### TNPSC BITS

- ❖ The Union Minister Rajyavardhan Rathore has inaugurated a National declamation contest on Patriotism and nation-building. It was organized by Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan (NYKC) along with Department of Youth affairs.
- ❖ The Oxford Dictionaries announced that the word 'Nari Shakti' (women empowerment) which is derived from Sanskrit has been chosen as the Hindi Word of the year for 2018.
- ❖ The historic Diggi Palace is hosting the 12<sup>th</sup> (5-day) Jaipur Literature Festival. The Jaipur Literature Festival is an annual literary festival which takes place in the Indian city of Jaipur each January.
  - It was founded in 2006, and from 2008 it has been produced by Teamwork Arts.

### **NATIONAL**

## **Bio-Jet fuel for Military Aircraft**

- ❖ The Centre for Military Airworthiness and Certification (CEMILAC), a premier military certification agency, has cleared the use of indigenously produced biofuel for use in the military aircraft.
- ❖ The Indian Air Force is expected to use bio fuel for its transport fleet and helicopters following this clearance.
- ❖ In a first for the Republic Day parade, the IAF flew an An-32 aircraft in 'vic' & 'satluj' formation, whose lead plane used a mix of traditional and biofuel during the grand event.
- ❖ The bio-jet fuel has been produced from seeds of Jatropha plant sourced from Chhattisgarh and processed at CSIR-IIP's lab at Dehradun.

### LRSAM Test from coast of Odisha

- ❖ India has successfully flight-tested Long Range Surface-to-Air Missile (LRSAM) from a warship off Odisha coast.
- ❖ The LRSAM successfully destroyed a low flying aerial target.





- ❖ LRSAM has been jointly developed by DRDO, India and Israel Aerospace Industries (IAI) for the Indian Navy.
- ❖ The LRSAM was test fired in operational configuration on board INS Chennai positioned in the Arabian Sea.

#### New norms for Jan Shikshan Sansthans


- ❖ The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) has issued new guidelines for Jan Shikshan Sansthans (JSS).
- ❖ The new guidelines are issued as part of an attempt by the MSDE to re-energize and reinvigorate the Jan Shikshan Sansthans.
- Some of the highlights of these guidelines are,
  - o Aligning of JSS program and curriculum to Nationwide Talent Qualification Framework (NSQF) to enhance teaching.
  - o Decentralisation of powers for JSSs by supplying additional accountability and independence to district administration.
- ❖ JSS were established to provide vocational training to non-literate, neo-literate, as well as school dropouts by identifying skills as would have a market in the region of their establishment.

### INTERNATIONAL

## UK to support nitrogen research in India

❖ The UK government has announced a research project to study Nitrogen pollution in India and South Asia.

- ❖ The South Asian Nitrogen Hub will be led by United Kingdom's "Centre for Ecology and Hydrology" under the new partnership programme.
- ❖ India is the only South Asian country which has completed its Nitrogen Assessment and now it is Co-leading the South Asian Assessment for the UN Environment.
- The five-year programme is being established with funds from the UK Research and Innovation (UKRI).







❖ Nitrogen pollution is one of the emerging environmental problem and it is caused by emissions from chemical fertilizers, livestock manure & burning of fossil fuels.

# World's longest 3D printed concrete bridge opened in china

- ❖ The World's longest 3D printed concrete bridge was opened in China.
- ❖ It is located on the Wenzaobang River in Shanghai.



- ❖ The Bridge is designed by Professor Xy Weiguo from Tsinghua University in China.
- ❖ The bridge is of 26.3 metre-long and 3.6-metre-wide and is made out of 44 hollowed-out 3D printed concrete blocks.

## **State Tiger Protection Force - Telangana**

- ❖ The Telangana government has decided to form a 'State Tiger Protection Force' to save the Big Cat population in the State.
- ❖ The State Forest Protection Committee headed by Chief Secretary S K Joshi took the decision to form the STPF.
- ❖ The 112-member-armed STPF will be headed by an Assistant Conservator of Forests to protect the tiger population in Amarabad and Kawal Tiger Reserves.
- ❖ The State and Central government will share the cost of the force on 40:60 basis.

## Yuva Swabhiman Yojana

- The Madhya Pradesh CM Kamal Nath has launched 'Yuva Swabhiman Yojana' for youths of the weak section in urban areas of Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ Under this scheme, 100 days of employment will be provided to youths from economically weaker sections in urban areas.
- ❖ They will also be given skill training.

### **Best Miniratna PSU**

- Numaligarh Refinery Limited (NRL) received best Miniratna PSU in strategic performance financial category award at 6th PSU awards function held in New Delhi.

## World Leprosy Day - last Sunday of January

- ❖ The World Leprosy Day is observed internationally every year on the last Sunday of January to increase the public awareness of the Leprosy or Hansen's Disease.
- ❖ In 2019 the World Leprosy Day falls on 27th January and will be observed in India on January 30 (Gandhi's death anniversary).
- ❖ This year the day focuses on the target of zero cases of leprosy-related disabilities in children.
- ❖ The day was initiated in 1954 by French philanthropist and writer, Raoul Follereau, as a way to raise global awareness of this deadly ancient disease.
