TNPSC BITS

- ❖ France's Ousmane Dembele won the 2025 Ballon d'Or, finishing over 300 points ahead of Spain's teenage star Lamine Yamal of Barcelona.
- Indian-origin Amita Chaudhury has been appointed chair of the United Nations Environment Programme Finance Initiative (UNEP FI) Principles for Sustainable Insurance (PSI).
 - o She is the first woman of Indian origin to hold this global position.
- ❖ World Food India 2025 will be held at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi, and inaugurated by Prime Minister.

TAMIL NADU NEWS

Tidal Mangrove Nursery



- ❖ A tidal mangrove nursery has been established at Killai near Pichavaram in Cuddalore district.
- ❖ The nursery holds around three lakh saplings and is the first of its kind in Tamil Nadu.
- Four species are raised here Avicennia marina, Avicennia officinalis, Rhizophora mucronata, and Rhizophora apiculata.
- This initiative supports the Green Tamil Nadu Mission and Tamil Nadu Coastal Restoration Mission (Tamil Nadu - Sustainable Coastal and Habitat Restoration for Resilience - TN-SHORE).





❖ Pichavaram is home to thirteen true mangrove species, benefiting long-term restoration plans.

1000 plus Kidney Transplantation

- ❖ Government Stanley Medical College Hospital (SMCH) in Chennai has completed 1,006 kidney transplants.
- ❖ The first renal transplant using a living donor was performed in April 1986 at SMCH.
- ❖ Out of the total, 837 transplants were from live related donors and 169 from deceased donors.

Govt Stanley Medical College Hospital in Chennai achieved a historic milestone by performing its 100th cadaveric liver transplant on March 3, becoming the first government hospital in India to do so. The recipient is recovering well, hospital sources said. Stanley's first successful liver transplant was in 2009, 15 years after its initial attempt in 1995. Led by Dr. S Jeswanth, the latest surgery was conducted in collaboration with Rela Hospital, further boosting organ transplantation efforts in government hospitals.

Megalithic Dolmens of Kodaikanal

- ❖ Dolmens in Kodaikanal, dating back over 5,000 years, were first surveyed by Jesuit priests in the early 1900s.
- ❖ Dolmens were mostly built using undressed stones on rocky ridges or slopes near natural rock formations.
- ❖ Less than 50% of the dolmens recorded by the Jesuit Fathers are currently visible and intact.
- ❖ At Pethuparai near Perumal Malai, some dolmens have been fenced by the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI).
- ❖ At Thandikudi, several dolmens have disappeared under vegetation or been damaged over time.
- ❖ Excavations near the Marudanadhi river revealed continuous occupation from the pre-Iron Age.






❖ Artefacts such as black and red ware and carnelian beads were found in burial sites spanning 40 hectares.



NATIONAL NEWS

Polluted River Sites in India



- ❖ The number of river locations unfit for bathing in India decreased to 807 in 2023 from 815 in 2022, according to the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB).
- ❖ The count of 'most polluted' river stretches, classified as Priority 1 with biological oxygen demand (BOD) over 30 mg/L, dropped from 45 in 2022 to 37 in 2023.
- ❖ Maharashtra had the highest number of polluted rivers stretches (54) in 2023, followed by Kerala (31), Madhya Pradesh (18), and Manipur (18).





- ❖ Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh, and Uttarakhand recorded the highest number (five each) of Priority 1 river stretches needing urgent remediation.
- ❖ The CPCB monitors water quality at 4,736 locations including rivers, lakes, canals, and drains across India.

LPG Connections 2025-26

- ❖ The Union Government has approved 25 lakh new LPG connections under the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) for the financial year 2025-26.
- ❖ Since its launch in 2016, PMUY aims to provide LPG connections to women from poor households without charging for installation or the first refill.
- ❖ Total LPG connections provided under PMUY will reach 10.58 crore after the latest disbursal.



