TNPSC BITS

- ❖ The third edition of World Food India 2024 was held in New Delhi.
- ❖ Dhruvi Patel, a Computer Information System student from the USA, has been declared the winner of Miss India Worldwide 2024.
- ❖ The United States (US) International Development Finance Corporation (DFC) has announced an investment of USD 70 million in India's private sector to strengthen key priorities of both governments.
- ❖ The two-time world boxing champion Nikhat Zareen joined the Telangana Police as a Deputy Superintendent of Police (Special Police).
- ❖ The United States Federal Reserve has cut the benchmark interest rate the Federal Funds Rate by 50 basis points, or half a percentage point.
- ❖ Delhi's Indira Gandhi International Airport (IGIA) has climbed to 24th place in the latest ranking of global "Megahub" airports, up from its previous 25th position.
- ❖ Indian cricketer Jasprit Bumrah has become the 10th Indian bowler to reach the illustrious milestone of 400 international wickets.
- ❖ The South Korea's Ambassador to Austria Ham Sang-wook has been elected as the president of the 68th General Conference of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA).
- ❖ Taiwan will recognise the same-sex marriages between Taiwanese-Chinese nationals, giving couples the right to register their unions.
 - o Same-sex marriage has been legal in Taiwan since 2019, making it the first country in Asia to legalize same-sex marriage.

TAMIL NADU

CM Research Fellowship 2024

- ❖ The state government has sanctioned ₹50 lakh for giving a fellowship of ₹1 lakh each to 50 students with the disabilities under the Chief Minister's Research Fellowship.
- ❖ The fellowship would support their research for their Ph.D. program.
- ❖ Only students with disabilities, pursuing Ph.D., are eligible.





❖ There is no bar on the income and candidates should pursue Ph.D. either part-time or full time at any recognised educational institution in the country.



Statue of archaeologist John Marshall



❖ The Tamil Nadu government will install a life-size statue of British archaeologist John Marshall to mark 100 years of the discovery of the Indus Valley Civilisation.





- ❖ Marshall was the director-general of the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) from 1902 to 1928.
- ❖ During this time the Harappa and Mohanjodaro, two main cities that comprise the Indus Valley Civilisation, were discovered.
- ❖ 100 years ago, on 20th September 1924, Sir John Marshall had announced the discovery of the Indus Valley Civilisation.

NATIONAL

Production of various Horticultural Crops 2023-24

- ❖ The Department of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare has released the Third Advance Estimates of 2023-24 of Area and Production of various Horticultural Crops.
- ❖ The horticulture production in the country in 2023-24 (Third Advance Estimates) is estimated to be about 353.19 million Tonnes.
- ❖ It is decrease of about 22.94 Lakh Tonnes (0.65%) over 2022-23 (Final Estimates).
- ❖ Increase in production of Fruits, Honey, Flowers, Plantation Crops, Spices and Aromatics & Medicinal Plants is seen over 2023-24.

White Revolution 2.0

- ❖ The Operation Flood, launched in 1970, has ushered in the White Revolution and transformed the dairy sector in India.
- ❖ Dairy cooperatives procured 660 lakh kg of milk per day in 2023-24.
- ❖ The government wants to increase this to 1,007 lakh kg/ day by 2028-29.





- ❖ There are about 1.7 lakh dairy cooperative societies (DCSs), which cover around 2 lakh villages (30% of the total number of villages in the country), and 22% of producer households.
- ❖ These cooperative societies procure about 10% of the country's milk production and 16% of the marketable surplus.
- ❖ In the states of Gujarat, Kerala, and Sikkim, and the Union Territory of Puducherry, more than 70% of villages are covered by dairy cooperatives.
- ❖ In the states of Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, and Madhya Pradesh, and the UT of Jammu & Kashmir coverage is only 10-20%.
- ❖ In West Bengal, Assam, Odisha, Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, Himachal Pradesh, and the smaller states of the Northeast, less than 10% of villages are covered.
- ❖ The national per capita availability of milk is 459 grams/ day, which is higher than the global average of 323 g/ day.
- ❖ This number varies from 329 g in Maharashtra to 1,283 gram in Punjab.
- ❖ India is the world's top milk producer, with production having reached 230.58 million tonnes during 2022-23.
- ❖ In 1951-52, the country produced just 17 million tonnes of milk.



Fencing Myanmar border

❖ The Union government has approved ₹31,000 crore to fence the Myanmar border.






- ❖ The 1,643-km Myanmar border runs along the States of Arunachal Pradesh (520 km), Nagaland (215 km), Manipur (398 km) and Mizoram (510 km).
- ❖ The Union Home Ministry earlier this year scrapped the Free Movement Regime (FMR) along the Myanmar border.
- ❖ It allows people residing close to the border to venture 16 km into each other's territory without any documents.



Expedition Param Vir



* The Andaman & Nicobar Command Tri-service launched 'Expedition Param Vir'.





- ❖ It is a first-of-its-kind Open Water Swimming Expedition to the 21 Islands of the Andaman & Nicobar archipelagos named after the Param Vir Chakra (PVC) Awardees.
- ❖ The team swam to all 21 islands, more than 300 kms, over a period of five months.
- ❖ The 11-member expedition team was led by Wing Commander Paramvir Singh.

6th Food Safety Index 2024

- ❖ This ranking was released by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI).
- ❖ Kerala has once again secured the top position in the State Food Safety Index (SFSI) 2024.
- ❖ This marks the second consecutive year that Kerala has topped the index.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu, which had slipped to the third position last year, secured second position this time.
- ❖ Jammu and Kashmir, Gujarat, and Nagaland follow in the top five.
- ❖ In 2022, Tamil Nadu had topped the Index, replacing Gujarat at the number one slot.


Black Hole Finder App

❖ The Dutch Black Hole Consortium recently unveiled a new app called Black Hole Finder.





- ❖ This will aid astronomers identify new black holes.
- ❖ The app is free-to-use and is available on Android and iOS and can also be accessed from a web browser.
- ❖ The app description states that users who identify 1000 transients will be granted the "Super User" status.

Rare Dung Beetle Species



- ❖ Entomologists have discovered a new species of dung beetle, Onitis visthara.
- Onitis is a relatively rare genus of dung beetles found in the Afrotropical, Oriental, and Palaearctic regions.
- ❖ Before the discovery of the three new species, only 176 species of Onitis had been reported globally.





❖ All species of this genus are tunnellers, meaning they bury large quantities of cattle dung beneath the dung pat to provide food for their larvae.

- ❖ It serves as a global reminder of the need to foster a culture of peace.
- ❖ In 1981, the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) had passed a resolution declaring this day.
