# TNPSC BITS

- ❖ India's Anandkumar Velkumar won gold in the men's 42 km marathon at the 2025 World Speed Skating Championships in China.
- ❖ The first India-Greece bilateral naval exercise was held in the Mediterranean Sea with INS Trikand representing India.
- ❖ Ahmednagar railway station in Maharashtra was officially renamed Ahilyanagar to honor the legacy of Ahilya Bai Holkar.
- ❖ Anish Raj won bronze in the Junior Men's One-Lap Road Sprint at the 73rd Inline Speed World Championships 2025 in China.
  - o He is the first Indian to win a medal in this category, clocking 39.714 seconds.

# **Mangrove Restoration**

# World Bank Clears ₹1,675 Cr TN SHORE Project

The World Bank has cleared the ₹1,675 crore SHORE project to enhance Tamil Nadu's coastal resilience by combining ecosystem restoration with livelihood opportunities. Of the total outlay, ₹1,172.5 crore will come from the World Bank and ₹502.5 crore from the state. Covering 30,000 hectares, it will restore mangroves, coral reefs, and seagrass while protecting endangered species. Implemented under the TN-SHORE Mission, the project will also tackle pollution, encourage eco-tourism, and create a blue carbon framework.

- ❖ The Tamil Nadu Coastal Restoration Mission called Tamil Nadu-Sustainable Coastal and Ocean Resource Efficiency (TN-SHORE) is a ₹1,675 crore project.
- ❖ The World Bank will contribute ₹1,000 crore, and the remaining funds will be provided by the Tamil Nadu government.
- ❖ Under TN-SHORE, 1,000 hectares of mangroves will be restored, including 300 hectares of new plantations and 700 hectares of degraded areas.





- ❖ An initial amount of ₹38 crore has been allocated specifically for mangrove restoration.
- ❖ World Bank funds will be sent directly to village mangrove councils to enable local financial decision-making.

# **Infrastructure Status for Large Ships**



- ❖ The Indian government has granted infrastructure status to large commercial ships under the Harmonized Master List of Infrastructure.
- ❖ Commercial vessels with a gross tonnage of 10,000 or more under Indian ownership and flag now qualify for this status.
- ❖ Ships built in India with a gross tonnage of 1,500 or more also qualify.
- ❖ Infrastructure status offers benefits such as easier overseas borrowing, tax-free bonds, and access to dedicated lenders like the India Infrastructure Finance Company Limited (IIFCL).
- ❖ Large ships are included as a transport and logistics sub-sector in the harmonized master list, which now contains 38 sub-sectors.
- **❖** The 2025-26 Budget announced a ₹25,000 crore Maritime Development Fund to support ship acquisition and industry growth.

## AI-powered audit system

❖ The Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) is developing a Large Language Model (LLM) powered by artificial intelligence to improve audit efficiency.






- ❖ The AI system will help auditors access decades of institutional knowledge and enhance consistency in audit analysis.
- ❖ The first version of this system is expected to be ready by November 2025.



#### Combined Commanders' Conference 2025

- ❖ India merges the education branches of the Army, Navy, and Air Force into a single tri-services education corps.
- ❖ The decision was announced at the Combined Commanders' Conference 2025 held in New Delhi.
- \* Three new joint military stations will be established under this reform.
- ❖ The Integrated Defence Staff (IDS) will manage the merged education organisation.
- ❖ These steps aim to improve jointness and integration among the armed forces.

# **Global Tropical Forest Fund**



- ❖ Brazil will be the first country to announce an investment in the Tropical Forests Forever Facility (TFFF).
- ❖ It is a multilateral fund supporting conservation of endangered tropical forests worldwide.
- ❖ President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva plans to announce the investment at the United Nations in New York ahead of COP30, which Brazil will host in November.
- ❖ The Brazilian government aims to set a benchmark with a "considerable" initial contribution to encourage other countries and private investors to join.
- ❖ The TFFF targets raising \$125 billion, combining sovereign and private-sector funds to pay countries annual stipends based on their remaining tropical forests.
- ❖ Initial support for the fund has come from China, the United Kingdom, France, Germany, Norway, Singapore, and the United Arab Emirates.
- ❖ Brazil hopes its investment will catalyze further commitments, signalling trust in the fund and promoting global climate finance cooperation.

