- Scientists Victor Ambros and Gary Ruvkun have won the 2024 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine.
- They discovered microRNA, a new class of tiny RNA molecules that play a crucial role in gene regulation.
- It revealed a completely new principle of gene regulation that turned out to be essential for multicellular organisms, including humans.
- It is now known that the human genome codes for over one thousand microRNAs.
- The 2023 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine was awarded to Katalin Karikó and Drew Weissman.

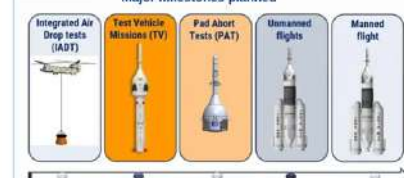

Origin of forever chemicals

- American researchers have found a method to be able to trace the origin and the destination of forever chemicals.
- These chemicals that are scientifically known as per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS).
- They are generally useful in applications such as water-proofing, heat resistance, detergents, food packaging and non-stick technologies.
- They are known to stay in the environment virtually forever and contribute to environmental degradation which adversely impacts the health of all organisms including human beings.



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- Non-stick cookware has long been hailed as a convenient option for cooking due to its non-stick surface.
- This makes it easy to clean and requires less oil for cooking.
- One of the primary concerns with non-stick cookware is perfluorooctanoic acid (PFOA) and perfluorooctanesulfonic acid (PFOS).
- They are the chemicals used in producing non-stick coatings such as Teflon.
- When non-stick cookware is heated to high temperatures, these chemicals can release toxic fumes into the air, posing health risks to those exposed.
- Inhalation of these fumes has been linked to various health issues, including respiratory problems, thyroid disorders, and even certain types of cancer.
- PFOA belongs to a larger class of chemicals known as per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS).
- While PFOA is largely phased out, other PFAS compounds may still be present in some non-stick cookware.
- Non-stick cookware, particularly those coated with polytetrafluoroethylene (PTFE or Teflon), can release toxic fumes when overheated.
- They potentially causing flu-like symptoms in humans and being fatal to birds.

In highly polluted areas:

- It has worried that a combination of bacteria, sewage, chemicals and plastics can remove oxygen from water and transform it into a "poison for people and ecosystems alike".

Nitrogen

- The report notes that a key contributor to poor water quality is nitrogen.
- Nitrogen which is applied as fertiliser in agriculture, eventually enters rivers, lakes and oceans where it transforms into harmful nitrates and enters into food chain.

Biological Oxygen Demand (BOD)

- It states that when BOD crosses a threshold of 8 milligrams per litre, GDP growth in those regions drops by 0.83 percentage points.
- BOD is a measure of how much organic pollution is in water.

- Scientists treated Hussain Sagar lake water with 'CV technology' and found that the water met the WHO and Indian standards.
- This chemical treatment is faster than a sewage treatment plant that uses a biological method of treatment.
- The researchers claimed an improvement in BOD (means lower level of BOD) level and 12 quality parameters in the treated water, significant improvement in the total dissolved solids and reduction in metal ions.

BOD (BIOLOGICAL OXYGEN DEMAND)

- It's a measurement of amount of dissolved oxygen needed by aerobic biological micro organism to decompose the organic matter present in the water.
- Its level indicates the quality of water or pollution level of the water.
- Lower level of BOD indicates the water's suitability to sustain the life dependent on oxygen.

INSAT-3DS Mission

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- The OSLV-F14, carrying INSAT-3DS meteorological satellite, was successfully launched from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota.
- The INSAT-3DS satellite is a follow-on mission of the third-generation meteorological satellite from geostationary orbit.
- This satellite is an exclusive mission designed for enhanced meteorological observations, monitoring of land and ocean surfaces for weather forecasting, and disaster warning.
- The INSAT-3DS satellite will augment meteorological services along with the presently operational INSAT-3D and INSAT-3DR in-orbit satellites.
- This was the 16th mission of the heavy-lift vehicle GSLV-MkII, which has been operational since 2001.

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- Annadurai was born on 15 September 1909 in Kanchipuram (then called Conjeevaram), Tamil Nadu in a lower-middle-class family.
- His father Nataraja Mudaliar was a weaver whereas his mother Bangaru Ammal was a temple servant. His sister Rajamani Ammal.
- Conjeevaram Natarajan Annadurai was popularly called "Anna" or "Arignar Anna".
- He was well known for his oratorical skills and was an acclaimed writer in the Tamil language.
- He was the first politician from the Dravidian parties to use Tamil **cinema** extensively for political propaganda.

