TNPSC BITS

- ❖ Dr. V. Mohan has received the inaugural Diabetes Global Impact Prize 2025 from the European Association for the Study of Diabetes, recognizing his lifelong contributions to diabetes care and research.
- ❖ The Prime Minister laid the foundation stone of India's first Pradhan Mantri Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel (PM MITRA) Park in Dhar district, Madhya Pradesh.

TAMIL NADU NEWS

Tamil Nadu State Highways Authority



- ❖ Tamil Nadu Chief Minister inaugurated the Tamil Nadu State Highways Authority (TANSHA) on September 19, 2025, in Chennai.
- ❖ The Chief Minister also released the official logo of the authority.
- ❖ The State government established TANSHA in the year 2024.






❖ TANSHA will implement major road infrastructure projects in Tamil Nadu, including four-lane corridors and expressways, through a public-private partnership.

Deep-Sea Exploration at Poompuhar

- ❖ The Tamil Nadu State Department of Archaeology launched underwater archaeological explorations off the coast of Poompuhar.
- ❖ The exploration began on September 19, 2025, after a gap of more than two decades.
- ❖ The project is being carried out in collaboration with the Indian Maritime University.
- ❖ Poompuhar, also known as Kaveripoompattinam, is located in the Mayiladuthurai district.
- ❖ The survey involves advanced equipment such as side-scan sonar, echo sounders, ROV (remotely operated vehicle), and sub-bottom profilers.



NATIONAL NEWS

Section 498A Cases

❖ The Supreme Court upheld the Allahabad High Court's 2022 guidelines introducing a two-month 'cooling period' in Section 498A cases.





- ❖ During this cooling period, no coercive action can be taken, and the matter is referred to a Family Welfare Committee (FWC).
- ❖ The ruling came in the case Shivangi Bansal vs Sahib Bansal, decided on July 22, 2025.
- Critics say the cooling period delays justice and undermines the autonomy of criminal justice agencies.
- ❖ Section 498A was originally enacted to address cruelty against women in matrimonial settings.
- ❖ The courts have previously introduced checks like preliminary enquiry, arrest guidelines (Arnesh Kumar, 2014), and bail safeguards (Satender Kumar Antil, 2022).
- ❖ A similar FWC model in Rajesh Sharma (2017) was overturned by a three-judge Bench in Social Action Forum for Manay Adhikar (2018).




Revised EVM Ballot Design

- ❖ The Election Commission of India (ECI) revised guidelines for EVM ballot papers under Rule 49B of the Conduct of Elections Rules, 1961.
- ❖ Coloured photographs of candidates will now be printed on EVM ballot papers to improve identification.
- ❖ Serial numbers of candidates and the None of the Above (NOTA) option will be printed in the international form of Indian numerals.
- * These serial numbers will use a bold font with a size for better clarity.





- ❖ Names of candidates and NOTA will be printed in uniform font type and size for easy readability.
- ❖ EVM ballot papers will be printed with pink colour specified for assembly elections based on defined RGB values.



Seva Parv 2025 - Key Highlights



❖ Seva Parv 2025 was launched by the BJP on September 17, 2025, to mark Prime Minister Narendra Modi's 75th birthday.





- ❖ The 15-day digital volunteering campaign is hosted on the NaMo App and runs until October 2, 2025.
- ❖ The initiative is based on the theme "Seva he sankalp, rashtra pratham he prerna".

INTERNATIONAL NEWS

Genocide in Gaza



- ❖ The UN Commission of Inquiry, after a multi-year investigation, concluded that Israeli authorities have committed genocide in Gaza.
- ❖ It is also confirming long-standing allegations by human rights organizations and genocide scholars.
- ❖ The Commission found "reasonable grounds" for four of five genocidal acts:
 - o Killing members of a community,
 - o Causing serious bodily and mental harm,
 - Actions aimed at destroying the group, and
 - o Preventing births.
- ❖ The UN panel held Israeli authorities at the highest levels responsible for orchestrating a genocidal campaign against Palestinians in Gaza.





❖ Israel, founded by survivors of the Holocaust, now faces global isolation due to its actions, continuing ground offensives, and disregard for international law.

ECONOMY NEWS

Regulatory Review Cell

- * RBI establishes a Regulatory Review Cell (RRC), effective from October 1, 2025, to systematically review all banking regulations every five to seven years.
- ❖ The RRC will function under the Department of Regulation and conduct phased reviews of rules affecting banks and other regulated entities.
- ❖ An independent Advisory Group on Regulation (AGR) has been formed to bring external expert feedback into the review process.
- ❖ The six-member AGR aims to enhance stakeholder engagement and leverage industry expertise, with an initial tenure of three years, renewable for an additional two years.



SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY NEWS

Water-Based Hydrogen Fuel

- ❖ HONC Gas Private Limited has developed a technology to convert purified water into hydrogen gas.
- ❖ The company is based in Avinashi, Tiruppur district, Tamil Nadu.
- ❖ The technology uses a proprietary multi-stage electrolysis and gas-blending process.





- ❖ The process generates hydrogen fuel instantly from purified water with no carbon emissions.
- ❖ The innovation includes a Gyroid Electrolyte Membrane (GEM) that produces a precise hydrogen and oxygen mix.
- ❖ The GEM technology enables on-demand hydrogen fuel generation without storage or compression.
- ❖ The system uses direct current (DC) or solar power and recycles energy during operation.
- ❖ The generators consume minimal water and are fully indigenously developed.
- ❖ The technology has completed the patenting process.
- ❖ It has been submitted to the State and Central government authorities for approval.