#### **Recognition of Palestine 2025**

- ❖ Britain, Canada, Australia, and Portugal officially recognized the State of Palestine.
- ❖ The move aims to promote a two-state solution amid frustration over the Gaza war.






- ❖ Palestinian leaders welcomed the decision, seeing it as a step toward peaceful coexistence with Israel.
- ❖ This recognition aligns these Western nations with over 140 countries supporting Palestinian statehood.

# **GCHA Report 2025**







- ❖ The Global Climate and Health Alliance (GCHA) released a report titled "Cradle to Grave: The Health Toll of Fossil Fuels and the Imperative for a Just Transition."
- ❖ The report warns that fossil fuels cause a public health emergency, affecting humans from the womb to old age.
- ❖ It highlights health impacts in India's coal belt, including childhood asthma, tuberculosis, and congenital disorders linked to pollution.
- ❖ Exposure to fossil fuel pollutants raises risks of miscarriage, cancer, cardiovascular diseases, and neurological disorders across all age groups.
- ❖ Toxic chemicals from fossil fuel operations persist in the environment for decades, causing intergenerational health damage.
- ❖ Marginalized communities near mines and refineries suffer disproportionately from disease, poverty, and displacement.
- ❖ The report calls for urgent policy changes, including ending new fossil fuel projects and enforcing the polluter pays principle.

- Seven Tier II cities rank among India's top ten millionaire hubs, says Mercedes-Benz Hurun India Wealth Report 2025.
- ❖ They are Ahmedabad, Surat, Jaipur, Vadodara, Nagpur, Visakhapatnam, and Lucknow, with rapidly growing millionaire households.






- ❖ The top ten states host over 79 percent of India's millionaire households, highlighting wealth concentration in specific regions.
- ❖ Mumbai, New Delhi, and Bengaluru lead as the top three cities with the highest number of millionaire households.
- ❖ Wealth management startups report that around 30 percent of new clients now come from outside the top 18 state capitals.
- ❖ Digital stockbroking platforms like Zerodha and Groww see over 80 percent of new users from non-metro cities.

#### State of Global Water Resources 2024

- ❖ The World Meteorological Organization (WMO) released its "State of Global Water Resources 2024" report.
- ❖ In 2024, nearly 60 percent of global river basins saw either drought or flood conditions, while only one-third recorded normal hydrology.
- ❖ The Asia-Pacific region was the most affected by weather, climate, and water-related disasters in 2024.
- ❖ Typhoon Yagi killed over 850 people and caused 16 billion US dollars in damage across Vietnam, Myanmar, China, Thailand, the Philippines, and Laos.
- ❖ Global glaciers lost 450 gigatonnes of ice in 2024, enough to fill 180 million Olympic-sized swimming pools, contributing 1.2 millimetres to sea level rise.




#### State Finances 2022–23 Report

❖ The Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) released the State Finances 2022–23 report on 20 September 2025.





- ❖ The report is the first of its kind, providing comprehensive data, analysis, and trends on fiscal parameters for all 28 states over 10 years (2013–14 to 2022–23).
- ❖ In 2022–23, states' total debt was 22.17 percent of India's Gross Domestic Product (GDP).