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Swadeshi Movement:

- Subramania Iyer was a strong supporter of the Swadeshi movement, which aimed at promoting indigenous industries and self-sufficiency.

Home Rule League:

- In 1916, Subramania Iyer and Annie Besant founded the Home Rule League, with this he serving as its honorary President.
- Letter to U.S. President:** In 1917, Subramania Iyer wrote a letter to U.S. President Woodrow Wilson outlining the oppression and misrule in India.
- This letter prompted a detailed discussion in the British Parliament and led to a personal rebuke from Viceroy Chelmsford.
- Renunciation of Knighthood:** In response to the insult from the Viceroy, Subramania Iyer renounced his knighthood, declaring it as an impediment to his "legitimate exercise of his civic rights."



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- At the request of Gopal Krishna Gokhale, conveyed to him by C. F. Andrews, Gandhi returned to India on 1915 January 9 which is celebrated every year as a Pravasi Bhartiya Divas.

Titles of Gandhi

- Gandhi gave a title to CF Andrews as Deena bandhu ("Friend of the Poor").
- Gopal Krishna Gokhale was a political guru of Gandhi.
- Rabindranath Tagore bestowed the title "mahatma" on Gandhi in 1915 while writing his autobiography.
- Gandhi called Tagore as Gurudev.

Regional Struggles

- On 19 April 1917, Gandhi joined farmer's uprising which is took place in Champaran district of Bihar.
- Tenants from Champaran were forced under the law to plant three out of every twenty parts of their land with indigo plant for their landlords under the so called Tinkathia system.

- In 1863, he opened a home for pregnant Brahmin widows to give birth in a safe and secure place.
- He opened an orphanage home to avoid infanticide. In this regard, he is believed to be the first Hindu to start an orphanage for the unfortunate children.
- In 1868, Jyotirao decided to construct a common bathing tank outside his house to exhibit his embracing attitude towards all human beings and wished to dine with everyone, regardless of their caste.
- In 1873, Phule founded the **Satyashodhak** Samaj, or the Society of Seekers of Truth, for the rights of depressed classes, to denounce the caste system and to spread rational thinking.
- His wife Savitribai became the head of the women's section.

- The Zonal Councils are the statutory (and not the constitutional) bodies.
- They are established by the States Reorganisation Act of 1956.
- The Act divided the country into five zones (Northern, Central, Eastern, Western and Southern) and provided a zonal council for each zone.

- Recently, the Supreme Court of India (SC) has directed Ministry of Women and Child Development of all states/UTs to appoint district officers under the POSH Act.
- POSH Act stands for Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013.
- It aims to address the issue of sexual harassment faced by women in the workplace.
- This act mandates States to appoint an officer in every district who would play a "pivotal" role in the implementation of the Act.
- The District Officer would constitute Local Complaints Committees (LCCs) to receive complaints from women employed in small establishments with less than 10 workers.
- A District Officer's responsibilities also included appointing nodal officers under the Act in rural, tribal and urban areas.

- This policy recommends the Six-Dimensional TAM-DEF Framework for evaluation of AI-based systems.
- The framework's factors like transparency & audit, accountability & legal issues, misuse protection, digital divide and data deficit, ethics and, fairness and equity, ensure that the evaluation is aligned to democratic values.

- The Act also requires every public authority to computerize their records for wide dissemination.
- The first RTI application was filed at a police station in Pune by Shahid Raza Burney.
- The first RTI application in Delhi was filed to the office of President about article 370 in Jammu & Kashmir.
- Information disclosure in India is restricted by the Official Secrets Act 1923 and various other special laws, which the new RTI Act relaxes.

Constitutional Acceptance

- Under section article 19 (1) (a), the Supreme Court of India has held that rights to freedom of speech and expression include the rights to information.
- According to this, the Right to Information is implicit in the right to freedom of speech.
- The apex court of India has ensured this right in the case of the state of Uttar Pradesh* Vs Raj Narain (1974) 4 SCC 428.

