- ❖ The 26th Meeting of the Financial Stability and Development Council (FSDC) was chaired by the Union Finance and Corporate Affairs Minister.

- ❖ The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change had recently released the Management Effectiveness Evaluation (MEE-ZOO) report 2022.
- ❖ It was created based on the survey of zoos across India.
- ❖ India currently has 147 recognized zoos.
- ❖ These are categorized as large (17), medium (23), small (33), mini-zoos (60) and rescue centres (14).

- ❖ The recent MEE-ZOO evaluated the 39 zoos under the categories large and medium.
- ❖ Vandalur Zoo was rated “Very Good” and it is the top performers of large zoo category.
- ❖ West Bengal’s Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park is the Top performers of medium zoo category.
- ❖ Alipore Zoological Garden, National Zoological and Nawab and Wajid Ali Shah Zoological Garden is the Top performers in context element.
  - Top performer in planning element: Vandalur Zoo.
  - Top performers in Input element: Vandalur Zoo, Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park and Mysore Zoo.
  - Top performers in Process element: Kanpur Zoological Park and Mysore Zoo.
  - Top performers in Output element: Vandalur Zoo and Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park.
  - Top performer in Outcome element: Padmaja Naidu Himalayan Zoological Park.

### **KRITAGYA 3.0**



- ❖ KRITAGYA 3.0 was launched by ICAR to promote “speed breeding” for crop improvement.

- ❖ This initiative would give opportunities for students, faculties, entrepreneurs, innovators and others to demonstrate innovative approaches and technological solutions for the crop improvement.
- ❖ The KRITAGYA stands of KRI for Krishi, which means agriculture; TA for Taknik, meaning technology; and GYA for Gyan meaning knowledge.

## ECONOMY

### National Logistics Policy 2022



- ❖ The Government has launched a National Logistics Policy (NLP) 2022.
- ❖ It aims to achieve 'quick last-mile delivery', end transport-related challenges.
- ❖ The term "logistics" describes the total process of controlling the acquisition, storage, and delivery of resources to their intended location.
- ❖ The policy focuses on key areas such as process re-engineering, digitisation, and multi-modal transport.
- ❖ Logistics costs have to be cut by half to be near global benchmarks by 2030 by reducing the cost of logistics from 14-18% of GDP.
- ❖ The global best practices are 8% of GDP.


- ❖ Countries like the US, South Korea, Singapore, and certain European nations have such a low logistics cost-to-GDP ratio.
- ❖ The current cost is 16% of GDP.
- ❖ India aims to be among the top 10 in the LPI (Logistics Performance Index) by 2030.
- ❖ In 2018, India was ranked 44th in the LPI.

## SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

### Sova virus in India

- ❖ CERT-In has given warning on SOVA virus.
- ❖ It is a novel mobile banking “Trojan” virus that is currently targeting Indian customers.
- ❖ It is capable of stealthily encrypting an android phone for ransom.
- ❖ This malware is distributed through smishing (phishing via SMS) attacks
- ❖ It is a major threat to privacy and security of sensitive customer data and can cause large-scale financial frauds and cyberattacks.

### Virus detecting mask



- ❖ Scientists have developed a face mask that can detect common respiratory viruses, such as influenza and Covid-19, in the air as droplets or aerosols.
- ❖ If specific viruses are present in the ambient air, the extremely sensitive mask may inform wearers via their mobile devices within 10 minutes.

- ❖ The sensor responded to as little as 0.3 microliters of liquid containing viral proteins, about 70 to 560 times less than the volume of liquid produced in one sneeze.

## ENVIRONMENT

### Congo Basin Forests – State of the Forests 2021




- ❖ It was released recently by the Central African Forests Commission.
- ❖ Increased investment and research are required for the protection of peatlands in central Congo basin.
- ❖ This area is currently under threat because of hydrocarbon exploration, logging, palm oil plantation, hydroelectric dams and climate change.
- ❖ The conservation of these peatlands is critical as they are capable of storing around 30 giga tons of carbon in a peat.
- ❖ This is equal to the above-ground biomass of trees in the entire Congo basin forest.

- ❖ They are capable of storing carbon worth of about 20 years of fossil fuel emissions of the United States.

## STATES

### Renaming of Daulatabad Fort

- ❖ After renaming Aurangabad, Maharashtra government has now decided to rename Daulatabad Fort as Devgiri.
- ❖ Earlier Aurangabad was renamed as Sambhaji Nagar.
- ❖ It was earlier the capital of the Yadava Dynasty for a brief time the capital of the Delhi Sultanate.
- ❖ The fort was renamed Daulatabad by Mohammed Tughlaq in the 14th century.
- ❖ The fort was later known as Qubbatul Islam and coins were minted with this name.



## PERSONALITIES, AWARDS, AND EVENTS

### INSPIRE Awards

- ❖ Union Ministry of Science and Technology has recently provided financial aid to around 53,000 students under the INSPIRE Scheme.
- ❖ INSPIRE stands for The Innovation in Science Pursuit for Inspired Research.
- ❖ This has been implemented by Indian Government's Department of Science and Technology.
- ❖ It has three components

- Scheme for Early Attraction of Talent (SEATS)
- Scholarship for Higher Education (SHE) and
- Assured Opportunity for Research Careers (AORC).
- ❖ Government confers INSPIRE Award – MANAK every year under the SEAT Program.
- ❖ MANAK stands for Million Minds Augmenting National Aspiration and Knowledge.



### **World's First Cloned Arctic Wolf**



- ❖ China have successfully cloned wild Arctic Wolf for the first time.
- ❖ It aims to prevent the endangered species from going extinct.
- ❖ The newly cloned wolf was named Maya, which means good health.
- ❖ The donor cell of the wolf came from a skin sample of a wild female Arctic Wolf.
- ❖ Its oocyte was obtained from a female dog.



- ❖ The Arctic Wolf is also known as white wolf or polar wolf.
- ❖ It is native to the High Arctic tundra of Canada's Queen Elizabeth Islands.
- ❖ It is a subspecies of the grey wolf.
