- ❖ USA President Joe Biden nominated Judge Ketanji Brown Jackson to the U.S. Supreme Court.
 - o She is now the first Black woman elected to serve on the Supreme Court.
- Ukraine has submitted its application against Russia to the International Court of Justice.
- An amount of ₹18,000 crores has been returned to banks from Vijay Mallya, Nirav Modi, and Mehul Choksi.
- ❖ The government of India has launched an evacuation mission named Operation Ganga.
 - o This is to evacuate Indian nationals from Ukraine due to the Russia-Ukraine tension.
- ❖ Indian Wushu player Sadia Tariq has won a gold medal in the junior tournament at the Moscow Wushu Stars Championship 2022.
 - o The 15-year-old Sadia Tariq hails from Srinagar in Jammu & Kashmir.
- ❖ Bangladesh has become the largest recipient of the COVID vaccines donated by the US worldwide via the Covax facility of the WHO.
- ❖ Ilker Ayci has declined the offer of Tata Sons to be the new Air India Chief executive officer.
- ❖ Self-Injury Awareness Day is observed globally on March 1st.
 - o This is to raise awareness about self-harming behaviours such as "cutting" and other intentional methods of self-injury.
- ❖ The President of India, Ram Nath Kovind has inaugurated a newly developed 'Arogya Vanam' at the Rashtrapati Bhavan in New Delhi.
 - o The objective of this Arogya Vanam is to promote the importance of Ayurvedic plants and their effects on the human body.
- ❖ The Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, made the decision to approve 20% FDI via the automatic method in the Life Insurance Corporation.
 - o The government hopes that doing so, will make it easier for India's largest insurer to be disinvested.
- ❖ The Union Minister of State for Education, Annpurna Devi, presented the National Information and Communication Technology (ICT) Awards 2022.
 - The Award was presented to 49 teachers across India.
- ❖ The Global Mobile Economy Report was showcased at the "Mobile World Congress (MWC)" in Barcelona, Spain.





- o The Global Mobile Economy Report shows that the total number of 5G connections globally is likely to reach 1 billion in 2022.
- ❖ The Swiss Air Lines, the subsidiary of Lufthansa, plans to become the world's first airline to use solar fuel.
 - o Lufthansa and Swiss have started the strategic cooperation with the manufacturer Synhelion for market launch.
- ❖ The 'Stree Manoraksha Project' has been launched by the Ministry of Women and Child Development (MoWCD) in collaboration with NIMHANS Bengaluru.
 - This was launched with the aim to improve women's mental health across India.
- ❖ March 4 is observed as World Day of Fight Against Sexual Exploitation every year since 2009.
 - o It is to create awareness against sexual exploitation, which overwhelmingly involves women and children.
- ❖ Sanjiv Kapoor has been appointed as the new Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Jet Airways.
 - o The Jalan Kalrock Consortium is the new promoter of Jet Airways.
- ❖ The Telangana State has ranked the highest in the country among states with a population over 1 crore in terms of growth rate in terms of Per Capita Net State Domestic Product at Current Prices.
 - This is as per the latest data, from the Ministry of Statistics and Program Implementation.
- * Russian forces have seized control of a key port city in southern Ukraine.
 - o Kherson is the first major city to be taken by Russia.
- ❖ Hero MotoCorp has unveiled a new brand "Vida" for its emerging mobility solutions and upcoming electric vehicles.
 - o It has been unveiled in Dubai (Vida means life).
- ❖ India's Shri Nivetha, Esha Singh, and Ruchita Vinerkar have won the gold medal in the women's 10m air pistol team event of the ISSF World Cup in Cairo, Egypt.
 - With this win, India is leading the medal table with three medals, including two gold and silver.
- ❖ The 53rd Raising Day ceremony of the Central Industrial Security Forces (CISF) was organized on March 06, 2022, in Ghaziabad, Uttar Pradesh.
 - o CISF is one of six paramilitary forces in India and functions under the Ministry of Home Affairs with headquarters located at New Delhi.





- ❖ The government has approved the continuation of the Swatantrata Sainik Samman Yojana and its components for the financial years 2021-22 to 2025-26.
 - o Under this scheme, freedom fighters, and their dependents are given financial benefits and pensions.
- Next-Gen 3D Printed Catalysts are developed by researchers at Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology (RMIT) University in Melbourne, Australia.
 - o Their main application of 3D Printed catalysts is solving the overheating challenge in hypersonic aircraft.
- ❖ Dalit Bandhu is the Telangana government's flagship programme.
 - It is a welfare scheme for empowering Dalit families of the state and enabling entrepreneurship among them through a Rs 10 lakh direct benefit transfer per family.
- ❖ India's first 100 percent women-owned industrial park named FLO Industrial Park was opened in Hyderabad, Telangana.
- Chief Minister M.K. Stalin said the allotment of houses by the Tamil Nadu Urban Habitat Development Board will henceforth be made in the name of woman heads of the family.
 - o Tamil Nadu Urban Habitat Development Board was formerly the Slum Clearance Board.
- ❖ The University of Madras announced an award in the name of Veeramangai Velu Nachiyar to be presented to deserving girl students of the university.
- ❖ The Hindu Group has been named the 'Publisher of the Year' for the second consecutive year at the WAN-IFRA South Asian Digital Media Awards 2021.
 - The World Association of News Publishers is the global organization of the world's press.
- ❖ Andy Murray said that he would donate his prize money from tennis tournaments for the rest of the year to UNICEF's Ukraine appeal.
- ❖ Andhra Pradesh has retained its number one spot in the SKOCH State of Governance rankings for the second consecutive year.
 - o The second rank was bagged by West Bengal and Odisha was ranked 3.
- ❖ In a first-of-its-kind initiative, the National Highway for Electric Vehicle (NHEV) is constructing a green charging hub along the Jaipur-Delhi-Agra E-highway.
 - NHEV is an organization for promoting the electrification of the country's transportation systems.
- * Reliance Industries Limited announced the opening of the Jio World Centre in Mumbai.





- o It is set to act as a business, commerce, and cultural destination.
- ❖ Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar has said his government would revive its longpending demand for the inclusion of Bhojpuri in the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.
 - o The state cabinet had sent a proposal to the Centre in this regard in 2017.
- ❖ Famous Golfer, Tiger Woods from USA was formally inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame.
- ❖ Debasish Panda has been appointed as the chairman of the Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI).
 - o He is a former financial services secretary.
- ❖ The Union Minister for MSME, Narayan Rane has announced the MSME Innovative Scheme (Incubation, Design, and IPR) as well as the MSME IDEA HACKATHON 2022.
 - He claims that these programmes will assist entrepreneurs in launching new businesses.
- ❖ The Assam government has extended the Armed Forces (Special Powers) Act, 1958 (AFSPA) in the state for six more months.
 - o The notification came into effect on February 28.
- ❖ Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar while presenting the state budget, has announced a 'Sushma Swaraj Award' for women.
 - o The award is given for their significant achievements or contribution to different walks of life in the international and national spheres.
- ❖ The Bolivian soldier Mario Terán Salazar died at the age of 80 in Santa Cruz de la Sierra in eastern Bolivia.
 - o He was who claimed to have killed the Argentine-Cuban guerrilla Ernesto "Che" Guevara in 1967.
- Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw will inaugurate the 3rd edition of the NIC Tech Conclave 2022.
- ❖ The Kerala government has put aside Rs 1 million to construct a memorial to MS Viswanathan.
- ❖ The 11th edition of the Khel Mahakumbh was started at Sardar Patel Stadium in Ahmedabad by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.
 - This edition of the Khel Mahakumbh includes 36 general sports and 26 parasports.
- ❖ Jammu and Kashmir Bank (J&K Bank) was honored with the "National Award for Outstanding Performance for FY 2020-21".

- ❖ The first Virtual Smart Grid Knowledge Centre of India was inaugurated in Manesar, Haryana.
- ❖ For the first time, India's equity market reached the world's fifth position in terms of market capitalization.
 - o At present India is ranked 5th, after the U.S., China, Japan, and Hong Kong.
- ❖ The chairman of Tata Sons, N Chandrasekaran has been appointed as the chairman of Air India.
 - o In February 2022, N Chandrasekaran was reappointed as chairman of Tata Sons for a second term of five years.
- ❖ Indian Shuttler Lakshya Sen has settled for silver in the men's singles final at the German Open 2022.
 - He lost to Kunlavut Vitidsarn of Thailand.
- ❖ The Karnataka High Court dismissed various petitions challenging a ban on hijab in educational institutions.
 - The High Court, in its judgment also stated that wearing the hijab is not an essential religious practice of Islam.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu chief minister M K Stalin announced that a mega book park would be established in the state.
 - The government will identify land for the same and extend necessary support to create the park.
- ❖ Chennai will host the 44th Chess Olympiad in July this year.
 - o The International Chess Federation (FIDE) Council had decided to shift the venue of the event out of Moscow.
- * Rashtriya Indian Military College, for the first time in its history of 100-years, will induct girls cadets from July 2022.
 - o Five girl cadets are set to join the college in 2022.
- ❖ Mahanadi Coalfields Limited (MCL) has announced that it has become the country's largest coal producer.
 - o In the financial year 2021-22, the company reported it produced 157 million tonnes of coal.

 - o The word green in the plaque signifies their commitment to sustainable development and saving the environment.
- ❖ Union Minister Nitin Gadkari has inaugurated the advanced Green Hydrogen Fuel Cell Electric Vehicle Toyota Mirai at New Delhi.
 - o Toyota Mirai is India's first Fuel Cell Electric Vehicle (FCEV), which is completely powered by Hydrogen.
- ❖ Indian Space Research Organization has successfully completed the ground test of the solid fuel-based booster stage of its new Small Satellite Launch Vehicle.
 - o It was done at Satish Dhawan Space Centre Sriharikota at Andhra Pradesh.
- ❖ The International Court of Justice ordered Russia to stop the military actions in Ukraine.
 - o Russia started it on 24 February.
- ❖ The foundation stone for the International Arbitration and Mediation Centre in Hyderabad was laid by Chief Justice of India N.V.Ramana.
 - o IAMC-Hyderabad is India's first arbitration center for alternative dispute resolution.

 - o The 105-meter offshore patrol vessel [OPV] has been designed and built indigenously by Goa Shipyard Limited.

 - o Banco Central de Chile is the name of the central bank of Chile.
- ❖ North Korea has test-fired an intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM) named Hwasong-17.
 - o This missile is the world's largest liquid-fuelled ICBM.
- ❖ The annual Mangaluru Kambala's fifth edition will be held on the grounds of Goldfinch City in Bangra Kulur.
 - o It is a buffalo race held annually in Karnataka.
- * 'Rape is rape, be it by man or husband' said the Karnataka HC on marital rape.
 - The Karnataka High Court said that marriage is not a license for 'unleashing a brutal beast'

Palk Bay Dugong Reserve

- ❖ Tamil Nadu government has begun work to set up the first Dugong Conservation Reserve of India in the Palk Bay region.
- ❖ Dugongs are endangered species and are protected under the Wildlife Protection Act's, 1972 Schedule 1.
- ❖ The size of the reserve will be spread over around 500 sq km and will be located in Palk Bay's northern part from Adiramapattinam to Amapattinam.
- Dugongs are also known as Sea Cows.







Ungalil Oruvan

- * Rahul Gandhi, leader of Congress, has released the autobiography of DMK president and Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin.
- ❖ "Ungalil Oruvan" (One Among You) is the name of that autobiography.
- ❖ The book's first copy was received by state Water Resources Minister and senior DMK leader Duraimurugan.
- ❖ MK Stalin is the 8th chief minister of Tamil Nadu.



Ambulance for street animals



- ❖ India's first ambulance for street animals has been launched in Chennai, Tamil Nadu.
- ❖ It has been started by the Blue Cross of India in collaboration with the international animal welfare organization "Four Paw".
- ❖ The Stray Animal Care programme will be a "hospital on wheels" with an onboard veterinarian to provide on-site treatment to injured and sick street animals.





Naan Mudhalvan scheme



- ❖ Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Stalin inaugurated the 'Naan Mudhalvan' scheme.
- ❖ It aims to equip about 10 lakh youth across the State annually with skills that will help them realize their talents for the benefit of the country.
- ❖ The scheme aims to identify, train and offer career and academic guidance to talented students in government-run and State-aided educational institutions.

Oath of administration



- ❖ The swearing-in ceremony of 200 councilors of Greater Chennai Corporation was done with Commissioner Gagandeep Singh Bedi administering the oath of office/affirmation.
- ❖ There were 102 women and 98 men councilors.

Mayor of Chennai

- ❖ Twenty-nine-year-old R Priya of the DMK will be the first Dalit woman to hold the post of Mayor of Chennai.
- Priya will be Chennai's third woman mayor after Tara Cherian and Kamakshi Jayaraman.





- ❖ Priya will be taking over as councilor of ward 74, Mangalapuram.
- ❖ She is also the first mayor from North Chennai.