Rights available under RTI Act 2005

Immigration and Foreigners Bill 2025

- The Union Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) is likely to bring the Immigration and Foreigners Bill, 2025.
- The bill repeals all the four existing legislations that deal with immigration and movement of foreigners.
- The proposed legislation will replace the existing laws
 - The Passport (Entry into India) Act, 1920
 - The Registration of Foreigners Act, 1939
 - The Foreigners Act, 1939; and
 - The Immigration (Carriers' Liability) Act, 2000.
- The proposed legislation also gives the power to the States to restrict or regulate the entry, exit, and movement of foreigners within India.
- The new Bill imposes a penalty up to Rs 5 lakh for unauthorised entry, and up to Rs 10 lakh for false passport.
- The role of universities, hospitals, and other medical institutions admitting the foreign nationals will be specified, along with matters related to passports and visas.



- As per the party decision, DMK contested and won 15 seats in MLA election (Legislative Assembly Election) and 2 seats in Lok Sabha election.
- Anna won in Kanchipuram constituency and went to assembly.
- He started new **English** weekly magazine named "**Home Land (1957)**" and "**Home Rule (1966)**" to spread his ideologies around the world.
- In February 1962 General Election, DMK contested and won 50 seats in Legislative Assembly Election and 7 seats in Lok Sabha Election, despite Anna lost in Legislative Assembly election, later got elected to Rajya Sabha in March 20, 1962.
- As per **16th Amendment Act**, 1963 informally referred to **Anti-secession Bill**, prevented local political leaders in different regions within India from using the electoral process to propagate secession from the Union. This Amendment was passed due to consequences of India-China war in 1962.

Backward Classes Commission of Tan

- Tamil Nadu News**
- The Tamil Nadu government has reconstituted its Backward Classes Commission.
 - Retired Justice R.Thandapani will head the Commission now.
 - It is for ensuring regularity of inclusion and compliance of over-inclusion in the list of Other Backward Classes (OBC).
- Background**
- The first Backward Classes Commission in Tamil Nadu was formed on November 12, 1955 when the DMH was in power.
 - It was known as Backward Classes Commission.
 - Santhanam Commission recommended the incorporation of 'Creamy Layer' among the OBC at the state.
 - In pursuance of the directions of the Supreme Court in the Mandal Commission cases or Indira Sawhney cases in 1992, the State government had constituted a present-day Tamil Nadu Backward Classes Commission.
 - It was formed under the Chairmanship of retired Justice K Shanmugasubramanian in 1995.
 - It is formed under Article 16(4) read with Article 340 of the Constitution of India.

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- As per the order, quotas were announced to maintain temple quotas and given complete power over the administration of temples.
- In 1921, a labour strike erupted in the Buckingham and Carnatic Mills in Madras.
- The strike eventually came to an end in October through the mediation of C. Natesa Mudaliar.
- Gour's Bill, introduced in 1921, brought about an amendment in the Special Marriages Act, sanctioning the legal validity of inter-caste marriages.
- In 1921, the Justice Party government of the Raj of Panagal introduced reservations for backward classes in government jobs.
- In August 1921, the First **Communal** Government Order was passed.
- As per the order, 44 percent of jobs were reserved for non-Brahmins, 16 percent for Brahmins, 16 percent for Muslims, 16 percent for Anglo-Indians and Christians and eight percent for the Scheduled Castes.
- However, this Act did not guarantee adequate quotas for scheduled castes.
- In 1922, MC Rajah passed a resolution demanding that the terms Paraiya and Panchama be dropped from official usage and instead be substituted with Adi-Dravida and Adi-Andhra.

Communal G.O – 1921

- Tamil Nadu News**

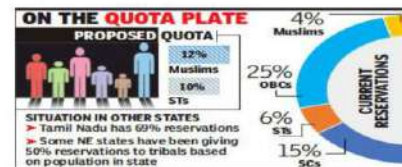
Update in BCs list of Tamil Nadu

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- The Tamil Nadu State government has allowed the delisting of the Thuluvai Vallalar community from Agamudayars in the list of Backward Classes (BCs).
- This marks the end of the 80-year-long "association" of the community with the Agamudayars, who are one of the three constituents of 'Mukhalathars', the other two being Kallars and Maravars.
- The First BC Commission, headed by veteran civil servant A.H. Saranathan, was constituted during November 1969-70.
- This Commission, used the term 'Agamudayars', had received representations that "like the Kallars, Agamudayars also migrated from the southern districts but there is no relation between them and the Agamudayan Shudras and the Thuluvai Vallalar of Madras.
- The Second BC panel (1982-83) was headed by J. A. Annaswami.
- The Second Commission had carried out a caste survey; stated that no separate count of the Thuluvai Vallalar was possible, going by the way they had identified themselves.