Viksit Bharat Buildathon 2025

- Union Education Ministry launched the Viksit Bharat Buildathon 2025, a nationwide innovation challenge for school students.
- ❖ The event is organised in collaboration with Atal Innovation Mission, NITI Aayog, and AICTE.
- ❖ The Buildathon encourages students to innovate around four themes: Vocal for Local, Atmanirbhar Bharat, Swadeshi, and Samriddhi.
- ❖ It aims to foster a culture of grassroots innovation and empower youth as drivers of a self-reliant and prosperous India.





Oju hydroelectric project



- ❖ The Union Environment Ministry's expert committee has recommended environmental clearance for the 2,220 MW Oju hydroelectric project.
- ❖ It is planned on the Subansiri river in Taksing, near the China border.





- ❖ The project is the largest in capacity among hydroelectric projects in the Subansiri basin.
- ❖ It is located 5 km downstream of Redi village in Upper Subansiri district.

DRAVYA Portal


- ❖ The DRAVYA portal was launched on National Ayurveda Day, September 23, 2025.
- ❖ This is the largest database of Ayurvedic ingredients and products.
- ❖ DRAVYA stands for Digitized Retrieval Application for Versatile Yardstick of AYUSH Substances
- ❖ It provides easy access to data from classical Ayurveda textbooks, contemporary scientific literature, and field studies.
- ❖ It is developed under the Ministry of AYUSH, it serves as a comprehensive resource for students, practitioners, and researchers in the field.



CDS Tenure Extension


- ❖ The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet approved the extension of General Anil Chauhan's service as Chief of Defence Staff.
- ❖ He was also continued to function as Secretary to the Government of India, Department of Military Affairs until May 30, 2026, or until further orders.
- ❖ General Chauhan was initially appointed as Chief of Defence Staff on September 28, 2022.





INTERNATIONAL NEWS

Global Reach of Traditional Medicine



- ❖ Traditional medicine is practiced in 170 of 194 WHO member-states, serving as primary health care for billions.
- ❖ The global traditional medicine market is projected to reach \$583 billion by 2025, with annual growth between 10% and 20%.
- ❖ India exports AYUSH and herbal products worth \$1.54 billion to more than 150 countries, with Ayurveda recognised as a medical system in several nations.





- ❖ The National Sample Survey (2022–23) showed 95% rural and 96% urban awareness of AYUSH, with over half the population using it in the preceding year.
- ❖ India has signed 25 bilateral AYUSH agreements and set up 43 AYUSH Information Cells in 39 countries and 15 academic chairs abroad.

ECONOMY NEWS

GST Appellate Tribunal



- Union Finance Ministry launched the Goods and Services Tax Appellate Tribunal (GSTAT) in New Delhi.
- ❖ GSTAT aimed to deliver jargon-free decisions, simplified formats, digital filings, virtual hearings, and strict timelines for case handling.
- ❖ The tribunal sought to reduce legal frictions, simplify processes, and address litigation delays to improve cash flow and boost MSME and exporter confidence.
- ❖ The GSTAT e-Courts Portal was unveiled, enabling online appeal filing, case tracking, and digital hearings.

ENVIRONMENT NEWS

Achanakmar Tiger Reserve

- ❖ The tiger population in Achanakmar Tiger Reserve (Chhattisgarh) rose from 5 in 2022 to 18 in 2025 after the arrival of tigress Jhumri from Bandhavgarh.
- ❖ Achanakmar Tiger Reserve, located in Bilaspur, was declared a wildlife sanctuary in 1975 and became a tiger reserve in 2009.
- ❖ It is part of the Achanakmar–Amarkantak Biosphere Reserve.
- It serves as a key corridor between Kanha and Bandhavgarh Tiger Reserves.






❖ The reserve is inhabited by tribal communities such as Baiga (Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Group), Gond, and Yadav.



Impatiens selvasinghii




- * Researchers discovered a new plant species in Kudremukh range of the Western Ghats, Karnataka.
- ❖ It was named 'Impatiens selvasinghii' in honour of Professor P Selva Singh Richard for his contributions to reproductive biology of endemic plants.
- ❖ India hosts over 280 Impatiens taxa, with 130 endemics to the Western Ghats, and about 80% of these are classified as endangered.





