the Tibetan Plateau.
- ❖ This plateau is called 'third pole' that are the sources for fresh water for more than 1.3 billion people in Asia.







CII National Energy Leader

- ❖ GMR led Delhi International Airport Limited (DIAL) has won the prestigious awards of CII 'National Energy Leader' and 'Excellent Energy Efficient Unit'.
- ❖ GMR Hyderabad International Airport Limited (GHIAL) also clinched the CII 'National Energy Leader' and 'Excellent Energy Efficient Unit'.
- ❖ It was at the 22nd National Award ceremony for 'Excellence in Energy Management'.
- ❖ It was organised by the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) Green Business Centre (GBC) during the 22nd edition of 'Energy Efficiency Summit'.
- ❖ The objective of these awards is to recognize the companies engaged in energyefficiency initiatives that adopt best practices and technological advancement in their daily operations.
- ❖ DIAL is Asia Pacific's first Level 4+ (transition) accredited airport under Airport Council International's Airport Carbon Accreditation (ACA) programme.
- ❖ Hyderabad International Airport is also a carbon neutral airport having Level 3 + "Neutrality" accreditation.




Latest Red List of Threatened Species

- ❖ The International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) has released this report.
- ❖ Some 902 species are officially extinct according to the latest Red List
- ❖ The Red List also shows that 30 per cent of the species (38,543) that it assessed (138,374) face the threat of extinction.





- ❖ Some 80 species are extinct in the wild, 8,404 are critically endangered, 14,647 are endangered, 15,492 are vulnerable and 8,127 are near threatened.
- ❖ The Atlantic bluefin tuna moved from endangered to least concern.
- ❖ The Southern bluefin tuna moved from critically endangered to endangered.
- ❖ The world's largest living lizard, the Komodo dragon has been moved from vulnerable to endangered.
- ❖ The species is endemic to Indonesia and occurs only in the World Heritage-listed Komodo National Park.



Pollen Calendar

- Chandigarh gets its first pollen calendar.
- ❖ Pollen calendars are graphical representations of the time dynamics of airborne pollen taxa in a certain geographic area.
- ❖ Pollens are considered major outdoor airborne allergens responsible for allergic rhinitis, asthma and atopic dermatitis in humans.

Sharks' status

- ❖ According to a new red list by IUCN, world's sharks and rays have been witnessing declines in their populations since 2014.
- * Sharks are now threatened with extinction.





❖ About 37% of sharks and rays across the world are considered endangered as of 2021.

Slender Gecko in Goa




- ❖ A tiny slender gecko, Hemiphyllodactylus goaensis, has been described by researchers as a new species from Goa and the northern Western Ghat region.
- ❖ It was published in Zootaxa "A new species of the genus Hemiphyllodactylus Bleeker, 1860," a zoological journal.
- ❖ The Goan slender gecko is one of the smallest of the species in India.
- ❖ It is hardly 32mm in size that can sit on the human thumb.
- ❖ Hemiphyllodactylus goaensis is only the eight Indian species of the genus and 44th globally.
- This is also the first species of animal described from Goa University.

Largest Open-Air Fernery

- ❖ India's largest open-air fernery has been inaugurated in Ranikhet of Uttarakhand.
- ❖ It is the country's first open-air fernery in natural surroundings which is not under any poly-house/ shade house.
- ❖ The fernery has the largest collection of fern species, second to only Jawaharlal Nehru Tropical Botanical Garden and Research Institute (TBGRI), Thiruvananthapuram.
- ❖ It has been developed under Central Government's Compensatory Afforestation Management Funds Management and Planning Authority (CAMPA) scheme.







India's first plant to capture CO2



- ❖ Tata Steel has commissioned India's first carbon capture plant.
- ❖ It extracts CO2 directly from the blast furnace gas, at its Jamshedpur Works.
- ❖ With this achievement, Tata Steel has become the country's first steel company to adopt such a carbon capture technology.
- ❖ The plant can capture 5 tonnes of CO2 per day (5 tonne per day TPD).
- ❖ This project has been executed with technological support from Carbon Clean, a global leader in low-cost CO2 capture technology.






Mura-Drava-Danube

- ❖ Recently, Mura-Drava-Danube (MDD) was declared as the world's first 'five-country biosphere reserve' by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).
- ❖ The biosphere reserve covers 700 kilometres of the Mura, Drava and Danube rivers.
- ❖ It stretches across Austria, Slovenia, Croatia, Hungary and Serbia.