- The Supreme Court declined to intervene in a petition filed by 2 successful NECT (National Eligibility cum Entrance Test) candidates from Tamil Nadu.
- According to the petition, the 69% quota was against the fundamental right enshrined in the constitution that no person should be discriminated against in the name of his/her caste, religion, gender, sex, etc.



- The petition argued that the apex court had capped the reservation at 50%.
- Consequently, Tamil Nadu has passed a law enabling 69% reservation. The law was included in the Ninth Schedule of the Constitution.
- The Backward Class Commission, which was directed to assess the justifiability of 69% reservation on objective criteria, filed a report in July 2011.
- The petition said the report was without any objective criteria and simply confirmed the 69% reservation on the basis of the **Ambedkar** Shankar Commission report of 1969.

April 7, 2024 | 43k days | 995 | 0

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- The Tamil Nadu government has told the Madras High Court that 89% of the State's population is already eligible for the 69% reservation provided in the education and public employment.
- Therefore, the State cannot be compelled to implement the additional 10% reservation for others under the category of Economically Weaker Sections (EWS).
- The litigant had sought a direction to the State government to implement the 10% EWS quota for admission to all higher educational institutions in the State.
- 100% door-to-door enumeration of castes and communities in the State was carried out in 1983, following the directions issued by the Supreme Court on October 14, 1982.
- Ambasankar Commission (1983) had revealed that the proportion of socially and educationally backward classes in the State, including the most backward classes and de-notified communities, was 68% of the total populace.
- The 2011 decennial census also found the population of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes in Tamil Nadu to be 20% and 1.1%, respectively.

Youngsters in government jobs and education.

- Besides, the state was also required to conduct the case regarding the 69 per cent reservation for Tamil Nadu, pending before the Supreme Court.
- The Commission is also the first such panel to be put in place in Tamil Nadu since the 1950s.

Tamil Nadu Background

- The First Backward Classes Commission led by A.H. Saranathan in 1969 avoided the pre-independence census data to arrive at population of various castes in Tamil Nadu.
- In 1983, the Second Backward Classes Commission led by J.A. Annaswami conducted caste-wise socio-economic and educational survey through door-to-door enumeration.
- It submitted a report in 1985.
- The state government altered the Tamil Nadu Backward Classes, Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes Act, 1982 to prevent the existing 69% quota.
- It was included in the Ninth Schedule of the Constitution by the 76th Amendment 1994.

- The Retired Madras High Court judge and former chairman of the State Backward Classes Commission, Justice M.S. Janarathanan, passed away.
- He served as a judge of the Madras High Court from 1988 to 1998.
- He also served as the chairman of the State Backward Classes Commission from 2006 to 2015.
- It was on the basis of his recommendations that reservations were implemented for Muslims, Christians, and Arunthathiyars in Tamil Nadu.
- In July 2010, the Supreme Court, provided one year to Tamil Nadu to come out with justification along with quantifiable data for the continuance of the 69% reservation for BC, MBC and SCs/STs.
- Justice Janarathanan, as the head of the State BC Commission, had authored a report in support of the quota scheme, as provided in the Tamil Nadu Act 45 of 1994.

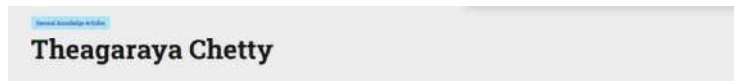

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- The Union Cabinet has approved the "Pradhan Mantri Janjatiya Unnat Gram Abhiyan".
- It aims to improve the socio-economic conditions of tribal communities through schemes convergence.

- Theagaraya Chetty is regarded as one of the founders of the non-Brahmin movement in Tamil Nadu and the first to lead the movement.

Early Life

- Theagaraya Chetty was born in Egathur, Madras Presidency in Telugu speaking Devanga family on 27 April 1852.
- On graduation in 1873, he entered public life and served as a member of the Corporation of Madras from 1882 to 1922.
- He served as a member or Councillor of the Corporation of Madras for 40 years from 1882 till 1922.
- He also served as the President of the Corporation of Madras from 1920 to 1923.
- He was the first non-official President of the Madras Corporation.
- He was elected to the Madras Legislative Council in 1910.
- He was one of the founder-members of the South Indian Chamber of Commerce and served as its President from 1910 to 1921.
- Theagaraya Chetty fought on behalf of the Indian Patriot newspaper and its editor Karunakara Menon against Dr T. M. Nair who later became his close associate.
- Theagaraya Chetty served as a member of the Indian National Congress before founding the South Indian Liberal Federation in 1916.