REPORTS AND INDICES

Production Gap Report 2025



- ❖ The report 2025 was released by Stockholm Environment Institute, Climate Analytics, and the International Institute for Sustainable Development.
- ❖ The report highlights that governments worldwide plan to produce far more fossil fuels by 2030 than is compatible with limiting global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius.
- ❖ Governments plan to produce 120% more fossil fuels by 2030 than consistent with limiting warming to 1.5°C.
- ❖ Planned coal production will be 500% higher than climate-compatible levels by 2030, while oil production exceeds by 31% and gas by 92%.
- ❖ Coal production is expected to rise through 2035, and gas production is projected to increase until 2050.
- ❖ Of 20 major fossil-fuel-producing countries profiled, 17 plan to increase production of at least one fossil fuel by 2030.
- ❖ 13 countries anticipate significant increases in gas production despite climate goals.
- ❖ Only 6 countries are developing production scenarios aligned with net zero targets; most continue inconsistent expansion plans.

STATES' NEWS

Visakhapatnam Declaration

❖ The 28th National Conference on e-Governance (NCeG) was concluded in Visakhapatnam with the adoption of the Visakhapatnam Declaration.






- ❖ The conference was jointly organised by the Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances (DARPG), Ministry of Electronics and IT (MeitY), and Government of Andhra Pradesh.
- ❖ It called for AI-driven, citizen-centric, and multilingual digital service delivery using platforms like BHASHINI and Digi Yatra.
- ❖ Proven models like SAMPADA 2.0, eKhata, and DAMS were proposed for nationwide replication under a whole-of-government approach.



Mukhyamantri Mahila Rojgar Yojana



- Prime Minister has launched the Mukhyamantri Mahila Rojgar Yojana of Bihar.
- ❖ The scheme aimed to empower women by providing seed capital to start selfemployment ventures and livelihood activities of their choice.





- ❖ ₹10,000 each was directly transferred into the bank accounts of 75 lakh women across Bihar.
- **❖** They will get potential additional support up to ₹2 lakh in later phases.

SPORTS NEWS

Asia Cup 2025

- ❖ India defeated Pakistan to lift the Asia Cup 2025 trophy.
- ❖ This is the ninth time in the history of the tournament that India has won the trophy.
- Sri Lanka has won 6 trophies and Pakistan has clinched two trophies.

World Maritime Day 2025 - September 25



❖ It is observed every year on the last Thursday September.






- ❖ It provides an opportunity to recognise the indispensable role shipping plays in global trade, cultural exchange, and environmental stewardship.

World Contraception Day 2025 - September 26

- ❖ It aims to spread awareness of various contraceptive options to individuals, especially young men and women, regarding Family Planning and Reproductive Health.
- ❖ In 2024, contraceptives supported by UNFPA prevented 18 million unintended pregnancies, 7.5 million unsafe abortions and 39,000 maternal deaths.
- ❖ This year's theme is "A choice for all. Freedom to plan, power to choose."



World Environmental Health Day 2025 - September 26



- ❖ This day serves as a powerful reminder of the deep interconnection between human health and the environment.
- ❖ It was launched in 2011 by the International Federation of Environmental Health (IFEH) at a Council meeting held in Indonesia.





❖ The theme of 2025 is "Clean Air, Healthy People".

International Week of the Deaf 2025 - September 22/28

- ❖ The World Federation of the Deaf and is celebrated annually in the 3rd or the last week of September.
- ❖ It fosters better deaf people's rights advocacy activities and strengthens the bonds of solidarity between deaf people and those who support them.
- ❖ The Theme for 2025 is 'No Human Rights Without Sign Language Rights'.



World Tourism Day 2025 - September 27



- ❖ It highlights the vital role travel plays in shaping societies, cultures, and economies.
- ❖ The day commemorates the adoption of the United Nations World Tourism Organisation statutes in 1970.
- ❖ It was celebrated for the first time in the year 1980.
- ❖ The theme for this year is 'Tourism and Sustainable Transformation'.