Biosphere Reserves in India

- ❖ Presently, there are 18 Biosphere Reserves in India.
- ❖ 12 Biosphere reserves in India find their place in UNESCO's List of Man & Biosphere Reserves Programme.
- ❖ The latest included under the MAB was 'Panna Biosphere Reserve' (Madhya Pradesh).



Black Carbon emission - IMO

- ❖ With Arctic summer ice reaching its 12th lowest ever extent, the Clean Arctic Alliance has called for urgent cuts to black carbon emissions from shipping.
- ❖ This is planned ahead of the 77th Marine Environment Protection Committee meeting (MEPC 77) at the International Maritime Organization (IMO) in November.








Climate Indicators and Sustainable Development Report

- ❖ The World Meteorological Organization (WMO) has published a new report.
- ❖ It is titled "Climate Indicators and Sustainable Development: Demonstrating the Interconnections".
- ❖ WMO published its report with the aim of demonstrating the connections between global climate and SDGs.
- ❖ It also seeks to limit global warming to less than 2 °C or even 1.5 °C by the end of the current century.







UNESCO 33rd session

- The 33rd session of the International Co-ordinating Council of the UNESCO's MAB (Man and the Biosphere) Programme was held in a hybrid format in Abuja, Nigeria.
- ❖ This was the first time that it was held in the African continent.
- ❖ 20 new sites in 21 countries were added to the World Network of Biosphere Reserves (BRs).
- ❖ This made Biosphere Reserves reach a total number of 727 Biosphere in 131 countries.
- ❖ The sites from Lesotho (Matseng BR), Libya (Ashaafean BR), and Saudi Arabia (Juzur Farasan BR) are designated for the first time.
- ❖ UNESCO's BRs now cover more than 5% of the Earth's landmass.




Climate Change 2021: The Physical Science Basis report

- ❖ Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change recently published this report
- ❖ The report calls for clear climate action.
- ❖ It illustrated the following scenarios,
 - Very low and low GHG emissions Here, emissions decline to net zero around the middle of the century. Beyond this, emissions are net negative.





- o Intermediate GHG emissions Emissions are double the current level by 2100.
- \circ High and very high emissions Here, emissions are double the current levels by 2050.
- ❖ The average global temperature is currently 1.09°C higher than pre-industrial levels.
- ❖ The CO2 concentration in the atmosphere is 410 ppm as compared to 285 ppm in 1850.

- ❖ The Copernicus Marine Environmental Monitoring Service has released the 5th edition of the Ocean State Report (OSR 5).
- ❖ The report has said that the global ocean is undergoing severe changes from natural variations, over-exploitation and anthropogenic influences.
- ❖ These changes caused the sea level to rise by 3.1 millimeters each year on an average between January 1993 and May 2020.
- ❖ The report showed that the sea ice is steadily decreasing in the Arctic.

United in Science 2021 - WMO

- ❖ Recently, the World Meteorological Organization (WMO) released a report named United in Science 2021.
- ❖ It is a multi-organization high-level compilation of the latest climate science information.
- ❖ The report is coordinated by the WMO.
- ❖ It had got inputs from the United Nations Environment Programme, World Health Organization, Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, Global Carbon Project, World Climate Research Programme and the Met Office (UK).







STATES

Airforce Heritage Centre

- ❖ The Chandigarh Administration and Indian Air Force on Friday signed an Agreed in Principle (AIP) for setting up of "Airforce Heritage Centre" at Chandigarh.
- ❖ This is the first such Air force Heritage Centre in the country.
- ❖ The Air Force Heritage Centre will bring awareness in the region particularly among the students about the role and contribution of the Indian Air Force in national security and defence.



World class science city - Maharashtra

- ❖ The Maharashtra Government has decided to set up a world-class science city at Pimpri-Chinchwad near Pune.
- ❖ This is to develop a scientific outlook among the students and prepare them to become students in future.
- This is to be named as 'Bharat Ratna Rajiv Gandhi Science Innovation City'.

United Nations World Geospatial Information Congress

* Recently, it was announced that the second United Nations World Geospatial Information Congress (UNWGIC) will be held in Telangana, Hyderabad in 2022.





- ❖ The event would show a glimpse of India's evolving geospatial ecosystem.
- ❖ It is organised by United Nation Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management (UN-GGIM).
- It is conducted every four years.
- ❖ The first UNWGIC was organized by China in October 2018.
- ❖ Theme of Second UNWGIC is 'Geo-enabling the Global Village'.