- ❖ The Fiscal Responsibility and Budget Management (FRBM) Act (2003) sets a benchmark of 20 percent of GDP for state government debt by 2024–25.
- ❖ Punjab had the highest debt-to-GSDP (Gross State Domestic Product) ratio at 40.35 percent.
- ❖ It is followed by Nagaland (37.15 percent) and West Bengal (33.70 percent).
- ❖ All 28 states reported a fiscal deficit, ranging from 0.76 percent (Gujarat) to 6.46 percent (Himachal Pradesh) of GSDP in 2022–23.
- ❖ The FRBM Act recommends that states limit fiscal deficit to 3.5 percent of GSDP for FY 2022–23.
- ❖ States' Own Tax Revenue (SOTR) as a share of total revenue varied widely—from 70 percent in Haryana to just 9 percent in Arunachal Pradesh.
- ❖ High public debt is attributed to subsidy schemes, such as farm loan waivers, free or subsidised electricity, and cash transfers.





- ❖ Committed expenditures (e.g., salaries, pensions, interest payments) made up over 42 percent of revenue expenditure and stayed above 6 percent of GSDP in most years.
- ❖ Many states continue to show low revenue mobilisation and heavy dependence on Goods and Services Tax (GST).

## STATES' NEWS

#### Mana Mitra

- ❖ The Andhra Pradesh government launched Mana Mitra, a WhatsApp-based governance platform.
- ❖ The official WhatsApp number for availing the services is 9552300009.
- ❖ Mana Mitra will deliver 161 public services in the first phase across 36 departments.
- ❖ An additional 360 services will be added in the second phase of Mana Mitra.
- Certificates issued through the platform will carry a QR code linked to the Andhra Pradesh government website.
- ❖ Andhra Pradesh is the first state in the world to implement full-scale WhatsApp governance.



# **Kurmi Agitation**

- ❖ The Adivasi Kurmi Samaj will resume protests in Purulia, West Bengal.
- ❖ The Kurmi community is demanding Scheduled Tribe status across parts of West Bengal, Jharkhand, and Odisha.





- ❖ Kurmis were included among the communities classified as STs in the 1931 Census and were excluded from the ST list in 1950.
- ❖ In 2004, the Jharkhand government recommended that the community be added to the ST list rather than be categorised as OBCs.
- ❖ Kurmis are mainly a peasant community, with their population concentrated in the Jungle mahal areas or the Chota Nagpur plateau of West Bengal, Jharkhand, and Odisha, and a few bordering areas of Bihar.
- ❖ After 1950, when the Scheduled Tribe list was prepared in independent India, Kudmis did not find a place on it.

## Stanford-Elsevier Ranking 2025








- ❖ Dr. V. Mohan has been listed in the 2025 Stanford–Elsevier list of the top 2% of global scientists.
- ❖ He is chairman of Madras Diabetes Research Foundation and chief diabetologist at Dr. Mohan's Diabetes Specialities Centre.
- ❖ In India, he ranks first in the Clinical Medicine/Endocrinology and Metabolism category.
- ❖ His global ranking is 3,087 among top scientists listed in the 2025 edition.
- ❖ Other Indian scientists in the top 10 include Anoop Misra, C. S. Yajnik, A. Ramachandran, and Vijay Viswanathan.

# Day of Social Justice 2025 - September 17

- ❖ This day mark the birth anniversary of E.V. Ramasamy (Periyar).
- ❖ He was an Indian social activist and politician who started the Dravidar Kazhagam.
- ❖ He is known as the 'Father of the Dravidian movement'.
- ❖ He is known the most for his Self-respect Movement, that aimed at generating pride in lower castes.
- ❖ He promoted the principles of rationalism, self-respect, women's rights, and the eradication of caste.
- ❖ World Day of Social Justice is observed annually on 20 February.







# International Day of Peace 2025 - September 21

- ❖ UN established this day to emphasize the importance of non-violence, unity, and harmony in building sustainable societies.
- ❖ Each year, the Peace Bell (a gift from Japan) is rung at the UN Headquarters in New York as a gesture of global solidarity and non-violence.
- ❖ Theme for 2025 is "Act Now for a Peaceful World".