Top borrower state - TN

- ❖ The Tamil Nadu government has been the top borrower among States in the current fiscal 2022.
- ❖ Overall, the State has raised ₹65,400 crores through the issuance of bonds called State Development Loans (SDLs) in April-February 2022.
- ❖ It is about 18% lower than the ₹79,500 crore raised during the same period in fiscal 2021.
- ❖ After Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra, Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh, and West Bengal are the top borrowing States.

Rectangular ivory dice




- ❖ A rectangular dice made of ivory measuring 4.5 cm was recovered during the eighth phase of archaeological excavations in Keeladi.
- ❖ This is the first time that the Tamil Nadu State Department of Archaeology has stumbled upon a rectangular dice after it took over the excavations from the fourth phase in Keeladi.





❖ However, rectangular and cubical dices made of ivory and terracotta were found in the first two phases of the Keeladi excavation.

Rare depression in the Bay of Bengal



- ❖ A rare weather phenomenon of depression in March is unfolding over the Bay of Bengal.
- ❖ The approaching weather system set a new record as such depressions that are considered unusual in March.
- ❖ In the past 130 years, the Bay of Bengal has churned two depressions in March.
- ❖ It was in 1938 and 1994.

Liquor shops

- ❖ The State government informed the Madras High Court of having amended the Tamil Nadu Liquor Retail Vending (In Shops and Bars) Rules of 2003.
- ❖ These rules were framed under the Tamil Nadu Prohibition Act of 1937.
- ❖ This makes it mandatory for Collectors to consider objections received with regard to the location of liquor shops before approving the location.
- ❖ As per the amendment to this Rule, no State-run liquor shop should commence business unless the location of the shop had been approved by the Collector.


Reservation to transgenders

- ❖ The Madras High Court strongly recommended to the Tamil Nadu government to provide a specified percentage of special reservation for the Transgenders/Third Genders (TGs) in future public employments.
- ❖ This was recommended apart from other relaxations and concessions extended to the socially and economically backward classes.





- While granting any reservation, concessions, and relaxations to the TGs, the State government shall take into account the ratio adopted for granting similar privileges to the other socially and economically backward classes and
- ❖ It needs to adopt a similar method for determining these privileges for the Transgenders.



Mayor election

- ❖ In Tamil Nadu, 12,800 newly elected urban civic body ward councilors took the oath of office.
- ❖ Indirect elections for the posts of Mayors and Deputy Mayors of municipal corporations, Chairperson and Vice-Chairpersons of municipalities, and town panchayats were held across the State on March 4.
- ❖ This is the first time that the 21 municipal corporations, 138 municipalities, and 489 town panchayats have elected representatives after a gap of six years.
- Of the 20 Mayor posts, DMK Government has allotted 11 to women and 9 to men.

Overall Installed Renewable Capacity - TN

- ❖ According to the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy, Tamil Nadu (TN) has achieved the first position in overall installed renewable energy capacity in India surpassing Karnataka.
- ❖ As of 31st January 2022, TN's total installed renewable capacity stood at 15,914 MegaWatt.
- ❖ Karnataka's total clean energy capacity was 15,795 MW.
- ❖ In recent years, Tamil Nadu has increased its capacity across solar and wind segments to regain its top position against Karnataka.

Excavation at Maligaimedu

❖ A broken piece of bracelet made of gold and copper, a brick structure, and Chinese potsherds were unearthed in Ariyalur.





- ❖ These were found during the second phase of excavation at the southern part of Maligaimedu near Gangaikondacholapuram.
- ❖ The broken bracelet, weighing 7.920 grams and 4 mm thick, and made of copper and gold was the first remnant excavated from the site.
- ❖ Objects made of gold and other metals combined indicate that there was a royal palace here.



Women to head Avadi Police Commissionerate

- ❖ To recognize the role played by women personnel on the occasion of International Women's Day, women officers will be given charge of all police stations under the Avadi Police Commissionerate for a day.
- ❖ For the first time in India, all police stations in a Commissionerate will be headed by women officers.
- ❖ This initiative is to recognize, honor, celebrate and cherish the role of women in our uniformed services.







India's first furniture park

- ❖ Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin laid the foundation stone for India's first international furniture park at Thoothukudi in Tamil Nadu.
- ❖ The park seeks to create a better ecosystem to meet 70-80 percent of the raw material demand.



Floating solar project in Tamilnadu



- ❖ A floating solar project at Thoothukudi in Tamil Nadu has been set up by leading fertilizer manufacturer Southern Petrochemical Industries Corporation Ltd.
- ❖ The unit is claimed to be India's largest and first floating power plant in Tamil Nadu.
- Greenam Energy, a wholly-owned subsidiary of AM International, owns this project.
- ❖ Yearly, this plant can generate 42.0 million units of electricity.





Bail granted to Perarivalan



- ❖ The Supreme Court has granted bail to Rajiv Gandhi assassination convict AG Perarivalan.
- ❖ Perarivalan is serving a life sentence in connection with the Rajiv Gandhi assassination case.
- ❖ He has served 32 years in prison till now.
- ❖ In 2014, his death sentence and that of two others, Murugan and Santhan (both Sri Lankan Tamils), was commuted to life over the long pendency of their mercy petitions by the Apex court.
- ❖ The Council of Ministers of the Government of Tamil Nadu had recommended Perarivalan's release on September 9, 2018 to the Governor under Article 161 (pardoning power) of the Indian Constitution.

Entry of domesticated cattle into forest areas

- ❖ The Madras High Court has directed the Forest Department not to allow any domesticated cattle to venture into the forest areas across Tamil Nadu for grazing.
- ❖ The verdict aimed at reserving the forests only for wild animals and preventing multiple threats faced by them owing to the entry of domestic cattle.

Avvaiyar Award 2022

- ❖ Chief Minister M.K. Stalin presented the Avvaiyar Award for 2022 to social worker Girija Kumarbabu.
- ❖ This was in recognition of her service towards the welfare of women and children.
- **❖** The Avvaiyar Award includes an eight-gram gold medal, a cheque for ₹1 lakh, a shawl, and a citation.





- ❖ Mr. Stalin also handed over the 'Bharat Ratna Dr. M.G.R. Traditional Rice Variety Conservator Award' for 2020-21.
- ❖ It was awarded to S. Moorthy from Namakkal district, K. Ponnu Puthiyavan from Tirunelveli district, and P. Lakshmi Devi from Tirunelveli district.



Chief Minister's fellowship programme

Research will be done in 12 areas to: 1) augment water resources, 2) increase agricultural production and create marketing linkages, 3) provide housing for all, 4) improve educational standards, 5) boost health indicators, 6) achieve social inclusion, 7) upgrade infrastructure and facilitate industrial development, 8) provide skill development and entrepreneurship development, 9) facilitate institutional credit, 10) protect heritage and culture, 11) achieve ecological balance and 12) enhance data governance.

- ❖ The State government has issued orders for implementing Tamil Nadu Chief Minister's Fellowship Programme (TNCMFP) during 2022-24.
- ❖ 24 persons would get the fellowship for researching in 12 identified thematic areas.
- TNCMFP aims to create a pool of knowledgeable and action-oriented resources to work on policy efficacy, identify gaps, build internationally referred benchmarks for policy and programme outcomes.
- ❖ Bharathidasan Institute of Management in Tiruchi has been proposed to be the academic partner for the fellowships.





Tamilnadu Petroproducts Ltd



- ❖ Tamilnadu Petroproducts Ltd. (TPL) has received the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) certification for its product linear alkylbenzene (LAB) from the Department of Chemicals & Petrochemicals, Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers.
- ❖ With the BIS certification, TPL emerges as the only authorized seller of LAB in the Indian market.
- ❖ It has also become the world's first LAB manufacturer accredited with BIS 12795:2020 certification.

Property registrations in Tamil Nadu

- ❖ The Revenue from property registrations touched a new high, with 12,700 crore revenue generated till the second week of March this fiscal.
- ❖ This is a leap with respect to revenues of 1,672 crores and 2,057 crores in 2019-20 and 2020-21.
- ❖ Chennai and Coimbatore zones have together contributed around 60% of the total income.
- ❖ The Chennai zone comprising the city, Chengalpet, Kancheepuram, and Tiruvallur districts contributed about 45% of the total income.


Spotted Royal butterfly

- The Spotted Royal (Tajuria maculata) butterfly was rediscovered again in the Nilgiris district.
- ❖ It has not been recorded in the Nilgiris for over a century.





- ❖ It was rediscovered by members of the Wynter-Blyth Association (WBA).
- ❖ It is known to occur in the Northeast of India.
- ❖ The Spotted Royal lives close to its host plant, which is native Loranthus species.



Tamil Nadu Covid-19 death

- ❖ After almost two years, Tamil Nadu reported no Covid-19 death on March 11th.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu has so far reported 38,023 Covid deaths since March 2020.
- ❖ The state recorded the first death on March 25 of 2020 in the Government Rajaji General Hospital in Madurai.

Ice cream factory







- ❖ Tamil Nadu Chief Minister opened a new ice cream factory at Aavin Dairy in Madurai.
- ❖ On behalf of the National Dairy Board, he opened a new ice cream plant with a production capacity of 30,000 liters.
- ❖ The plant here is the second for Aavin in Tamil Nadu after Chennai.

Advanced robotic surgery center



- Chief Minister M.K.Stalin inaugurated an advanced robotic surgery center at the Tamil Nadu Government Multi Super Speciality Hospital (TNGMSSH), Omandurar Estate.
- ❖ The robotic system with two consoles was procured through Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation
- ❖ The da Vinci robotic surgery system installed at TNGMSSH was an advanced form of minimally invasive surgery system.
- * Robotic surgery would enable surgeons to perform complex major surgeries with ease by using robotic instruments.
- ❖ The installation is the first in a State-owned government set-up in the country.

Tamil Nadu Data Policy

- ❖ Aiming to harness data for effective decision-making, the Tamil Nadu government has formulated the Tamil Nadu Data Policy, 2022.
- ❖ It is expected to support policy-making, improve implementation of schemes, encourage value-added services, improve access to and quality of services.






- ❖ A State-level empowered data governance committee, headed by the Chief Secretary, would provide strategic guidance for the data policy framework.
- ❖ A data inter-departmental committee, headed by the Chief Executive Officer of Tamil Nadu e-Governance Agency (TNeGA), would make the operational-level decisions emanating from the policy.
- ❖ The CEO of the TNeGA would be the State's Chief Data Officer.



Tamilnadu budget - highlights



- ❖ Tamil Nadu Finance Minister Palanivel Thiaga Rajan presented the General Budget for 2022-23 in the House on March 18, 2022.
- ❖ This is the second Budget of the DMK government.
- It was presented as an e-budget.
- ❖ A separate organization will be set up for Climate Change and green initiatives.
- ❖ The Government announces 'Project Nilgiri Tahr' to protect & conserve the 'State Animal' of Tamil Nadu.
- ❖ All girl students in Tamil Nadu who studied from classes 6 to 12 in Government schools will be paid Rs.1,000/- per month directly into their bank account till the





uninterrupted completion of their undergraduate degree, diploma, and ITI courses.

- ❖ A Mobile information centers would be launched for migrant workers.
- ❖ New museums will be built this year in Villupuram and Ramanathapuram districts.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu will launch the 'Perasiriyar Anbazhagan School Development Scheme' to modernize the government schools.
- ❖ The State Startup Hub Centre with all facilities will be established by the Tamil Nadu Industrial Development Corporation at Nandambakkam, Chennai.

Mina Swaminathan

- ❖ Mina Swaminathan, a childcare expert, died due to the old age.
- ❖ She was at 89.
- ❖ She is the wife of agricultural scientist M S Swaminathan.



Tamilnadu Budget 2022 - highlights

- ❖ The revenue deficit has been brought down by ₹ 7,000 crores from 4.61 per cent to 3.80 per cent.
- ❖ The revenue deficit which has been going up in an alarming trend since 2014 will be reversed this year.
- ❖ The revised budget estimate had pegged the revenue deficit at ₹58,692.68 crores for 2021-22.
- Tamil Nadu's outstanding debt as of 31st March 2023 will be ₹6,53,348.73 crore.
- ❖ This constitutes 26.29% of Gross State Domestic Product in 2022-23.
- ❖ The fiscal deficit also will see a reduction from 4.61 per cent last year to 3.8 per cent.





❖ For the third consecutive year, the school education department has been accorded the highest allocation in the State Budget, at Rs 36,895.89 crore.