Most Linguistically Diverse



❖ Bengaluru is the top district in India where the greatest number of languages are spoken.





- ❖ With 107 languages, Bengaluru has a diverse set of languages spoken in the district including 22 scheduled and 84 non-scheduled languages.
- ❖ In Bengaluru, 44.5 per cent of people speak Kannada, 15 per cent Tamil, 14 per cent Telugu, 12 per cent Urdu, 6 per cent Hindi and 3 per cent Malayalam.
- ❖ The other districts where more than 100 languages are spoken is Dimapur in Nagaland with 103 languages and Sonitpur in Assam with 101 languages.
- ❖ The least diverse districts included Yanam in Puducherry, Kaimur in Bihar, Kaushambi and Kanpur Dehat in Uttar Pradesh and Ariyalur in Tamil Nadu.
- ❖ In these districts, less than 20 languages were spoken.
- ❖ The data did not include dialects, but only scheduled and non-scheduled languages.

Online Game in Karnataka

- ❖ The Karnataka Cabinet decided to ban online gambling or betting in the state by amending the Karnataka Police Act, 1963.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Telangana and Kerala have already banned online rummy game.
- ❖ But the Madras High Court in august 2021 struck down a recent amendment (2020) made to the Tamil Nadu Gaming Act of 1930.

Karbi Anglong Peace Accord

- ❖ It was signed between the government of India, government of Assam and six factions of the Karbi.
- ❖ As per the accord, the armed groups shall shun their path of violence within one month of the date of signing of this Accord.
- ❖ The Government of Assam will consider favorably a proposal of Karbi Anglong Autonomous Council (KAAC) to notify Karbi as official language of KAAC.
- * English, Hindi and Assamese will continue to be used as official languages.

Vatan prem Yohana

- ❖ It is a repackaged version of Madar-e-Vatan scheme by the government of Gujarat.
- ❖ Madar-e-Vatan has been renamed due to association of the title with Persian language.
- It is the biggest campaign for public participation in developmental works.





❖ Under the scheme, Non-Resident Gujaratis (NRGs) and NRIs can contribute 60 percent of the cost of a village-level project.

Chhattisgarh domicile certificate

- ❖ Chhattisgarh has decided to issue the domicile certificate.
- ❖ It is an official document issued by the State Government of Chhattisgarh.
- ❖ It serves as proof of a person residing in a particular state.
- ❖ It will be issued to the students studying outside the state.

Model Tenancy Act

- ❖ Assam has become the first state to adopt this Act.
- ❖ With this Assam Urban Areas Rent Control Act, 1972 gets repealed.

State fish - Sikkim



- ❖ The Government of Sikkim has declared 'Cooper Mahseer' locally named as 'Katley' as the state fish.
- Neolissochilus hexagonolepis is the scientific name of the Cooper Mahseer.
- ❖ The decision has been taken to highlight the importance of the Katley fish and to give emphasis to its conservation measures.
- ❖ The fish has high market value and is highly preferred by the public in the State.
- ❖ The Sikkim government has also declared the reservoirs of the State to be open for fishing activities.
- ❖ The reservoirs are in Chungthang in North Sikkim, Legshep in West Sikkim along with Dikchu and Rorathang in East Sikkim.





Hathei chilli and Tamenglong mandarin orange

- ❖ Two famous products of Manipur, Hathei chilli, which is found in Manipur's Ukrul district and is known for its unique flavour, and Tamenglong mandarin orange have been granted the Geographical Indication (GI) tag.
- ❖ The Hathei chilly works as a good anti-oxidant and possesses high calcium and Vitamin C levels.
- ❖ It has an extremely high American Spice Trade Association (ASTA) colour value of 164.
- ❖ The extractable colour of chilli is usually expressed using ASTA values.
- ❖ The Tamenglong mandarin orange is bigger in size.
- ❖ It is a unique sweet and sour flavour.
- ❖ It has high juice content (around 45 per cent) and is rich in ascorbic acid (48.12 mg/100ml).



The new Punjab Chief Minister







- ❖ Charanjit Singh Channi is appointed as the new Punjab Chief Minister.
- ❖ The Minister of Technical Educational & industrial Training in the Punjab government is now appointed as the new Punjab Chief Minister.
- ❖ He was appointed as the Chief minister after Captain Amarinder Singh resigned from the post.
- ❖ This is the first time ever that Punjab has got a chief minister from a scheduled caste community.