Global Innovation Index 2025

- ❖ The Report was released by the World Intellectual Property Organisation (WIPO).
- ❖ Switzerland ranks first with a score of 66, Sweden second with 62.6, and the United States third with 61.7.
- ❖ China ranks tenth with a score of 56.6 and leads in patent filings.
- ❖ India ranks 38th globally, up from 48th in 2020.
- ❖ India holds the number one position among lower-middle-income economies.
- ❖ India also ranks first in the Central and Southern Asia region.






- ❖ India performs best in Knowledge and Technology Outputs at 22nd place.
- India's Market Sophistication ranks 38th globally.
- ❖ India's lowest ranks are Business Sophistication (64th), Infrastructure (61st), and Institutions (58th).
- Research and Development growth slowed to 2.9 percent in 2024.
- ❖ R&D growth is projected to fall further to 2.3 percent in 2025.



Narcotics Control Bureau annual report 2024




❖ According to the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) annual report 2024, Punjab seized 1,150 kg of heroin.





- ❖ Punjab accounts for 44.5% of India's heroin seizures but only has 2.3% of the country's population.
- ❖ The total heroin seized across India in 2024 was 2,596 kg.
- ❖ New Delhi ranked second with nearly 234 kg of heroin seized in 2024.
- ❖ Punjab also led in seizure of habit-forming tablets, with 2.94 crore pills confiscated.
- ❖ Uttar Pradesh was second with 51 lakh habit-forming pills seized.
- ❖ In 2024, there were 179 drone-related narcotics seizures compared to three in 2021.
- ❖ Punjab had 163 drone seizures involving 187 kg of heroin, 5.4 kg of methamphetamine, and 4.2 kg of opium.
- ❖ Nepalese nationals topped arrests among foreigners in India for drug-related offenses in 2024, with 203 arrests.
- ❖ Nigeria was second with 106 foreign nationals arrested in drug cases in 2024.

IEA report 2025



- ❖ The International Energy Agency (IEA) warned that global oil and gas fields are depleting faster than before.
- ❖ India, which imports over 85 per cent of its crude and 45 per cent of its gas, is especially vulnerable.






- ❖ Nearly 90 per cent of upstream oil and gas investment is now used to offset natural decline in existing fields.
- ❖ Without new investment, global oil output could fall by 5.5 million barrels per day each year.
- ❖ Shale and offshore fields decline fastest, with output dropping over 35 per cent in the first year.
- ❖ The IEA urged India to diversify sources, expand domestic exploration, and adopt clean alternatives.
- ❖ New oil and gas projects take nearly 20 years from licensing to production, raising long-term risks.

STATES' NEWS

Economic Blockade in Assam



- ❖ The Moran community launched an indefinite economic blockade in Tinsukia district, Assam, on September 15, 2025.
- ❖ The blockade halted transportation of vital resources like oil, coal, tea, and timber through the district.
- ❖ The protest is led by the All-Moran Students' Union (AMSU) with support from six other Moran organisations.





- ❖ The community is demanding Scheduled Tribe (ST) status and a constitutional upgrade of the Moran Autonomous Council.
- ❖ Currently, the Moran council functions under state legislation and lacks Sixth Schedule constitutional protections.
- ❖ The blockade's economic impact on regional industries has prompted calls for urgent government intervention.

Sambhaji Maharaj Statue

- ❖ A massive statue of Chhatrapati Sambhaji Maharaj is under construction in Moshi, Pimpri-Chinchwad, Pune.
- ❖ Once completed, it will be the tallest statue in the world dedicated to Chhatrapati Sambhaji Maharaj.
- ❖ The London Book of Records honoured the Trust for record participation and hosting the tribute to Sambhaji Maharaj event.




Jungle Warfare School in Red Corridor

❖ The government is setting up a jungle warfare school at Karregutta Hills in Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district, a former Maoist stronghold.





- ❖ The school will train forces like the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF), Chhattisgarh Police, and Commando Battalion for Resolute Action (COBRA) in special jungle and cave intervention tactics.
- ❖ Karregutta Hills, with difficult terrain including caves and waterfalls, was cleared of Naxal control in April 2025 after a major CRPF operation.
- ❖ This real terrain will help improve training quality.
- ❖ CRPF leads counter-insurgency and anti-Naxal operations, with around 100 battalions currently deployed for such tasks.

NECA 2025 Awards



❖ Bureau of Energy Efficiency introduces a new category under the National Energy Conservation Awards (NECA) 2025 for content creators and influencers.






- ❖ The initiative aims to leverage digital media to promote awareness of energy efficiency, conservation, and sustainable living practices.
- ❖ NECA was instituted in 1991 and is a prestigious platform recognizing excellence in energy conservation across various sectors.

IMPORTANT DAYS

Engineers Day 2025 - September 15



- ❖ This day honours the birth anniversary of Sir Mokshagundam Visvesvaraya, one of India's greatest engineers.
- ❖ In 1912, he was appointed as the 19th Dewan of Mysore, earning the title "maker of modern Mysore".
- ❖ He designed reservoirs like Osman Sagar and Himayat Sagar and proposed systematic flood control solutions.
- ❖ He built the Krishna Raja Sagara (KRS) Damin 1932, creating Asia's largest reservoir and transforming Mandya agriculture.
- ❖ Theme for 2025 is "Deep Tech & Engineering Excellence: Driving India's Techade".

World Ozone Day 2025 - September 16

❖ This day is commemorating the Montreal Protocol, an environmental agreement that was signed in 1987.





- ❖ On September 16, 2009, the Vienna Convention and the Montreal Protocol became the first treaties in the history of the United Nations to achieve universal ratification.
- ❖ The protocol regulates the production and consumption of nearly 100 man-made chemicals referred to as ozone-depleting substances (ODS).
- ❖ The theme for this year's is "From science to global action".