Important initiatives

- ❖ The earlier 'Thalikku Thangam' scheme, which provided gold and financial assistance for women's marriages, has been reshaped into a higher education assurance scheme.
- ❖ ₹5 crores have been allocated to translate Periyar's writings and works in other languages.
- ❖ To provide quality mental health services, the government has planned to establish a Tamil Nadu Institute of Mental Health & Neuro Sciences, by upgrading the Institute of Mental Health (IMH), Kilpauk, Chennai.
- ❖ The New museums will be built this year in Villupuram and Ramanathapuram districts at an estimated cost of ₹10 crores.
- ❖ It has decided to set up a Children's Nature Park to house birds, butterflies and animals by remodelling the Guindy Children's Park.
- ❖ The State government has allocated ₹10 crores towards upgrading the disaster early warning system in Chennai.
- This is the first such initiative set up by the state government in India.
- ❖ To motivate government school students to aspire to join premier higher education institutions like IIT, IISC & AIIMS, the Tamil Nadu government will bear the full cost of undergraduate education of students who studied in government schools from classes 6-12.
- ❖ The Tamil Nadu government will revive and implement the Maduravoyal Chennai Port Elevated Corridor Project.
- ❖ The Special Social Media Monitoring Cells would be set up in the state.
- It is to battle fake news and misinformation on social media platforms





- ❖ In order to commemorate the 200th birth anniversary of a famous Tamil saint and poet Ramalinga Adigal, or Vallalar, the government will launch 'Vallalar Palluyir Kappagangal' scheme, that will help NGOs take care of abandoned animals.
- ❖ The tribal on-site museum at Courtallam in Tenkasi district, the pre-historic onsite museum at Poondi in Tiruvallur district and the Hero-Stone on-site museum in Dharmapuri district will be upgraded.
- ❖ Under the 'Climate-Friendly Modernisation of Buses in Major Cities of Tamil Nadu' Project being implemented with Germany's KfW bank assistance, 2,213 BS-VI new diesel buses and 500 new electric buses will be procured.

MSME sector

- ❖ It has hiked the allocation for Micro, Small and Medium-scale Enterprises (MSMEs) Department by almost 48%.
- ❖ With a view of helping micro enterprises' clusters, it would launch a new "Micro Cluster Development Programme".
- ❖ The Budget has announced an allocation of ₹50 crores for the development of 20 microclusters, including artificial jewellery making by Narikuruvars in Kancheepuram district, toy cluster in Madurai district, the cookware cluster in Tirunelveli district and cashew processing cluster in Cuddalore district.
- ❖ Tamil Nadu Coir Business Development Corporation will be set up in Coimbatore.
- The government would set up new industrial parks in Coimbatore, Perambalur, Madurai, Vellore and Tiruvallur districts to promote widespread industrial development.
- ❖ For the manufacturing of electronic products, two exclusive clusters will be established at Pillaipakkam and Manallur.

- It is handmade in Narasingapettai village in Thanjavur, unlike the other machinemade ones.
- ❖ Artisans of the nagaswaram choose the wood wisely.
- ❖ It is a type of ebony, ensuring it is 200 years old.
- ❖ The reeds are made from the leaves of a locally grown plant called 'naanal' (a variety of bamboo).



Multi-specialty hospital







- Chief Minister MK Stalin laid the foundation stone for a multi-specialty hospital in Guindy.
- ❖ A Foundation stone laying ceremony for the construction of a 1,000-bed multispecialty hospital building at the King Institute premises in Chennai was held.

Green Fellowship programme

- ❖ The Tamil Nadu government has launched a Green Fellowship programme.
- ❖ This is to actively involve youth in initiatives for climate change adaptation and mitigation activities.

President's Fleet Review 2022








- ❖ The Eastern Naval Command, Visakhapatnam hosted the President's Fleet Review 2022.

- ❖ For medical professionals, scientists, and technicians in medical, dental, and paramedical institutes, the Union health ministry has launched the ICMR/ DHR Policy on Biomedical Innovation and Entrepreneurship.
- This Policy will ensure multi-disciplinary collaboration, promote start-up culture, and develop an innovation-led ecosystem at Medical Institutes across the country by promoting Make-in-India, Start-Up-India, and Atmanirbhar Bharat initiatives.



New Development Bank



- ❖ New Development Bank (NDB) will become the first multilateral agency to open an office in the Gujarat International Finance Tech City (Gift).
- ❖ The Indian office will help identify suitable projects and try to create a pipeline of potential financing for the bank.
- ❖ NDB also expects to partner with the newly launched National Bank for Financing Infrastructure and Development (NBFID) to support crucial infrastructure projects in India.





'Hit and Run' Solatium



- ❖ The Road Transport and Highways Ministry have decided to increase the compensation to the kin of hit-and-run victims by eight times to Rs 2 lakh in case of death starting April 1.
- ❖ The solatium for a person who suffers serious injuries in a hit-and-run case would be increased from Rs 12,500 to Rs 50,000.

Fresh fruits export



- ❖ Fresh fruits export from India has witnessed a major growth.
- ❖ The major destinations of exports of fresh fruits include the Netherlands, Bangladesh, the UK, the UAE, Iran, Nepal, Saudi Arabia, Russia, Qatar, and Oman.
- ❖ In April-January 2021-22, guava exports have risen to USD 2.09 million against USD 0.58 million recorded in April-January 2013-14.





❖ Paneer (Indian cottage cheese) and Curd (yogurt) exports have increased as well, to USD 30 million in April–January 2021-22 from USD 10 million in April–January 2013-14.

Cobra Warrior 22 - India withdraws



- ❖ The Indian Air Force (IAF) has decided not to send its aircraft to the multilateral air exercise 'Cobra Warrior-22' in the United Kingdom.
- This is due to the deepening crisis in Ukraine, arising out of the Russian military attack in that country.
- ❖ The exercise is scheduled to take place from March 6 to 27, 2022, at Waddington in the United Kingdom.

International Monsoons Project Office

- ❖ On the occasion of National Science Day 2022, the government has launched an International Monsoons Project Office.
- ❖ The IMPO was set up to highlight the importance of monsoons for the economy of the nation.
- ❖ It will work under the leadership of the World Climate Research Programme and the World Weather Research Programme.
- ❖ IMPO would identify and foster as well as include connections and activities which will be related to international monsoon research.
- ❖ Initially, for five years, the International Monsoons Project Office (IMPO) will be based at the Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology (IITM) in Pune.







Bilateral Swap Arrangement



- ❖ Japan and India have renewed the Bilateral Swap Arrangement.
- ❖ The size of it is up to USD 75 billion.
- ❖ The BSA is a two-way arrangement where both authorities can swap their local currencies in exchange for the US Dollar.
- ❖ The actual Bilateral Swap Arrangement (BSA) was signed between the Bank of Japan and the Reserve Bank of India in 2018.

Indo-Belgian diplomatic ties

- ❖ A special logo was unveiled to commemorate 75 years of diplomatic relations between India and Belgium.
- ❖ Belgium was among the first European countries to set up a bilateral relationship with India.
- The logo is a peacock.
- ❖ National flags of both the national, have also been symbolized on either side of the peacock.
- ❖ India is the second-largest importer of and fifth-largest exporter of Belgian products.





National Gender Index



- ❖ The NITI Aayog is in the process to develop a National Gender Index.
- ❖ The objective of the National Gender Index is to measure the progress and identify the persisting gaps in gender equality to make informed policy decisions.
- ❖ It will serve as a tool to map the progress of India's States and UTs on defined gender metrics and build the foundation for positive change.
- ❖ The information was released in the Annual Report 2021-22 of NITI Aayog.

Women's Day Week

- ❖ The Women and Child Development Ministry celebrates the International Women's Day week from the 1st of March as an Iconic Week as a part of Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsay.
- ❖ This will mark an occasion to celebrate the progress made towards achieving gender equity and women's empowerment.
- ❖ On 3rd March 2022, the theme for the celebration was 'Women of Tomorrow'.
- ❖ On 8th March, Nari Shakti Puraskaar will be given.
- ❖ And the International Women's Day Conference for Women Police Delegates from all States and UTs will also be organized.

National Conclave on Social Enterprises for Garbage Free Cities



- "The National Flag shall be made of hand-spun and hand-woven or machine-made, cotton, polyester, wool, silk khadi bunting" is what the latest revision acknowledged.







State of India's Environment Report 2022



- ❖ The State of India's Environment Report, 2022 of the Centre for Science and Environment was released by Union Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav.
- ❖ According to this report, India's ranking has slipped due to substantial challenges in 11 SDGs such as zero hunger, good health and wellbeing, gender equality, and sustainable cities and communities.
- ❖ India has dropped three places from last year's ranking of 117 to 120.
- ❖ The overall Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) score of India was 66 out of 100.
- ❖ According to the report, the states that are least prepared to meet the SDGs by the target year of 2030 are Jharkhand and Bihar.
- ❖ The report also stated that among the states Kerala topped, with Tamil Nadu and Himachal Pradesh coming in second and third, respectively.
- ❖ According to the report, Chandigarh topped among the Union Territories.

- ❖ Indian Air Force (IAF) will conduct the Exercise Vayu Shakti that will take place at Pokharan range in Jaisalmer, Rajasthan.
- ❖ Prime Minister Narendra Modi will be the Chief Guest of this event.






- ❖ A total of 148 aircraft of the Indian Air Force (IAF) will participate in this exercise.

National Innovation Conclave on Low Carbon Technologies



- ❖ It is being organized jointly by IIT Roorkee and the National Institute of Hydrology.
- The Conclave 2022 would focus on understanding water security and its multiple facets supporting sustainable water resource management as a key component of social development.
- ❖ The conclave focuses on the theme of "Water Security for Sustainable Development".

'Relief and Rehabilitation of Migrants and Repatriates' Scheme

- ❖ Under the "Relief and Rehabilitation of Migrants and Repatriates scheme", Central Government has approved the proposal for the continuation of seven existing sub-schemes for the period 2021-22 to 2025-26.
- ❖ This approval seeks to ensure that assistance under the Umbrella Scheme, continues to reach beneficiaries through the Ministry of Home Affairs.
- ❖ The scheme enables repatriates and migrants, who have suffered due to displacement, to earn a reasonable income as well as to facilitate their inclusion in mainstream economic activities.

Pew Center report on gender roles

- The Pew Research Centre recently published its report on gender roles.
- ❖ The survey results were based on a face-to-face survey of 29,999 Indian adults in 2019 and 2020.





- ❖ As per the report, Indian adults universally say that it is important for women to have the same rights as men and 8 out of 10 men say it is very important.
- ❖ 80% of men agree that "when there are few jobs, men should have more rights than women".



Sagar Parikrama Program

- ❖ The Sagar Parikrama Program will be inaugurated by Union Minister for Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying Parshottam Rupala.
- ❖ This program has been organized by The Department of Fisheries, and the National Fisheries Development Board along with the Department of Fisheries, Indian Coast Guard, Fishery Survey of India, Gujarat Maritime Board, and fishermen representatives.
- It is a navigation journey that will take place in all coastal states/UTs along a pre-decided sea route to show unity with all fishermen, fish farmers, and other stakeholders.
- ❖ The focus of Sagar Parikrama will be on the sustainable balance between the livelihood of coastal fisher communities and the usage of marine fisheries resources for the nation's food security.







Swachh Survekshan




- ❖ The Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs launched Swachh Survekshan.
- ❖ It is the seventh consecutive edition of the world's largest urban cleanliness survey.
- ❖ Swachh Survekshan 2022 is designed to capture initiatives of cities for the welfare and well-being of frontline sanitation workers, with the notion of 'People First' as its driving philosophy.

Smart Managed EV Charging Station

- ❖ A subsidiary of Reliance Infrastructure, SES Yamuna Power Limited (BYPL) has commissioned India's first 'Smart Managed EV Charging Station' in New Delhi.
- ❖ BYPL is backed by Bombay Suburban Electric Supply (BSES).
- ❖ It will be the first-ever BYPL managed Smart EV Charging Station.
- ❖ The smart-managed EV charging station can charge five Electric vehicles at the same time.

National Mission for Clean Ganga







- National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) has been awarded the 'Special Jury Award' at the 7th India Industry Water Conclave and the 9th edition of the FICCI Water Awards.
- ❖ NMCG has been awarded for its effort in reviving River Ganga and bringing about a paradigm shift in water management.
- ❖ G Asok Kumar was appointed as the new Director-General of the National Mission for Clean Ganga.

National War Memorial

- ❖ National War Memorial's 3rd anniversary was observed on February 25, 2022.
- ❖ The National War Memorial was dedicated to the nation by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on February 25, 2019.
- ❖ The National War Memorial is India's first war memorial built to honor all the soldiers who fought in armed conflicts of independent India.
- ❖ The memorial memorializes the soldiers who martyred during the Indo-China War in 1962, the Indo-Pakistan wars in 1947, 1965 and 1971 and the Kargil war in 1999.



India and the Netherlands - 75 years

- ❖ The 75th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations between India and the Netherlands is being commemorated this year.
- ❖ A logo was released to commemorate the occasion.
- ❖ The logo features the national flowers of both the countries, the lotus, and the tulip.
- ❖ The chakra in the heart of the logo represents our friendship.
- ❖ The flag colors emphasize the ties that exist between Indians and Dutch people.







Health Heritage Walk

- ❖ The health heritage walks were held during the Jan Aushadhi Diwas weeklong celebrations in 10 cities.
- ❖ This is to spread the message of wellbeing from physical exercise and walking, as well as to spread the message of affordable and quality generic medications which can be availed from Janaushadhi Kendras.

Host Country Agreement



- ❖ The Government of India has signed the Host Country Agreement with International Telecommunication Union (ITU).
- This is for the establishment of an Area Office & Innovation Centre of ITU in New Delhi.
- ❖ The Area Office and Innovation Centre of ITU at New Delhi will serve South Asian countries comprising Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Iran, Maldives, Nepal, Sri Lanka, and India.