United Democratic Alliance government - Nagaland

- ❖ All the ruling and opposition political parties in Nagaland finalized the formation of an opposition-less government.
- ❖ That will be called the United Democratic Alliance (UDA) government.
- ❖ This is the second time that Nagaland will have an all-party government (opposition-less govt).
- ❖ In 2015, Congress MLAs merged with the ruling NPF-led Democratic Alliance of Nagaland (DAN).
- ❖ However, in 2021, the UDA government has been formed as a coalition without any merging.

Rajasthan Compulsory Registration of Marriages (Amendment) Bill, 2021

- ❖ CM Ashok Gehlot's government passed the Rajasthan Compulsory Registration of Marriages (Amendment) Bill, 2021 by voice vote to amend a 2009 Act.
- * Rajasthan's new marriage bill says that the bride and groom can apply for registration of marriage to the marriage registration officer of the place where they have been residing for more than 30 days.






❖ The marriage between the bridegroom who has not completed 21 years and the bride who has not completed 18 years of age could be registered by the parents or guardians within the 30 days of the marriage.

Bill banning online games - Karnataka

- ❖ Karnataka Assembly has passed an amendment to the Karnataka Police Act, 1963.
- ❖ This seeks to ban online gaming and curtail online gambling.
- ❖ The proposal is not valid for online games that strictly comply with "game of skills".
- It bans only the 'games of chance'.

Nagaland's sweet cucumber



- ❖ Nagaland's "sweet cucumber" was awarded a geographical identification (GI) tag.

- ❖ Nagaland has the fifth-highest cultivation of this fruit area-wise and ranks third in production.
- With respect to the state, regional variants of tree tomato (tamarillo) and the famed Naga king chilli are also GI tagged.





GI tag for Assam's Rice Wine Judima

- ❖ Judima has become the first beverage from the north-eastern region to earn the geographical indication (GI) tag.
- ❖ Judima is a rice wine made from sticky rice, which is steamed and mixed with traditional herbs.
- ❖ The wine is brewed by the Dimasa tribal community in Assam.
- It is traditionally made by women.
- ❖ The wine has a distinct sweet taste.
- ❖ It takes around one week to prepare and it can be stored for years.

Dr Basant Kumar Misra

- ❖ Odisha-born neurosurgeon Dr Basant Kumar Misra has been conferred the prestigious American Association of Neurological Surgeons' 'International Lifetime Achievement Award in Neurosurgery'.
- ❖ Misra is the first Indian physician to receive the AANS honor.
- ❖ He was the world's first surgeon to perform Computer-Guided Aneurysm surgery.
- ❖ He is also the recipient of the most prestigious Dr BC Roy National Award in the category of 'Eminent Medical Person' (Highest Medical Award in India) in 2018.







Ramon Magsaysay Award

- ❖ Ramon Magsaysay Award 2021 awardees have been announced
- ❖ The winners will be formally awarded the Magsaysay Award at the Ramon Magsaysay Centre in Manila.
- ❖ Awardees are,
 - o Vaccine pioneer Dr Firdousi Qadri of Bangladesh,
 - o Muhammad Amjad Saqib of Pakistan,
 - o Philippine fisheries and community environmentalist Roberto Ballon,

- ❖ It was established in April 1957.
- ❖ It is widely regarded as the equivalent of the Nobel Prize in Asia.
- ❖ The award is presented to individuals who have made extraordinary contributions in eradication of poverty and development of the society in Asia.







Dorje Angchuk

- ❖ Dorje Angchuk has been admitted as an Honorary Member of the International Astronomical Union.
- ❖ He is an Engineer in charge at the Indian Astronomical Observatory of the Indian Institute of Astrophysics at Hanle in the Ladakh region.
- ❖ Angchuk is the first and only Indian to bag the position in the prestigious body.



Global award for turtle conservation

- ❖ The Indian biologist Shailendra Singh has been awarded the Behler Turtle Conservation Award.

- The species are,

- ❖ There are 29 species of freshwater turtles and tortoises in the country.

- ❖ He has won for capturing a photograph of a greater roadrunner staring up at the barbed-wire-clad border wall between the USA and Mexico.




Yamin Hazarika Woman of Substance Award

- It hunts for 30 meritorious students from among economically backward sections of the society and shapes them to clear the test to get into the prestigious Indian Institutes of Technology (IIT).


National Florence Nightingale Award 2021

Nishad Kumar - silver

- ❖ India's Nishad Kumar has clinched a silver medal in the men's high jump T47 event at the Tokyo Paralympics 2020.