- The agitation was also supported by Tamil scholars like Maraimalai Adigal, Somasundara Bharathi, K. Appadurai, Madiyarsan, A. P. Viswanatham and Ilakkuvanar.
- Observing an anti-Hindi day on 1 July and 3 December 1938.
- On 21 February 1940, Madras Governor Erskine issued a press communique withdrawing compulsory Hindi teaching and making it optional.

Justice Party – President (1938–1944)

- A political party known as the South Indian Libertarian Federation (commonly referred to as Justice Party) was founded in 1916, principally to oppose the economic and political power of the Brahmin groups.
- The party's goal was to render social justice to the non-Brahmin groups.
- V. Ramasamy took over the leadership of the party in 1938.

Dravidar Kazhagam

- At a rally in Salem under the leadership of Periyar at 1944 Aug 27, Annadurai passed a resolution and declared that the justice party would henceforth be known as the **Dravidar Kazhagam**.
- It focused its attention on the liberation of women, women's education, willing marriage, widow marriage, orphanages and mercy homes.



- The two leaders often clashed at Council meetings even though both were non-Brahmins.
- Natesa Mudaliar realised that if these two leaders could be brought together it would give the Non-Brahmin movement a fast forward push.
- Thus, Natesa Mudaliar was able to reconcile their differences.

Dravidian Movement

- The Madras Non-Brahmin Association was formed in 1909 by two lawyers from Madras city, P. Subramanyam and M. Purushotham Naidu.
- Theagaraya Chetty did not involve himself in the movement until 1912, when the Madras United League was formed.
- It was formed by disaffected non-Brahmin members of the bureaucracy like Saravane Pillai, G. Veerasami Naidu, Doraiswami Naidu and S. Narayanaswami Naidu with C. Natesa Mudaliar as its Secretary.
- Later in 1912 itself (October), Madras United League was renamed as Madras **Dravidian Association**.
- It was the first time the word Dravidian was used for a political entity.
- Panaganti Ramasayaningar, later the Raja of Panagal was elected its President.

- Also, it may review the existing arrangements on financing Disaster Management initiatives and make appropriate recommendations.

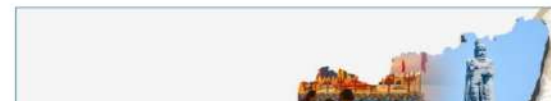

Kilnamandi

Excavation Overview

- Location:** Excavations were conducted in July-August 2023 at Kilnamandi, located in Vandavasi taluk, Tiruvannamalai district, Tamil Nadu.
- Burial Types:** The excavations uncovered a **sarcophagus** placed both in a pit and in a cist.

Iron Objects and Dating

- Iron Objects Found:** A sample collected from a stone circle that entombed a pit burial with **huro**sophagus, along with iron objects, was dated.
- Mean Calibrated Value:** The mean calibrated value for this sample was approximately 1692 BCE.

Significance of the Findings

- Earlier Iron Date:** This finding pushed the date of iron usage in Tamil Nadu a century earlier than the date from Mangadu.
- First Sarcophagus Burial Date:** This AMS 14C date (1692 BCE) marked the first time a **sarcophagus** burial was dated in Tamil Nadu, adding a new layer of understanding to the region's burial practices.

- IIT Guwahati have created a fermentation process that uses ultrasound to safely generate Xylitol from sugarcane bagasse.
- It is the by-product of crushing sugar cane.
- This approach gets over the operational constraints of chemical synthesis and the time lags of traditional fermentation.
- The use of ultrasound during the fermentation process reduced the time of fermentation to 15 hours.

- This is a part of the first trial run to dispose of the 40-year-old waste of Bhopal Gas Tragedy.
- The burning or incineration process takes about 72 hours to complete.
- The process began shortly after the Supreme Court rejected a petition that had challenged the Madhya Pradesh government's plans to dispose 358 tonnes of Union Carbide waste in Pithampur.

- One of the important leaders who fought vigorously against this system was Dr. Muthulakshmi Reddy.

- She was the first woman in India to get a degree in medicine.
- In 1923 her sister died in Cancer. On that day she took a vow to destroy cancer. So, she started cancer Relief Hospital in 1949.

- She was not only interested in medicine but also in politics and social reforms.
- she dedicated herself to the cause of eradicating the cruel practice **Devadasi** system from Tamil Nadu.