Pune Metro Rail Project

❖ The Prime Minister of India Narendra Modi has inaugurated Pune Metro Rail Project.





- ❖ Pune Metro is the first metro project in the country to have Aluminum body coaches.
- ❖ These are indigenously manufactured under the Make in India policy.
- ❖ PM Modi also unveiled the statue of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj at the premises of the Pune Municipal Corporation.



SLINEX 2022

- ❖ The ninth edition of the Indian and Sri Lankan Navy bilateral maritime exercise SLINEX (Sri Lanka–India Naval Exercise) was held at Visakhapatnam.
- ❖ The exercise is conducted in two phases.
- ❖ The Harbour Phase took place at Visakhapatnam and the Sea Phase will take place in the Bay of Bengal.
- ❖ In October 2020, the previous edition of SLINEX was conducted in Trincomalee.







HANSA-NG

- ❖ 'HANSA-NG', successfully completed the sea-level trials at Puducherry.
- ❖ It is India's first indigenously developed Flying Trainer.
- ❖ HANSA-NG was flown from Bengaluru to Puducherry covering a distance of 140 nautical miles in 1.5 hours at a cruising speed of 155 km/hr.
- ❖ The aircraft has been designed and developed by CSIR-National Aerospace Laboratories (NAL), under the aegis of the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR).



Floating storage and regasification unit


- ❖ H-Jaigarh Energy's Terminal in Maharashtra has received India's first floating storage and regasification unit (FSRU).
- ❖ On April 12, 2021, the FSRU Hoegh Giant arrived at Jaigarh Terminal in Maharashtra after sailing from Keppel Shipyard in Singapore.
- ❖ This will be India's first FSRU-based LNG receiving terminal.








Wheat Export



- ❖ This financial year, India is set to export around 7 million tonnes of wheat.
- ❖ This would be one of the highest exports of wheat by India.
- ❖ India is the world's second-biggest producer of wheat, accounting for 13.53% of global production.
- ❖ But it only accounts for 1% of global wheat exports.
- ❖ Annually India produces around 108 million tonnes of wheat.
- China is the World's largest producer of Wheat.

Solar Capacity - 2021



❖ India installed a record 10 gigawatts (GW) of solar capacity in the calendar year 2021, a 212 percent increase year on year (y-o-y).





- ❖ This is according to the report Annual 2021 India Solar Market Update by Mercom India Research.
- ❖ In 2021, rooftop installations increased by 138 percent year on year.
- ❖ As of December 2021, Rajasthan, Karnataka, and Andhra Pradesh were the top three states in terms of cumulative large-scale solar capacity.

Report on Sundarbans Tigers

- ❖ The Wildlife Institute of India (WII) was entrusted to prepare a report on the increasing cases of man-animal conflict.
- ❖ In this regard, WII released a preliminary report, which is based on the recent tiger census.
- ❖ The density of tigers in the Sunderbans of West Bengal may have reached its carrying capacity.
- ❖ WII informed the West Bengal forest department that the carrying capacity in the hostile terrain is three to five tigers per 100 sq km.
- ❖ But in multiple blocks of Sunderbans, the density is more than that.
- ❖ This high density will force tigers to move out of forests in search of new areas.
- * Recently, around eight tigers have entered villages in Sunderbans and all of them were captured and released into the wild.
- ❖ The WII has advised the Bengal forest department to release the captured tigers in those areas of the forest that have less density of tigers.

Indo-Pacific Military Health Exchange Conference



❖ Defence Minister Rajnath Singh virtually inaugurated the four-day Indo-Pacific Military Health Exchange conference.





- ❖ This conference is being co-hosted by the US Indo-Pacific Command and Armed Forces Medical Services (AFMS).
- ❖ 'Military Healthcare in a Volatile, Uncertain, Complex and Ambiguous (VUCA) World' is the theme of the conference.
- ❖ This conference aims to enhance joint manship and cooperation in military medicine.

SAMARTH

- ❖ The Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises has launched a Special Entrepreneurship Promotion Drive for Women named "SAMARTH".
- ❖ The objective of SAMARTH is to provide Skill Development and Market Development Assistance to women and to train more than 7500 women candidates from rural and sub-urban areas in the FY 2022-23.



Donate-a-Pension initiative







- Union Labour and Employment Minister, Bhupender Yadav has launched the 'Donate-a-Pension' campaign under Pradhan Mantri Shram Yogi Maan-Dhan (PM-SYM) scheme.
- ❖ Under the new initiative, citizens can contribute to the pension fund of their immediate support staff such as domestic workers, drivers, helpers, etc, by donating the premium amount.

India Global Forum annual summit

- ❖ India Global Forum's (IGF) annual summit is being organized in Bengaluru, Karnataka.
- The summit will bring together eminent faces of tech-driven disruption and those who have joined the unicorn club along with Union ministers, policymakers, and global business leaders.
- ❖ The previous editions were hosted in Dubai and the UK.
- ❖ This is the first-ever edition of IGF at Bengaluru.



National Mineral Development Corporation








- ❖ The National Mineral Development Corporation Ltd (NMDC) received 1st prize in the Ispat Rajbhasha Award for 2018-19 and 2020-21.
- ❖ The company also received the Ispat Rajbhasha Prerna Award for 2019-20.
- ❖ The NMDC is a Navratna PSU under the Ministry of Steel.
- ❖ It is an eco-friendly mining company and the largest producer of iron ore in India.

Kavach system



- ❖ 2,000 km of railway network will be brought under Kavach for safety and capacity augmentation in 2022-23, as a part of Prime minister's Atmanirbhar Bharat.
- ❖ The trial of the 'Kavach' functioning system between Gullaguda and Chitgidda Railway stations in Telangana was examined by the Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnay.
- ❖ Kavach is designed to protect trains by preventing them from passing the Danger (Red) signal and colliding.
- ❖ It prevents collisions between two locomotives equipped with a functional KAVACH system by automatically activating the train braking system if the driver fails to regulate the train according to the speed regulations.





Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj statue



- ❖ Prime Minister Narendra Modi has unveiled a tall statue of great Maratha warrior Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj in Pune, Maharashtra.
- ❖ The Statue is made up of 1,850 kg of gunmetal and is about 9.5-feet tall.
- ❖ PM Modi also laid the foundation stone for the rejuvenation and pollution abatement of the Mula-Mutha River projects in Pune.

Kanya Shiksha Pravesh Utsav



- ❖ It is a campaign to bring out-of-school adolescent Indian girls back into the formal education and skilling system.
- ❖ The campaign aims to increase the enrolment and retention of the number of adolescent girls (girls aged 11 to 14) in school.
- ❖ The campaign will be implemented as part of the Ministry of Women and Child Development's BetiBachaoBetiPadhao (BBBP) project.





Swachhagraha Event



- ❖ The event aimed to promote awareness on "Swachhta, Swadhinta and Sulabh".
- ❖ The Swachhagraha campaign is inspired by 'Satyagraha,' the world's largest and most effective mass movement.
- ❖ Developing a sustainable culture of cleanliness is the aim of this campaign.
- ❖ This campaign also looks to promote Swacch Bharat Abhiyaan by encouraging young citizens to participate actively and develop youth leaders.

Acetabularia jalakanyakae



- It is the new marine algae species discovered in India.
- ❖ It was discovered by Indian scientists from the Central University of Punjab in the Andamans archipelago.
- ❖ The scientists sighted the species in 2019 during their trip to Andamans.

Manas National Park - Tiger and Rhino Population

❖ The Manas National Park and Tiger Reserve in Assam have witnessed a sharp rise in the population of rhinos and tigers.





- ❖ The authorities of the national park expect the tiger population will rise to more than 60 from 48 as per the 2021 census.
- ❖ The park's Rhino population has also increased.
- Manas National Park is a national park that has been given the status of UNESCO Natural World Heritage Site, an elephant reserve, a Project Tiger reserve, and a biosphere reserve.
- ❖ It is located in the Himalayan foothills of Assam and is contiguous with Bhutan's Royal Manas National Park.



123PAY



- * Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Shaktikanta Das launched Unified Payments Interface (UPI) for feature phones called "UPI123Pay".
- UPI '123PAY' is a three-step method to initiate and execute services for those who use feature phones.
- ❖ Except for 'the scan and pay' option, all other transactions can be done by feature phones, with the help of UPI 123PAY.
- ❖ The bank account should be linked to a feature phone to use UPI 123PAY.
- ❖ There is no need for an internet connection, to initiate and execute transactions.





Statue of Lord Buddha

- ❖ India's largest reclining statue of Lord Buddha is being built in Bodh Gaya.
- ❖ It is built by Buddha International Welfare Mission.
- ❖ The statue will be 100 feet long and 30 feet high.



5 state Election results



- ❖ Votes were counted in five states namely Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Uttarakhand, Goa, and Manipur.
- ❖ Except for Punjab, the BJP has been in power in all the other states.
- ❖ In Punjab, Arvind Kejriwal-led AAP won the election.
- ❖ Yogi Adityanath became the first chief minister to retain power in Uttar Pradesh since the 1985 assembly elections.

WHO Global Centre for Traditional Medicine

❖ The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has approved the establishment of a World Health Organization Global Centre for Traditional Medicine (WHO GCTM) at Jamnagar, Gujarat.





- ❖ The WHO GCTM is to be established under the Ministry of AYUSH (Ayurveda, Yoga, Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha, Sowa-Rigpa and Homoeopathy).
- ❖ This will be the first and only global outpost centre (office) for traditional medicines.



Freedom of the World 2022 report


- ❖ For the second consecutive year, India has been termed as 'partly free' country in terms of democracy and free society.
- ❖ This is according to the report titled "Freedom in the World 2022 The Global Expansion of Authoritarian Rule" by Freedom House.
- ❖ Freedom House is a US-based NGO that assesses political rights and civil liberties.
- ❖ India scored 66 out of 100 in 2022.
- ❖ The country had scored 67 in 2021.
- ❖ India was a free country till 2020 when its score was 71.
- ❖ In Internet freedom, India scored 49.
- ❖ In 2022, 85 countries were termed as free, 56 as partly free and 69 as not free.







Jharokha



- ❖ The Ministry of Culture and Ministry of Textiles organized a programme called "Jharokha-Compendium of Indian handicraft/ handloom, art, and culture".
- ❖ This is to celebrate the traditional Indian handicrafts, handlooms, and art & culture.
- ❖ The first event under this celebration has been organized in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh at Rani Kamlapati Railway Station.
- ❖ Jharokha is a PAN India programme that will be held at 16 locations in 13 states and UTs, as part of the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav.

Motor Vehicle Agreement

- ❖ The Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Nepal (BBIN) Motor Vehicle Agreement (MVA) was signed by all four BBIN countries in 2015 but has not yet been implemented.
- ❖ BBIN MVA will allow the four countries to ply their vehicles in each other's country for transportation of cargo and passengers.
- ❖ Recently India, Bangladesh, and Nepal finalized an MoU to implement the BBIN MVA at a meeting held in New Delhi, India.







International Election Visitors Programme 2022



- ❖ The virtual International Election Visitors Programme (IEVP) 2022 was hosted by the Election Commission of India (ECI) for Election Management Bodies (EMBs) from nearly 32 countries and four international organizations.
- ❖ More than 150 EMB Delegates participating online were given an overview of the recent elections for Legislative Assemblies in Manipur, Goa, Uttarakhand, Punjab, and Uttar Pradesh.

National Land Monetization Corporation

- ❖ The Union Cabinet has approved the setting up National Land Monetization Corporation (NLMC) as a wholly-owned Government of India company.
- NLMC will undertake monetization of surplus land and building assets of Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs) and other Government agencies.
- ❖ At present, CPSEs hold a considerable surplus, unused, and underused non-core assets in the nature of land and buildings.

- ❖ Pusa Krishi Vigyan Mela 2022 is being organized from 9th to 11th March 2022 at the Pusa Institute's Mela Ground.




Biodegradable nanoparticles


- * Researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Kanpur have created a biodegradable nanoparticle.


South India's longest bowstring bridge

- ❖ This programme is expected to encourage more students to pursue research and a career in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics.




- ❖ India is the second-largest global venture capital investment hub for digital shopping companies.

- ❖ Meanwhile, the first-ever consignment of GI-tagged hand-knotted carpets was exported to Germany from New Delhi this March.





- ❖ Pradhan's research work focused on understanding the chemistry and physics of light-emitting semiconductor nanocrystals.




Rejuvenation Project of 13 Rivers

- ❖ These 13 rivers cover nearly 57.45% of India's geographical area.




Arctic policy

- Customers who do not have access to a smartphone or the internet can use this feature to book cylinders and pay via the 'UPI 123PAY' system.


Surajkund International Crafts Mela

- ❖ The first Virtual Summit was held in 2020.








Gulf Business Summit



- ❖ There will be no common counseling sessions.



Indian Psychiatric Society national conference




- ❖ The 73rd Annual National Conference of Indian Psychiatric Society has been organized in Visakhapatnam.