- ❖ He finished behind Great Britain's Jonathan Broom-Edwards, who managed to jump 2.10 m.

- ❖ They also hold the record of smashing six-sixes in international cricket.




Asian Games 2022

- ❖ Harmilan Kaur Bains of Punjab has created a new national record in the women's 1500m race.
- ❖ She clocked 4:05.39 to bag the gold at the 60th National Open Athletics Championships in the Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium in Hanamkonda in Telangana.
- ❖ With this achievement, the 23-year-old athlete has erased the 19-year-old record held by Sunita Rani in 1500m at the 2002 Asian Games in Busan by clocking 4:06.03.

- ❖ India's Pankaj Advani won the Asian Snooker Championship 2021 by defeating Amir Sarkhosh.

- ❖ India's Teacher's Day Celebration is one month ahead of World Teachers' Day, which is on October 5.








International Day of Clean Air for Blue Skies - September 07



- ❖ Designated in 1996, this Day is promoted by the World Physiotherapy.
- ❖ This year's theme will the same theme of last year (Rehabilitation and Long Covid-19).

International Day to Protect Education from Attack - 9 September

- ❖ It is an international observance established by a unanimous decision of the United Nations General Assembly in 2020.
- ❖ The resolution proclaiming the Day was presented by Qatar.
- ❖ UNESCO and UNICEF will facilitate the annual observance of the Day in close collaboration with partners within and outside the UN system.







World Suicide Prevention Day – 10 September

- ❖ In 2003 at Stockholm of Sweden, the International Association for Suicide Prevention teamed up with the World Health Organization (WHO) to create a for this.
- ❖ For 2021, the theme for this day is "creating hope through action."




National Forest Martyrs Day - 11 September

- ❖ It is observed to commemorate the Khejarli massacre, which took place on September 11 in 1730.
- Over 360 Bishnoi tribe members led by Amrita Devi protested the destruction of trees.
- ❖ During the reign of Maharaja Abhay Singh in Rajasthan, it was ordered to cut down the Khejarli trees.
- ❖ In 2013, the Ministry of Environment and Forest announced officially announced the observation of this day.





- Moreover, the Chipko Movement was also inspired by this brave act of the people of Bishnoi community.
- ❖ The Chipko movement originated in the Himalayan region of Uttarakhand (then part of Uttar Pradesh) in 1973.
- ❖ The Gandhian social activist Chandi Prasad Bhatt led the first Chipko movement at Mandal village.
- ❖ Later this Movement gained traction under Sunder Lal Bahuguna, an ecoactivist.
- ❖ Bahuguna is best remembered for the slogan "ecology is the permanent economy".



International Day for South-South Cooperation – September 12

- ❖ The day celebrates the economic, social and political developments made in recent years by regions and countries in the south.
- ❖ The history of the South-South cooperation begins in 1949 with the establishment of the UN technical aid programme by the Economic and Social Council and the creation of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) in 1969.

International Programmers' Day - September 13

❖ It celebrates the positive changes that programmers make to improve our everyday lives.





- ❖ It is celebrated on the 256th day of each year on September 13, or on September 12 in leap years.
- ❖ 256 is also the highest power of two (28) that is less than 365.

Himalaya Day - 9 September

- ❖ It is celebrated every year in the state of Uttarakhand.
- ❖ The National Mission for Clean Ganga organised Himalaya Diwas in collaboration with Naula Foundation, as a part of 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav'.
- ❖ It was observed under the theme 'Contribution of Himalayas and our responsibilities'.

World Electric Vehicle Day - 9 September

- ❖ The day marks the celebration of e-mobility.
- ❖ It was an initiative created by the sustainability media company Green TV.
- ❖ The first World EV day was observed in 2020.
- China is the largest EV market in the world.
- ❖ Japan based Suzuki also declared to launch its first EV in India.
- ❖ Currently, the automotive industry of India is the fifth largest worldwide and is set to become third largest by 2030.

World First Aid Day – 11 September

- ❖ It is observed on the second Saturday of September.
- ❖ It is observed by the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC).
- ❖ The theme of this year is "First aid and road safety".

Hindi Day - 14 September

- ❖ It is celebrated every year marking the declaration of Hindi language in Devanagari script as one of the two official language of Union government of India.
- ❖ Hindi, along with English, are the official languages of India under Article 343 of the Constitution.
- ❖ The first Hindi Diwas was celebrated in 1953.
- ❖ World Hindi Day is celebrated on January 10.