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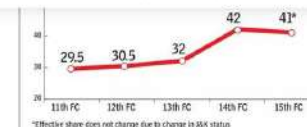

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- The Reserve Bank of India's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) voted unanimously to raise the repo rate by 50 basis points to 4.90%.
- In May 2022, RBI increased the repo rate or short-term lending rate by 40 basis points.
- The RBI's move will increase borrowing costs for those seeking loans to buy cars and homes and MSME firms looking to raise capital.
- The MPC also decided to remain focused on the withdrawal of accommodation which had been provided to support the COVID-19 hit economy.

NITI Aayog reconstitution 2024

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- Union government reconstituted the NITI Aayog, with four full-time members and 15 Union Ministers, as either ex-officio members or special invitees.
- Prime Minister remains the chairperson and economist Suman K. Bery will continue to be the vice-chairperson of NITI Aayog.
- Scientist V.K. Saraswat, agricultural economist Ramesh Chand, paediatrician V.K. Paul and macro-economist Arvind Virmani will also continue to be full-time members.
- The four ex-officio members will be the Union Ministers of Defence, Home, Agriculture and Finance.

Journals and Books- Periyar

- In 1925 May 2, Periyar published a Tamil Weekly under the title "Kudi Arasu" edited by himself to spread the principles of Self-Respect.
- Periyar published an English magazine under the title "Revolt" on 7-11-1928.
- In 1930 Periyar published his book on "Family Planning" (Birth Control) and propagated restriction of number of children.
- In 1933 another magazine 'Puratchi' (Revolution) was published by Periyar.
- Periyar brought out the Tamil weekly 'Pagutharivu' (Rationalism) on 12-1-1934.
- Periyar wrote and published a book titled as "Pen Yenn adimaiyanaal?".
- Justice Party started the Tamil weekly paper "Viduthalai" on 1-6-1935. Then it was entrusted to Periyar who published 'Viduthalai' as Tamil Daily Newspaper from 1-1-1937.
- On 22-01-1950 Periyar was sentenced to undergo imprisonment for the publication of his book 'Ponmozhiyal' (Golden sayings).
- In 1970 The Tamil Bi-monthly, the "Unmai" (Truth) was first started at Tiruchirappalli by Periyar.
- Why I am an Atheist is an essay written by Indian revolutionary Bhagat Singh in 1930 in Lahore. On the request of Periyar E. V. Ramasamy, P. Jeevanandham translated the essay to the Tamil language.

- He could speak three Dravidian languages: Kannada, Telugu and Tamil.

Periyar - Title

- The title "Periyar" was conferred on him by Tamil Nadu Women Conference held in Madras on 13-11-1938 under the presidentship of Neelambigai Ammaiyar daughter of Maraimalai Adigal, a veteran Tamil Scholar. Dr. Dharmambal gave the title of "Periyar" to him.
- The word 'periyar' meaning 'respected one' or 'elder' in Tamil.

Self-respect marriages since 2018

- 12,114 self-respect marriages have been registered in Tamil Nadu since 2018.
- The Self-respect marriages, also called Suyamariyadhai Thirumanam, are generally solemnised in the absence of a priest and without following any of the traditional wedding rituals.
- The registration of self-respect marriages comes under Section 7(A) of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955.
- This Section 7(A) was inserted by the Tamil Nadu Amendment Act, 1967.

- He enacted the Government law for approving **Self Respect Marriage** which took place since 1925.
- During those days, marriages were held under the priest (Brahmins) who recite Sanskrit Mantras to perform weddings, which was strongly opposed by Periyar E.V.R. and introduced a new system of marriage without Mangalaya Suthra (Thali) and reciting Vedic Mantras which was called as Self Respect Marriages.
- Anna introduced Hindu Marriage Amendment Bill in Legislative Assembly session. After this the bill became act and **Self** Respect Marriages got **legal recognition (1967)**.

Menhir and megalithic burial sites

- The Tamil Nadu Department of Archaeology has declared five 'menhir' (single stone) and megalithic burial sites at Kodumanal in Erode district as protected monuments.
- Kodumanal is located on the northern banks of the Noyyal and about 42 km from Erode.
- Potsherds containing names inscribed in Tamil-Brahmi script were found in a large number, apart from Roman silver coins, precious stones and quartz.
- These findings showed that an industrial and trade centre had existed here about 2,000 years ago.