- ❖ The lowest was in Gujarat.










- ❖ It is a campaign that will be held for 100 days, at 100 places and will include 100 organizations.
- ❖ This campaign will be organized till 21st June 2022.
- This was started with the objective of giving publicity and promotion to Yoga and its utility.

INS Valsura

- ❖ The Indian Naval Ship (INS) Valsura has been awarded the prestigious President's Colour by President Ram Nath Kovind.
- ❖ It is the highest award or honor that can be bestowed upon any of India's military units.
- * This award is also called 'Nishaan'.
- ❖ This award can be bestowed on a military unit as a sign of recognition of exceptional service rendered to the country, both during war and peace.




State Legislatures to tax lotteries

- ❖ The Supreme Court has held that a lottery conducted by the Government of India, states or authorized by a state or conducted by private entities is an activity falling within the nomenclature of betting and gambling.
- ❖ And hence, the State Legislature has the competence to tax lottery scheme.
- ❖ This is applicable to gambling being conducted not only by the Government of India or the Government of any State or by any other agency or instrumentality of a particular State but also by a private entity within the State as gambling.







Demand for the Ahir Regiment



- ❖ The demand for a full-fledged Infantry Regiment named after Ahir has found support from politicians seeking leverage with them.
- ❖ Ahirs community was brought into the national limelight after the story of the bravery of the Ahir troops of Haryana in the Battle of Rezang La in 1962 (India-China war) was widely known.
- ❖ Ahirwal region includes the southern Haryana districts of Rewari, Mahendragarh, and Gurgaon.
- This region is associated with Rao Tula Ram, the Ahir hero of the 1857 revolt.
- It has traditionally contributed soldiers to the Indian Army in large numbers.

Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw

- ❖ Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw has been elected as a fellow of the Royal Society of Edinburgh (RSE) in Scotland.
- * RSE is one of the world's oldest and most respected academic societies.






❖ Fellows are elected to join the RSE from across the fields of science, arts, education, business, and public life in recognition of their impact on improving the world around them.



Polar Science and Cryosphere Research Scheme



- ❖ The National Centre for Polar and Ocean Research (NCPOR), has successfully implemented the Polar Science and Cryosphere Research (PACER) scheme.
- ❖ The scheme comprises of Indian Arctic program, the Antarctic program, Cryosphere, and Climate Program, and the Southern Ocean program.
- ❖ NCPOR is an autonomous institute that falls under the ambit of the Ministry of Earth Sciences.

'Sambhav' and 'Svavlamban'

- ❖ 'Sambhav' and 'Svavlamban' are the initiatives to tackle the issue of plastic waste in India.
- ❖ The initiatives were launched by the Union Minister of State for Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), Bhanu Pratap Singh Verma.





- ❖ It was launched at the International Summit on Plastics Recycling and Waste Management.
- ❖ These initiatives aim to encourage young entrepreneurs, especially from the aspirational districts of India.



United Nations Commission on Status of Women




- ❖ Union Minister for Women and Child Development Smriti Irani addressed the 66th session of the United Nations Commission on Status of Women
- ❖ The Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) is the principal global intergovernmental body exclusively dedicated to the promotion of gender equality and the empowerment of women.
- ❖ It is a functional commission of the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) and was established on June 21, 1946.

Disaster Management Act provisions

- ❖ The Centre has revoked the provisions of the Disaster Management Act 2005 for Covid containment measures.
- ❖ This is because the number of Covid-19 cases continues to show a downward trend.
- ❖ Covid containment measures such as the use of face masks and hand hygiene can be continued.







Resilient Crops

- ❖ Scientists at the Indian Agricultural Research Institute, in collaboration with several other research institutions, have identified about 15,000 selected germplasms of rice and wheat.
- ❖ These are identified for developing varieties that are tolerant to floods, droughts, heatwaves, and diseases to mitigate the adverse impact of climate change on food production.
- ❖ Agricultural scientists have sourced rice and wheat genetic resources from a gene bank run by the National Bureau of Plant Genetic Resources (NBPGR) in Delhi.

International Geological Congress


- ❖ The 36th International Geological Congress (IGC) was held in New Delhi with the topic 'Geosciences: The Basic Science for a Sustainable Future'.
- ❖ The 36th International Geophysical Congress is a collaboration between the Ministries of Mines and Earth Sciences, the Indian National Science Academy, and the Science Academies of Bangladesh, Nepal, and Sri Lanka.
- ❖ The event would provide a one-of-a-kind forum for Geoscience knowledge and experience sharing, as well as professional networking.
- ❖ India held the 22nd session of the IGC, which was the first IGC on Asian land, 58 years ago in 1964.





Rashtriya Sanskriti Mahotsav 2022

- ❖ It was started in Arts College Ground, Rajamahendravaram, Andhra Pradesh.
- ❖ The first Rashtriya Sanskriti Mahotsav was held in 2015.
- ❖ The Rashtriya Sanskriti Mahotsav offers a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to see all of India's folk, traditional, tribal, classical, and popular art forms under one roof, with over 1000 artists performing.







Price hike of 800 essential drugs

- ❖ The National Pharmaceutical Pricing Authority has announced a hike in prices of around 800 essential drugs from 1 April.
- ❖ These drugs are included in the National Essential List of Medicine.
- ❖ The rise in drug prices works out at around 10.76% based on the Wholesale Price Index.

C40 Cities Network



- ❖ Maharashtra has launched the Mumbai Climate Action Plan in partnership with the C40 Cities Network.
- Mumbai Climate Action Plan is essentially designed to reduce emissions and meet the climate goals outlined in the Paris Agreement to limit global warming to 1.5 °C.
- ❖ Found in 2005, the C40 Cities Climate Leadership Group is an association of 97 cities from around the world C40.
- ❖ It is a global network of mayors aimed at fighting climate change and reducing greenhouse gas emissions, thus mitigating climate risks.





- ❖ The goal of the C40's initiative is to reduce the emissions of its member cities to half within a decade.
- ❖ Five Indian cities are currently a part of the C40 network.
- ❖ These are Delhi, Kolkata, Chennai, Bengaluru, and Mumbai.

Doctor-population ratio in India

- ❖ The number of medical undergraduate seats has increased from 51,348 before 2014 to 89,875 seats as of date.
- ❖ This is an increase of 75%.
- ❖ The number of medical postgraduate seats has gone up by 93%.
- ❖ The doctor-population ratio was 1:834 in the country assuming 80% availability of registered allopathic doctors and 5.65 lakh AYUSH doctors.

Criminal Procedure (Identification) Bill, 2022




- ❖ Recently, the Criminal Procedure (Identification) Bill, 2022 was introduced in Lok Sabha.
- ❖ It would allow the police and prison authorities to collect, store and analyze physical and biological samples, including retina and iris scans.
- ❖ It will also seek to apply these provisions to persons held under any preventive detention law.
- ❖ It also authorizes taking measurements of convicts and "other persons" for identification and investigation in criminal matters.
- ❖ It doesn't define the "other persons" implying its ambit beyond convicts, arrested persons, or detainees.
- ❖ Police personnel up to the rank of Head Constable have been authorized to record the measurements.





- ❖ It has been argued that the Bill was beyond the legislative competence of Parliament as it violated the fundamental rights of citizens including the right to privacy.
- ❖ It has been argued that the bill violates Article 20 (3) of the Constitution.
- ❖ It has been argued that the bill also violates human rights provisions as laid out in the United Nations charter.

India's first steel road



- ❖ The Hazira Industrial Area in Surat, Gujarat, has created a one-of-a-kind road.
- ❖ The road is created entirely of steel waste.
- ❖ That is one of the best instances of sustainable development.
- ArcelorMittal Nippon Steel India collaborated on the steel slag road with the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research India, the Central Road Research Institute, and Niti Aayog.
- ❖ The road was constructed entirely of processed steel slag.
- Steel slag is a major source of concern for the steel industry because it is regarded as a waste product.

Prasthan Exercise

- ❖ 'Prasthan' is an offshore security exercise that was conducted in Mumbai's Offshore Development Area.
- ❖ This exercise was conducted under the aegis of the Western Naval Command's Headquarters.





- ❖ This exercise is conducted every six months.
- This exercise was led by the Indian Navy.
- ❖ This exercise was conducted to refine the response and standard operating procedures (SOPs) to various contingencies in Mumbai's Offshore Defence Area.



50,000 ODF Plus Villages



- ❖ The milestone of having 50,000 open defecation-free (ODF) Plus villages has been crossed by the country.
- ❖ The top-performing states under this programme are Telangana.
- ❖ It is followed by Tamil Nadu and Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ Into three categories, the ODF Plus villages have been divided.
- ❖ The categories are Rising, Aspiring, and Model.

TEJAS Skilling Project

- ❖ The Union Minister Anurag Thakur launched Training for Emirates Jobs And Skills (TEJAS) in Dubai.
- ❖ This is an initiative under the Skill India International Project.
- ❖ This programme has the objective of skilling, providing certification, and employment of Indians overseas.





- ❖ TEJAS is also aiming to create pathways so that the Indian workforce can get equipped for the various skills and market requirements in the UAE.
- ❖ Under this project, 10,000 strong Indian workforces will be created in the UAE during the initial phase of implementation.

Yamunotsav

- ❖ The Yamunotsav was organized by the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG) as part of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav celebrations.
- ❖ This program was organized in collaboration with a group of NGOs.
- ❖ This event was organized at ASITA East River Front, ITO Bridge, New Delhi.
- ❖ This event was organized to celebrate River Yamuna's glory.

INTERNATIONAL

Ukraine's Airbases



- ❖ The air and missile strikes from the Russian side have destroyed over 90 military ground facilities belonging to Ukraine.
- ❖ This includes close to 14 airfields, command posts, radar stations, and the S-300 air defense systems.
- ❖ Key airfields like the Lutsk military airfield, the Ivano-Frankivsk airbase, the Melitopol airbase, the Mykolaiv airbase, the Gostomel airport, and the Chernihiv airbase were targeted heavily, resulting in major damages.





Minsk Agreements



❖ Minsk Agreements were signed in 2014 and 2015 in the Belarusian capital Minsk.

MINSK I

- ❖ Ukraine and the Russian-backed separatists agreed on a 12-point ceasefire deal in the Belarusian capital in 2014.
- ❖ Its provisions included prisoner exchanges, deliveries of humanitarian aid, and the withdrawal of heavy weapons.
- ❖ The agreement quickly broke down, with violations by both sides.

MINSK II

- ❖ Representatives of Russia and Ukraine, the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe, and the leaders of two pro-Russian separatist regions signed a 13-point agreement in 2015.
- ❖ The leaders of France, Germany, Russia, and Ukraine, gathered in Minsk at the same time issued a declaration of support for the deal.
- ❖ A major blockage has been Russia's insistence that it is not a party to the conflict and therefore is not bound by its terms.

Khaibar-buster Missile

- ❖ Iran unveiled a new missile called "Khaibar Buster Missile".
- It is capable of hitting nearby US bases and Israel.
- It has a range of 900 miles.






- * The missile runs on solid fuel.

Razzaza Lake



- ❖ Razzaza Lake is a man-made lake is located between Iraq's governorates of Anbar and Karbala
- It is also known as Lake Milh.
- ❖ It's the second largest lake in Iraq.
- * Razzaza was constructed as a measure to control floods in the Euphrates and to be used as a huge reservoir for irrigation purposes.
- * Razzaza Lake is currently seeing a significant decline in water levels.
- ❖ It has been hit by pollution and high levels of salinity.





IOC response to Russia's invasion

- ❖ The International Olympic Committee has stripped Russian President Vladimir Putin of the Olympic Order award in response to the invasion of Ukraine.
- ❖ International Olympic Committee urged sports federations and organizers to exclude Russian and Belarusian athletes and officials from international events.

Mriya




- * Russia destroyed the largest plane in the world called "Ukraine's Antonov-225 cargo plane".
- ❖ The plane was destroyed outside Kyiv.
- ❖ According to weapons manufacturer Ukroboronprom, restoring "AN-225 Mriya" would cost over USD 3 billion and could take over five years.
- It was destroyed on February 27.
- ❖ It has been named Mriya, which means "dream" in Ukrainian.

Yilan Crater

- ❖ A team of geologists has discovered a crater named "Yilan Crater".
- ❖ It was discovered in the northwest of Yilan in Heilongjiang Province of China.
- ❖ It is the largest crater on Earth under 100,000 years old.
- ❖ Carbon-14 dating sediments suggest that this crater was formed between 46,000 and 53,000 years ago.
- Prior to 2020, only one impact crater "Xiuyan Crater" was discovered in Liaoning province.





New Species of Orchid



- ❖ The Researchers have discovered an astounding new species of orchid in the cloud rainforest of Northern Ecuador.
- ❖ It has been scientifically named Maxillaria anacatalina-portillae.
- ❖ This plant is unique with its showy, intense yellow flowers.

Saudi Arabia foundation day

- ❖ Saudi Arabia held celebrations on February 22 to commemorate for the first time its foundation nearly 300 years ago.
- ❖ The anniversary marks the day in 1727 when Mohammed bin Saud, founder of the first Saudi state, took over the emirate of Diriyah.
- ❖ Emirate of Diriyah is a remote town that now lies on the northwest edge of the Saudi capital Riyadh.