- ❖ On 14 September 1949, Hindi was adapted as official language in India.
- ❖ The 14th September 1949 was the 50th birthday of Beohar Rajendra Simha.
- ❖ Beohar Rajendra Simha, along with Hazari Prasad Dwivedi, Kaka Kalelkar, Maithili Sharan Gupta and Seth Govind Das, debated tirelessly in the Constituent Assembly and worked hard towards making Hindi the official language of India.
- ❖ Hindi belongs to the Indo-Aryan branch of the Indo-European family of languages.
- ❖ The word "Hindi" is Persian in origin.
- ❖ The first ever 'Hindi' poem was written by the eminent Persian poet Amir Khusro.
- ❖ In 1977, Atal Bihari Vajpayee, the first External Affairs minister addressed the United Nations General Assembly for the first time in Hindi.
- ❖ In 1918, Mahatma Gandhi for the first time talked about making Hindi as the national language of India.

International Day of Democracy – 15 September

- ❖ In 2007, the United Nations passed a resolution in this regard.
- ❖ Qatar led efforts to promote an International Day of Democracy
- ❖ The Universal Declaration on Democracy was adopted on September 15, 1997 by the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU).
- ❖ It is an international organisation of national parliaments.
- ❖ In 2021, United Nations has called for strengthening democratic resilience in the face of a future crisis.


Engineers Day - 15 September

- ❖ It is celebrated to pay tribute to India's finest engineer Mokshagundam Visvesvaraya.
- Visvesvaraya was the Chief Engineer of Krishna Raja Sagara dam in the Mysuru city.

- ❖ The theme for this day is 'Engineering for A Healthy Planet- Celebrating the UNESCO Engineering Report'.






- ❖ In 1968, the Indian government declared Visvesvaraya's birth anniversary as Engineers' Day.

International Day for the Preservation of the Ozone Layer - 16 September







- ❖ It was designated by the United Nations General Assembly in 1994.
- ❖ It is in commemoration of the date in 1987 on which nations signed the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer.
- ❖ The closure of the hole in the ozone layer was observed 30 years after the protocol was signed

World Patient Safety Day - 17 September

- ❖ It aims to raise global awareness about patient safety and call for solidarity and united action by all countries and international partners to reduce patient harm.
- ❖ This year's campaign slogan by the World Health Organization is "Act now for safe and respectful childbirth!".
- ❖ The theme for this year is "Safe maternal and new born care".
- ❖ It was established in 2019 when the 72nd World Health Assembly adopted resolution.

World Lymphoma Awareness Day - 15 September

- ❖ The day is dedicated to raising awareness about lymphoma.
- ❖ It was initiated in 2002 by the Lymphoma Coalition.

International Equal Pay Day - 18 September

- Under an initiative of the United Nations, it is observed
- The world observed its first-ever International Equal Pay Day in 2020.
- ❖ It aims to highlight the importance of ending sexual discrimination in relation to gender pay gap.
- ❖ It refers to the difference in earnings between men and women in paid employment.

World Water Monitoring Day - 18 September


- ❖ It is an international effort aimed to increase public awareness and involvement in water monitoring and protecting water resources around the world.

International Day of University Sport - 20 September


- ❖ The International University Sports Federation (FISU) proposed to UNESCO to internationally recognize a day dedicated to university sport in 2015.

57th Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) day - 15 September


- ❖ It was established in 1964 by the External Affairs Ministry

- * There is no cure for Alzheimer's disease.

- ❖ It will launch the World Alzheimer Report entitled the 'Journey through the diagnosis of dementia'.

Zero Emissions Day - 21 September

- ❖ It is to help reduce carbon emissions from the atmosphere.
- ❖ It is to move towards renewable energies instead of fossil ones.
- ❖ The theme for 2021 is "Giving our planet a day off a year".

International Snakebite Awareness Day - September 19

 - Sumatran Rhino and
 - o Javan Rhinos.
- ❖ World Rhino Day was first announced by World Wildlife Fund-South Africa in 2010.
- ❖ It is being observed internationally since 2011.





Autumn Equinox 2021 - September 23








- ❖ The Autumn Equinox can occur any time between September 21 and September 24.

- ❖ The day was designated in 2009.


Antyodaya Diwas - September 25

- ❖ In India, the National Maritime Day is celebrated on April 5 every year.




International Translation Day - 30 September