Zaporizhzhia nuclear power plant

- * Russia has captured Ukraine's Zaporizhzhia nuclear power plant.
- * This is the largest one in Europe.
- ❖ It is located near the city of Enerhodar, on the Dnieper River.

United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) vote to probe Russian actions

- ❖ India has abstained on a vote at the UNHRC resolution which "strongly condemned" aggression by Russia on Ukraine.
- ❖ The resolution asked the council to set up an international commission of enquiry into Russia's actions in Ukraine.
- ❖ India was among 13 countries of the 47-member council elected from UN members that abstained from the resolution.
- ❖ Only Russia and Eritrea voted against the resolution.

Emergency General Assembly session

- ❖ India abstained from a procedural vote taken in the UN Security Council to call for a rare special emergency session of the UN General Assembly on Russia's aggression against Ukraine.
- ❖ India, China, and the UAE abstained from this.
- ❖ The resolution was adopted with 11 votes in favor.
- ❖ This was the 11th such emergency session of the General Assembly since 1950.





Mobile World Congress 2022



- ❖ The Global System for Mobile Communications Association has organized the 2022 Mobile World Congress.
- It took place in Barcelona, Spain.
- ❖ The Global Mobile Economy Report expects 5G connections globally to reach 1 billion in 2022 by 5G adoption.
- ❖ An increase in the 5G network connection will increase the global GDP by 5% up to \$5 trillion in 2025.

Pakistan - grey list




- ❖ Pakistan is likely to remain on the grey list of global money laundering and terrorist financing watchdog FATF until June.
- ❖ Pakistan has been on the grey list of the Paris-based Financial Action Task Force (FATF) since June 2018.
- ❖ It has been on the grey list for failing to check money laundering, leading to terror financing.





Plastics Innovation Hub



- ❖ A partnership has been established by Australia and Indonesia with the aim of tackling plastic pollution in the Indo-Pacific region.
- ❖ This partnership will bring together investors, researchers, and major stakeholders, including public and private sector businesses, to develop various solutions to tackle plastic waste in Indonesia's waterways and oceans.

Endurance ship

- ❖ The Scientists have found and filmed one of the greatest ever undiscovered ship wrecks 107 years after it sank.
- ❖ The Endurance, the lost vessel of Antarctic explorer Sir Ernest Shackleton, was found at the weekend at the bottom of the Weddell Sea.
- ❖ The ship was crushed by sea-ice and sank in 1915.
- ❖ The project to find the lost ship was mounted by the Falklands Maritime Heritage Trust (FMHT), using a South African icebreaker, Agulhas II.







South Korea President



- ❖ Yoon Suk-yeol has been declared the winner of the 2022 South Korean presidential election to be elected as the new President of the country.
- ❖ He is scheduled to assume office for a fixed term of five years.
- ❖ Yoon Suk-yeol will succeed incumbent President Moon Jae-in.

Care at work report



- ❖ It was released by the International Labour Organziation (ILO).
- ❖ This report offers a global overview of national laws, policies, and practices on care, including maternity, paternity, parental, child, and long-term care.
- ❖ It highlights how some workers fall outside the scope of these legal protections.
- ❖ The report finds that three in ten women of reproductive age, or 649 million women, have inadequate maternity protection.





- ❖ It means that it does not meet the key requirements of the ILO's Maternity Protection Convention, 2000.
- ❖ More than 1.2 billion men of prime reproductive age live in countries with no entitlement to paternity leave.

- ❖ The latest edition of Democracy Report was released recently by the V-Dem Institute at Sweden's University of Gothenburg.
- ❖ The study was titled 'Democracy Report 2022: Autocratisation Changing Nature?'.
- ❖ The report classifies countries into four regime types based on their score in the Liberal Democratic Index (LDI): Liberal Democracy, Electoral Democracy, Electoral Autocracy, and Closed Autocracy.
- ❖ It classifies India as an electoral autocracy ranking it 93rd on the LDI, out of 179 countries.
- ❖ India is one of the top ten 'autocratisers' in the world says the report.

Saudi Arabia - Mass execution


- ❖ Saudi Arabia executed 81 people convicted of crimes ranging from killings to belonging to militant groups.
- ❖ This is the largest known mass execution carried out in the kingdom in its modern history.
- ❖ The number of executed surpassed even the toll of a January 1980 mass execution for the 63 militants convicted of seizing the Grand Mosque in Mecca in 1979.







SIPRI Report



- ❖ The Stockholm International Peace Research Institute (SIPRI) has released its latest report on Trends in International Arms Transfer, 2021.
- ❖ As per the report, India and Saudi Arabia emerged as the largest importers of arms between 2017-21.
- ❖ Both two countries accounted for 11% of all global arms sales.
- ❖ The report placed India at the top of the list.





- * Russia (46%), France (27%), and the USA (12%) were the top three largest exporters of arms to India during the period.
- ❖ The USA, with a 39% share, retained its standing as the world's largest arms exporters during 2017-21.
- ❖ India was the 23rd largest exporter during 2017-21, with a share of just 0.2% of the global exports.

EU Carbon border tariff



- ❖ The European Union (EU) countries decided to impose the world's first carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions tariff on imports of polluting goods.
- ❖ The European Union (EU) wants to introduce carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions costs on imports of steel, cement, fertilizers, aluminum, and electricity.
- ❖ The aim of imposing this tariff is to protect the European industry, as the European market is flooded by cheaper goods made in countries with weak environmental rules.

Women on board of listed companies

- ❖ Bangladesh tops the list in South Asia in terms of women on board of listed companies.
- ❖ This is said in a study conducted by International Finance Corporation (IFC) and Dhaka Stock Exchange (DSE).
- ❖ According to the latest figures, there was an increase in the percentage of women who are independent directors on listed companies from five percent in 2020 to six percent.






Discovery of Old Stone Age culture

- ❖ In 2021, India's rank was 139.





- ❖ Finland has topped the 2022 World Happiness Report, for the fifth continuous year.
- ❖ Afghanistan has been ranked as the unhappiest country in the world, at 146th position.



Cold Response 2022



- ❖ The North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) has organized the massive military drill 'Cold Response 2022' in Norway.
- ❖ The exercise is held in Norway every second year, for NATO Allies and partners.
- ❖ Cold Response is a long-planned and defensive exercise where Norway and its allies exercise in defending Norway against external threats.





Boeing 737-800 crash

- ❖ The plane had taken off from Kunming and was headed towards Guangzhou.
- ❖ The plane crash has caused a massive fire on the mountain.

Montreux Convention



- ❖ Turkey activated the Montreux Convention in response to Russia's War over Ukraine.
- ❖ The declaration that the situation in Ukraine had become a war, authorizes Turkey to activate the Montreux Convention and ban Russian war vessels from entering the Black Sea through the Bosporus and Dardanelles straits.
- Montreux Convention is an international agreement that was signed by Australia, Bulgaria, France, Greece, Japan, Romania, Yugoslavia, the United Kingdom, the Soviet Union, and Turkey.
- ❖ It has been in effect since November 1936.





Hisashi Takeuchi

- ❖ Hisashi Takeuchi (from Japan) has been appointed as the Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer of Maruti Suzuki.
- ❖ Takeuchi will serve for a period of three years with effect from April 1, 2022.
- ❖ Takeuchi will succeed Kenichi Ayukawa as the MD and CEO.



BIMSTEC Charter



- ❖ 5th BIMSTEC Summit will be held in Colombo, Sri Lanka on 30th March.
- ❖ Six documents, which also includes the BIMSTEC Charter, are likely to be adopted and signed.
- ❖ "BIMSTEC-Towards a Resilient Region, Prosperous Economies and Healthy Peoples" is the theme for the 5th BIMSTEC Summit.





Bersama Shield 2022

- ❖ Malaysia will host armed forces from 4 nations in the annual Bersama Shield 2022 training exercise.
- ❖ The four nations are Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, and the United Kingdom.
- ❖ The exercise is referred to as BS22 (Bersama Shield 2022).
- Bersama means together in Malay.

Climate Early Warning Systems



- ❖ Antonio Guterres, UN Secretary-General, announced this project in association with the World Meteorological Organisation based in Geneva.
- ❖ The project has been announced to put every individual on the planet in early weather-warning systems range within the next five years as natural disasters have grown frequent and more powerful due to the effects of climate change.
- One-third of the Earth's population, especially in the countries which are leastdeveloped are not covered by early warning systems.
- ❖ 60 percent of people who are residing in Africa lack coverage.

Wildlife bond to save Africa's black rhino

- ❖ The World Bank (International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, IBRD) has issued the Wildlife Conservation Bond (WCB) to support South Africa's efforts to conserve endangered species of Black Rhino.
- ❖ Wildlife Conservation Bond (WCB) is also known as "Rhino Bond".





- ❖ The bond will contribute to protecting and increasing black rhino populations in two protected areas in South Africa.
- ❖ Those areas are the Addo Elephant National Park and the Great Fish River Nature Reserve.



Resolution demanding aid access

- ❖ 193 Member States adopted a resolution drafted by Ukraine.
- ❖ The UN General Assembly overwhelmingly demanded civilian protection and humanitarian access in Ukraine
- ❖ 140 votes were in favor.
- ❖ Five were against Russia, Syria, The Democratic People's Republic of Korea (more commonly known as North Korea), Eritrea and Belarus, and 38 others abstaining.




- ❖ The Security Council has adopted a resolution to extend the mandate of the UN Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA) for a year till March 17, 2023.
- ❖ The Resolution 2626 decides that UNAMA and the UN Secretary-General's special representative will continue to carry out their mandate in support of the people of Afghanistan.

- ❖ Dhaka has been ranked as the noisiest city in the world.
- ❖ It is followed by Moradabad, Uttar Pradesh.
- ❖ Five Indian cities have been ranked in this list of being among the noisiest cities of the world.

 - o Jaipur,
 - o Kolkata,
 - New Delhi, and
 - o Moradabad.
- Irbid, Jordan has been ranked as the world's quietest city
- ❖ The top 3 Noisiest Cities are,
 - o Dhaka, Bangladesh- 119dB
 - o Moradabad, India- 114dB
 - o Islamabad, Pakistan- 105dB





US-EU Agreement on Data Transfer Pact

- ❖ The United States and the European Union have announced that they have an "in principle" agreement in place to create a new framework for the purpose of cross-border data transfers.
- ❖ This announcement has come as a much-needed relief for various tech giants like Google and Meta.
- ❖ For more than a year, officials have been planning out a deal with the aim to replace the invalidated Privacy Shield, an arrangement that allows firms to share Europeans' data with the U.S.

Gilbert Houngbo

- ❖ Gilbert Houngbo from Togo will be the next Director-General of the International Labour Organization.
- ❖ Houngbo was the former Prime Minister of Togo.
- ❖ The current Director-General, Guy Ryder, from the United Kingdom, has held office since 2012.







COP-4 Minamata Convention on Mercury

- ❖ In the Conference of Parties (COP-4) Minamata Convention on Mercury, the participating parties have agreed to expand the mercury-added products list that has been planned to be phased out.
- ❖ The COP-4 Minamata Convention on Mercury took place in Bali, Indonesia.
- ❖ This convention aims to protect the environment and human health from the release of mercury, and anthropogenic emissions.







ECONOMY

T+1 Stock Settlement

- ❖ India has become the second country after China to implement the T+1 stock settlement mechanism in a phased manner.
- ❖ Before this, the settlement period of stocks in India was T+2, i.e. two days after the actual buy/selling of stock.
- T means the trade/transaction day i.e. the day on which stock is brought/sold.
- ❖ Here T+1 means that the actual stock settlement will happen on the next day.



GST Revenues - February



- ❖ The February 2022 collection of GST (Goods and Services Tax) stood at Rs. 1,33,026 crores.
- ❖ This is 18 percent higher than February 2021.
- ❖ For the fifth time, GST collection has crossed the mark of Rs 1.30 lakh crore.
- ❖ Since GST's implementation, GST cess collection, for the first time, crossed the mark of Rs 10,000 crore.





60 million Demat accounts



- ❖ The Central Depository Services (India) announced that it now has more than six crores (i. e. equivalent to 60 million) active Demat accounts.
- ❖ A Demat account is a kind of account that can be used to keep online copies of securities and shares.

Wealth Report 2022



- ❖ India is ranked 3rd in terms of most number of billionaires' population globally in 2021.
- ❖ This is as per Knight Frank's latest edition of The Wealth Report 2022.
- ❖ The number of ultra-high-net-worth individuals (UHNWIs) in India increased by 11% YoY in 2021 to 145 billionaires.





- ❖ This is the highest percentage growth in the Asia Pacific (APAC) region.
- ❖ UHNWIs are individuals with net assets of US\$ 30m or more (Rs 226 crore).
- ❖ The list has been topped by the United States (748) and China (554) respectively.
- ❖ In India, Bengaluru recorded the highest growth in the number of UHNWIs in 2021.
- ❖ It was followed by Delhi and Mumbai in 2021.

National Bank for Financing Infrastructure and Development



- * Reserve Bank of India has announced that National Bank for Financing Infrastructure and Development (NaBFID) will be regulated and supervised by it as an All India Financial Institution (AIFI) under the RBI Act, 1934.
- ❖ Presently RBI has four AIFIs under it namely EXIM Bank, NABARD, NHB, and SIDBI.
- ❖ NaBFID will be the fifth AIFI under RBI.
- ❖ NaBFID has been set up as a Development Financial Institution to support the development of long-term infrastructure financing in India.

Interest rate on PF deposits

- ❖ The retirement fund body, Employees Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) has slashed the interest rate on provident fund deposits to 8.10% for 2021-22.
- ❖ This rate is 0.4% lower than the previous year.
- ❖ The interest rate on PF deposits was 8.5% in 2020-21 and 2019-20.
- * This is the lowest in more than four decades.

- ❖ The Reserve Bank Innovation Hub (RBIH) has been inaugurated by Shaktikanta Das in Bengaluru.
- RBIH has been set up as a wholly-owned subsidiary of the RBI with Rs 100 crore as an initial capital contribution.
- ❖ An independent board has been constituted for this hub with S. Gopalakrishnan selected as the Chairman.
- ❖ The aim of the RBIH is to create an ecosystem that will focus on the promotion of access to various financial products and services for the low-income group population across the nation.

Economic Survey of Delhi

- ❖ Delhi ranked third in terms of per capita income behind Sikkim and Goa.
- ❖ This is according to the Economic Survey of Delhi 2021-22.






- ❖ According to the survey, Delhi's per capita income grew 16.81 percent year-on-year in fiscal 2021-22.
- ❖ The per capita income of Delhi was three times higher than the national average in 2021-22.

Decline in dollar's dominance

- ❖ The dollar's share of global reserve currencies has been in a steady decline over the past 20 years.
- ❖ This is because the Central banks turn to nontraditional currencies, including the renminbi, to diversify their holdings.
- * Reserve managers have moved out of dollars in two directions, with one quarter headed into the renminbi and three quarters into currencies of smaller countries.
- ❖ The findings are in a new paper issued by the International Monetary Fund titled: "The Stealth Erosion of Dollar Dominance: Active Diversifiers and the Rise of Nontraditional Reserve Currencies."
- ❖ It was co-authored by Serkan Arslanalp of the IMF, Barry Eichengreen of the University of California Berkeley, and Chima Simpson-Bell also of the IMF.







SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY

Fossil of Sea Dragon




- ❖ United Kingdom researchers have found colossal 180-million-year-old fossilized remains of an Ichthyosaur.
- It is popularly known as a 'sea dragon'.
- ❖ The researchers show one of the most significant discoveries in the region as the fossil is the biggest and most complete skeleton of its kind found in the United Kingdom.

Launch of 22 Satellites

- ❖ China launched a Long March-8 rocket to place 22 satellites in space.
- ❖ With the launch, China set a domestic record for the most spacecraft launched by a single rocket.
- ❖ The rocket blasted off at the Wenchang Spacecraft Launch Site in southern Hainan Province.
- ❖ It marked the 409th flight of Long March carrier rockets.

Thiomargarita magnifica







- Scientists have discovered a bacterium that is big enough to be seen through the naked eye.
- ❖ It has been named Thiomargarita magnifica.
- ❖ This huge string-like bacterium can grow up to 2 cm in length.
- It is native to Caribbean mangroves.
- ❖ It's nearly 5,000 times bigger than most other microorganisms.

PARAM Ganga



- ❖ It is the 'Made in India' Petascale supercomputer installed at IIT Roorkee under National Supercomputing Mission.
- ❖ It has a supercomputing capacity of 1.66 PFLOPS (Peta Floating-Point Operations per Second).
- ❖ It was designed and commissioned by the C-DAC (Centre for Development of Advanced Computing) under the National Super computing Mission.

Plasma

- * The Scientists have unraveled the science behind the jets of plasma.
- ❖ Plasma is the fourth state of matter consisting of electrically charged particles that occur just about everywhere in the sun's chromosphere.





- ❖ The jets, or spicules, appear as thin grass-like plasma structures that constantly shoot up from the surface and are then brought down by gravity.
- ❖ The amount of energy and momentum that these spicules can carry is of fundamental interest in solar and plasma astrophysics.
- ❖ The scientists recently elaborated that the plasma right below the visible solar surface (photosphere) is perpetually in a state of convection, much like boiling water in a vessel heated at the bottom.



Kilonova

- ❖ The afterglow from an epic cosmic event known as "Kilonova" might have been spotted by astronomers.
- ❖ Kilonovas occur when two hyper-dense neutron stars collide, which are the remnants of stars that died in supernova explosions.
- ❖ An afterglow in X-rays from the event, is dubbed GW170817.







5000 Exoplanets

- ❖ 65 new planets have been discovered by NASA outside the Earth's solar system.
- ❖ This new discovery takes the total number of exoplanets that have been discovered to over 5000.
- ❖ Some of these discovered planets are Earth-like.
- ❖ These 65 newly discovered planets will be studied to look for the presence of microbes, water, gases on the planet's surface, or even life.




TRAPPIST-1 system

- ❖ TRAPPIST-1 is a red dwarf star in the Aquarius constellation.
- ❖ TRAPPIST-1 was earlier known as 2MASS J23062928–0502285 or K2-112, because it was spotted with the Two Micron All-Sky Survey (2MASS).
- ❖ It was discovered in 1999 by astronomer John Gizis.
- ❖ It is older than the solar system, as it is 7.6 billion years old.
- ❖ Its mass is about 9% of the Sun.
- ❖ Its radius is slightly larger than Jupiter.
- ❖ It has a surface temperature of about 2,290 °C.
- ❖ It is about 39 light-years from the Sun.
- ❖ James Webb Telescope will be directed towards the TRAPPIST-1 system.
- ❖ It will look for signs of atmosphere on the planets of TRAPPIST-1.








ENVIRONMENT

UN Report on Climate Change

- ❖ The United Nations climate science panel, in a major report, warned that climate change is upon us and humanity is not prepared for it.
- ❖ The report noted that over half of the world's population was already exposed to increasingly hazardous climate impacts and called for massive action.
- ❖ The report stated that by 2040, climate change is expected to make the world hungrier, sicker, far more hazardous, and poorer with an increase in hazards.








- ❖ Also, if human-caused global warming is not limited, the Earth will degrade in 127 way.
- ❖ It is now regularly hit by deadly fires, heat, drought, and floods some of which will be irreversible.

IPCC Assessment Report



- ❖ Even if greenhouse gas emissions are decreased, several disasters caused by climate change are likely to happen in the next two decades.
- ❖ This is according to a report compiled by the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC).
- ❖ India will be severely impacted if emissions are not reduced, according to the second installment of the IPCC report.
- ❖ The report claims that sea-level rise will endanger Mumbai, while storms will threaten Kolkata.
- ❖ Rice production in India can decrease by 10 to 30 percent, while maize production could decrease by 25 to 70 percent, assuming a temperature increase of 1 to 4 degrees Celsius.
- ❖ The river basins of Indus, Amu Darya, Sabarmati, Ganges could face severe water scarcity issues due to climate change.





Sloth bear


- ❖ The sloth bear, tiger, and dhole are among 36 apex predators worldwide affected the most due to road construction.
- ❖ The sloth bear was the most affected predator as its habitat was in the Indian subcontinent.
- ❖ From 2012 to 2017, 15 sloth bear roadkills were recorded in India.
- ❖ The sloth bear is followed by the dhole or Asiatic Wild Dog, the tiger, Asiatic black bear, clouded leopard, sun bear, and Sunda clouded leopard.
- ❖ Eight of the top 10 apex predators most affected due to roads running through their habitat are from Asia.



Global Plastics Treaty

- ❖ In the biggest multilateral environmental deal, 175 countries have agreed to a legally binding global treaty called the "Global Plastics Treaty".
- ❖ This is to end the plastic pollution crisis by tackling the entire supply chain of materials.
- ❖ The resolution on the first treaty was passed at a meeting of the UN Environment Assembly (UNEA) in Nairobi in Kenya.
- ❖ The first treaty directly seeks to tackle 9 billion tonnes of plastic produced since the plastic age ramped up in the 1950s.
- Now, they have started working on how to implement the treaty by 2024.






Fish in Great Barrier Reef Fading


- ❖ Due to climate change, the oceans are heating up and corals are continuing to bleach which is causing Australia's Great Barrier Reef's fish communities to fade and lose their color.
- ❖ This is according to the study published in Global Change Biology.
- ❖ Dr Hemingson at James Cook University, Queensland, Australia led this newly published study.
- ❖ This recently published study has monitored the changes seen in the fish communities' coloration as well as their living environment.
- ❖ According to the researchers, the fish communities' color diversity is linked to the local environment's composition.







Annual Frontier Report 2022



- * Recently, United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) has released the Annual Frontier Report 2022.
- ❖ It is titled Noise, Blazes, and Mismatches: Emerging Issues of Environmental Concern.
- ❖ In the new report, UNEP has said that wildfires, noise pollution, and other looming environmental threats could cause widespread ecological damage, and need to be urgently addressed.
- ❖ The report highlights the urgent need to address the triple planetary crisis of climate change, pollution and biodiversity loss.
- Noise pollution has been termed as "a raucous killer".
- ❖ The report has highlighted that between 2002 and 2016, an average of 423 million hectares of the land surface have burned due to wildfires.






STATES

Byanjana Dwadashi



- ❖ It is a Vaishnavite festival that commemorates an episode featuring Krishna in the Mahabharata.
- ❖ It is a 500-year-old festival in Odisha.
- ❖ It is a festival with at least 701 dishes being prepared.

Upper Bhadra project



- Chief Minister of Karnataka Basavaraj Bommai announced that the highpowered committee of central government gave national project status to "Upper Bhadra Project".
- ❖ This is the first project from the state to get this status.
- ❖ It will speed up the ambitious irrigation project and help in transforming central Karnataka from being water-scarce to a water-rich state.





The Cochin International Airport Limited



- ❖ The Cochin International Airport Limited (CIAL) is set to commission a 12 MWp solar power plant near Payyannur in the Kannur district of Kerala.
- ❖ In 2015, CIAL became the world's first airport to be fully powered by solar energy.

Lachit Borphukan

- ❖ The Chief Minister of Assam had announced many projects in connection with the 400th birth anniversary of Lachit Borphukan.
- ❖ Lachit Borphukan was the commander of the Ahom forces and an icon of Assamese nationalism.
- ❖ In 1669, Aurangzeb dispatched the Rajput Raja Ram Singh I to recapture the territories won back by the Ahoms in previous battles.
- So, the Battle of Alaboi was fought in the Alaboi Hills in North Guwahati between the Ahoms and Mughals.
- ❖ Lachit Borphukan, after suffering a massive defeat at Alaboi, decimated the Mughals within just two years in 1671 (Battle of Saraighat).
- ❖ Lachit won the Battle of Saraighat (Naval battle) on the River Brahmaputra.
- ❖ The Ahom Kingdom was founded by Chaolung Sukapha, who was a 13th-century ruler.







Guinness record - Ujjain



- ❖ Ujjain in Madhya Pradesh has created a Guinness record by lighting 11.71 lakh clay lamps (diyas) in 10 minutes.
- ❖ The diyas were lighted as part of the 'Shiv Jyoti Arpanam Mahotsava' on the occasion of Mahashivratri.
- ❖ With this, they broke the earlier record of lighting 9.41 lakh diyas created in Ayodhya, Uttar Pradesh in 2021.
- Ujjain is also known as the 'Land of Mahakal'.

Herath festival



- ❖ Herath or the 'Night of Hara (Shiva)' is generally known as Maha Shivratri.
- ❖ It is the main festival celebrated by the Kashmiri Pandits across Jammu and Kashmir (J&K).
- ❖ The festival marks the marriage anniversary of Lord Shiva and Goddess Uma (Parvathi).
- ❖ 2022 Herath Festival was celebrated on 28th February 2022.





- ❖ Herath Festival is celebrated on "Trayodashi" or the 13th day of the dark half of the month of Phalguna (Hindu calendar), between February and March.
- ❖ The rest of the nation celebrates the Maha Shivratri on Chaturdashi or the 14th of Phalguna.

Camel Protection and Development Policy

- ❖ Rajasthan, the state government has announced a 'Camel Protection and Development Policy' in its budget 2022-23.
- ❖ According to the government figures, less than two lakh camels are left in Rajasthan.
- ❖ And in the entire country, the number of camels has reduced by 1.5 lakh since 2012.
- ❖ There were about 2.5 lakh camels left when counted last in 2019.
- ❖ World Camel Day is observed every year on 22 June to recognize the importance of camels to the livelihood of a large population.

Withdrawal of Consent to CBI

- ❖ Meghalaya has become the ninth state of the country to withdraw consent to CBI to investigate cases in the state.
- ❖ It means that the CBI will not be able to file any new cases involving central government officials or private persons in the state without the permission of the state government.
- ❖ Before Meghalaya, the eight other states that had withdrawn consent to the CBI are Punjab, Maharashtra, West Bengal, Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Jharkhand, Mizoram, and Kerala.
- ❖ The first state to withdraw consent was Mizoram which did so in 2015.

HC and Andhra government

- ❖ The Andhra Pradesh high court has ordered Amaravati's development as the state capital and ruled the government has no right to enact fresh legislation for three capitals.
- ❖ The court said that Parliament alone is competent to deal with the setting up of the legislature, executive and judicial organs of the state, and this was implicit in the language employed in Article 4 of the Constitution.





Konark temple town



- ❖ Odisha plans to make the Konark temple town a 100 percent solar town.
- ❖ It was built by King Narasimhadeva I, the great ruler of the Ganga dynasty.
- ❖ The temple was included in UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1984.
- This temple was also known as 'BLACK PAGODA'
- Similarly, the Jagannath Temple in Puri was called the "White Pagoda".

Microsoft data centre



- Microsoft has announced to set up its fourth data centre in India in Hyderabad, Telangana.
- ❖ Hyderabad Data centre will be one of the largest data centres in India.
- ❖ It will be operational by 2025.
- Microsoft already has a data centre in three Indian regions across Pune, Mumbai, and Chennai.





Kaushalya Matritva Yojana

- Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel introduced the 'Kaushalya Matritva Yojana'.
- ❖ On the birth of a second daughter, women recipients are eligible for a lump payment aid of Rs. 5,000 under this scheme.
- ❖ The programme will assist in the parenting and education of girls.



Aama Yojna & Bahini Scheme

- ❖ Chief Minister of Sikkim, Prem Singh Tamang has announced that the State Government will soon implement 'Aama Yojana & 'Bahini Scheme'.
- ❖ Aama Yojna scheme aims to inculcate the habit of saving among non-working mothers in the state and hence the Government will provide them Rs. 20,000 each in their bank accounts annually.
- ❖ Bahini Scheme is to reduce the dropout rate of girl students due to the lack of accessibility/availability of Sanitary Napkins & also to ensure menstrual health and hygiene.


Pal-Dadhvav massacre

- ❖ The government of Gujarat marked the 100 years of the Pal-Dadhvav massacre on 7th March 2022.
- ❖ Pal-Dadhvav massacre refers to the killing of around 1,200 tribal revolutionaries (Bhils) by the British.
- ❖ It happened on 7th March 1922, in the Pal-Chitariya and Dadhvaav villages of Sabarkantha district, then part of Idar state (present-day Gujarat state).






Matrushakti Udaymita Scheme



- ❖ Haryana government has announced Matrushakti Udaymita Scheme to provide support to women entrepreneurs.
- ❖ Under the scheme, the women whose family annual income is less than 5 lakh rupees based on Parivar Pehchan Patra (PPP) verified data, will be provided access to soft loans by financial institutions to the extent of 3 lakh rupees.

Mission Indradhanush

- ❖ The Government of India's Mission Indradhanush is a healthcare initiative.
- ❖ It was first launched on December 25, 2014.
- ❖ This scheme seeks to achieve 90 percent full immunization coverage in India and also sustain it by the year 2022.
- ❖ Apart from successful COVID-19 vaccination, Odisha has the highest coverage of complete immunization in the country, with 90.5 percent coverage.







Old pension scheme

- Chhattisgarh has become the second state, after Rajasthan, to reintroduce the old pension scheme for government employees that provides an assured pension after retirement.
- ❖ The scheme was scrapped by the Atal Bihari Vajpayee-led NDA government from April 1, 2004, and was replaced with a market-driven pension scheme.

Dudhala village - Gujarat

- ❖ Goldi Solar in partnership with Shree Ramkrishna Knowledge Foundation (SRKKF) laid the foundation stone for the solarization of the village of Dudhala in Southern Gujarat.
- ❖ 450 KW solar rooftop projects will be used to power around 350 houses and public areas such as anganwadis and gram panchayat.
- ❖ Once completed, this would be the first village to be completely powered with solar panels by a foundation.



Cheetah sanctuary



- Madhya Pradesh will be the first state in the country to introduce cheetahs.
- ❖ The Kuno Palpur sanctuary in Sheopur will be home to the batch of 12-15 cheetahs.
- ❖ The move comes 74 years after the last cheetah was killed in the country.





Mukhyamantri Chaa Srami Kalyan Prakalpa scheme

- ❖ Tripura Government has announced a special scheme 'Mukhyamantri Chaa Srami Kalyan Prakalpa' for tea workers.
- ❖ It is introduced as a step towards bringing the 7000 tea garden workers of Tripura under the social security net.
- ❖ This special scheme would ensure housing, rations, and financial support to the tea garden workers.

Drone school - Gwalior

- The Union Civil Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia and Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan jointly inaugurated the first drone school in Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ This drone school is one of the five Drone Schools planned to be opened in different cities of Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ The other four cities are Bhopal, Indore, Jabalpur, and Satna.

Child Budget - Madhya Pradesh

- The Madhya Pradesh state government for the first time presented a 'child budget' as part of its annual financial plan.
- ❖ The Child Budget will ensure that the children of the state have a bright future.
- ❖ The Child Budget will enable the government to deal with schemes that will be child-oriented including infant mortality and malnutrition.

Indrayani Medicity

- ❖ The state government of Maharashtra has announced to set up the country's first medical city named 'Indrayani Medicity' in Pune.
- ❖ This is to provide all kinds of specialized treatment under one roof.
- ❖ Indrayani Medicity will have hospitals, centers for medical research, pharmaceutical manufacturing, wellness, and physiotherapy.

Artificial Intelligence & Robotics Technology Park

- ❖ The country's first Artificial Intelligence & Robotics Technology Park (ARTPARK) was launched in Bengaluru, Karnataka.
- ❖ ARTPARK (AI and Robotics Technology Park) along with AI Foundry is going to launch a \$100 million venture fund to support AI and robotics innovations in India.




Digital Water Bank

- ❖ India's First Digital Water Bank, 'AQVERIUM' has been launched in Bengaluru, Karnataka.
- ❖ It is an innovative initiative aimed at better water management.
- ❖ It is formed by AquaKraft Group Ventures.
- ❖ Digital Water Data Bank can be understood as a curated list of 'Water Data' from all institutions and sources that will further aid in tackling some common development challenges.







Mumbai Climate Action Plan



- ❖ The Mumbai Climate Action Plan (MCAP), prepared by Brihanmumbai Municipal Corporation (BMC), was released.
- ❖ The MCAP has laid down a 30-year roadmap for Mumbai to tackle the challenges of climate change.
- ❖ It has set short, medium, and long-term climate goals to achieve the target of net zero emissions by 2050.
- ❖ It has identified six strategic areas where massive changes will have to be made over the next 30 years.
- ❖ With this Mumbai becomes the first South Asian city to make plans to eliminate carbon emissions by 2050.
- ❖ The main focus of MCAP will be decarbonizing Mumbai's energy grid.





Crop diversification patterns

- ❖ Telangana is the first state in the country to record its crop diversification patterns in the form of an index.
- ❖ The crop diversification index has a base value of one.
- ❖ It represents the percentage of total cultivated area devoted to a single crop.
- ❖ If the index value is higher, it denotes that the crops are more diversified.
- ❖ In Telangana, many districts have index values ranging from 0 to 5.
- ❖ The crop diversification index will serve as a baseline for future crop diversification in the state.

Dynamic map to track land ownership


- ❖ Bihar has become the first state in the country to introduce the concept of the dynamic map for villages.

Identification of New Marine Species


- ❖ A new Carangid species has been identified by the Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute (CMFRI) from the Indian coast of Kerala.

- ❖ In the local language, this fish is called 'pola vatta'.








Gahirmatha arribada



- ❖ He is only the second Bangladeshi to be chosen to such a high position in the bank's history.








Boltzmann Medal

- ❖ Shane Warn took more wickets than any other bowler in Ashes cricket, the tally standing at 195.









Stephen Wilhite

- ❖ She is the only third cricketer overall to play six world cup after Sachin Tendulkar and Javed Miandad.
- ❖ She has played in the ICC women's cricket world cup events in 2000, 2005, 2009, 2013, 2017, and now in 2022.
- ❖ The ICC women's cricket world cup 2022 is being held in New Zealand.





Ravindra Jadeja

- India's Ravindra Jadeja climbed to the top spot in the ICC Test rankings for all-rounders.
- ❖ This is after his match-winning performance against Sri Lanka in the opening Test in Mohali.
- ❖ His unbeaten 175 lifted him up to 17 places from 54th to 37th.
- ❖ He added nine wickets in this match.

Times Ravindra Jadeja has taken 25 wickets or more in a Test series: 26 at 25.84 in the five-Test series against England in India in 2016-17 and 25 at 18.56 in the four-Test series against Australia in 2016-17.

Jadeja is the only allrounder to have scored 750-plus runs and taken 40 wickets or more in the World Test Championships between 2019 and 2022, his tally being 885 runs at 46.57 and 49 wickets at 26.61 in 17 matches.

Just one allrounder has a higher batting average and has taken more wickets at a lower average in a 30-Test span than Ravindra Jadeja, who has 1436 runs at 49.51 and 112 wkts at 25.24 from his last 30 Tests. Imran Khan scored 1585 runs (ave 52.83) and claimed 114 wickets at 23.37 in 30 consecutive Tests.

Mithali Raj captainship

- ❖ India's ODI skipper Mithali Raj broke the record for most matches captained in the ICC Women's World Cup.
- ❖ She surpassed former Australian counterpart Belinda Clark.
- ❖ Mithali had led the country in 24 World Cup games.







S L Narayanan



- ❖ In Chess, S L Narayanan was declared the winner in the Grandiscacchi Cattolica International Open, held in Italy.
- ❖ Meanwhile, his compatriot R Praggnanandhaa came second.
- ❖ The 24-year old S L Narayanan from Thiruvananthapuram earned the title of Grandmaster in 2015.
- ❖ He is the 41st Grandmaster from India.

German Open Super 300



- ❖ Indian shuttler Lakshya Sen beat the reigning world no.1 Viktor Axelsen, to enter the final of the German Open Super 300.
- ❖ It happened at the Westenergie Sporthalle.
- ❖ This was Lakshya Sen's first-ever victory against Viktor Axelsen.
- ❖ The two players have faced each other five times.





Duplantis sets world record

International Day for the Right to the Truth - March 24

- ❖ The day is observed as the International Day for the Right to the Truth concerning Gross Human Rights Violations and for the Dignity of Victims every year.
- ❖ The day aims to pay tribute to those who have devoted their lives or lost their lives in the struggle to promote and protect human rights for all.
- ❖ This day is observed on 24th March every year to pay tribute to "Monsignor Óscar Arnulfo Romero" as he was murdered on 24 March 1980.
- ❖ He was actively engaged in criticizing violations of the human rights of the most vulnerable individuals in El Salvador.

International Day of the Unborn Child - March 25


- ❖ The International Day of the Unborn Child is an annual commemoration of unborn fetuses, observed as a day of opposition to abortion.
- It was established by Pope John Paul II.
- ❖ In 1993, El Salvador became the first nation to officially celebrate what was called a Day of the Right to Be Born.





International Day of Remembrance of the Victims of Slavery and the Transatlantic Slave Trade - March 25

- ❖ It is marked every year to raise awareness about the dangers of racism and prejudice.
- ❖ 2022 Theme: "Stories of Courage: Resistance to Slavery and Unity against Racism"



Earth Hour 2022 - March 26

- ❖ Every year, the Earth Hour is celebrated worldwide on the last Saturday of March month.
- ❖ Earth Hour 2022 is being marked on March 26th.
- ❖ This is to show support for the fight against climate change and commitment towards a better planet.
- ❖ The event encourages individuals, communities, and businesses to turn off non-essential electric lights, for one hour, from 8:30 to 9:30 p.m.
- ❖ This year's theme is 'Invest In Our Planet'.







World Theatre Day - March 27

- ❖ It is promoted by the International Theatre Institute (ITI).
- ❖ This year, the celebration will focus on the young, the next generation, the emerging artists.

World Idli Day - March 30

- ❖ The day was started by Eniyavan, a famous Idli caterer from Chennai.
- ❖ It only started in 2015.
- ❖ Although idli is an Indian staple food, some historians say that its origin is in the country of Indonesia.
- ❖ This country is known for its long tradition of fermenting foods.
- ❖ The tradition then went on to India in the form of steamed idli which was around 800 to 1200 CE.
- Some experts say that the term idli came from the word "iddalige" which is a food made from urad dal batter.
- ❖ In addition, the Sanskrit Manasollasa from 1130 AD mentions the term "Iddarika" which is a dish made from urad dal.
- ❖ During the 17th century, the Tamil people first mentioned the food as "Itali".

International Transgender Day of Visibility - March 31

- The day is dedicated to celebrating transgender people and raising awareness of discrimination faced by transgender people worldwide, as well as celebrating their contributions to society.
- ❖ The day was founded by US-based transgender activist Rachel Crandall of Michigan in 2009.
